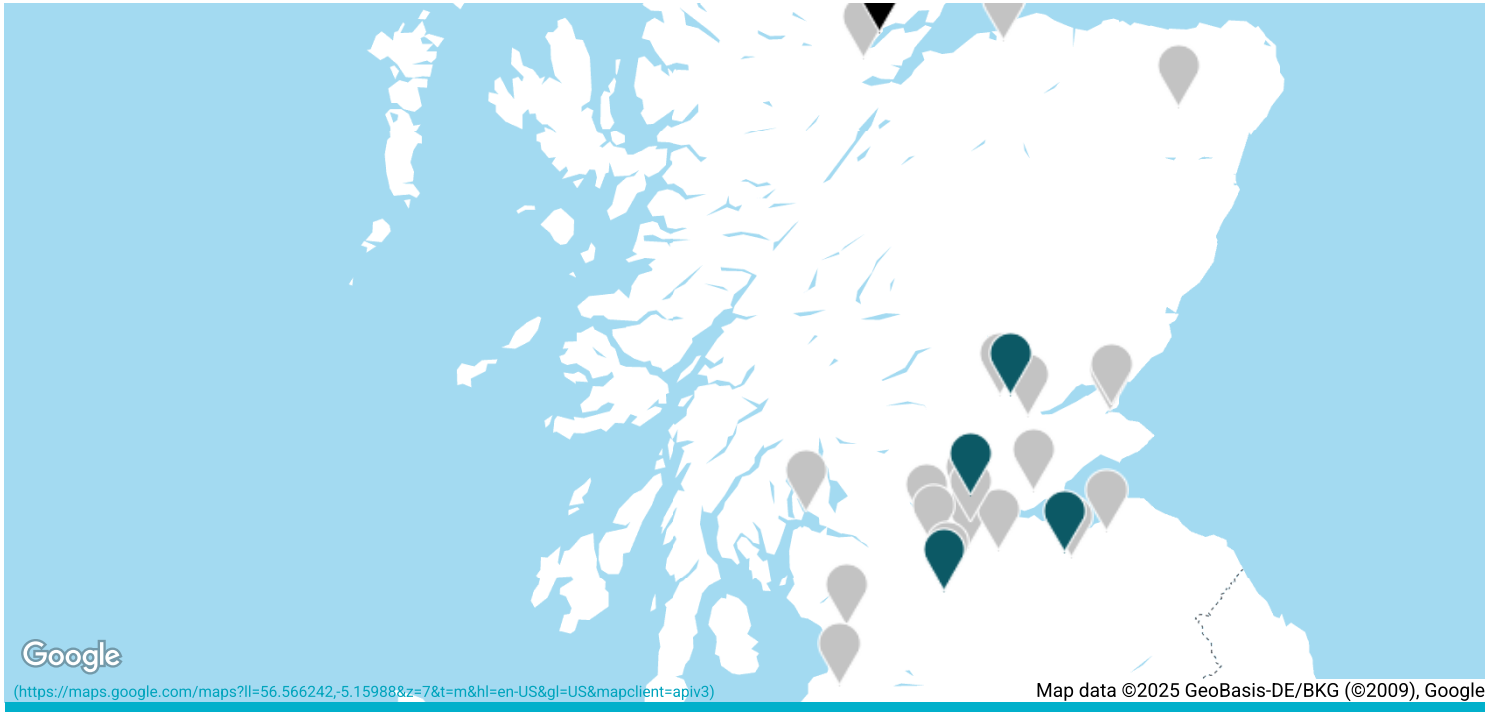




Evanton

Evanton in Easter Ross is in Highland. It developed from an estate village established by the local laird Alexander Fraser of Balconie in 1810 to house crofters who had been put off their land. The town suffered from famine and disease in the early 19th century but recovered to become a local service centre. The oil boom brought new industries and expansion of the town.

