Earlston is in Scottish Borders. It is a 16th century town which served the local agricultural area. It is a local market town.

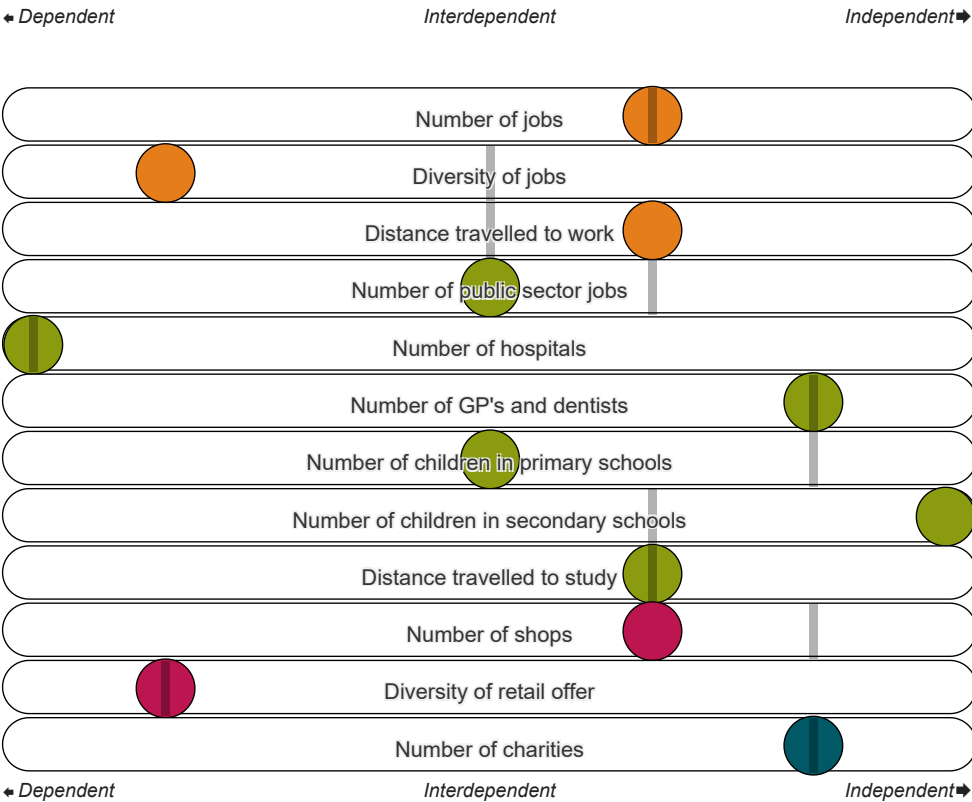
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Earlston is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Earlston is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and children in secondary schools. Earlston differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

