



Faifley

WEST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **4,776**

Faifley in West Dunbartonshire was established as a mill village first for wool and later for cotton. In the 1950s new public housing was built as the town accommodated residents working in Glasgow and Clydebank. Much of this has since been demolished. Faifley is now a suburb of Hardgate.

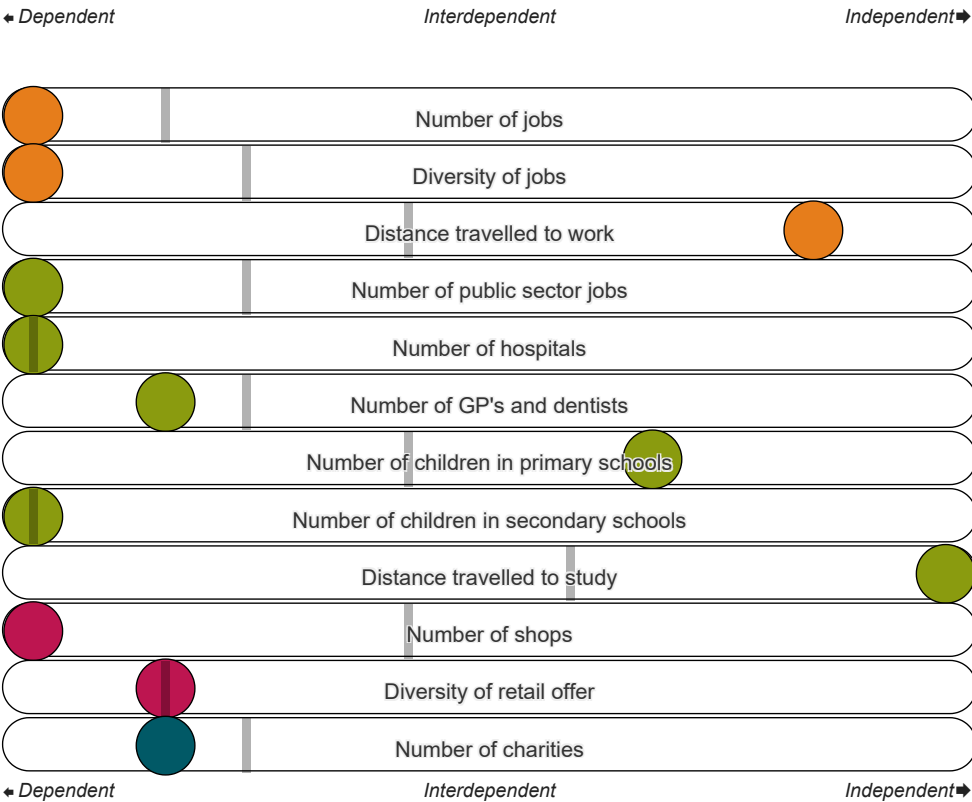
In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Faifley is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Faifley is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Faifley is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Faifley differs most from its group in the number of shops.

