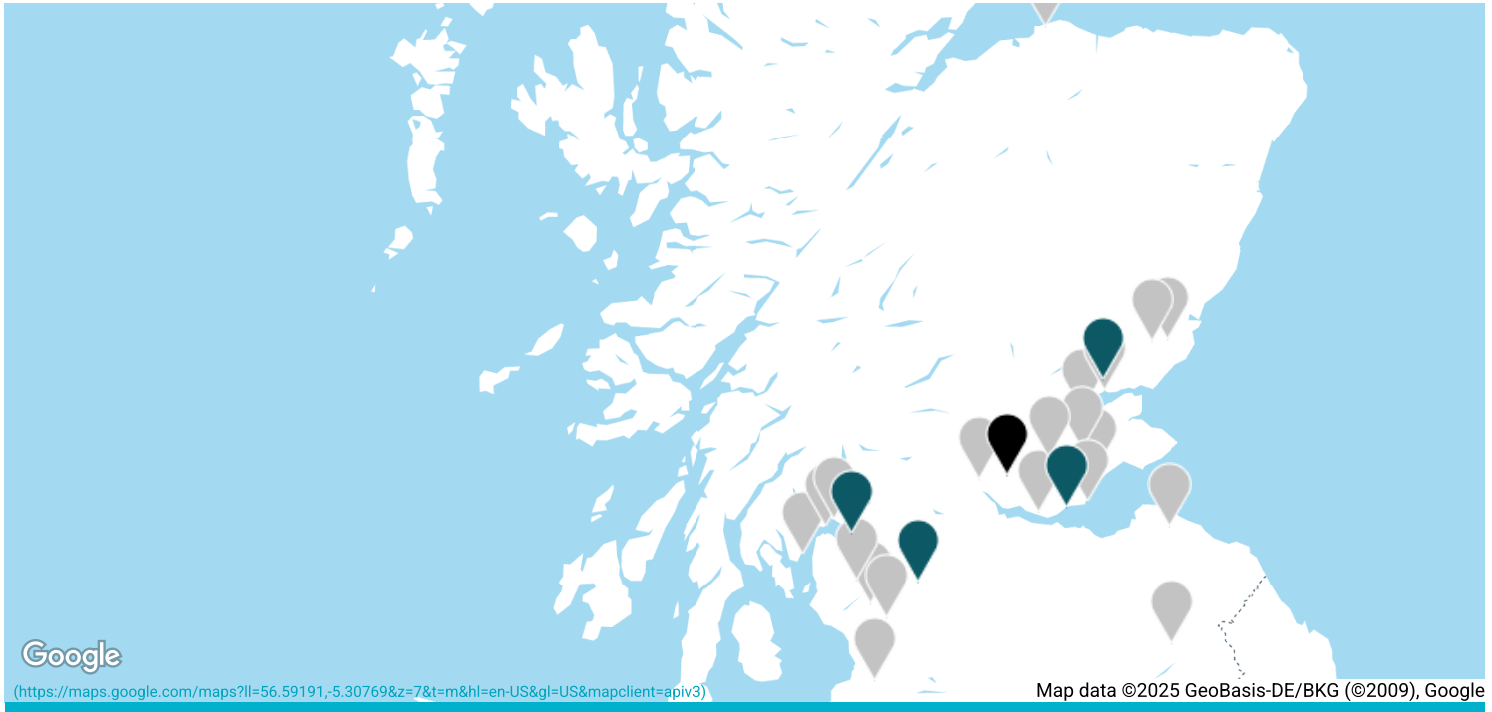




Dollar

Dollar in Clackmannanshire was destroyed in the 17th century and later rebuilt as a stopping point on the turnpike road. It had woollen mills. Coal was mined locally and there was a major brewery (which moved to Alva). It is now primarily residential. Dollar Academy is a central feature of the town.

