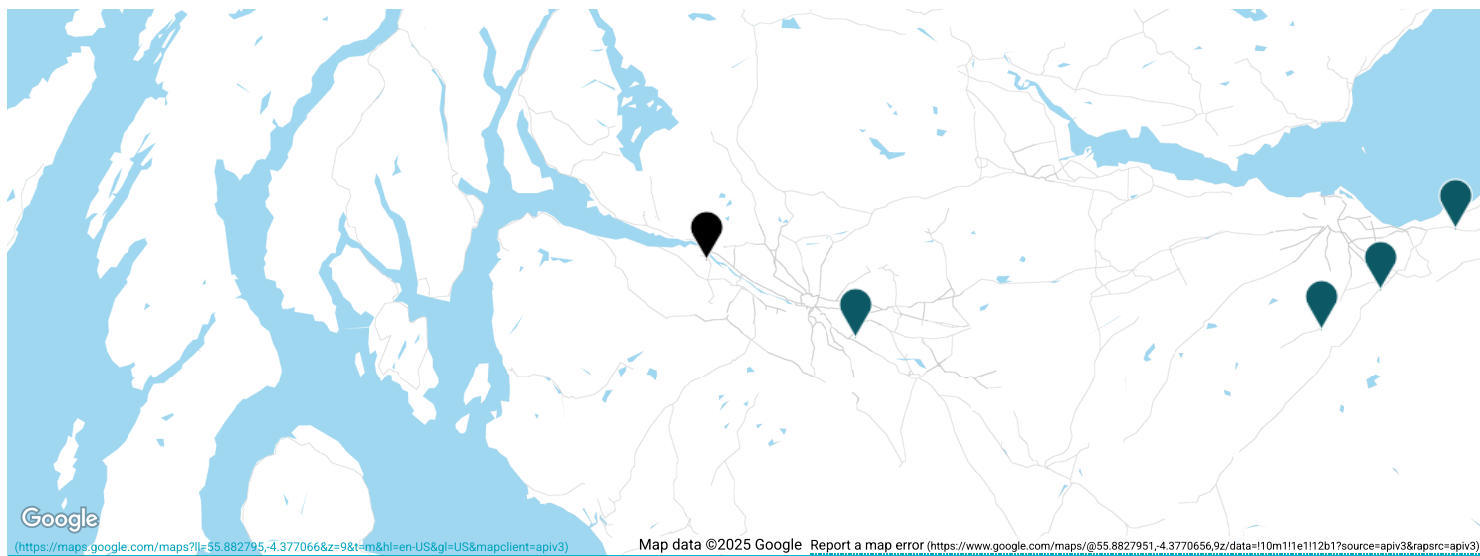




Erskine

Erskine was developed in the 1970s to provide post war public housing for Glasgow overspill. Since then considerable private housing development has taken place. It is a commuter settlement. Local services exist and some limited employment (call centre and logistics). The town used to be associated with Erskine Hospital (now closed) which was a hospital for ex-servicemen.

