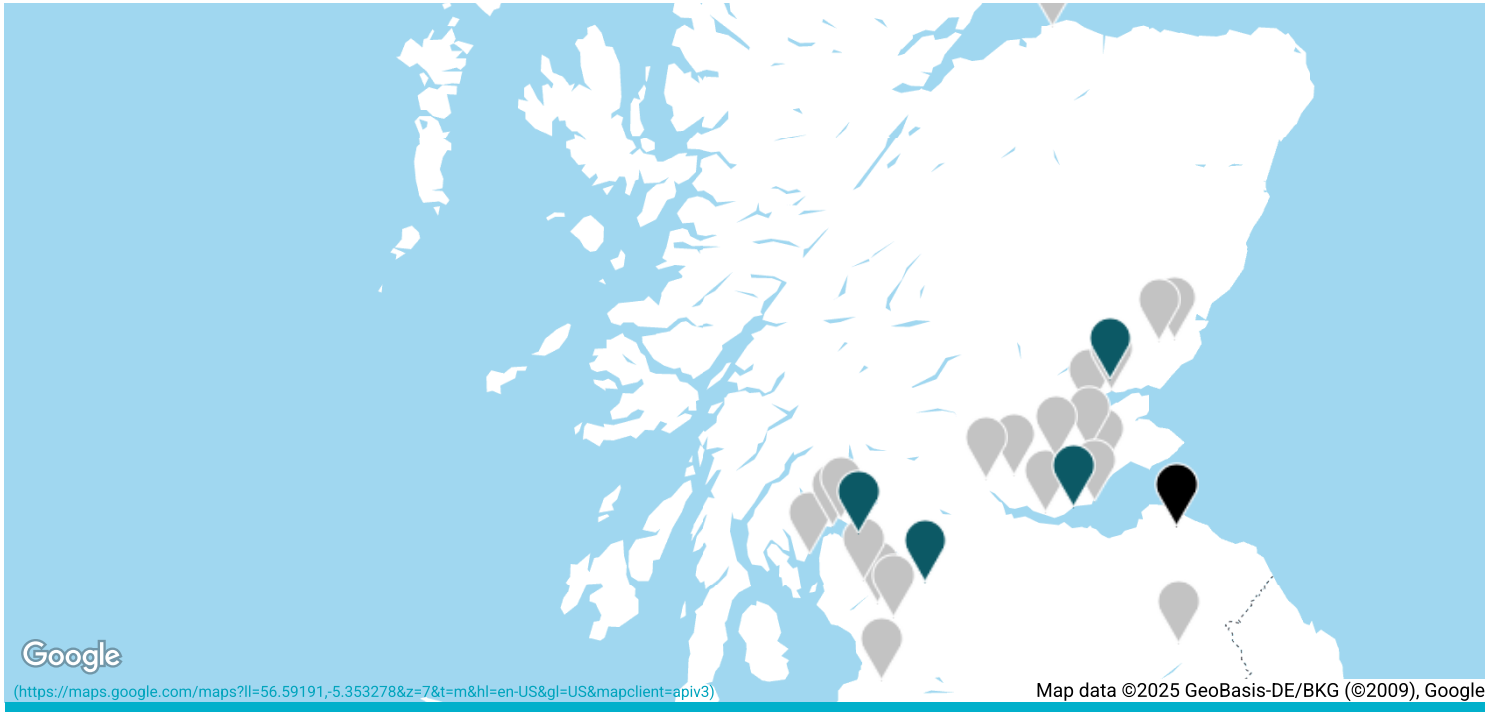




East Linton

East Linton is in East Lothian. At the bridging point on the Tyne the town became a staging post and market town. It was known for its agricultural trade with cattle and grain markets. Today it is bypassed by the A1 and it remains a rural service centre.

