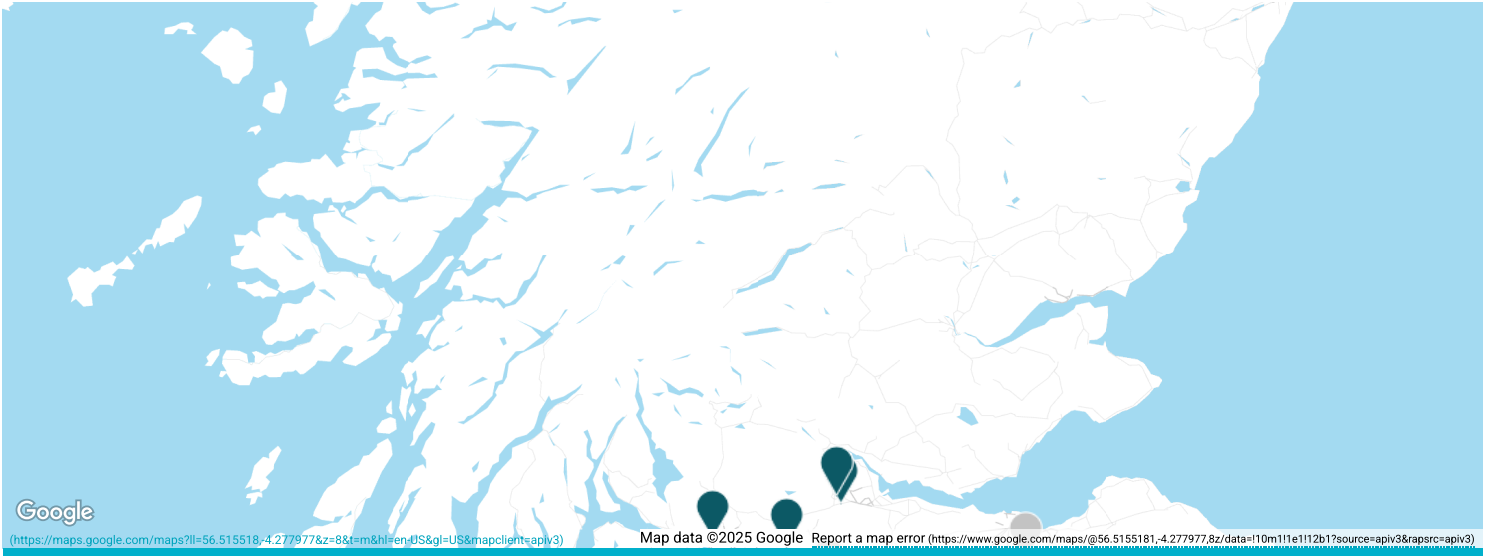




Dyce

Dyce is in Aberdeen City council area. Its original raison d'etre was a transport junction on the railway and later the site of Aberdeen airport. New industries have sprung up including oil related industries, food processing and engineering. It is adjacent to Aberdeen airport.

