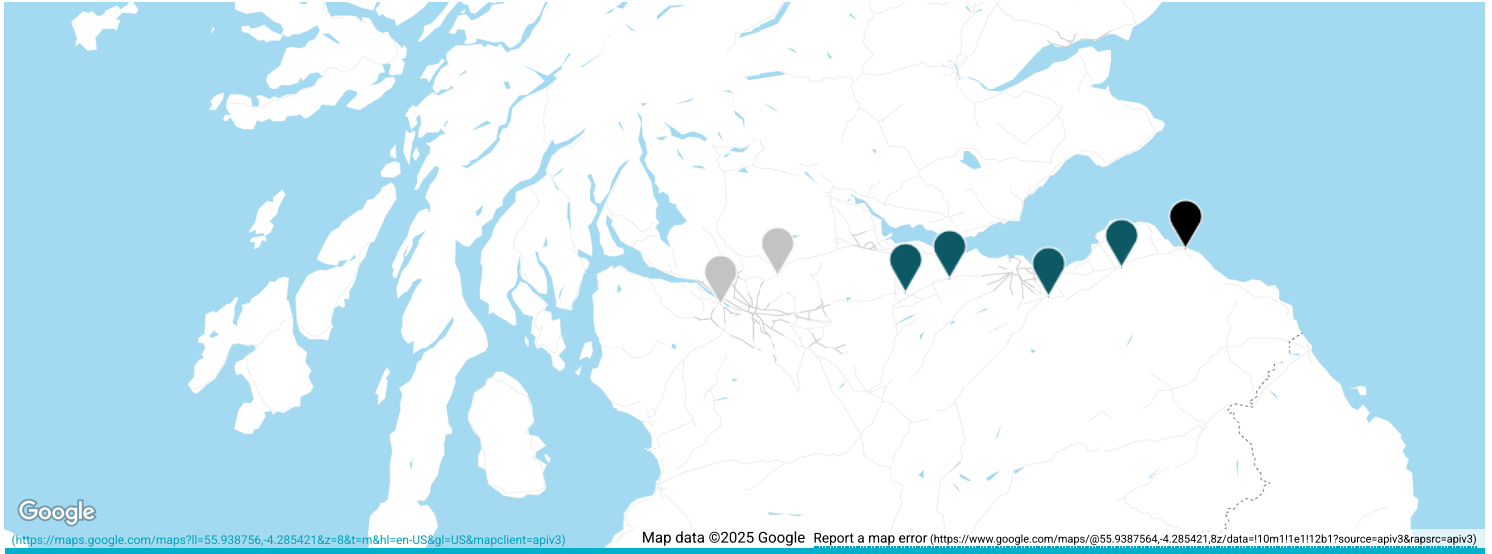




Dunbar

Dunbar in East Lothian was historically a port. Bypassed by the new A1 it is now a commuter settlement. It retains a tourist function. The Lafarge cement works and Torness Power Station provide some local employment.