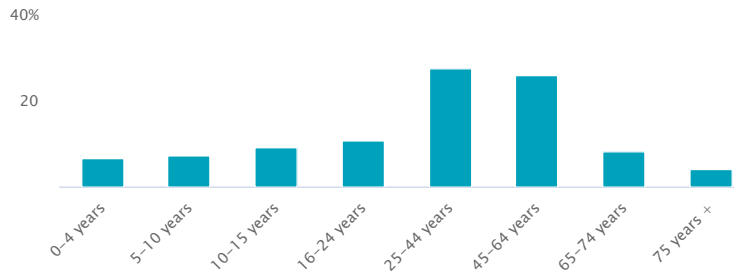

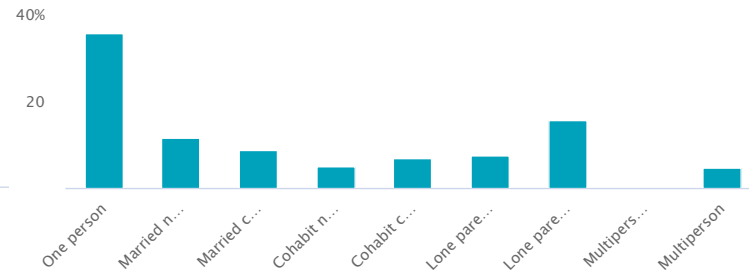

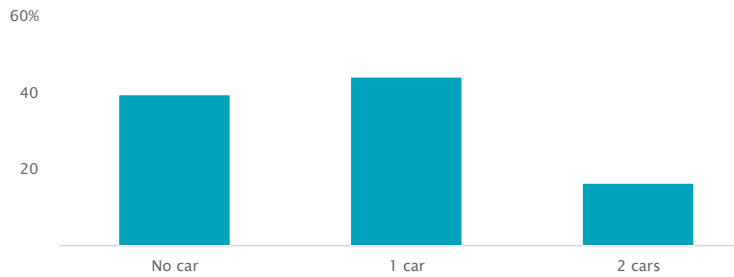

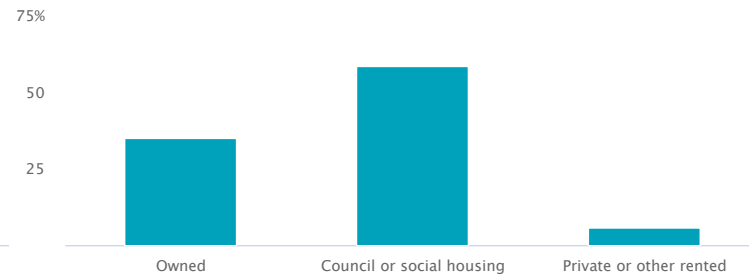
Household composition

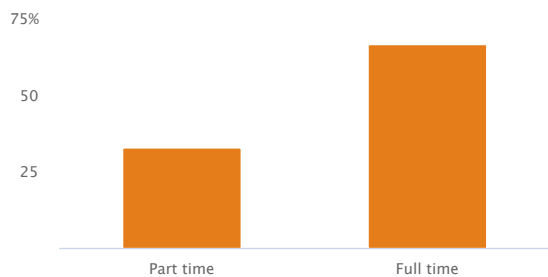

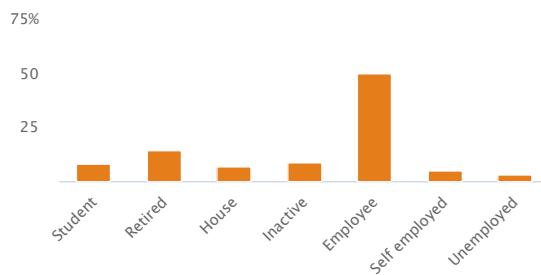
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



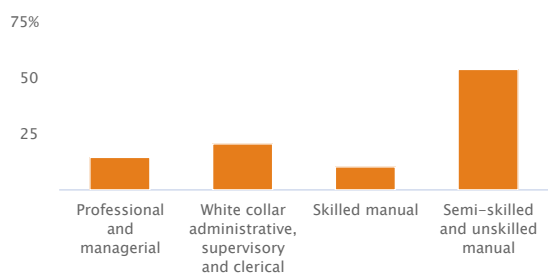
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

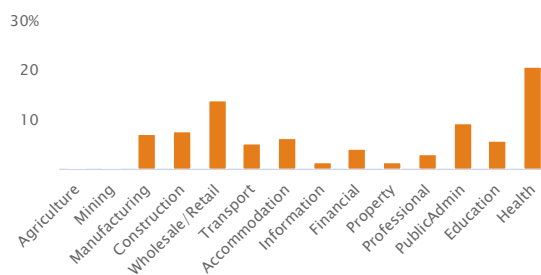


Social Grade

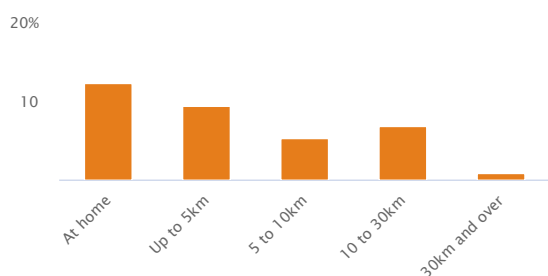
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

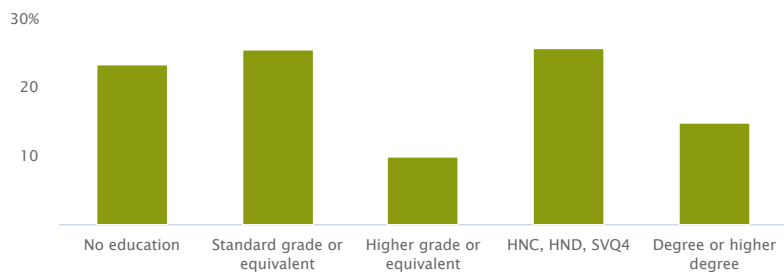


Distance travelled to work

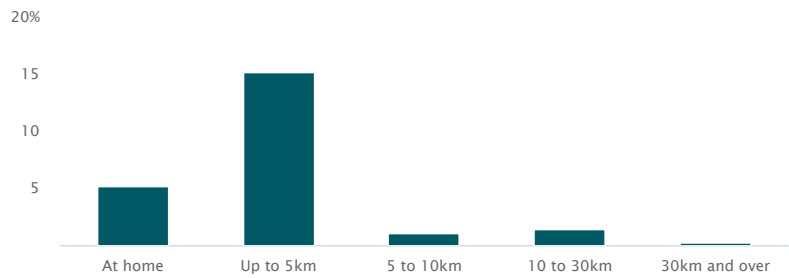
