Dronagan in East Ayrshire was a rural settlement until the development of coal mining from 1900. It was a town where miners were resettled in new public housing from surrounding areas in the 1950s. Local employment is in service industries.

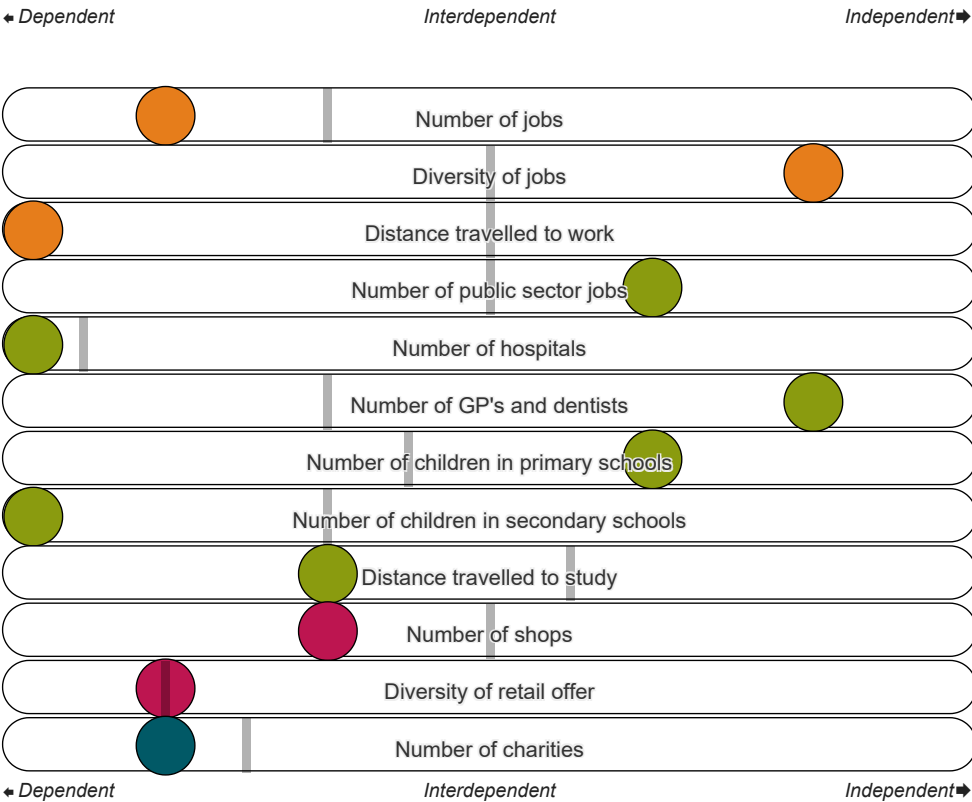
In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Drongan is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Drongan is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Drongan is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study. Drongan differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools; and the distance travelled to work.