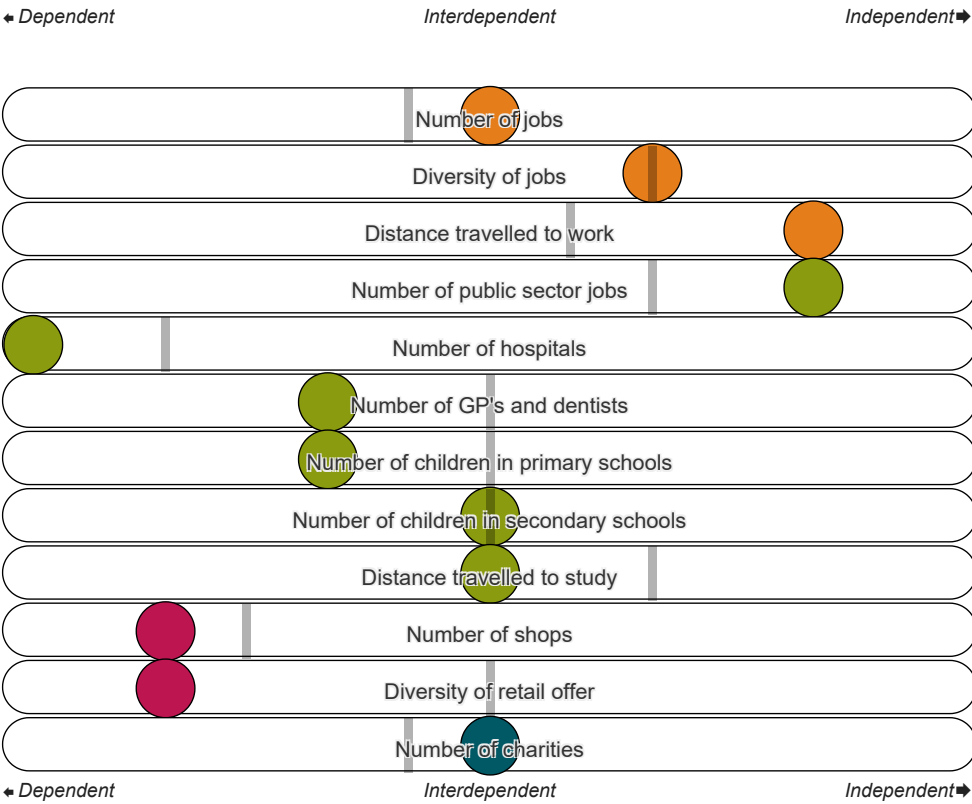
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Erskine is an interdependent town.

Erskine is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Erskine is grouped with 4 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

