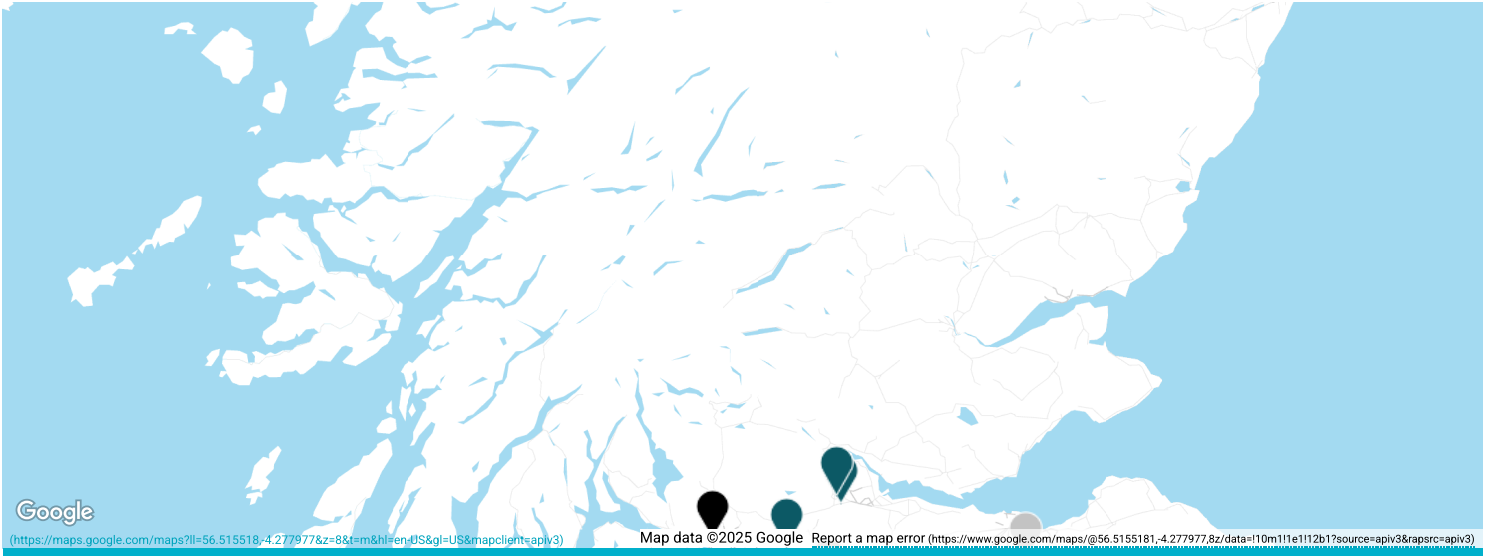




Duntocher and Hardgate

WEST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **6,562**

Duntocher and Hardgate are located in West Dunbartonshire. Located on the Antonine Wall the settlement has Roman origins. However it grew in the 18th and 19th century when woollen mills were established. In the 1930s public housing was built to house workers for Clydebank. It is now a residential suburb of Glasgow.

