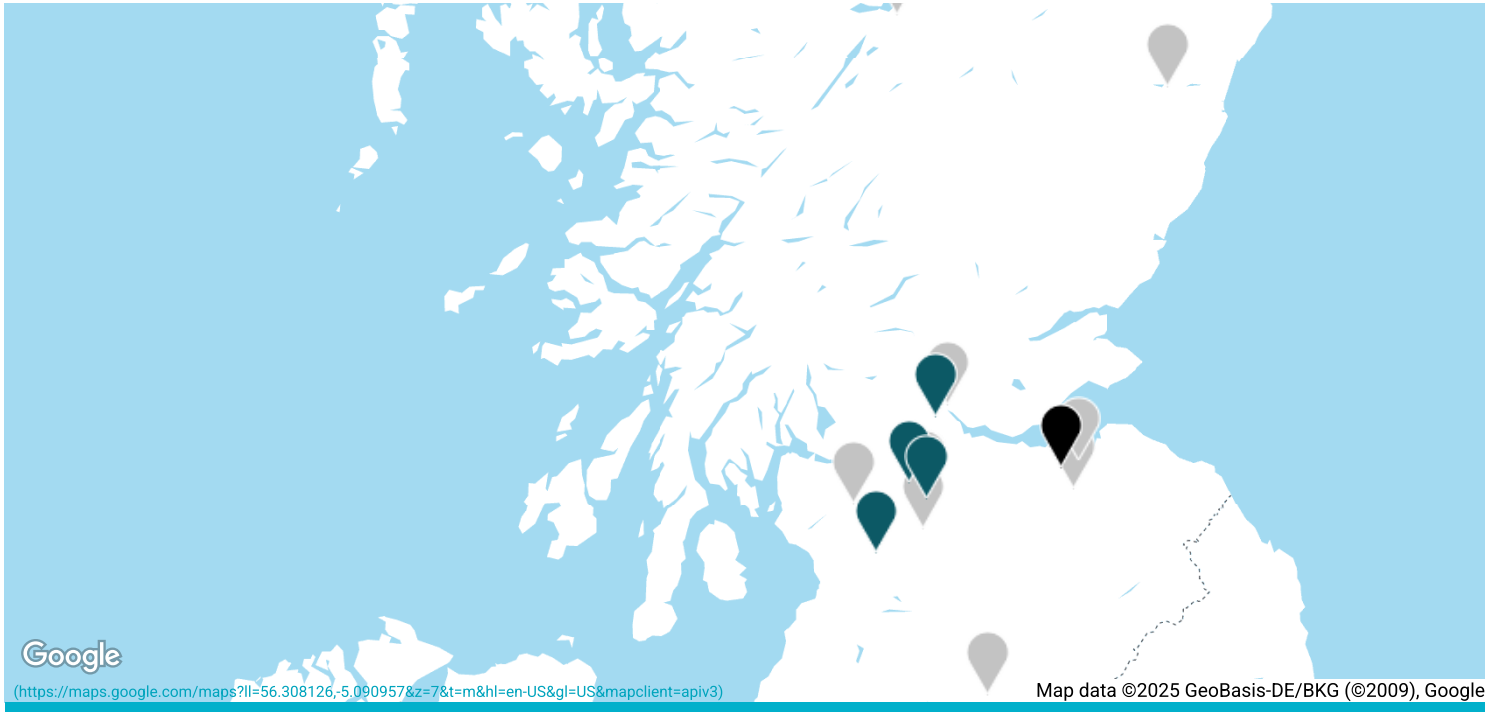




Danderhall

Danderhall is in Midlothian. It is very close to Edinburgh. It was a mining town and indeed the last mine (Monktonhall) did not close until 1998. The town has a large council estate. It acts as a suburb of Edinburgh.