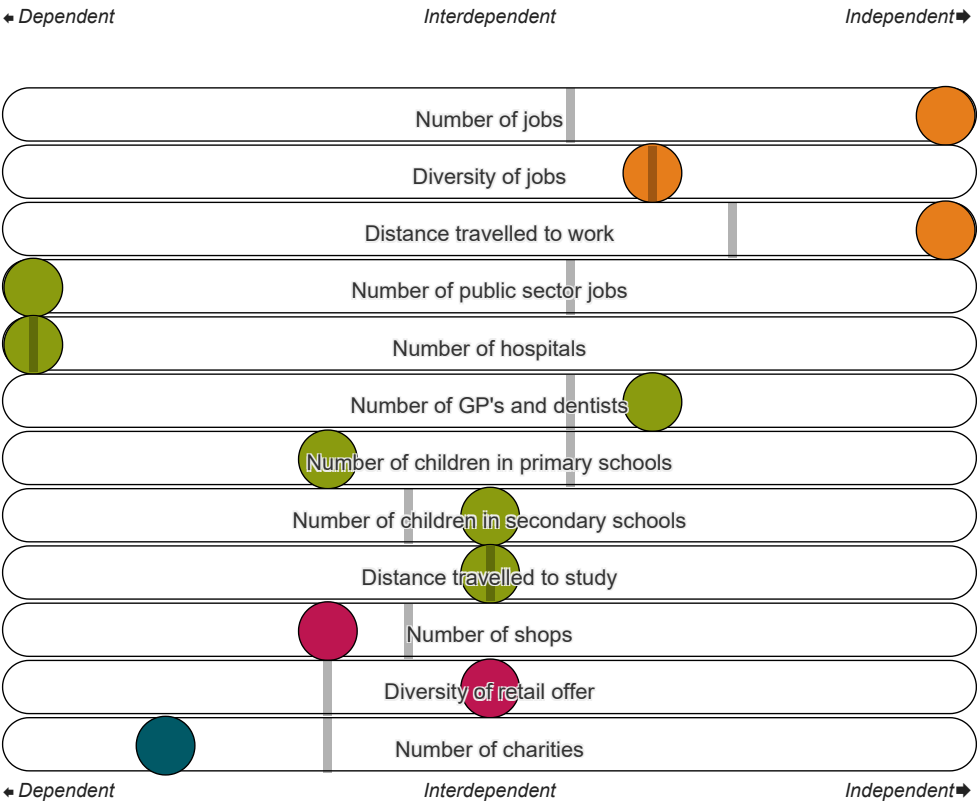
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Dyce is an interdependent town.

Dyce is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dyce is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Dyce differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