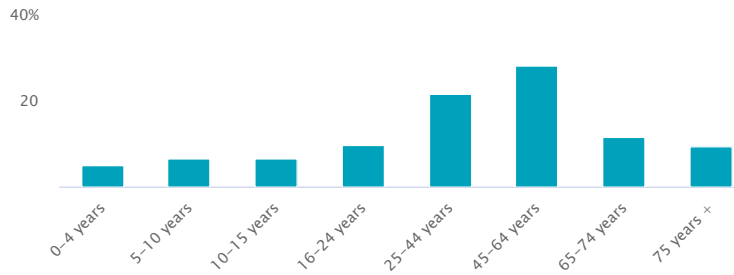

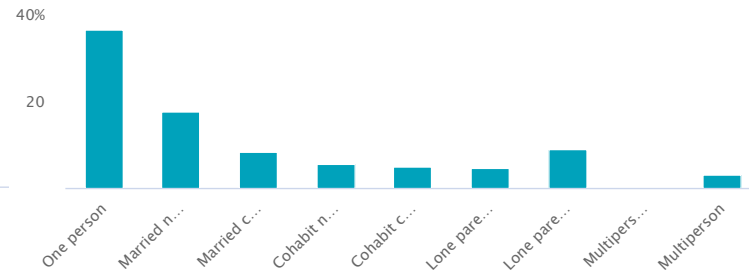

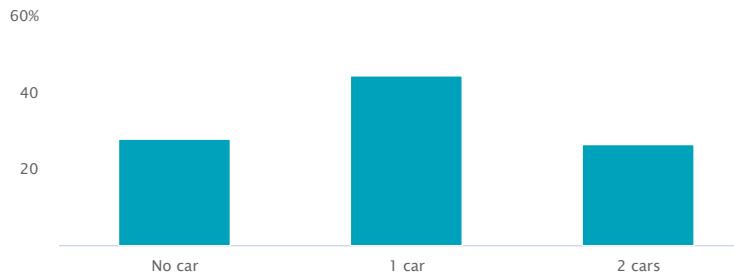

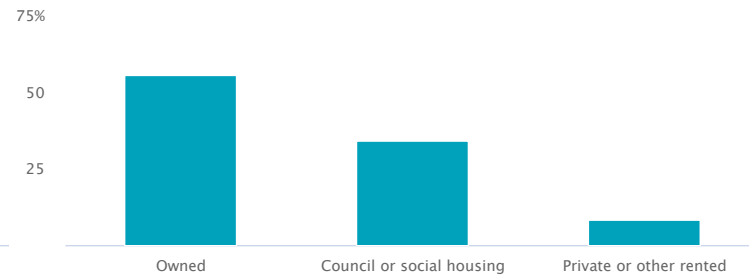

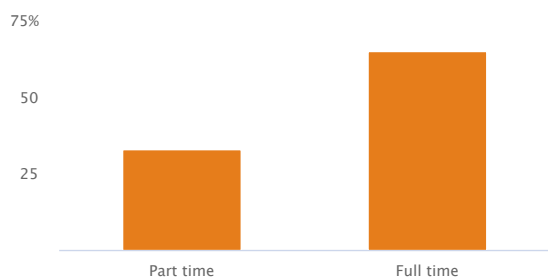

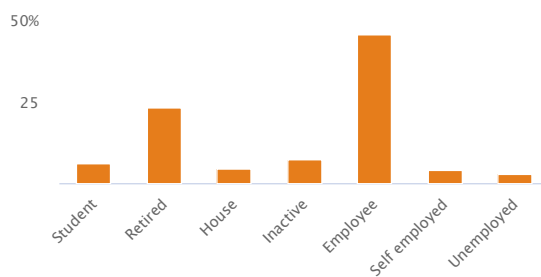
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



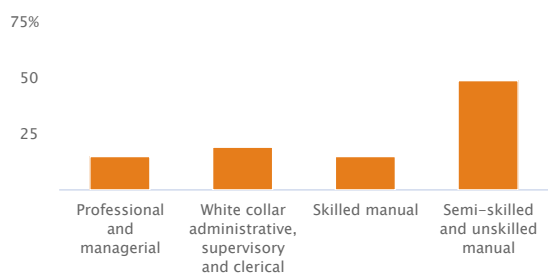
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

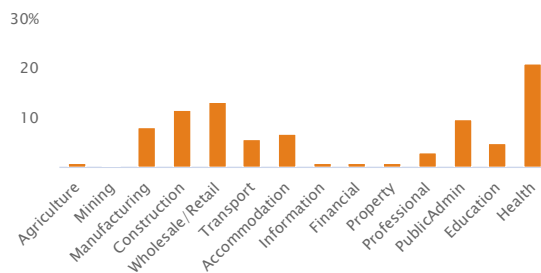

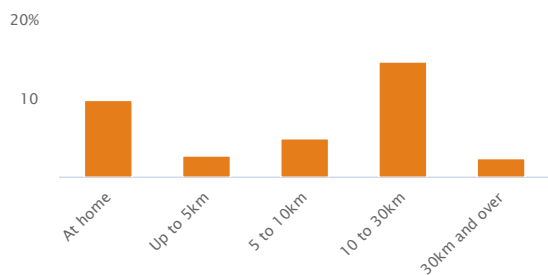
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

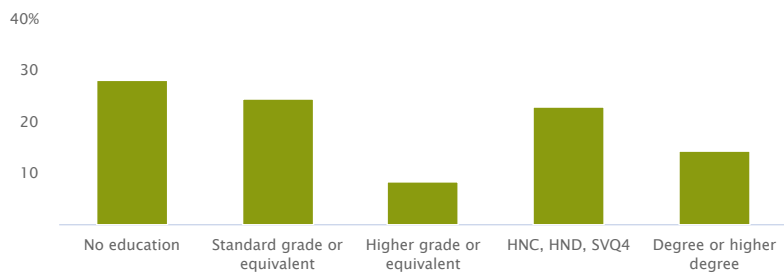


Distance travelled to work

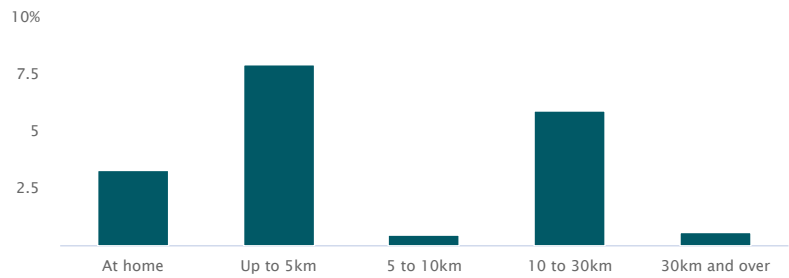
