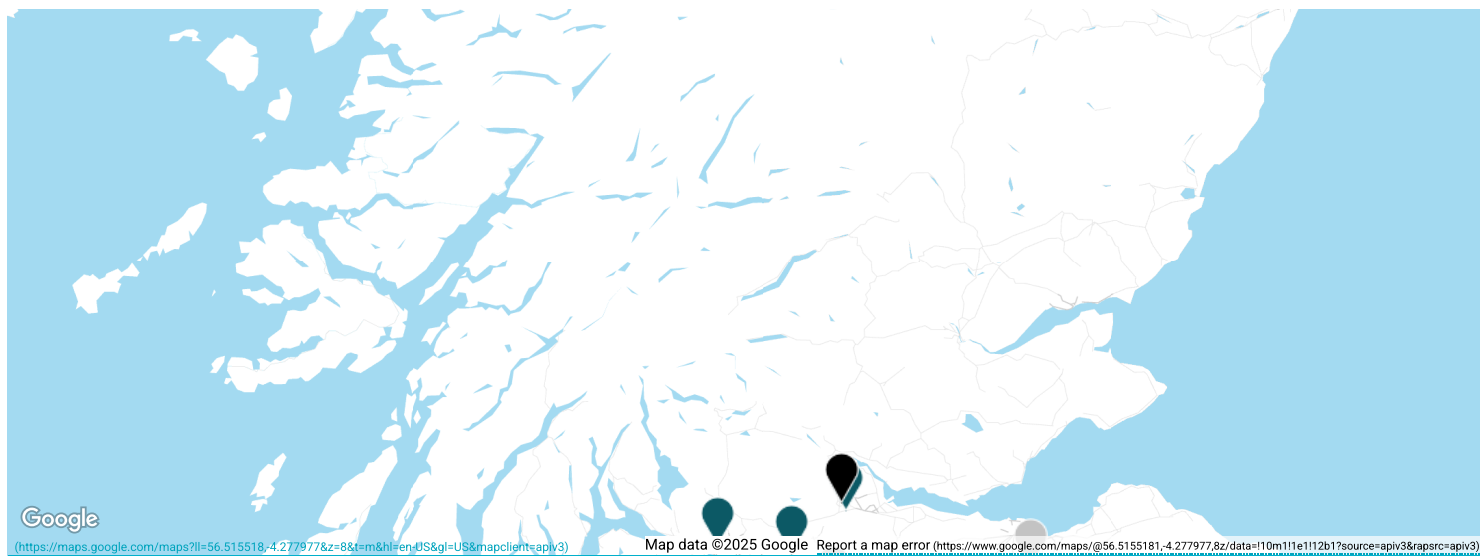




Denny.

Denny is in Falkirk Council. Denny was a calico and wool producing town in the 18th century. During the 20th century it was a coaching stop on the Glasgow Stirling road but it was bypassed by the new motorway network. It was an industrial town until the 1980s with iron production, brick works, coal mining and paper manufacturing. Since the closure of heavy industry local employment has declined and by 2010 it was asking for a regeneration programme.

