Dornoch in Highland was the former county town for Sutherland. It originally developed around the church and cathedral but these were destroyed in the Reformation. It is now a tourist centre.

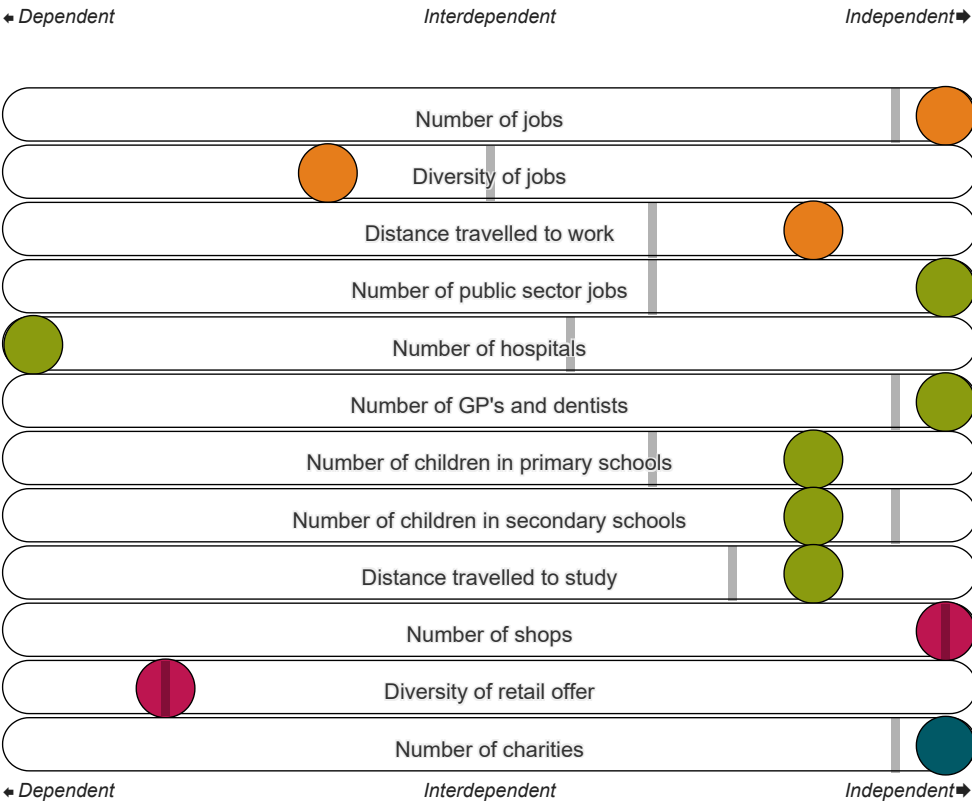
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Dornoch is an independent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Aberfeldy](#), [Aberlour](#), [Grantown-on-Spey](#), and [Lamlash](#).

Inter-relationships



Dornoch is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dornoch is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. Dornoch differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.

