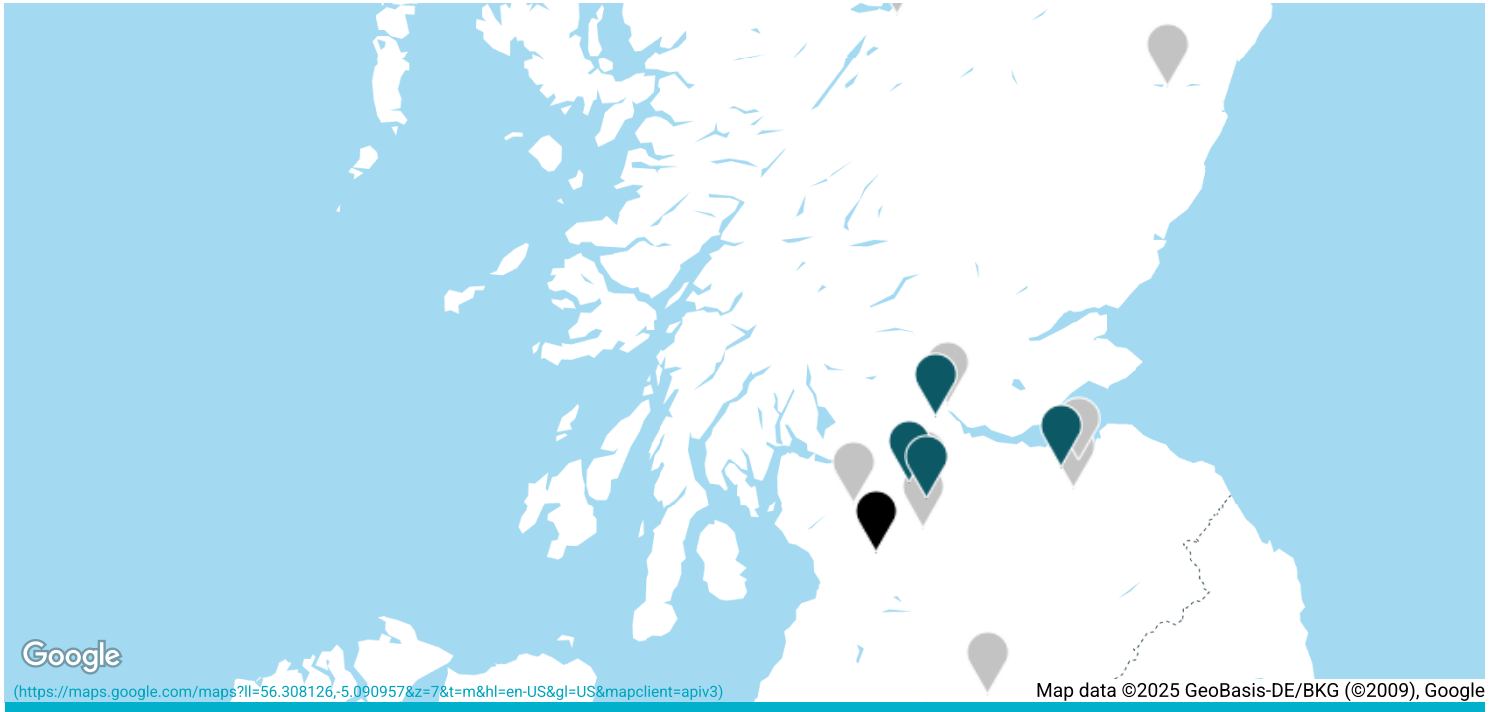




Darvel

Darvel in East Ayrshire was known as 'The Lang Toon'. It was famed for carpets and lace. Darvel lace was exported across the world. The last lace mill (making lace curtains) closed and moved to Newmilns.