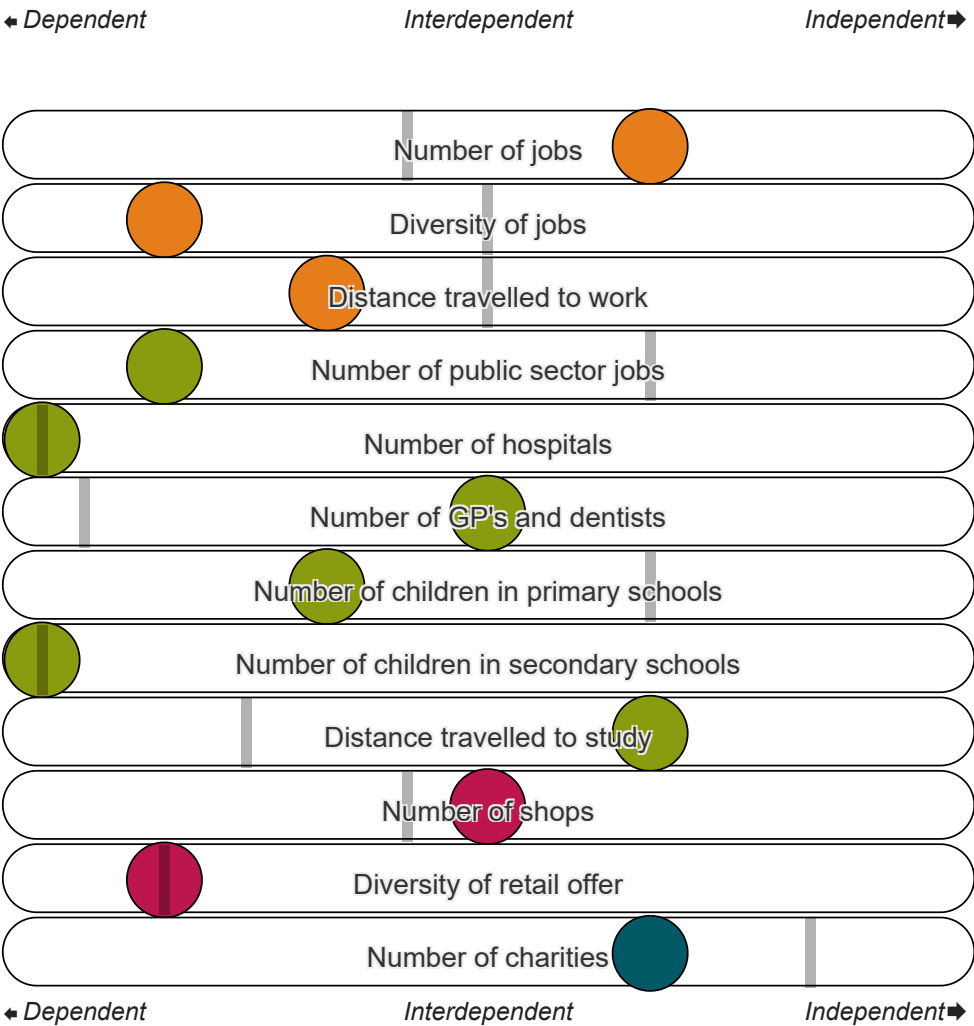
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Dollar is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Dollar is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dollar is grouped with 24 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Dollar differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