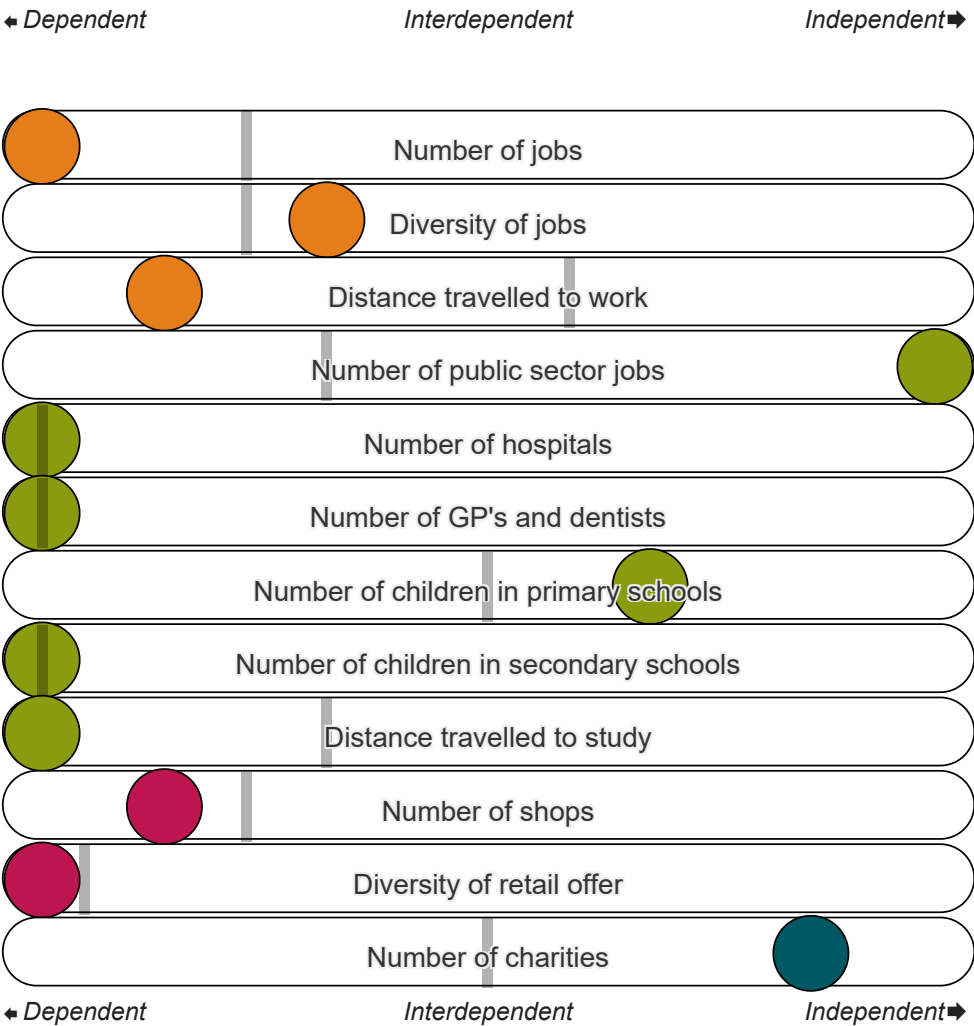
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Evanton is a dependent to interdependent town.

Evanton is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Evanton is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Evanton differs most from its group in the number of jobs; and the distance travelled to study.