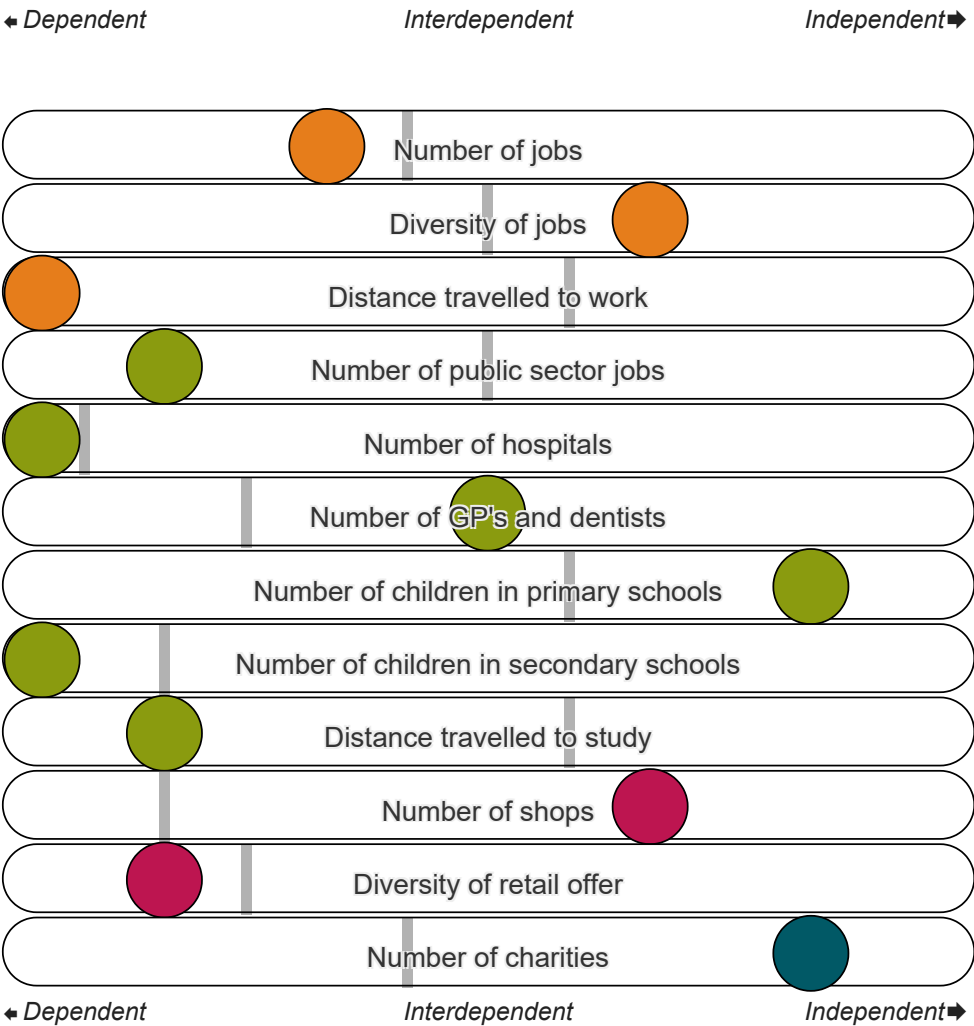
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