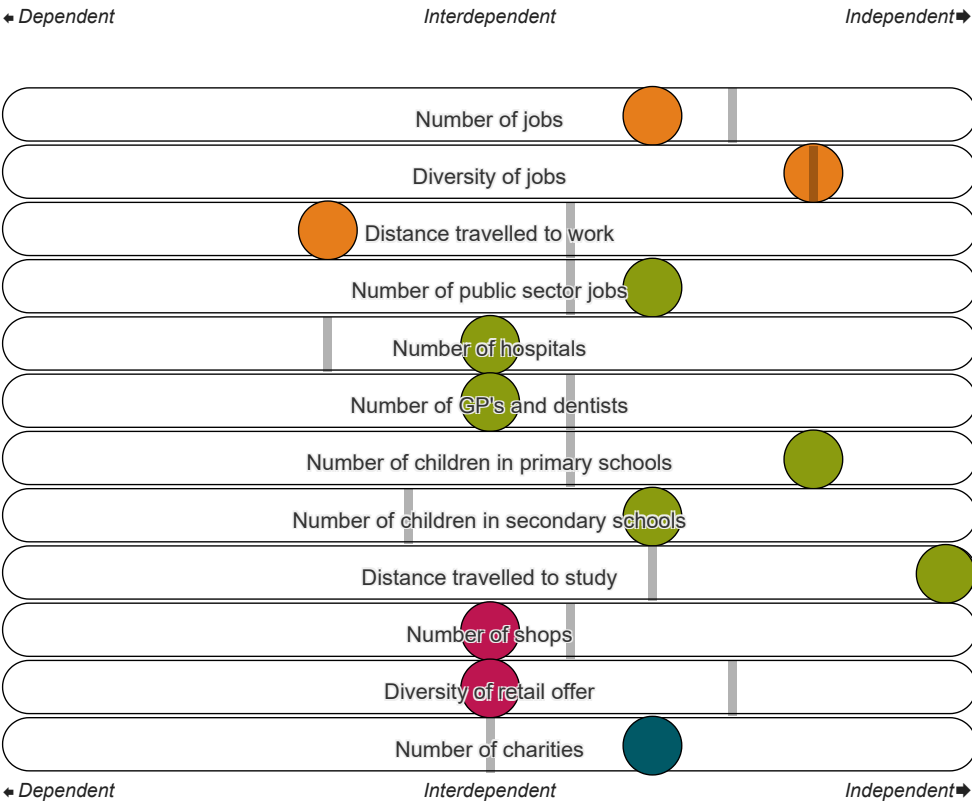
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Dunbar is an interdependent to independent town.

Dunbar is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dunbar is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Dunbar differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