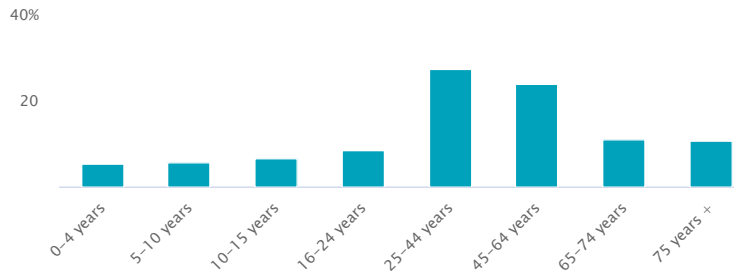

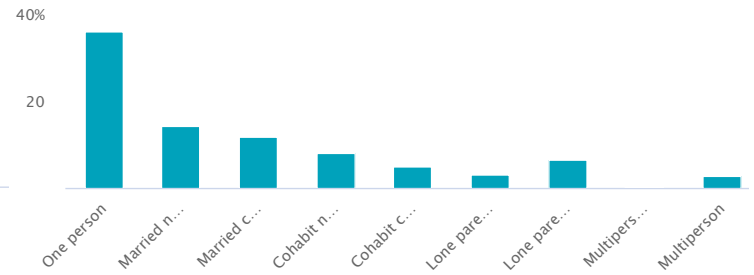

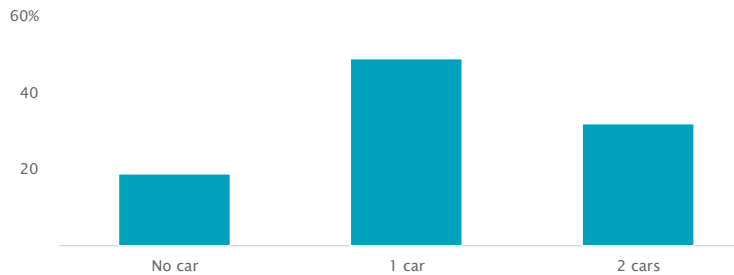

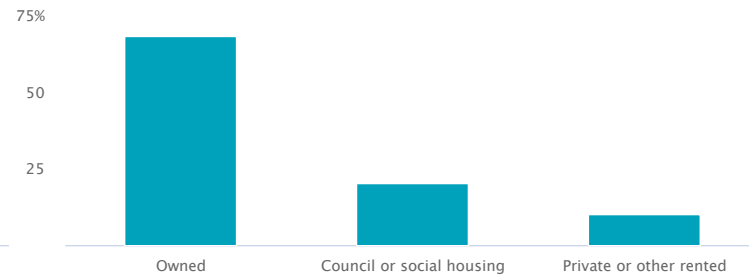

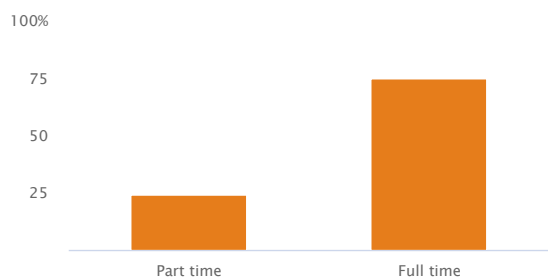

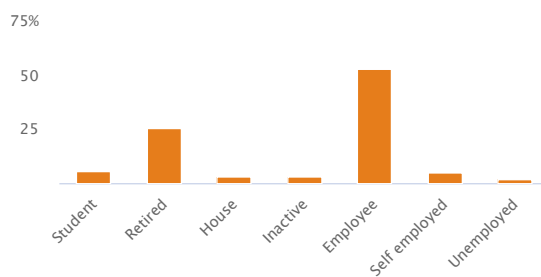
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



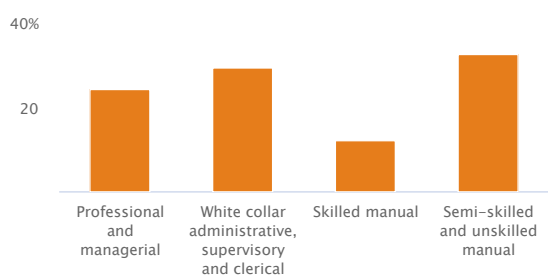
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

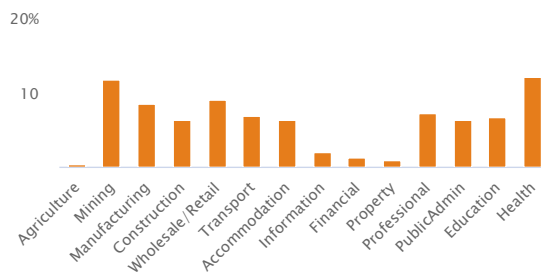


Social Grade

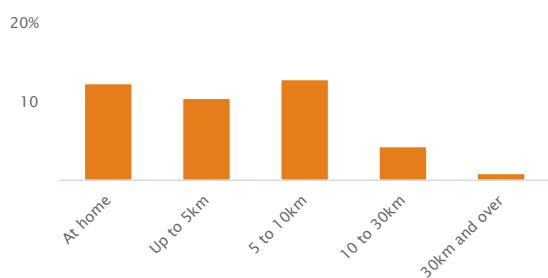
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

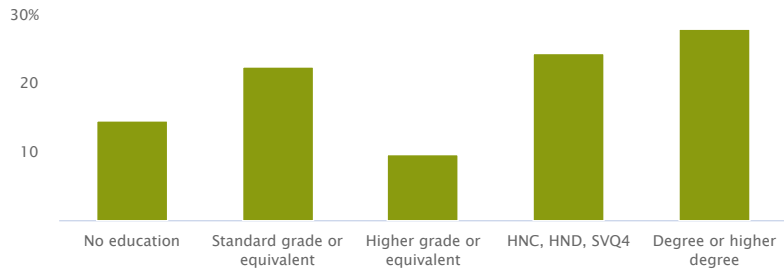


Distance travelled to work

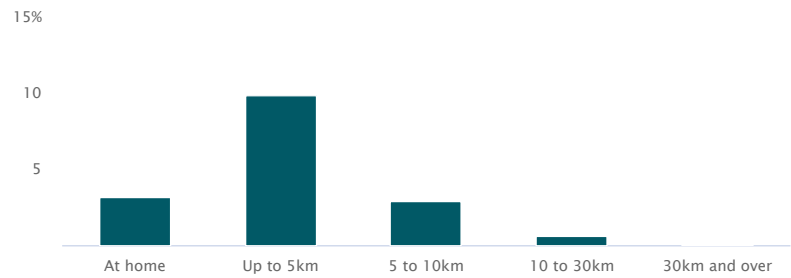