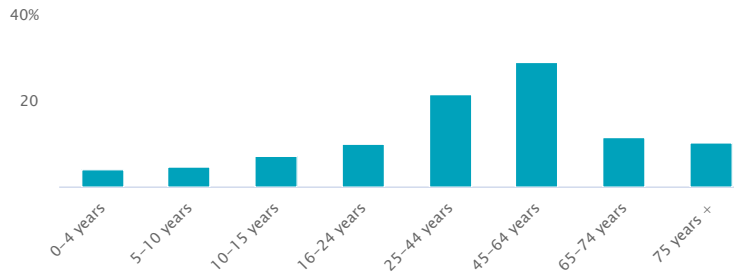

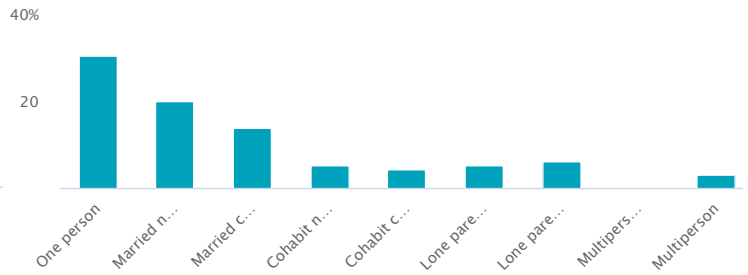

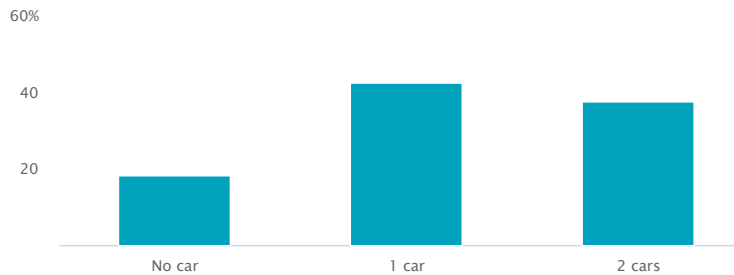

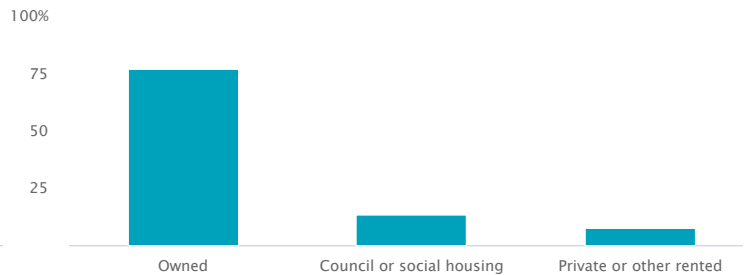
Household composition

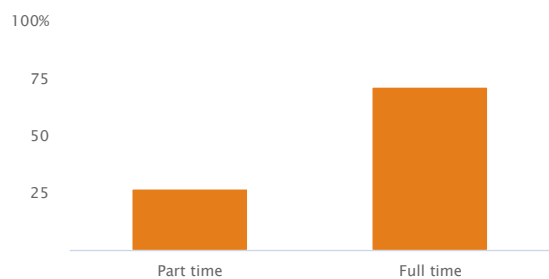

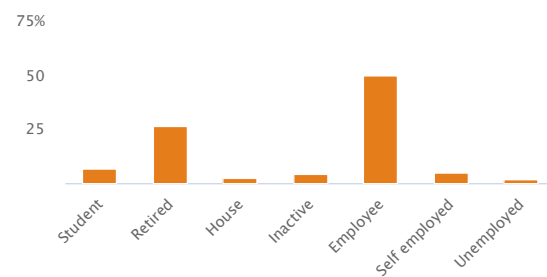
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



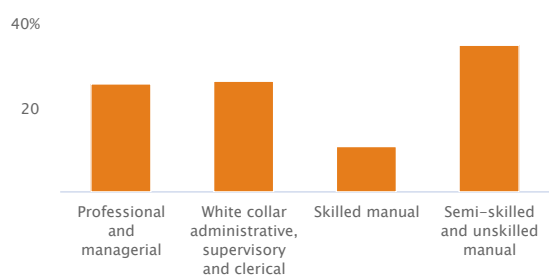
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

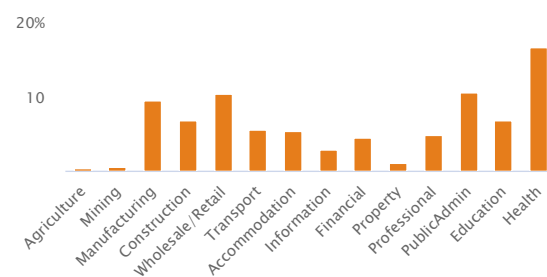

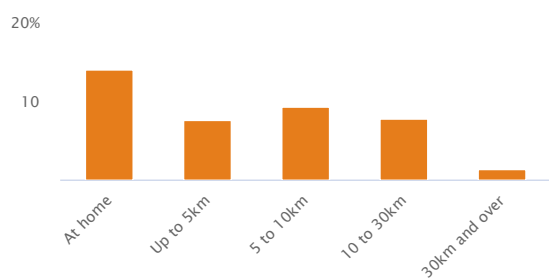
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

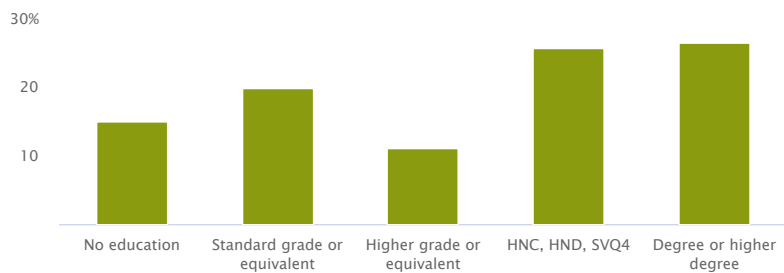


Distance travelled to work

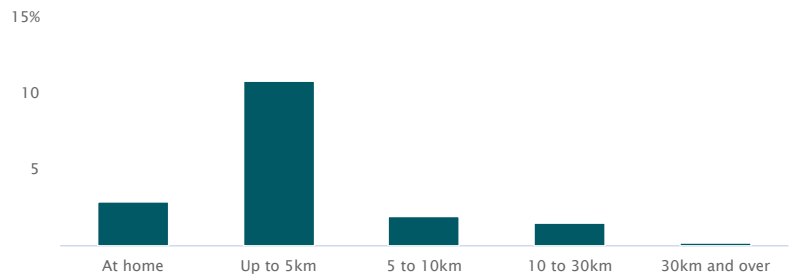
