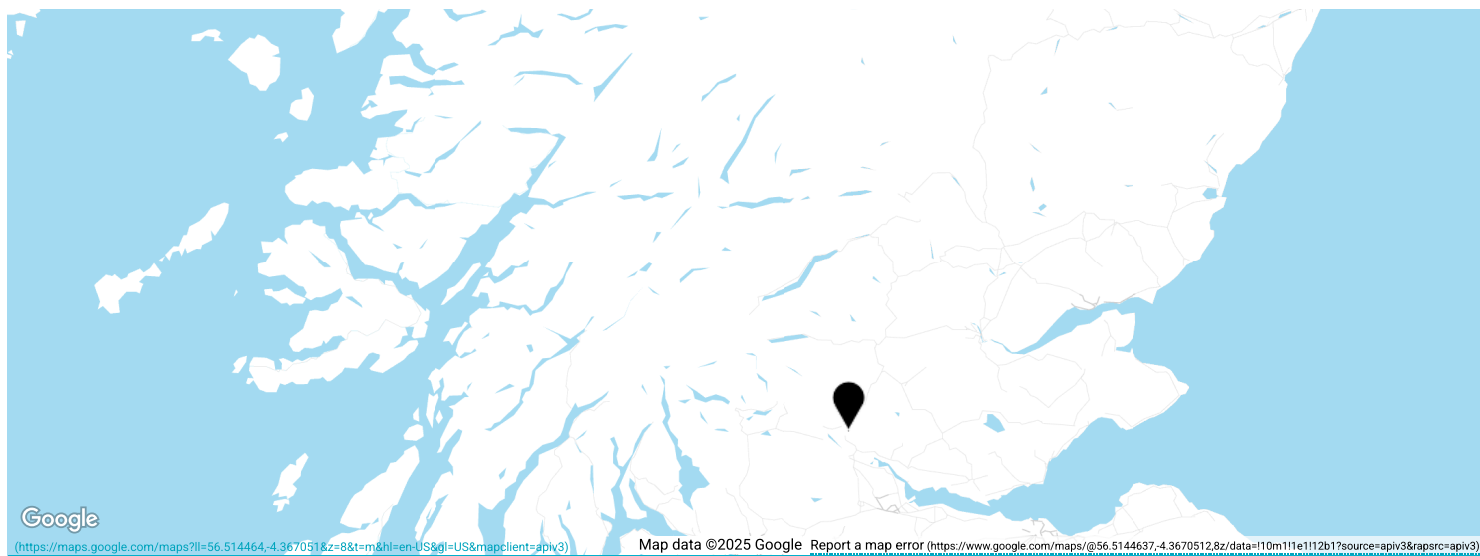

Dunblane in Stirling Council was an early burgh with church based origins from the 7th century when St Blane settled there. The Reformation saw Dunblane decline in importance although the cathedral was rebuilt in the 1890s. Today its accessible location on the railway line and close to the motorway linked to Glasgow and Edinburgh has seen it expand as a commuter settlement.