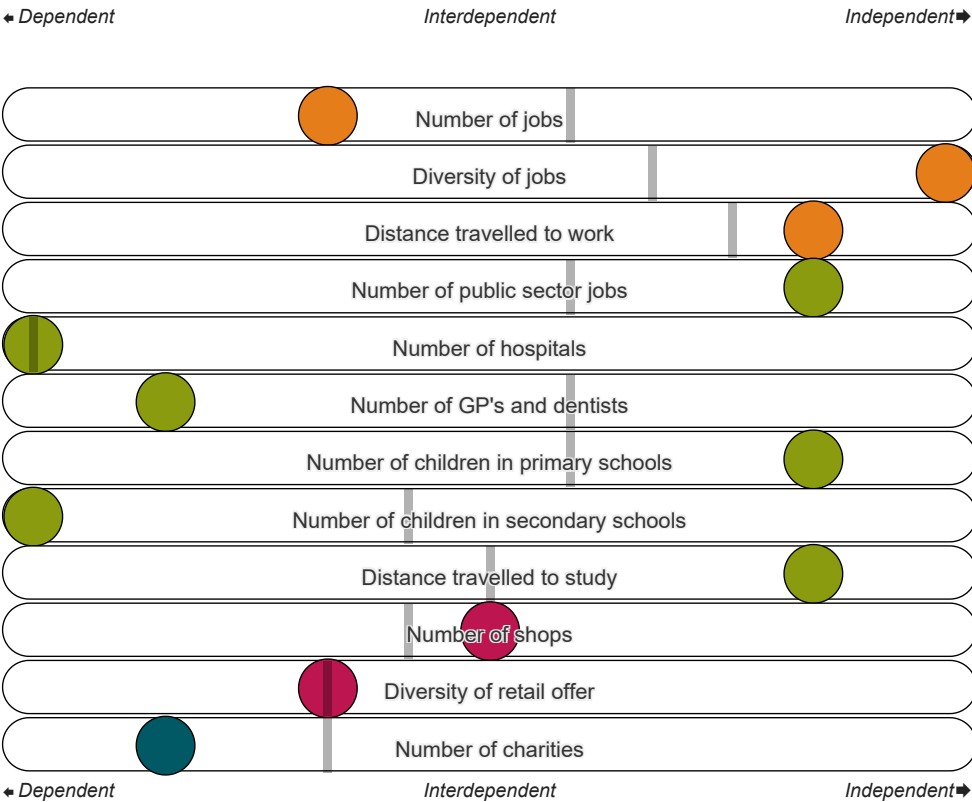
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Duntocher and Hardgate is an interdependent town.

Duntocher and Hardgate is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Duntocher and Hardgate is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study. Duntocher and Hardgate differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools.

