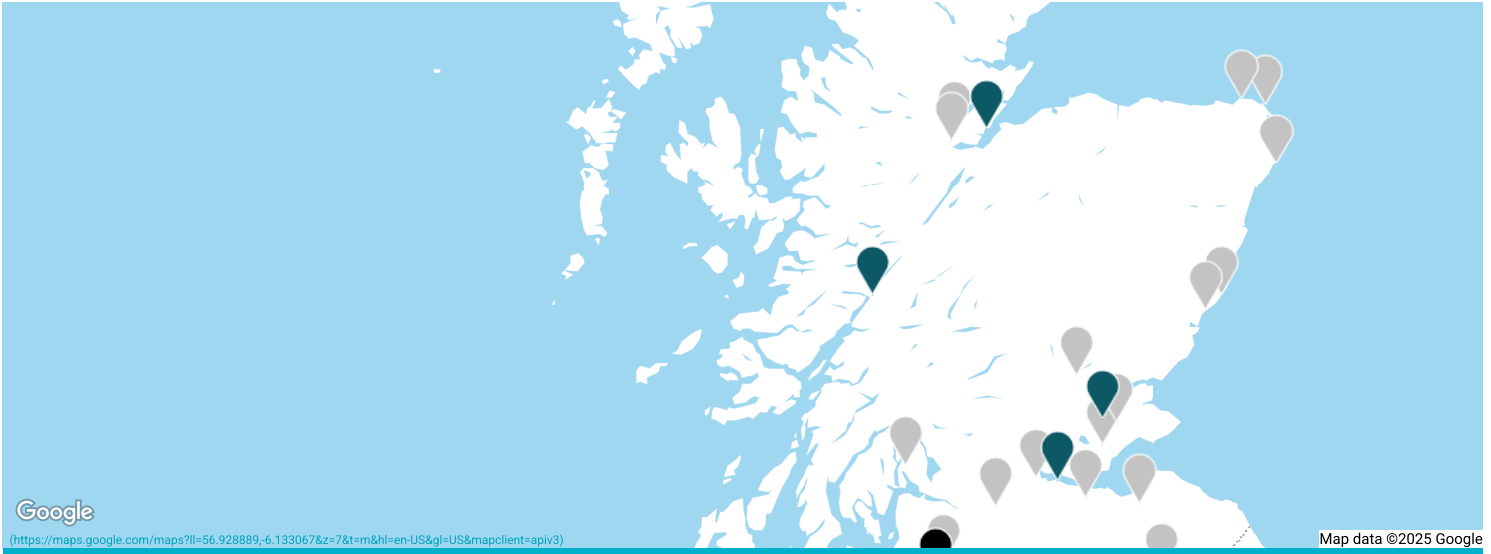




Dundonald

Dundonald in South Ayrshire was originally a weaving town, later becoming a coal mining town. Toady employment is to be found in the manufacture of nylon, quarrying and food distribution.

