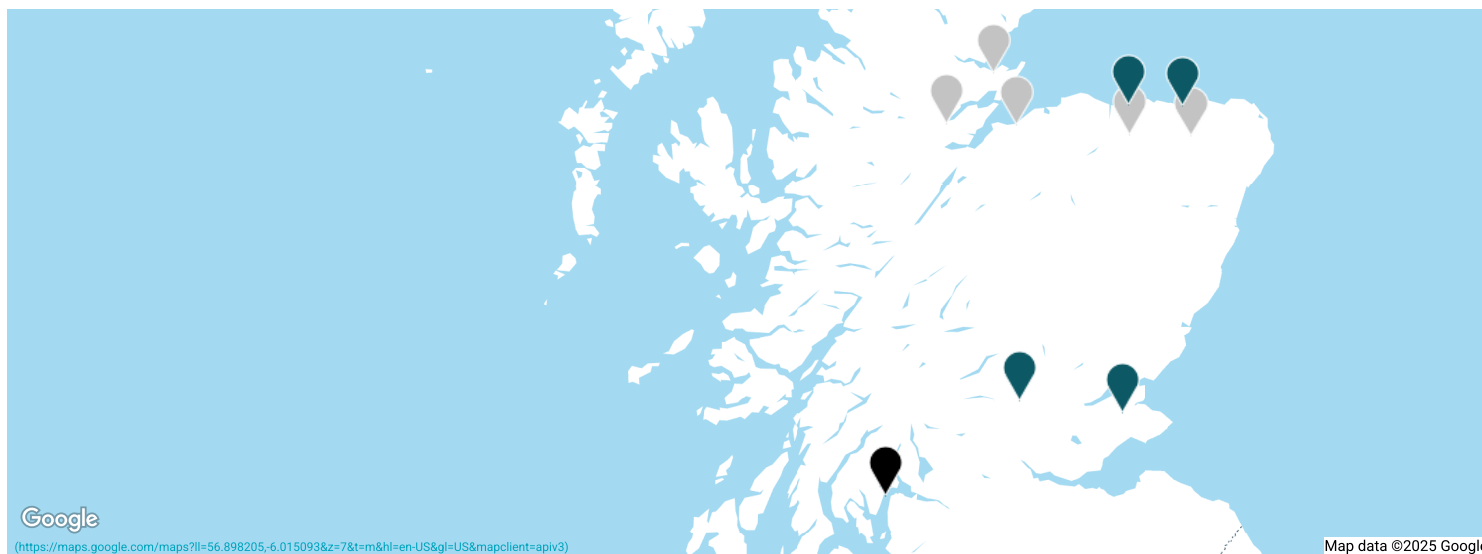




Dunoon

POPULATION **7,994**

Dunoon in Argyll and Bute is on the Cowal peninsula. It was a late 18th century planned village. In the 19th century it was a popular stopping point for Clyde cruises. From the 1960s until 1992 the US Holy Loch base brought trade to the town. Today it remains a tourist town linked by ferry to Gourock and close to the Benmore Botanic Gardens.