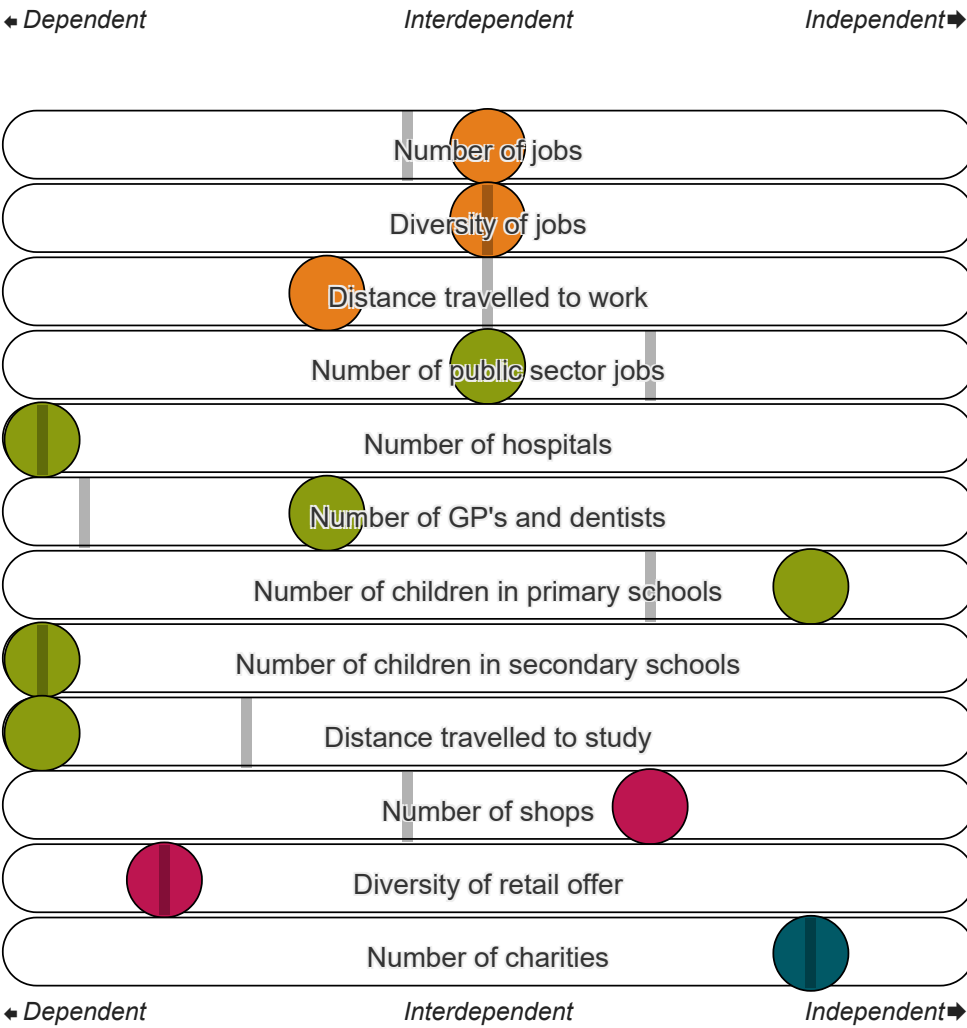
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

East Linton is an interdependent to dependent town.

East Linton is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, East Linton is grouped with 24 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