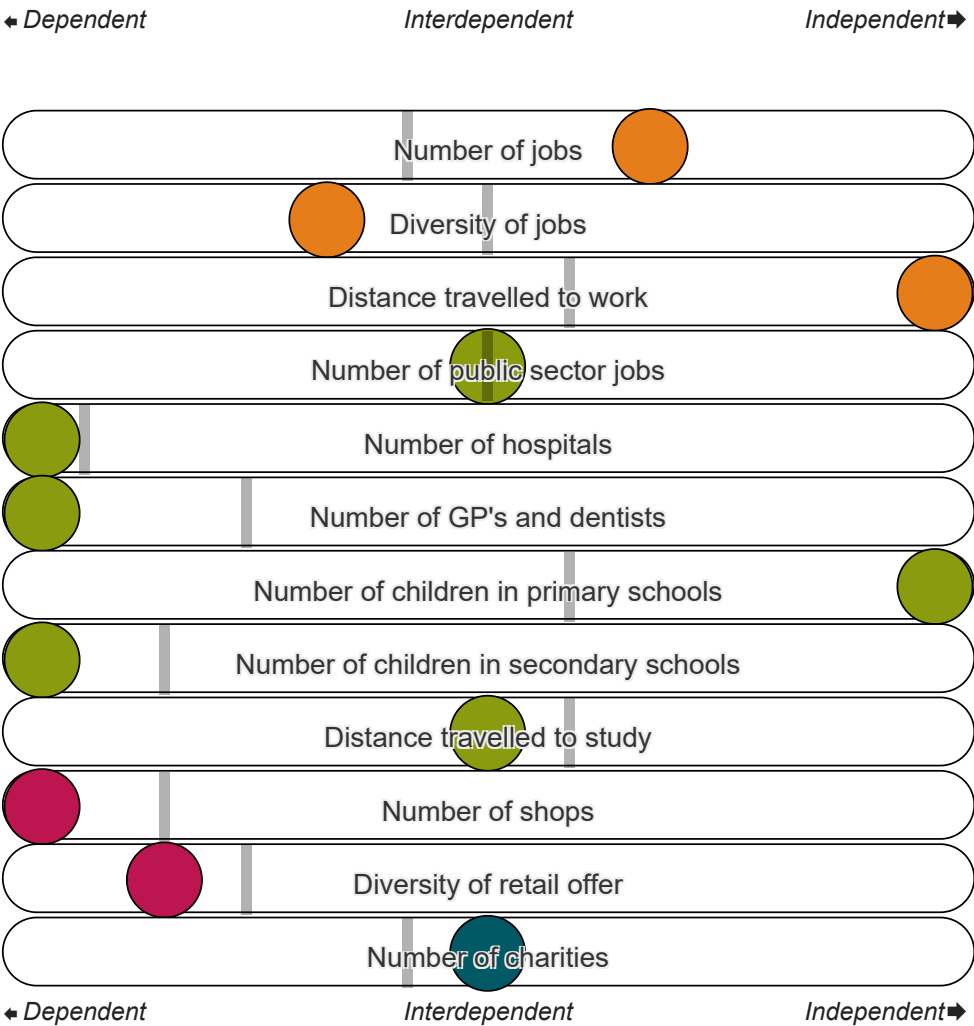
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Danderhall is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Danderhall is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Danderhall differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