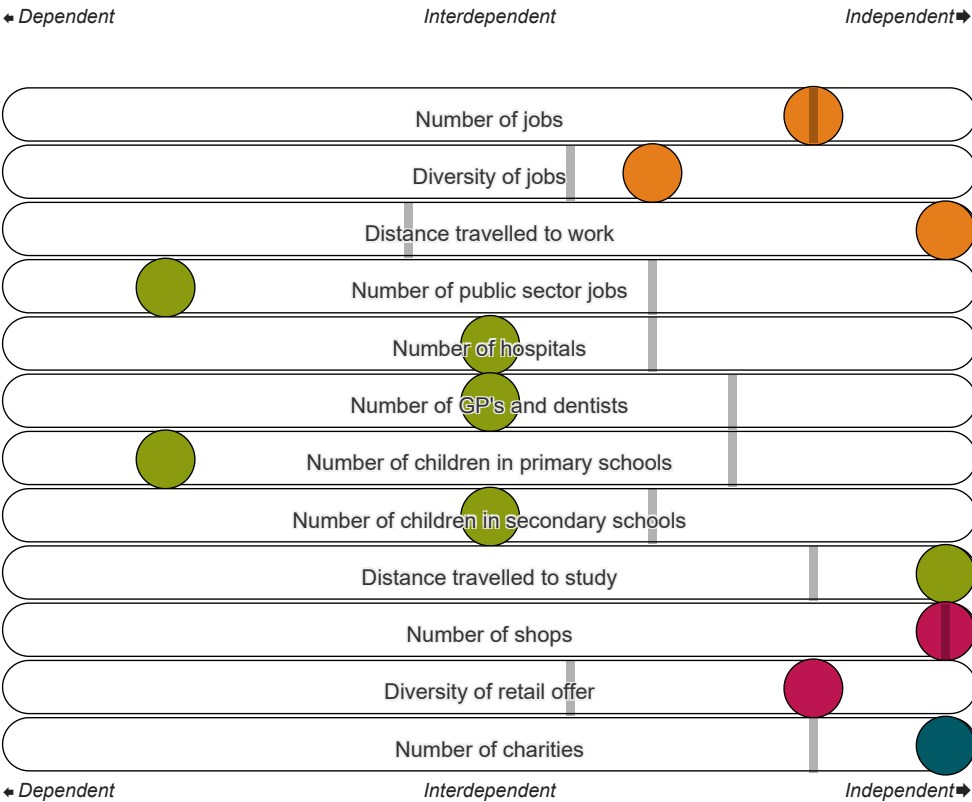
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Dunoon is an independent to interdependent town.

Dunoon is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dunoon is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, and shops. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Dunoon differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs.

