Douglas is a town in South Lanarkshire. The settlement grew initially in relation to Douglas Castle home of the Lords of Douglas. In the Industrial Revolution woollen mills and mining became important. Today it is a local service centre.


In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Douglas is an interdependent to dependent town.

Its most similar towns are Ardersier, Calderbank, Cowie, and High Valleyfield, Low Valleyfield and Culross.

Douglas is an interdependent to dependent town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Douglas is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, and diversity of retail

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and GP's and dentists. Douglas differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.










Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




Occupation