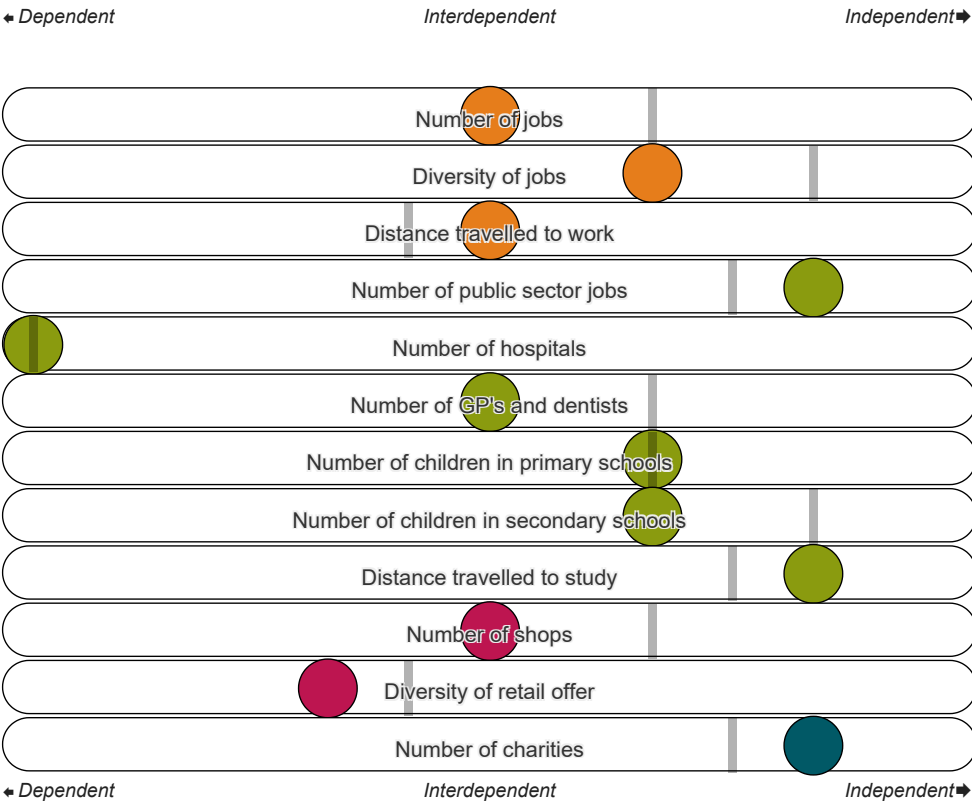
In affluent medium towns, population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Dunblane is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dunblane is grouped with 3 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