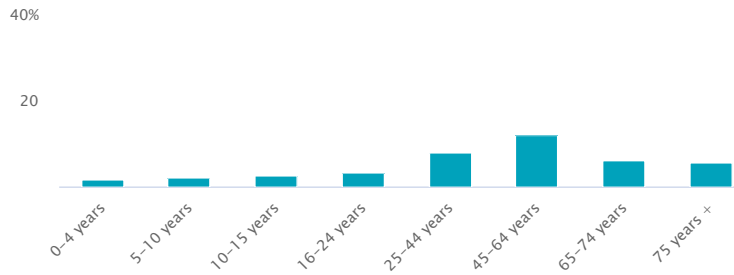

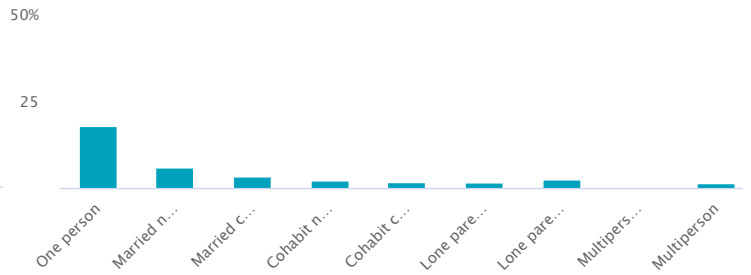

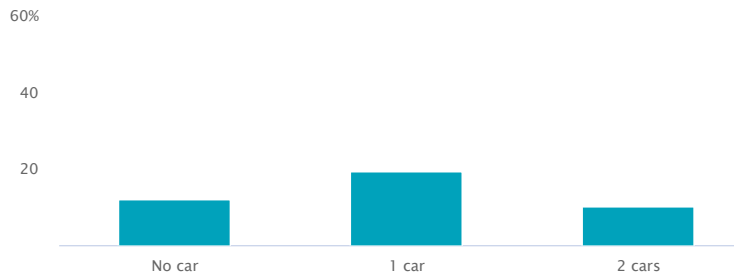

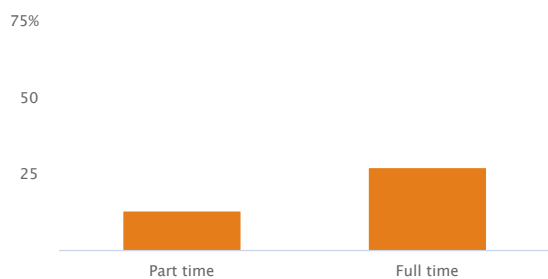

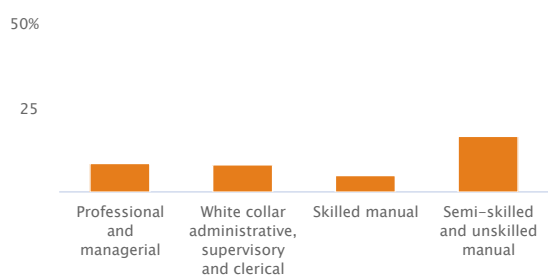
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



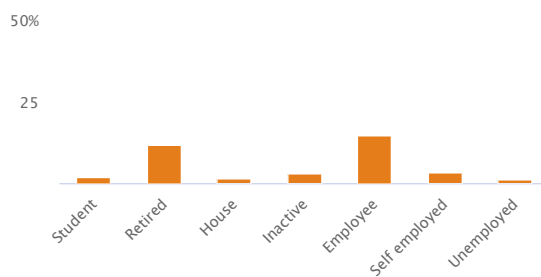
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

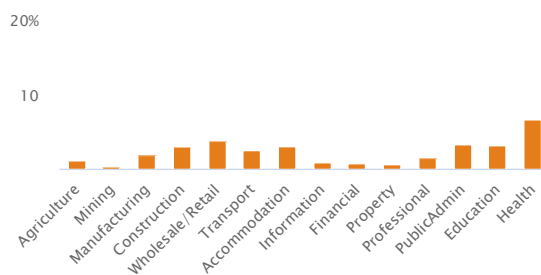

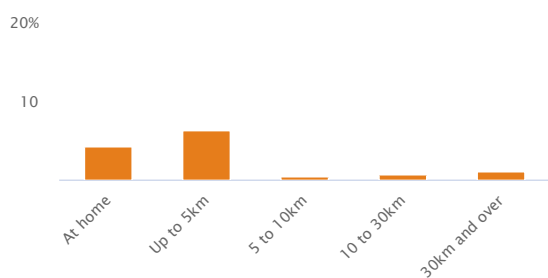

Sector Diversity

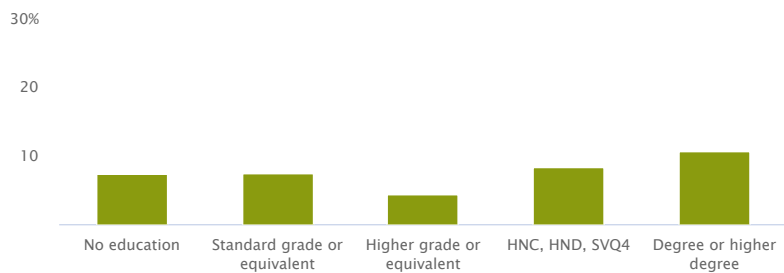


Distance travelled to work

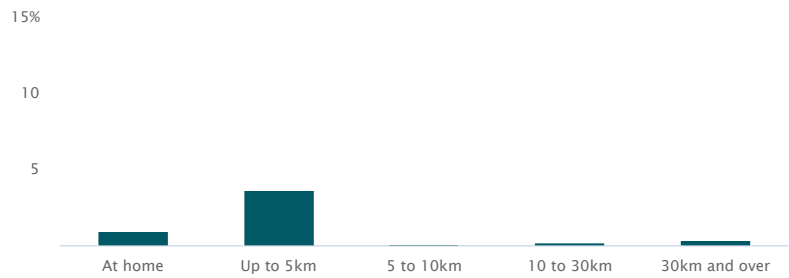