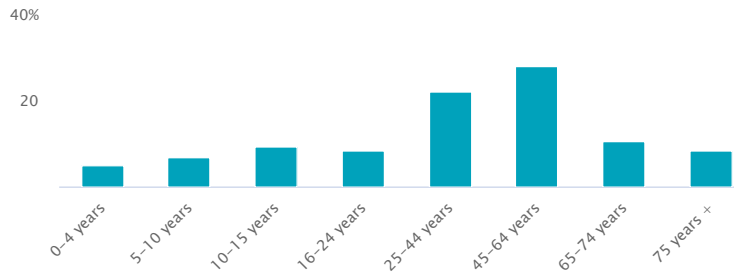

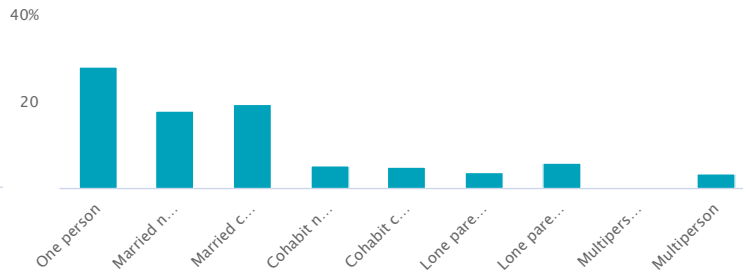

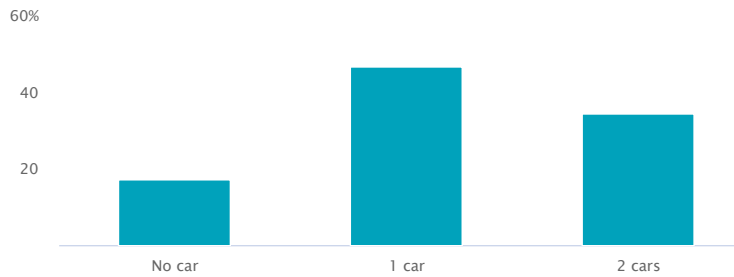

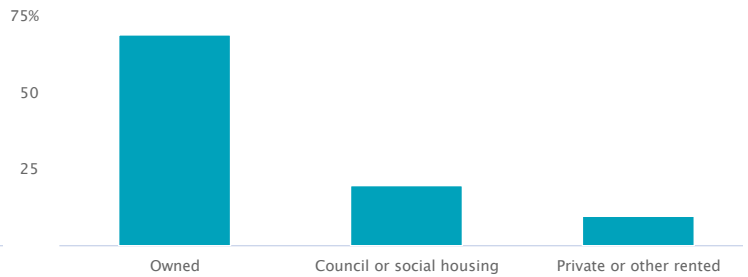

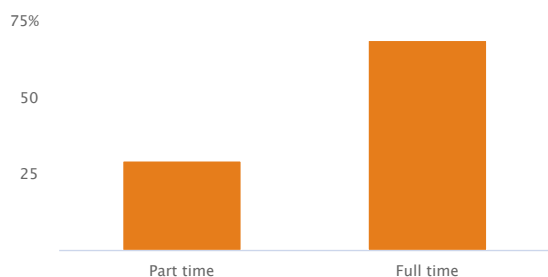

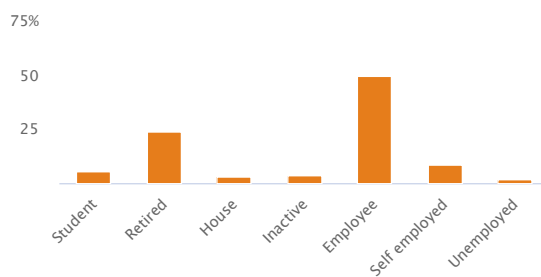
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



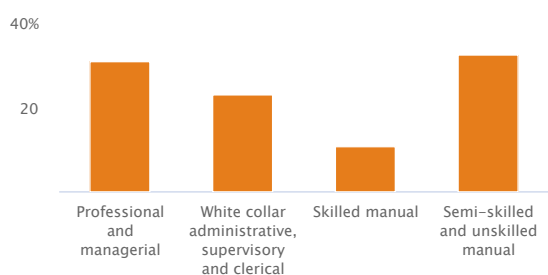
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

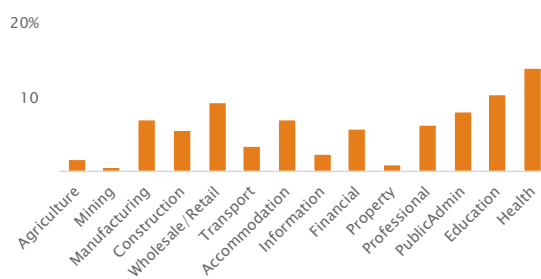

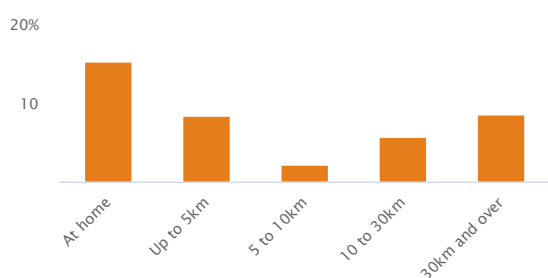
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

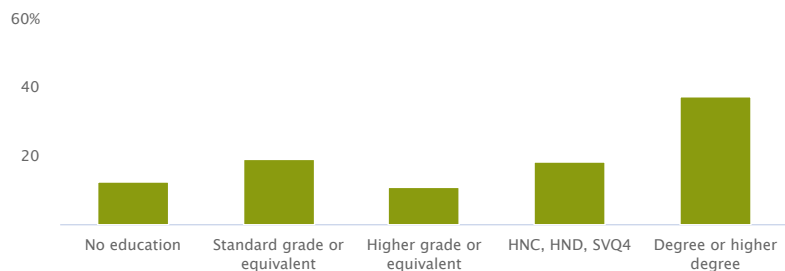


Distance travelled to work

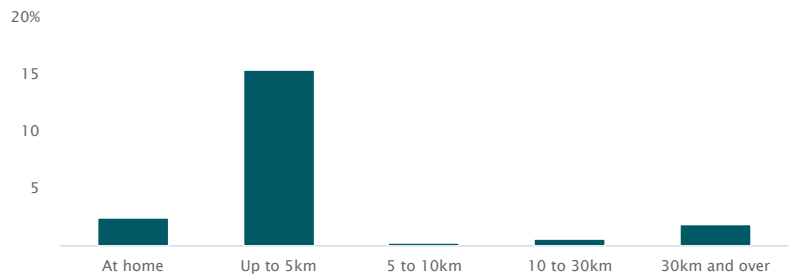