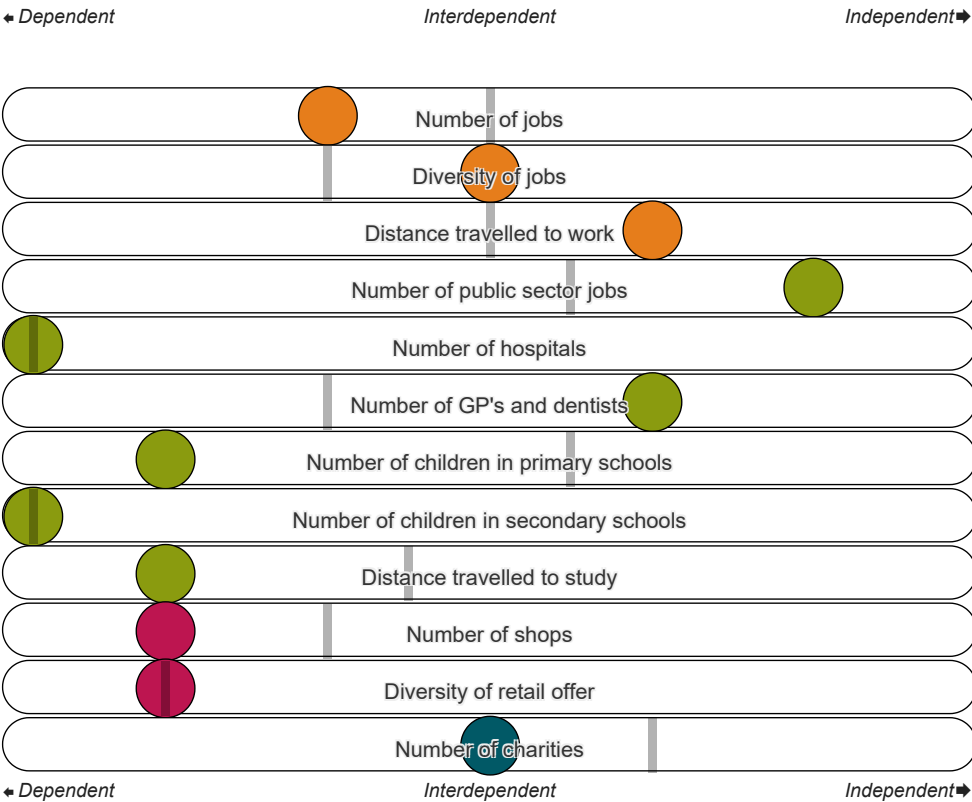
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Dundonald is an interdependent to dependent town.

Dundonald is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dundonald is grouped with 22 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. Dundonald differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