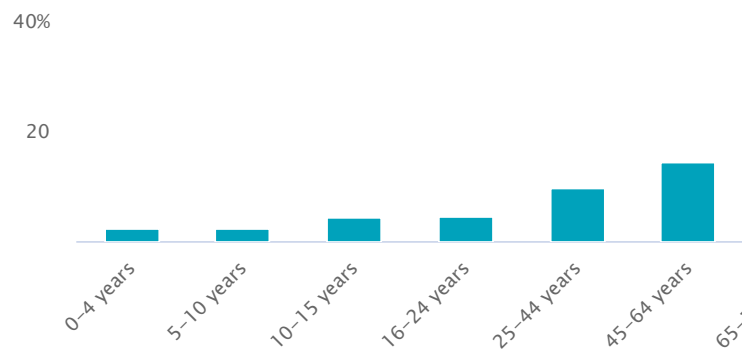

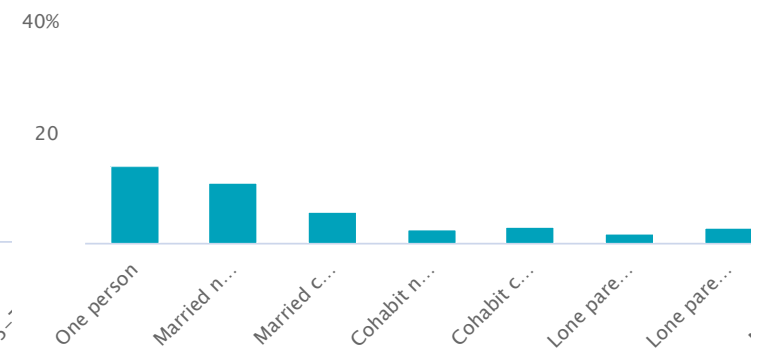

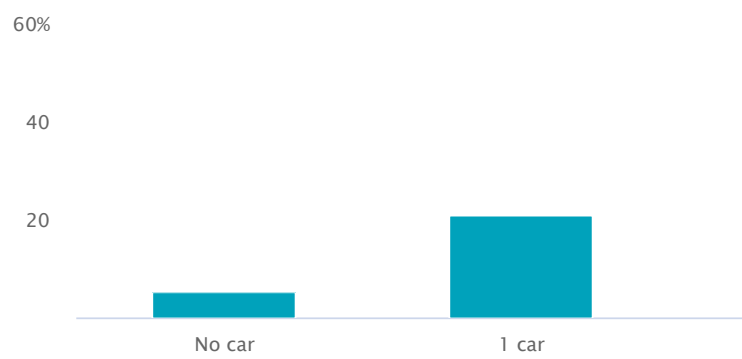

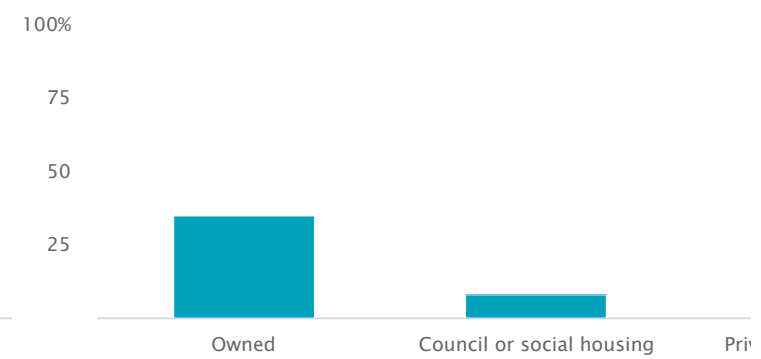
Household composition

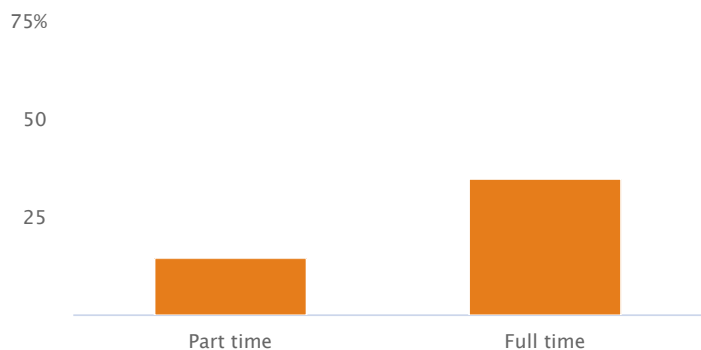

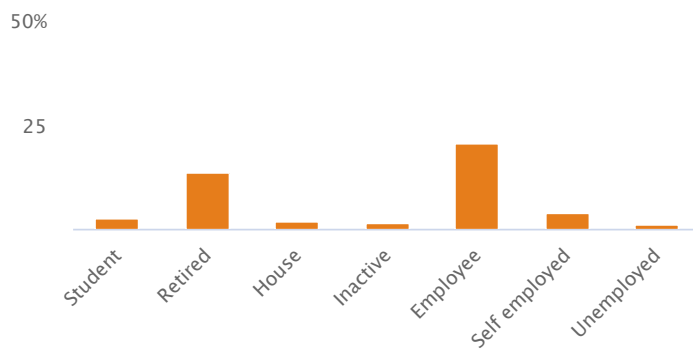
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



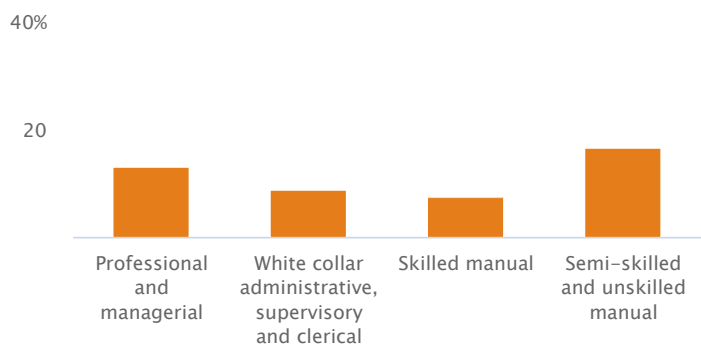
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