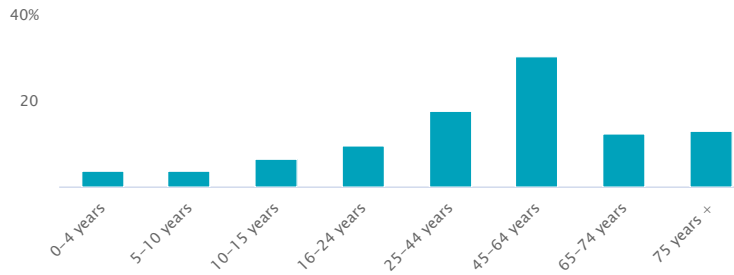

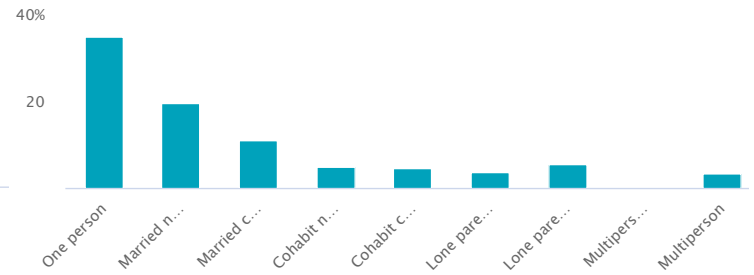

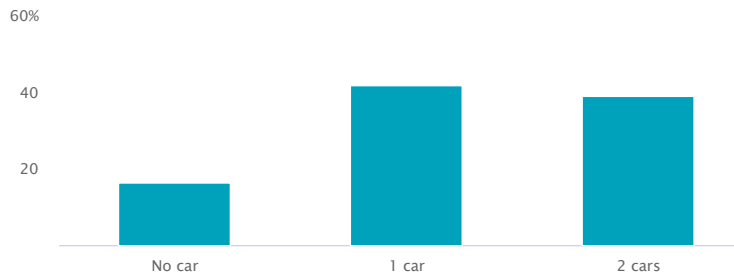

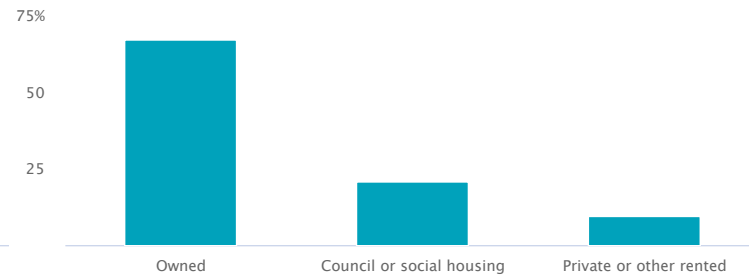
Household composition

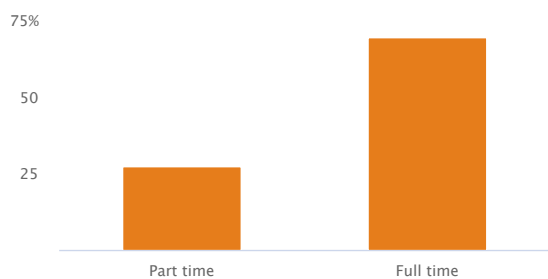

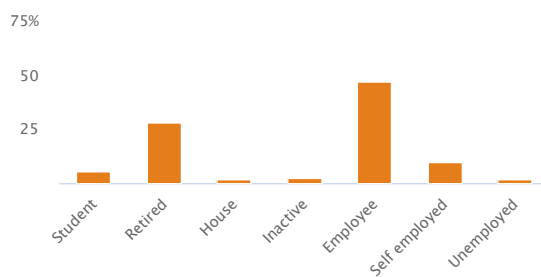
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



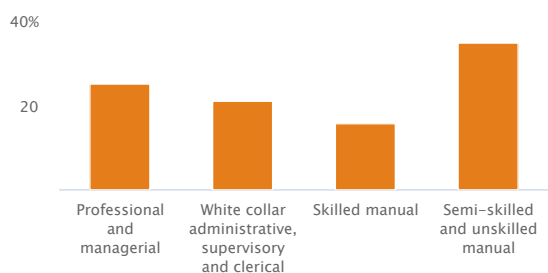
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

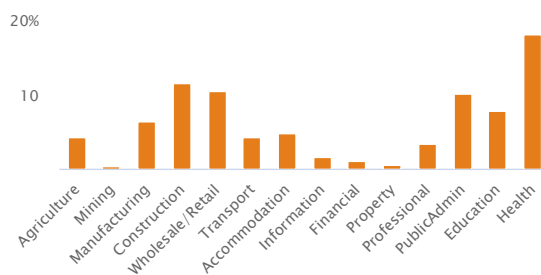

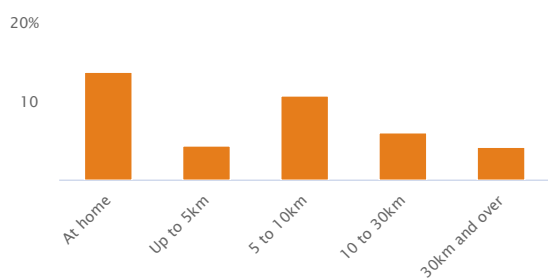
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

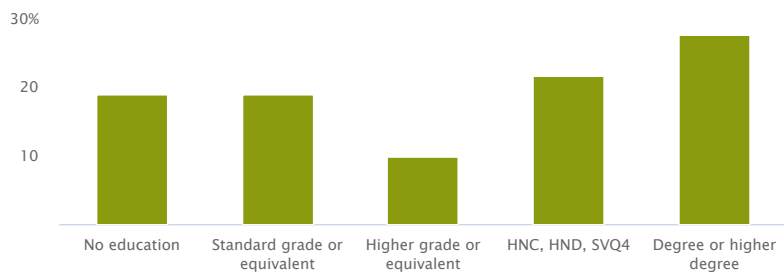


Distance travelled to work

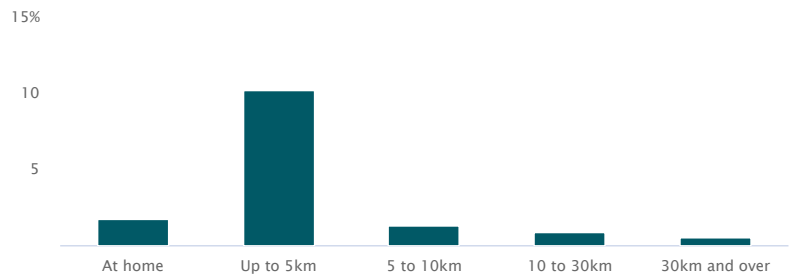