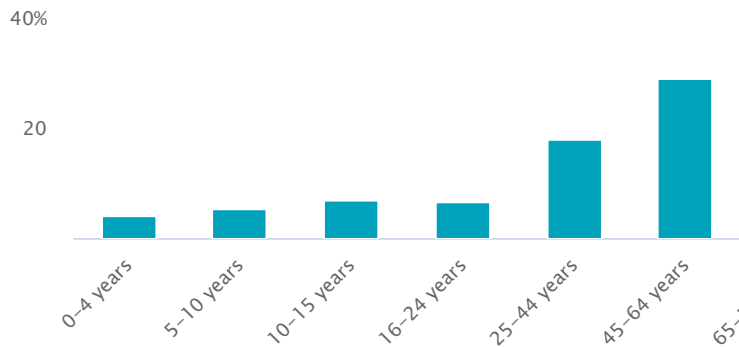

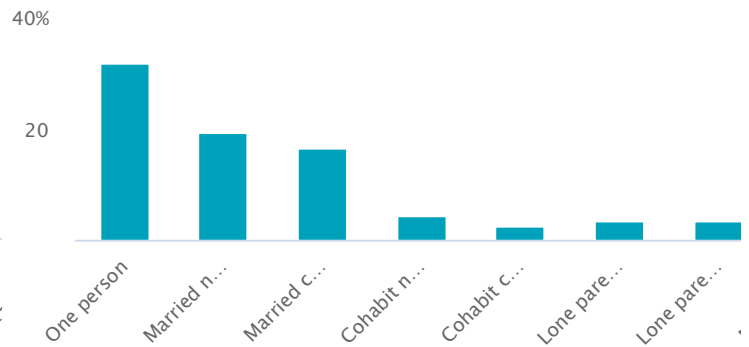

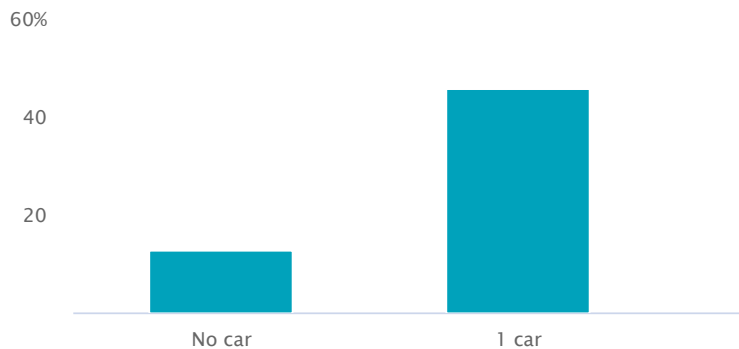

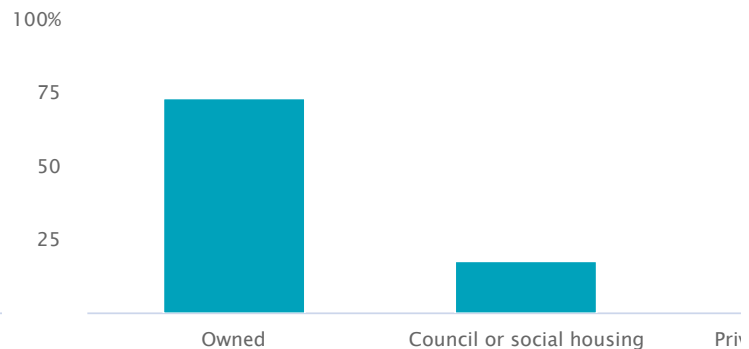

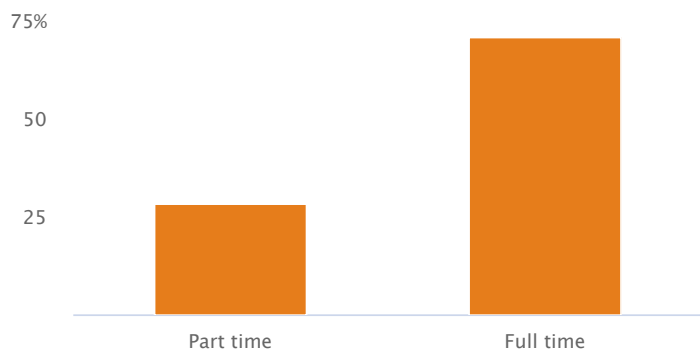

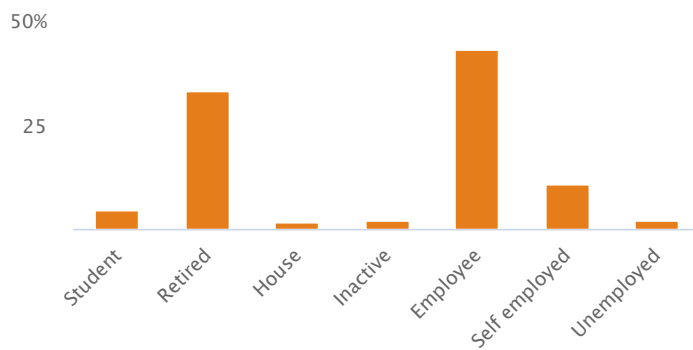
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



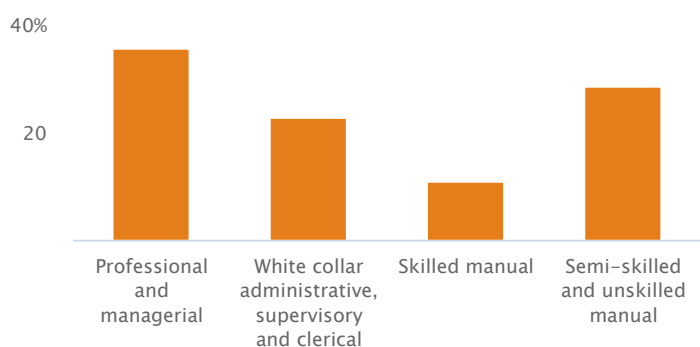
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