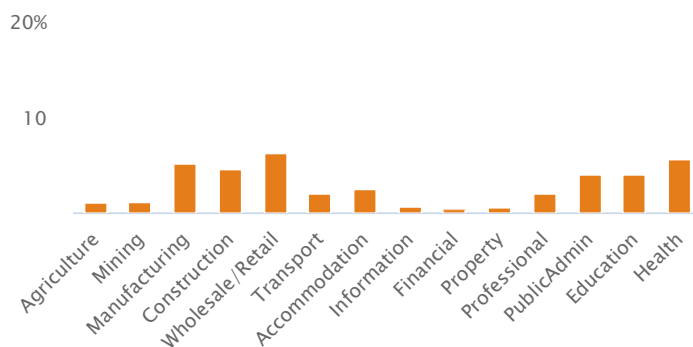


Social Grade

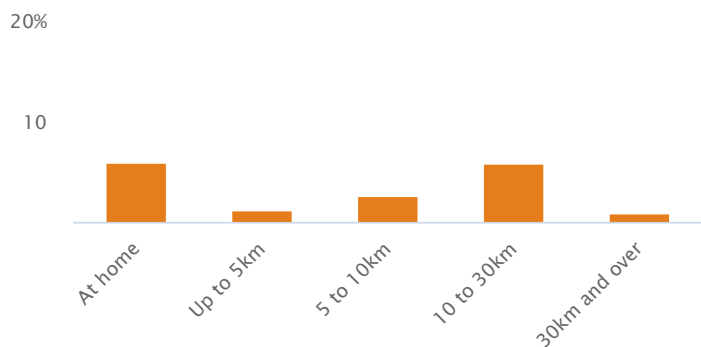
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

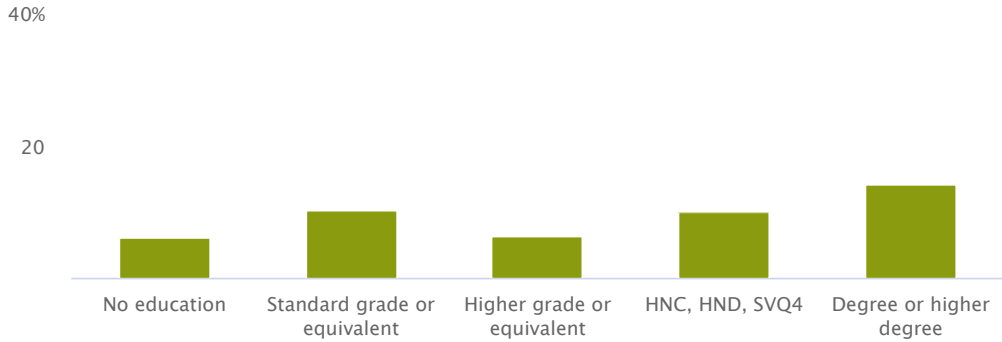


Distance travelled to work

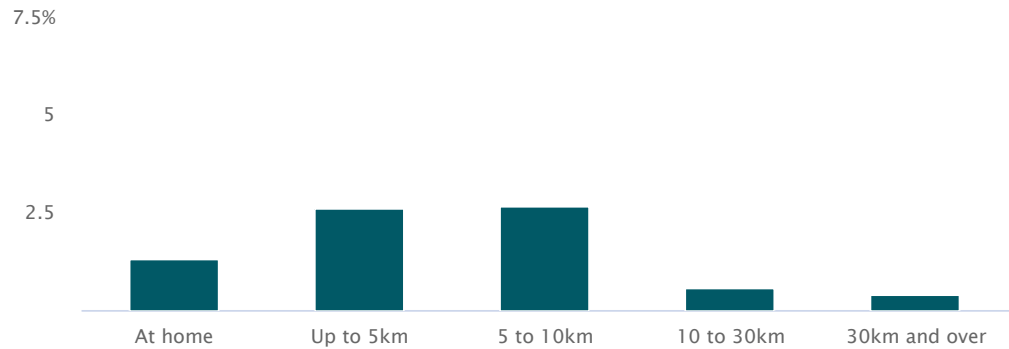