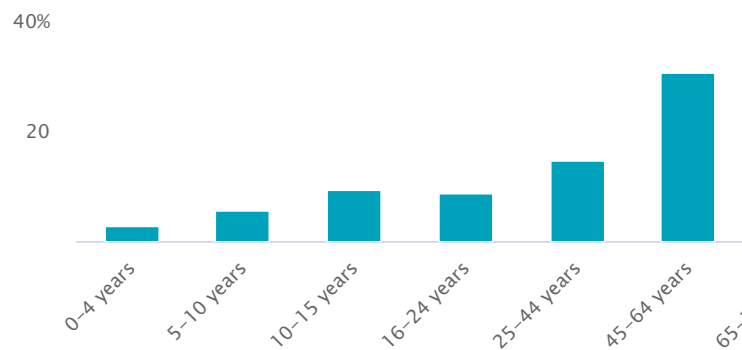

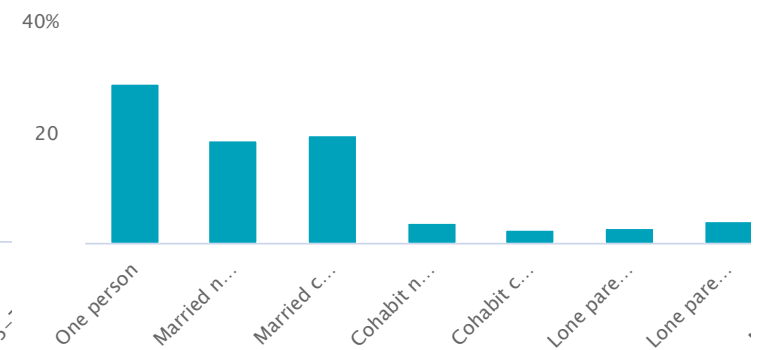

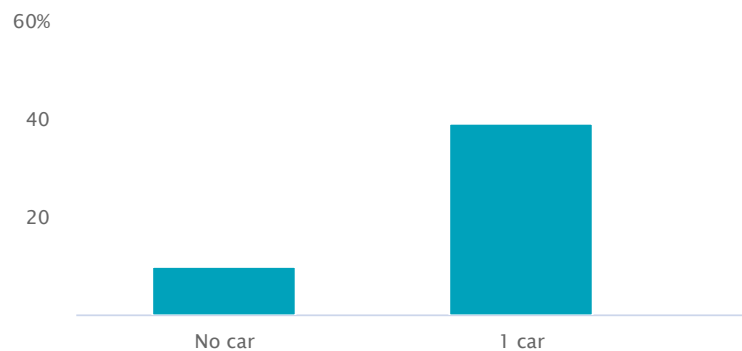

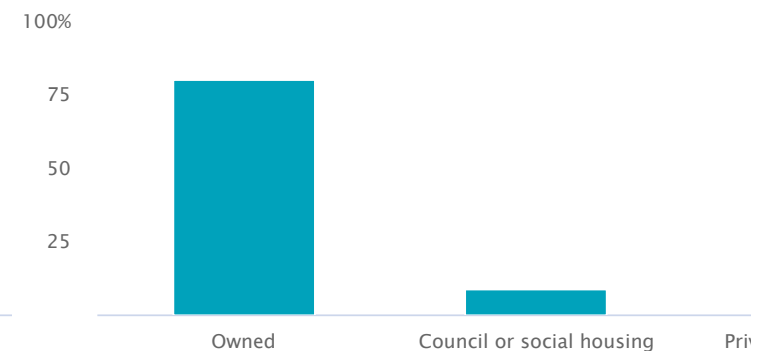
Household composition

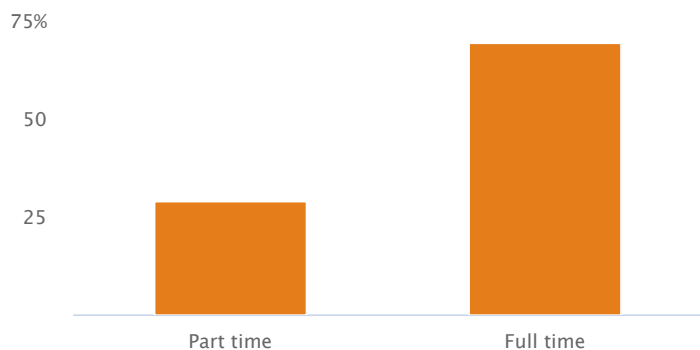

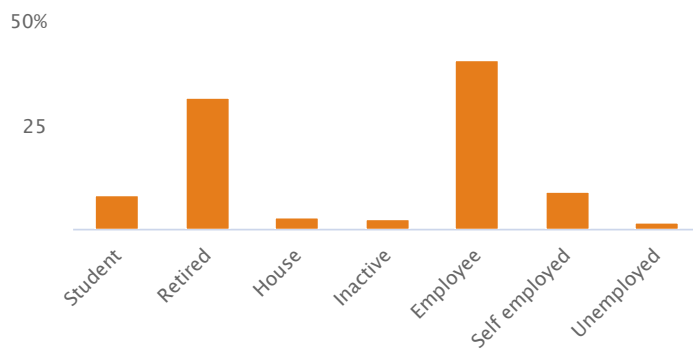
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



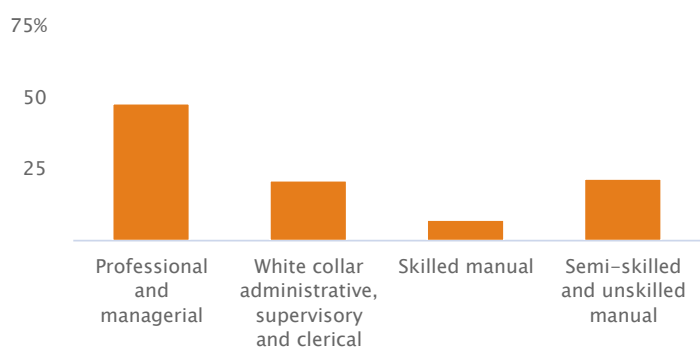
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