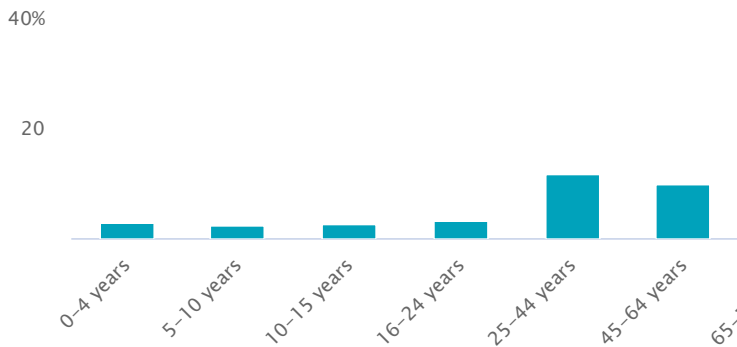

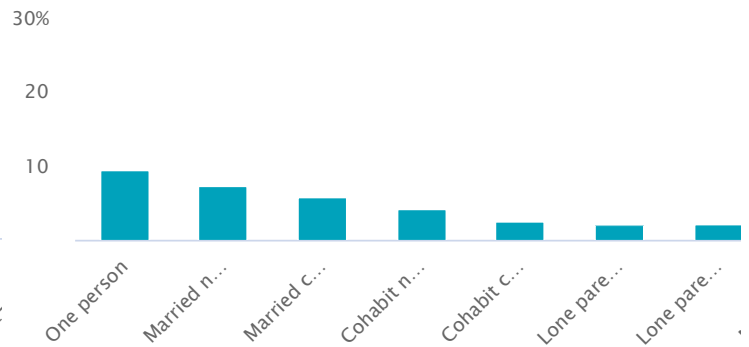

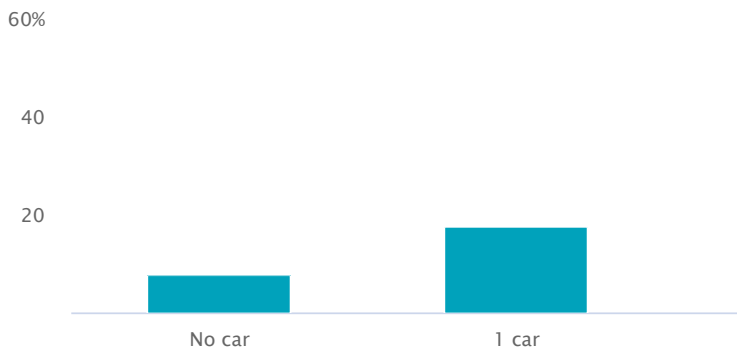

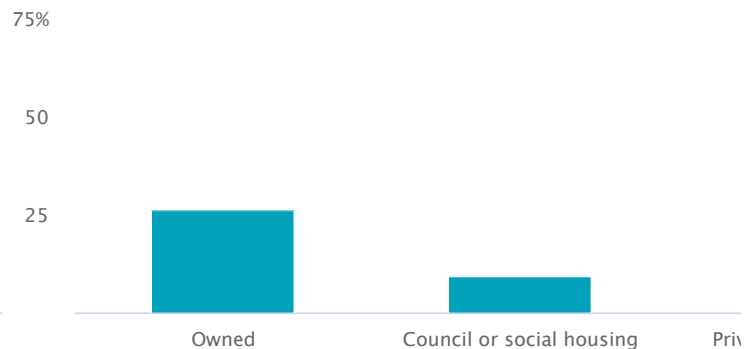

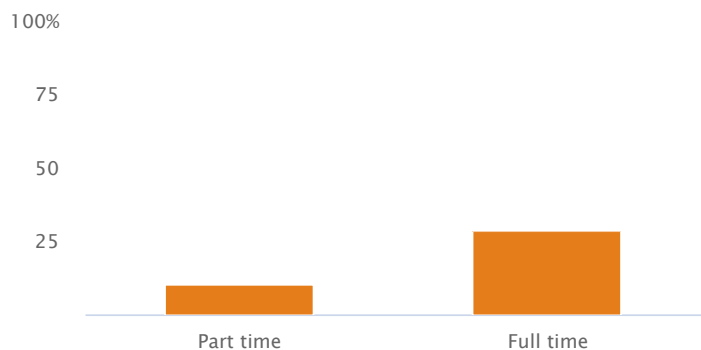

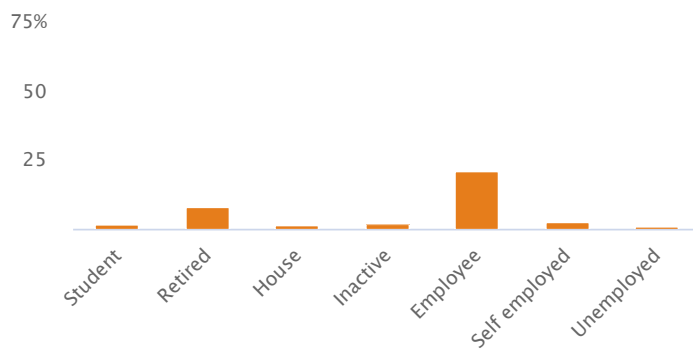
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



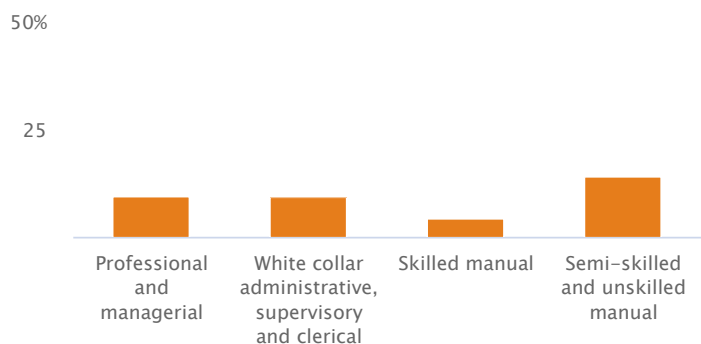
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