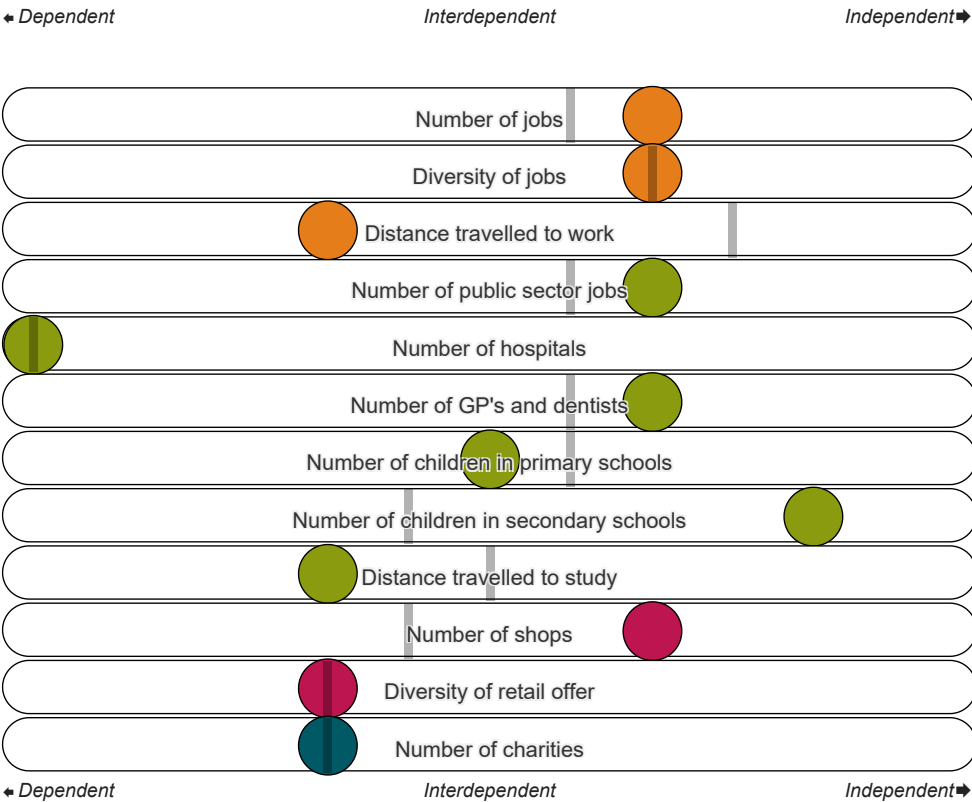
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Denny is an interdependent town.

Denny is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Denny is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools. Denny differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