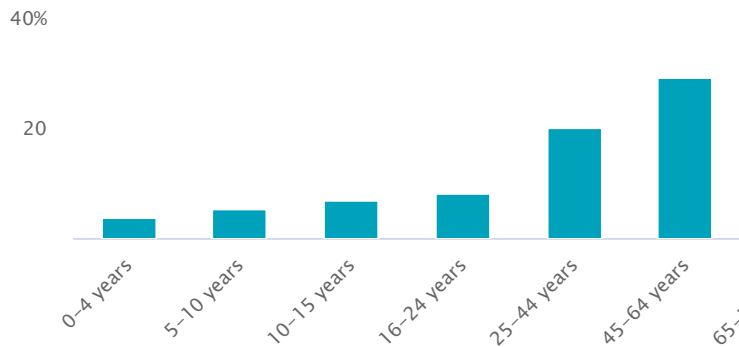

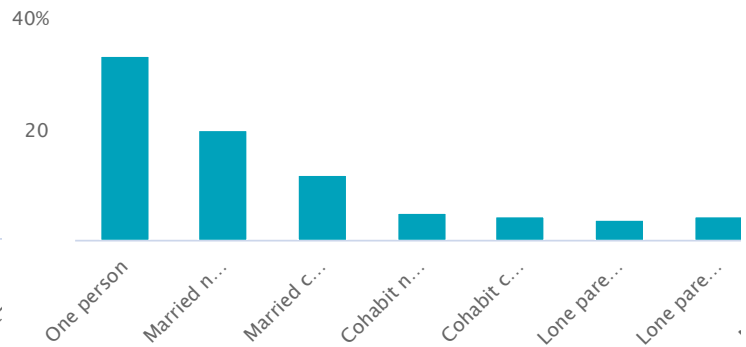

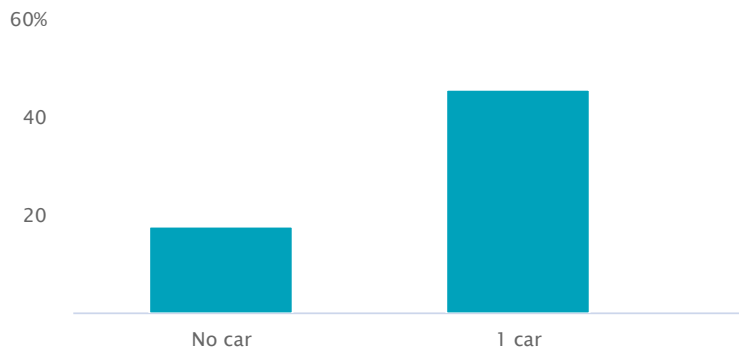

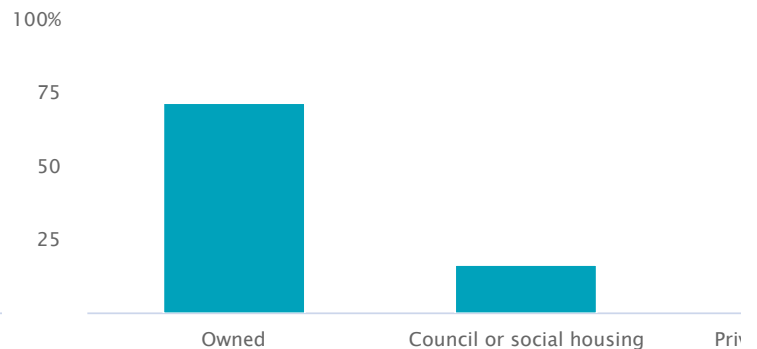

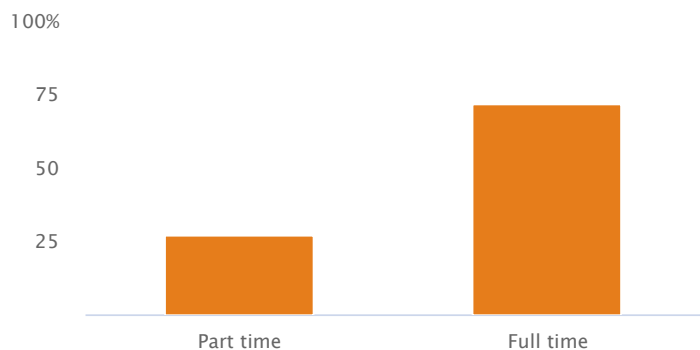

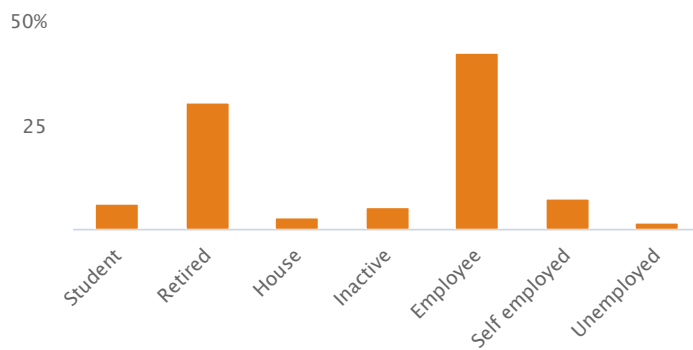
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



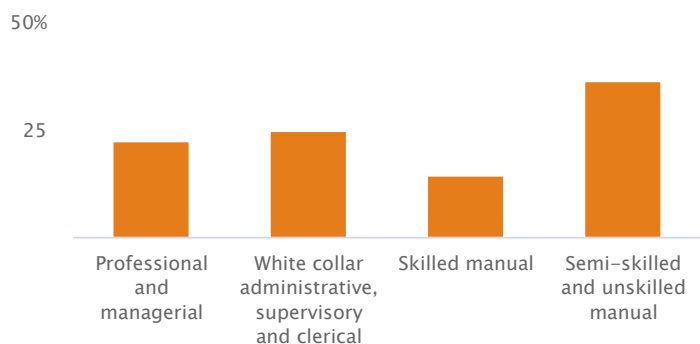
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