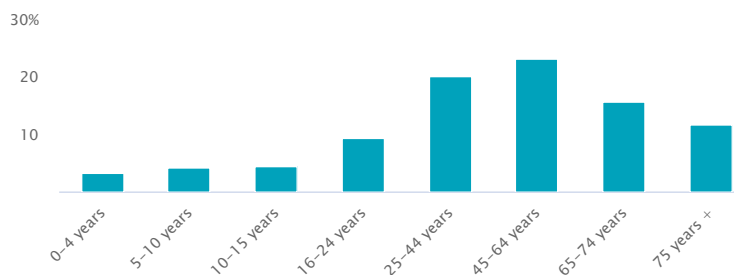

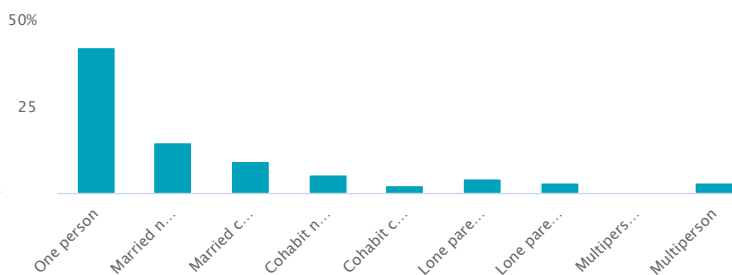

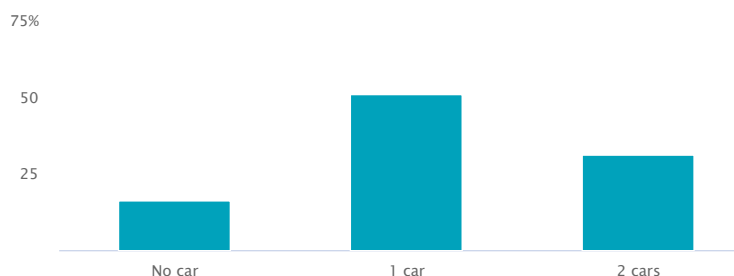

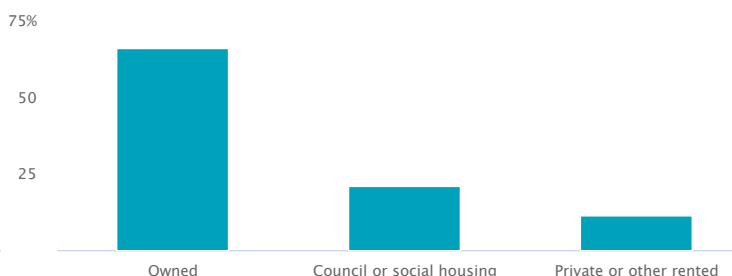

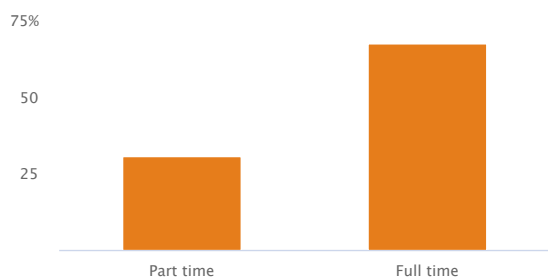

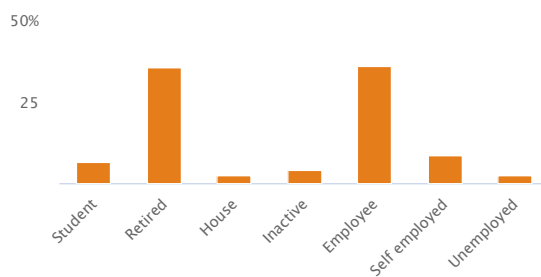
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



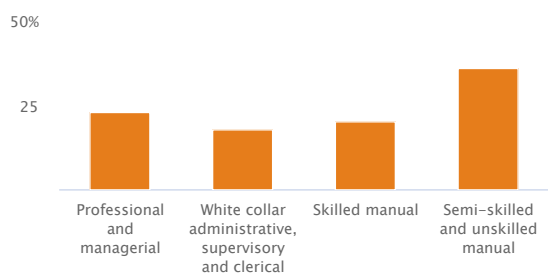
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

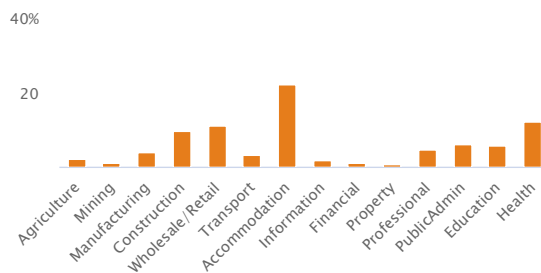

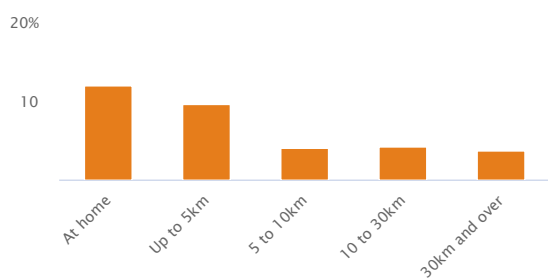
(% households aged 16-64)



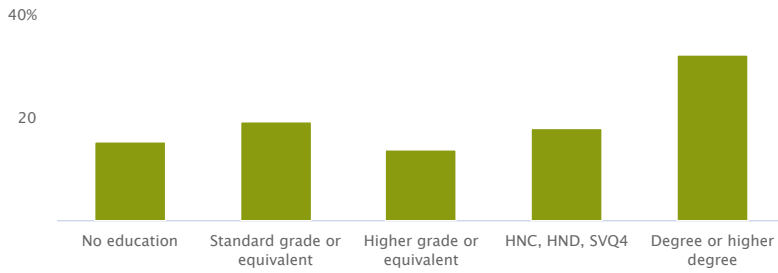
Sector Diversity

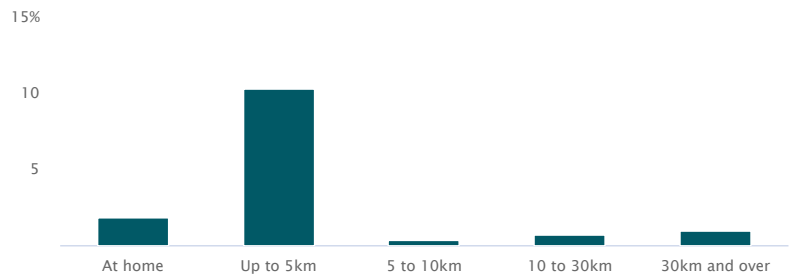