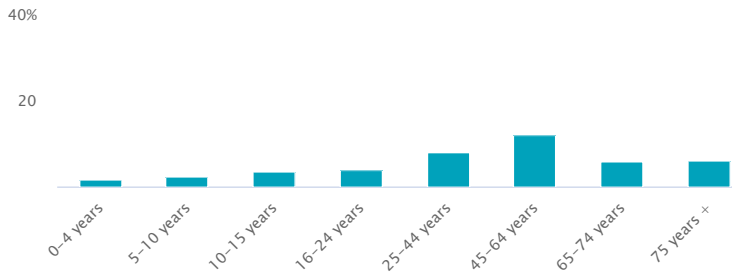

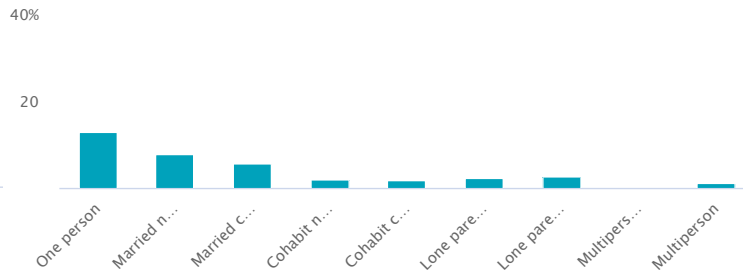

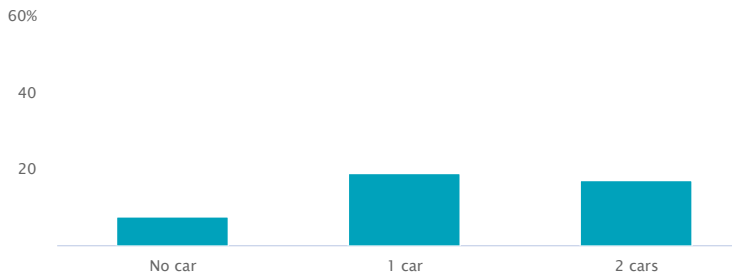

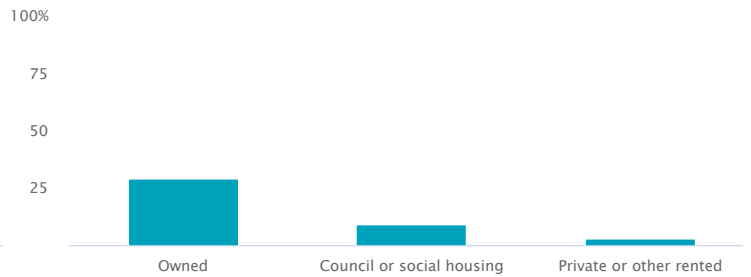

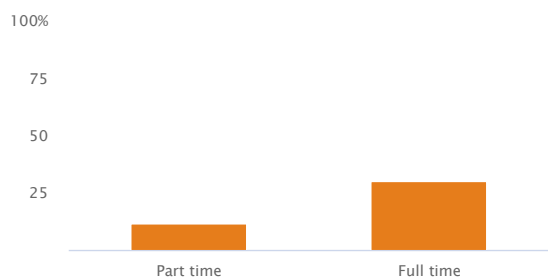

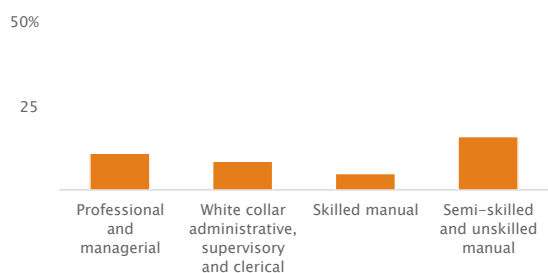
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



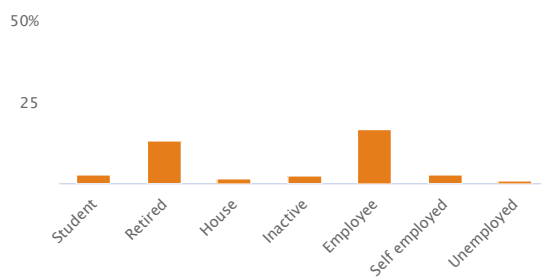
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

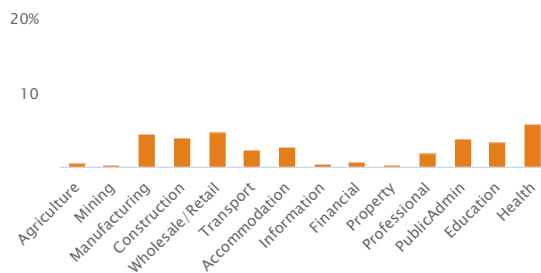

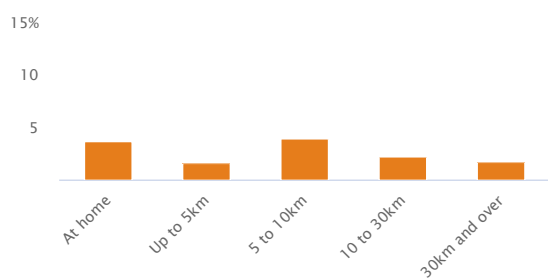

Sector Diversity

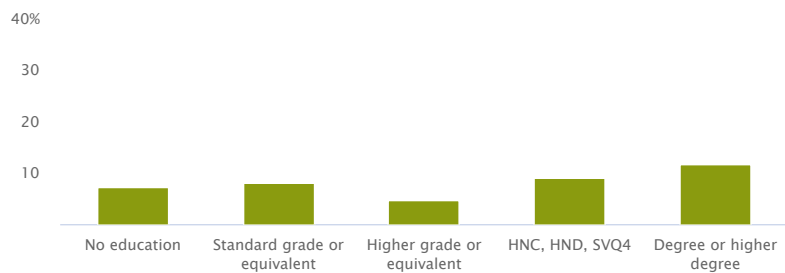


Distance travelled to work

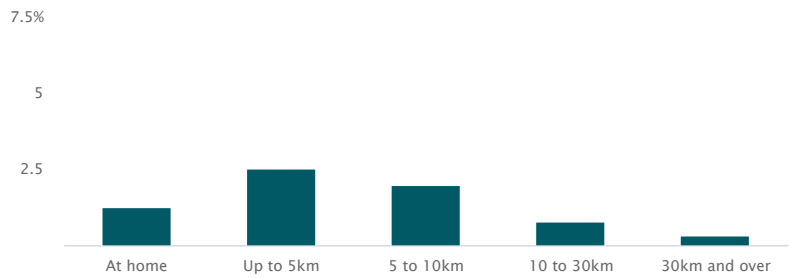