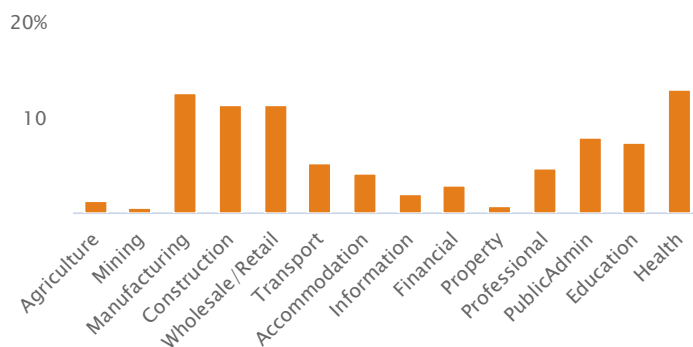

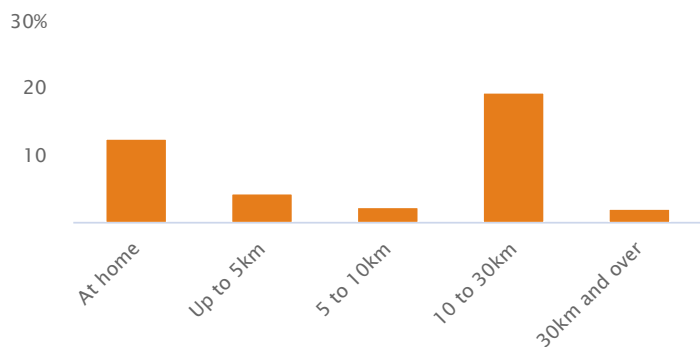
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

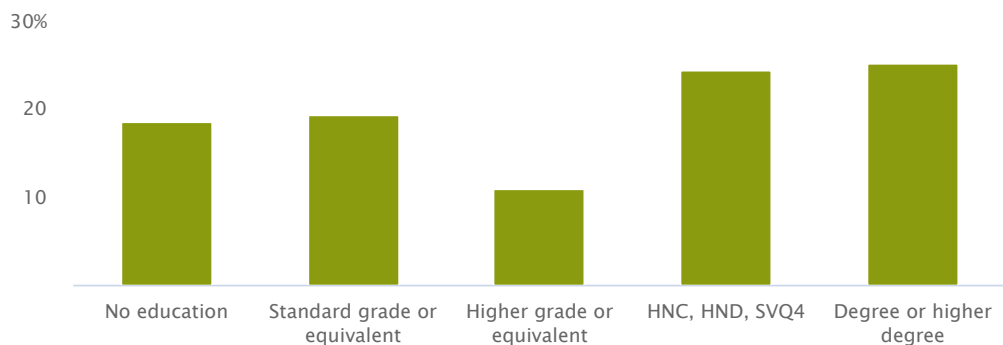


Distance travelled to work

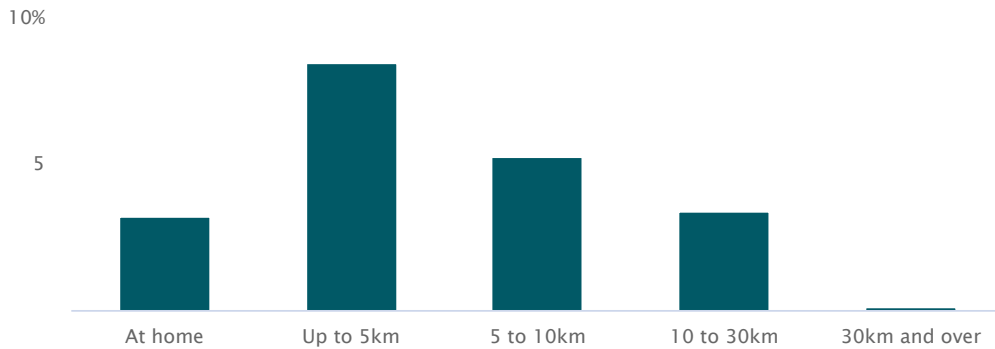