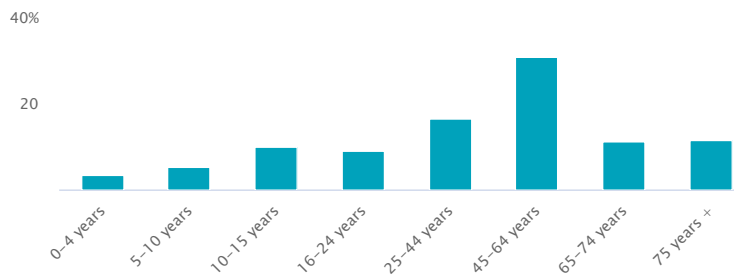

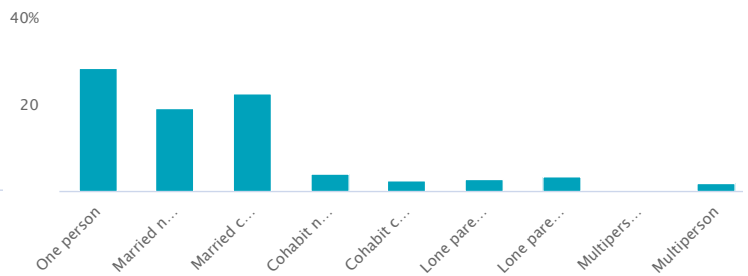

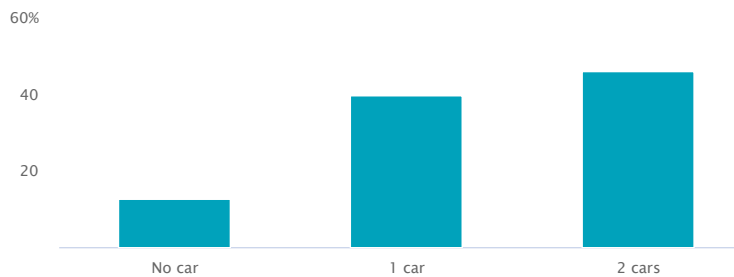

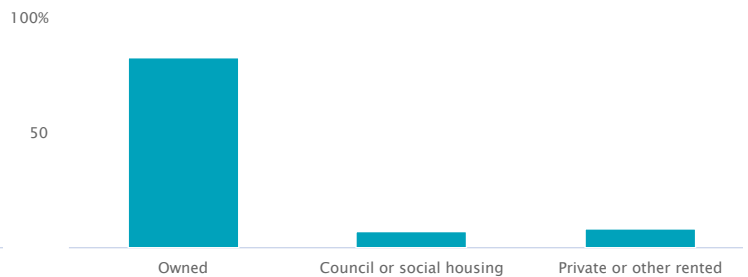

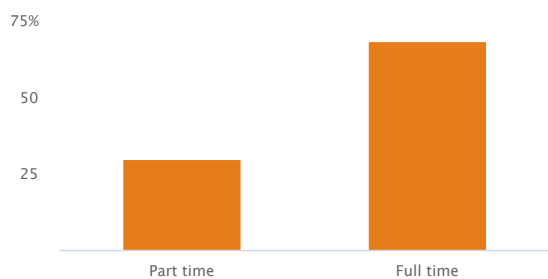

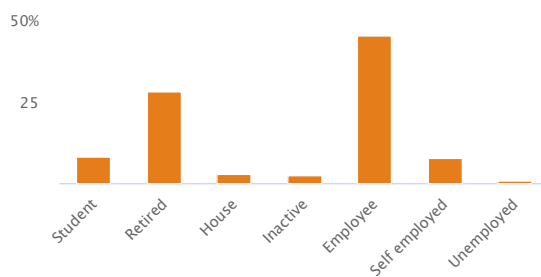
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



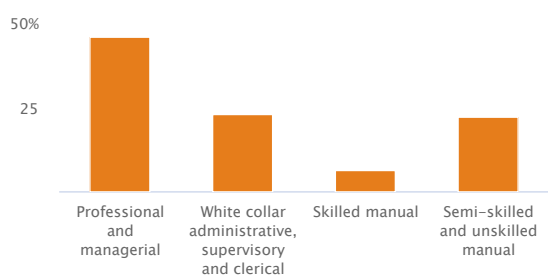
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

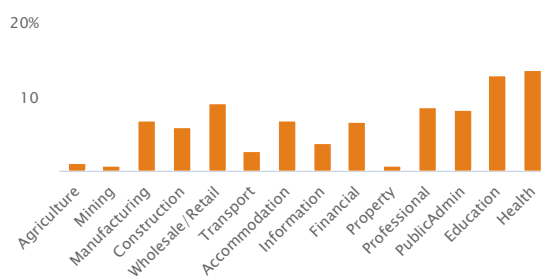


Social Grade

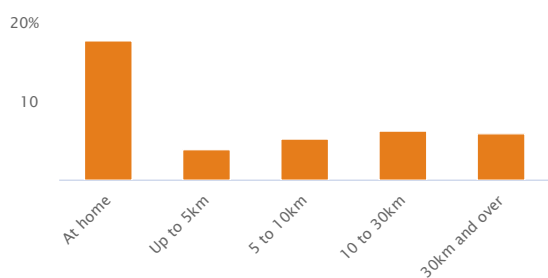
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

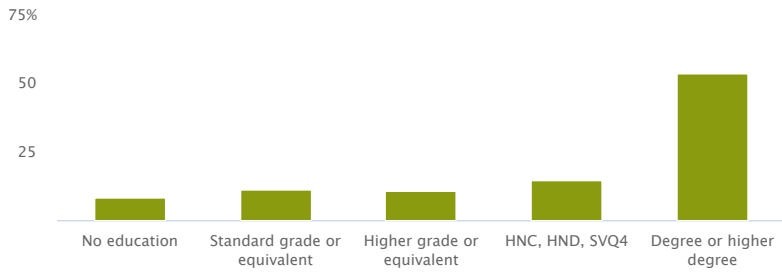


Distance travelled to work

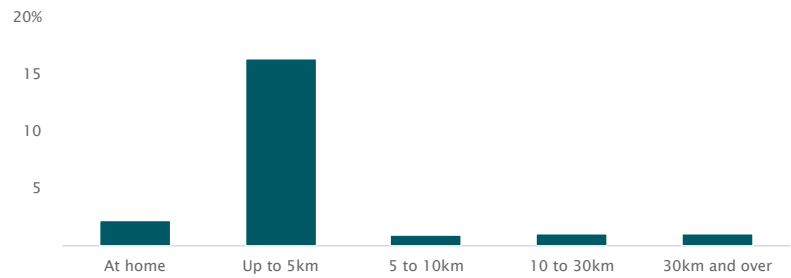