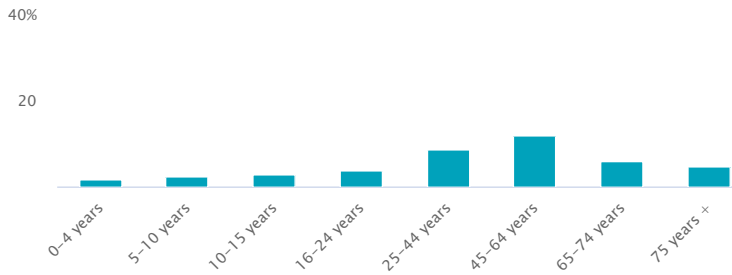

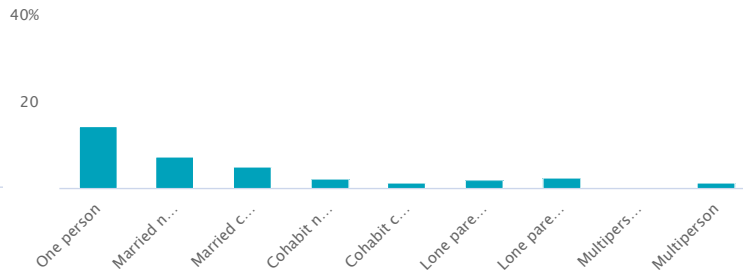

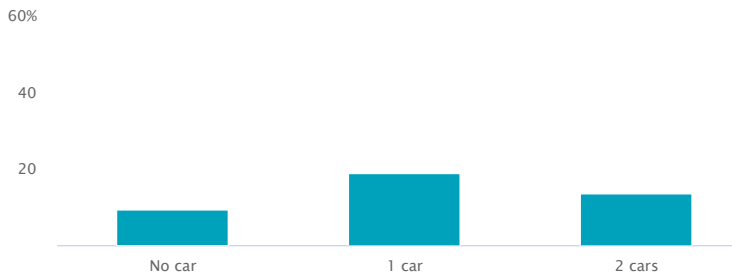

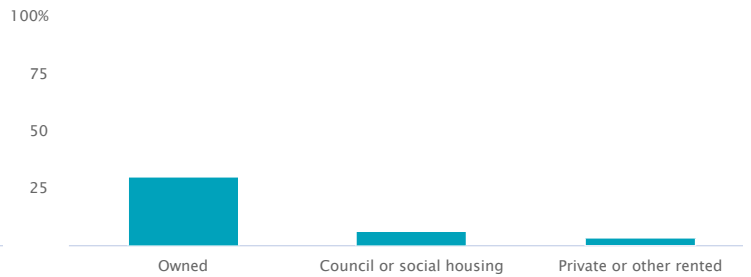

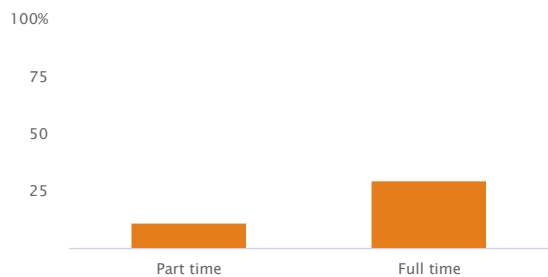

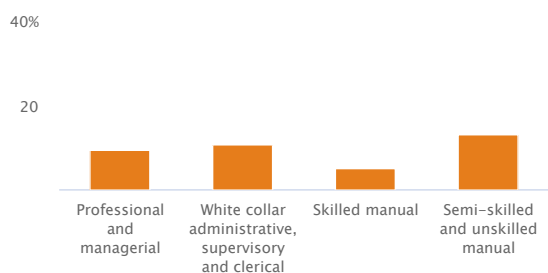
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



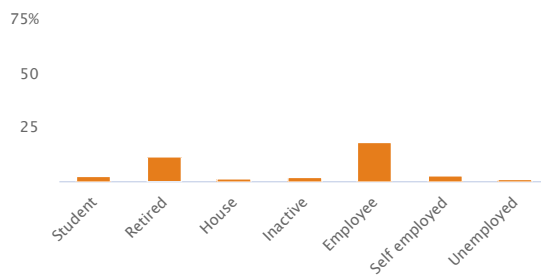
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

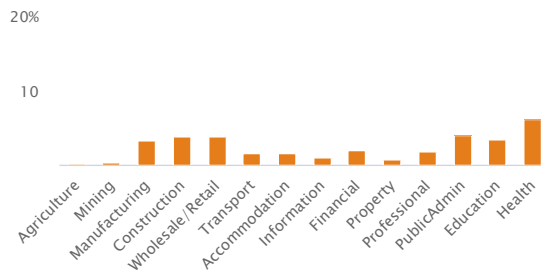

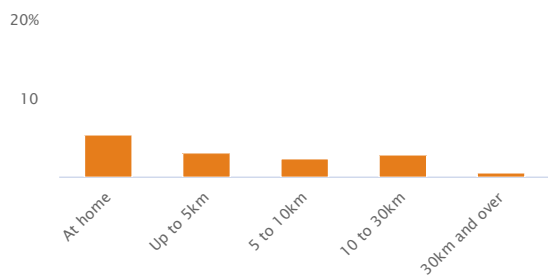

Sector Diversity

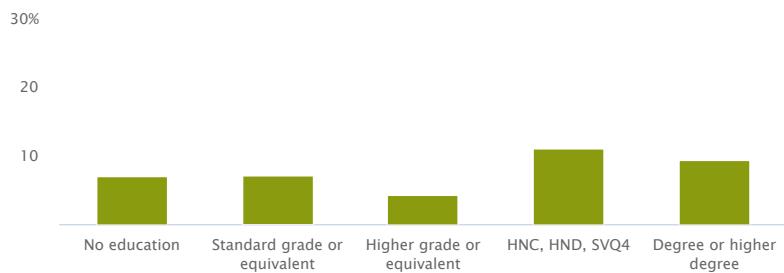


Distance travelled to work

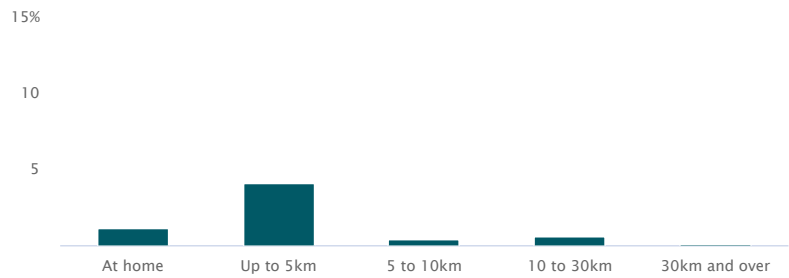