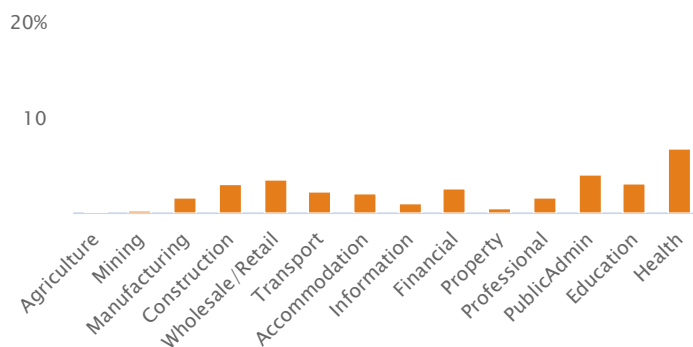

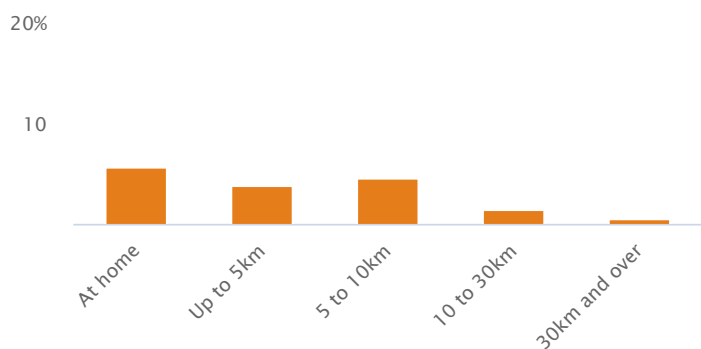
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

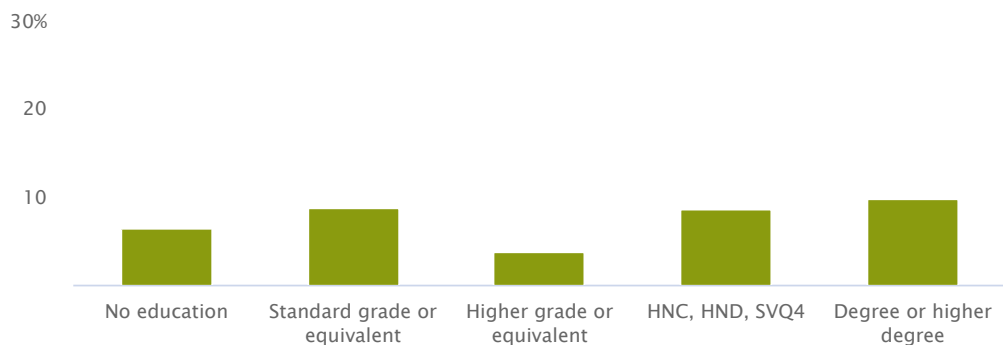


Distance travelled to work

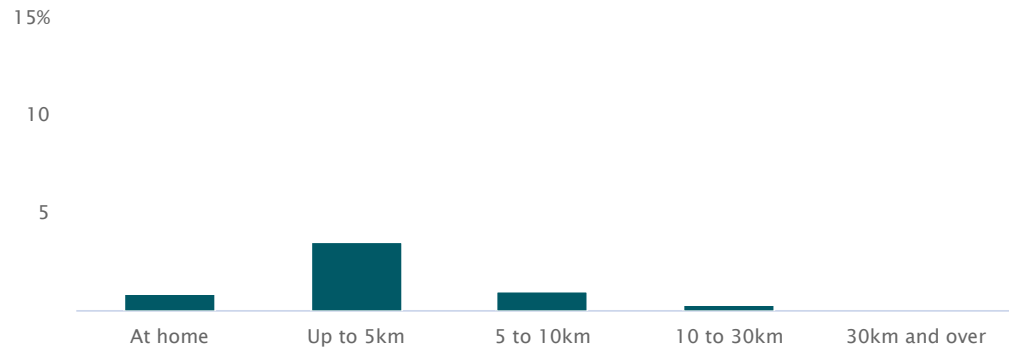