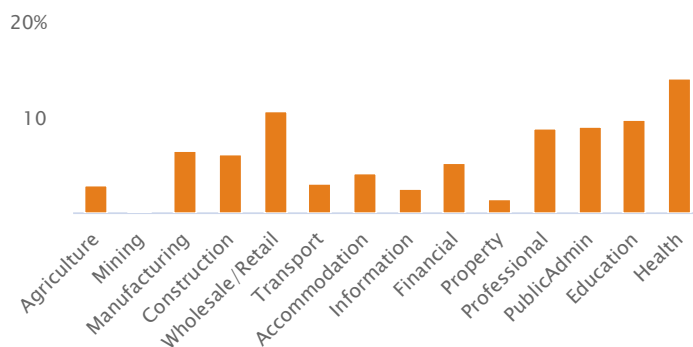


Social Grade

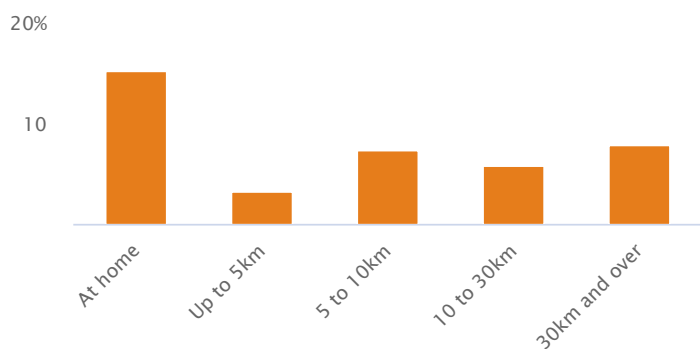
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

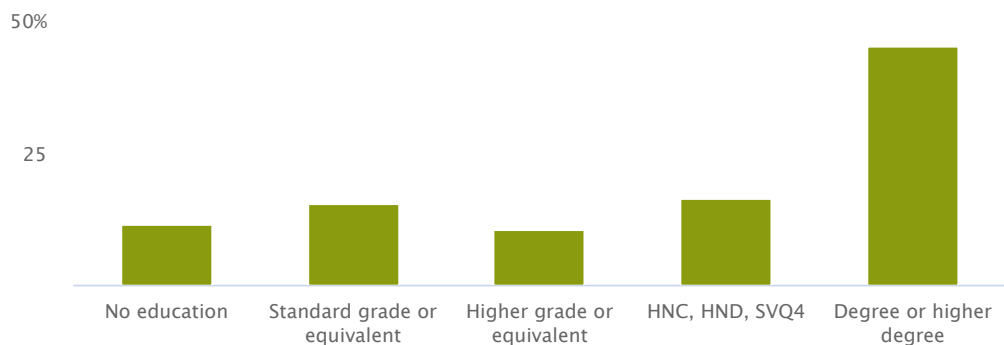


Distance travelled to work

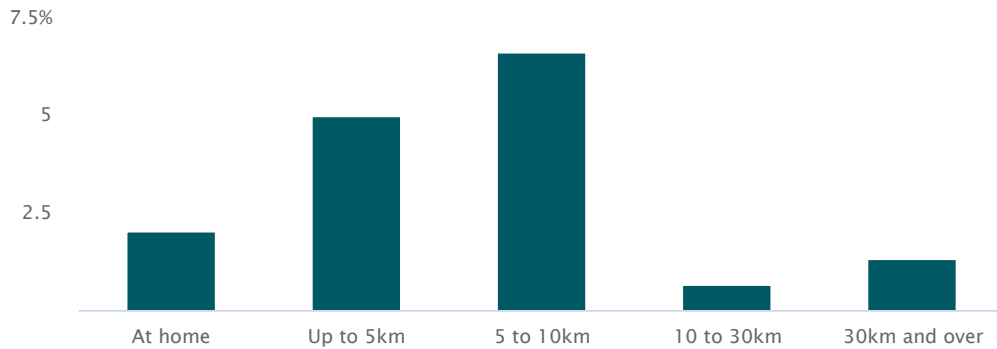