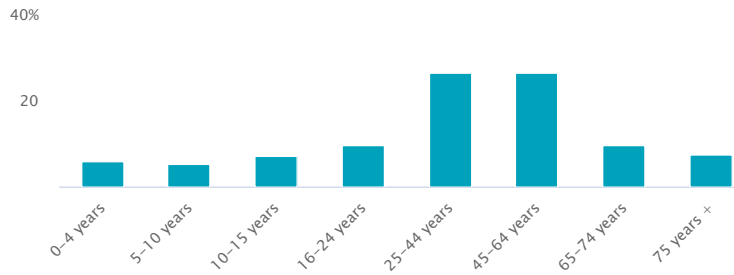

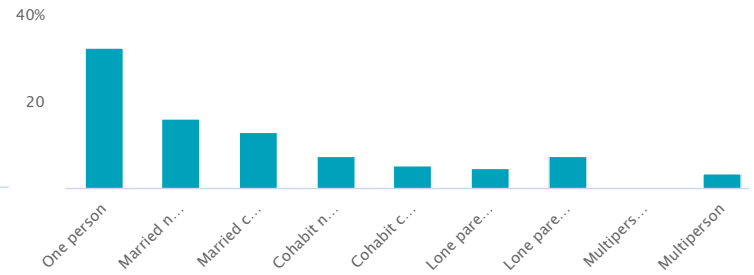

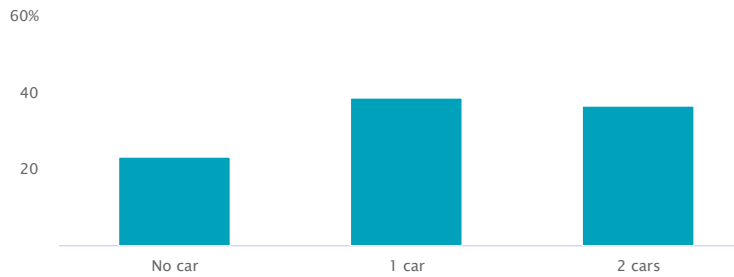

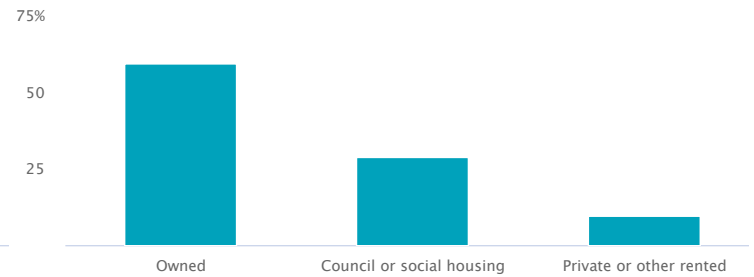
Household composition

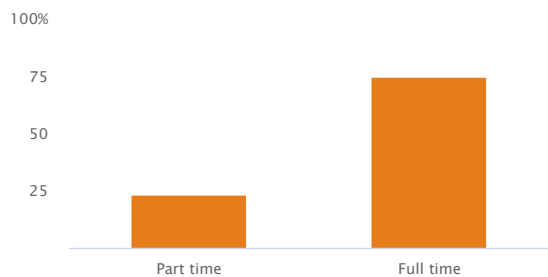

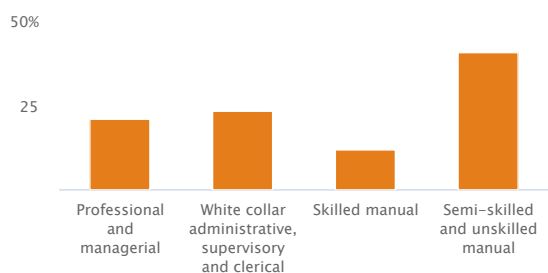
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



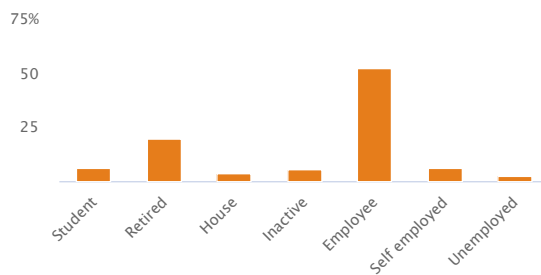
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

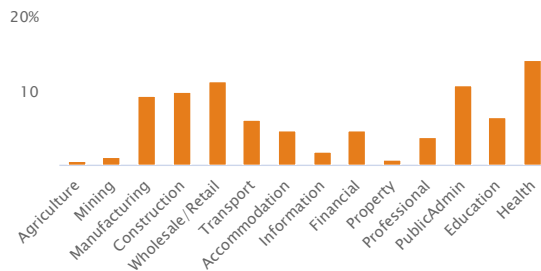

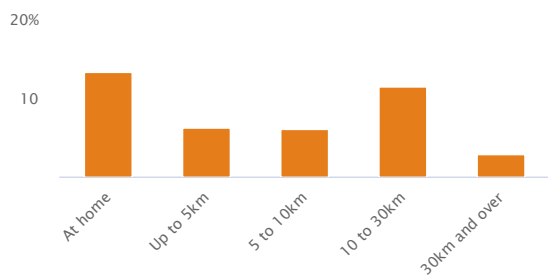

Sector Diversity

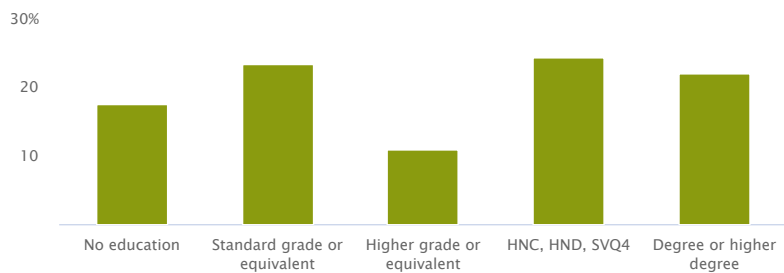


Distance travelled to work

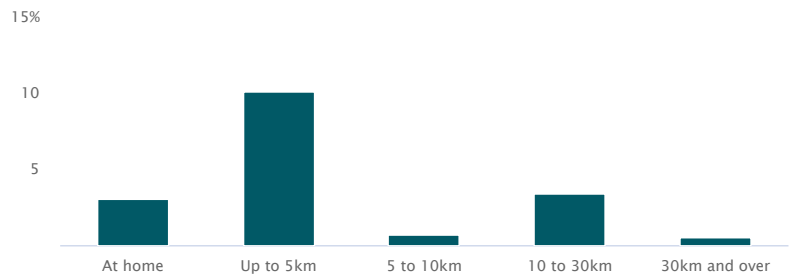