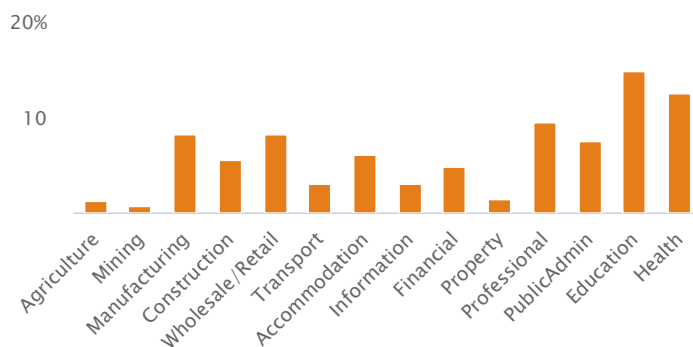


Social Grade

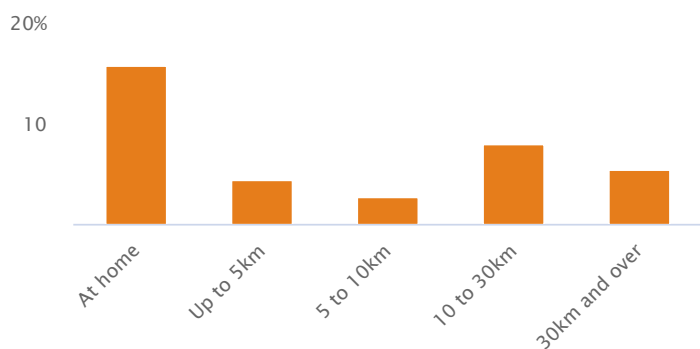
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

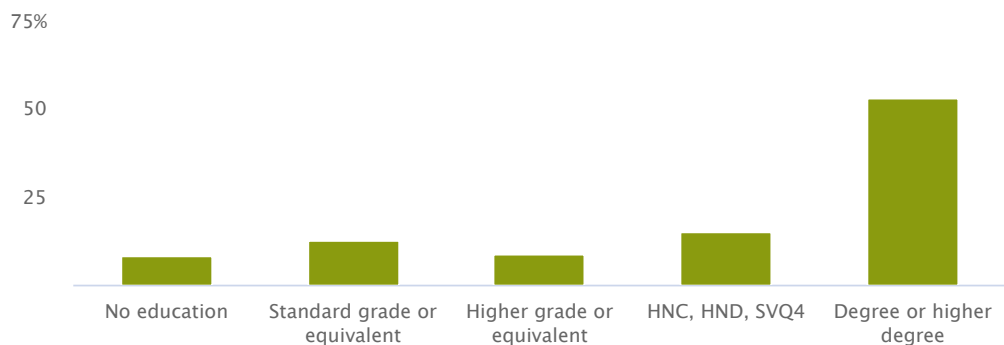


Distance travelled to work

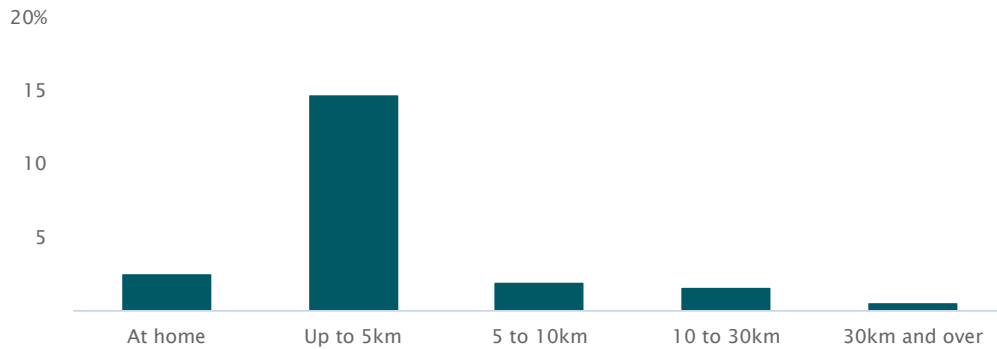
