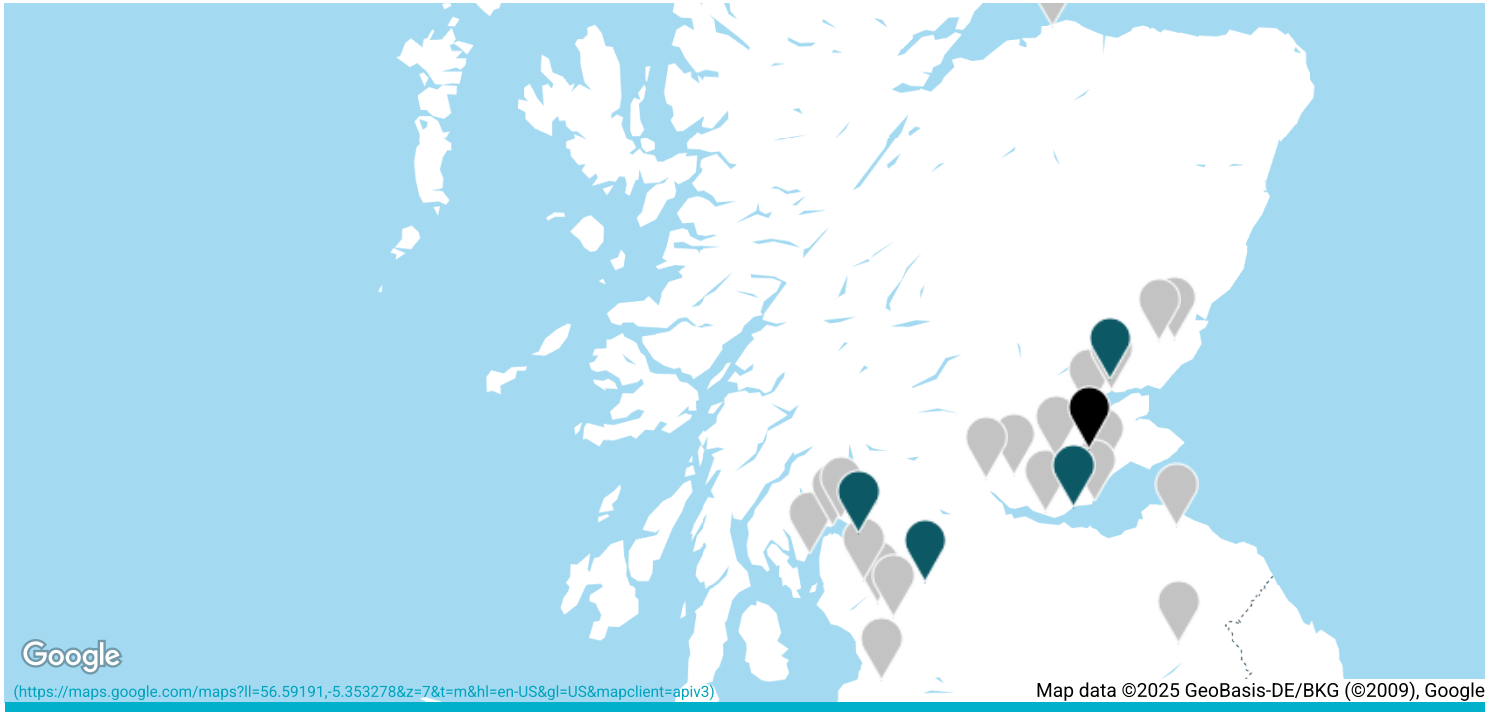

Falkland is an historic burgh in Fife. It is dominated by Falkland Palace, a former royal hunting lodge. Historically local industries included linen and linoleum and more recently a factory making paper bags. Today tourism is the most important role of the town.

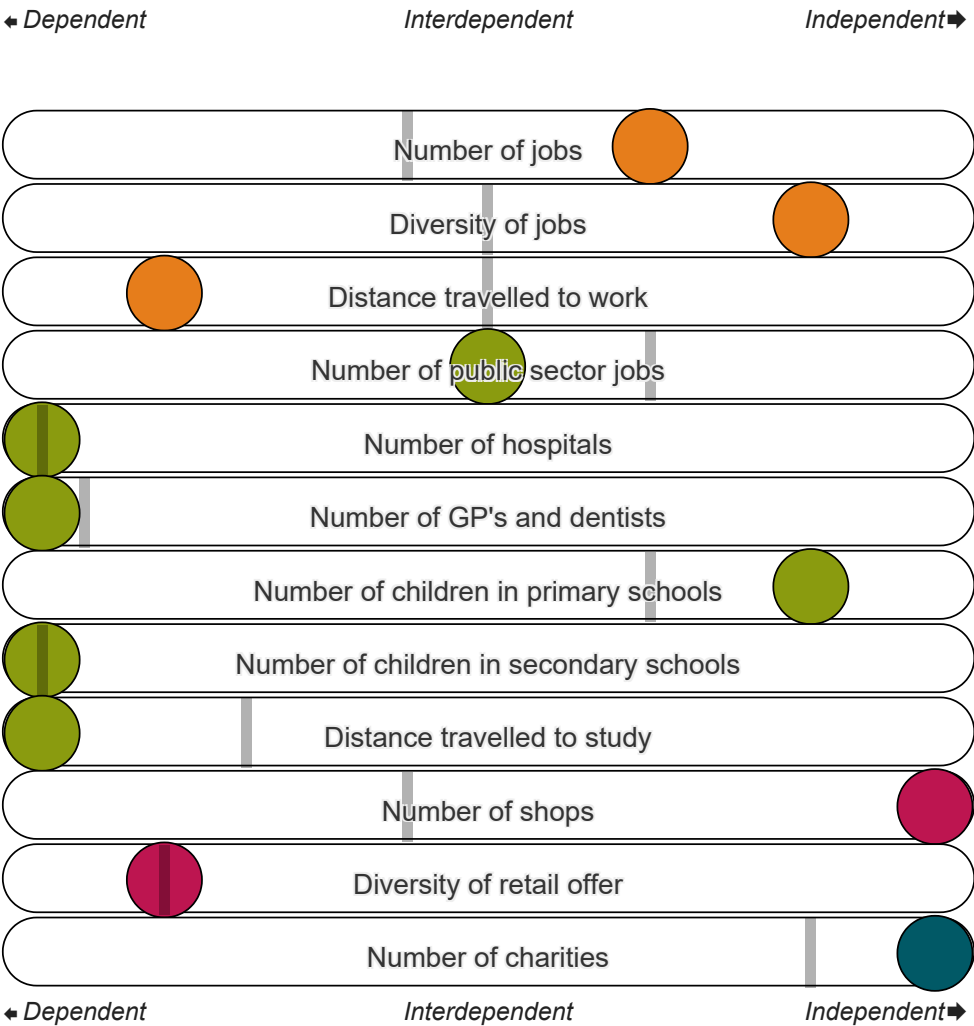
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Falkland is grouped with 24 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs, and shops. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Falkland differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

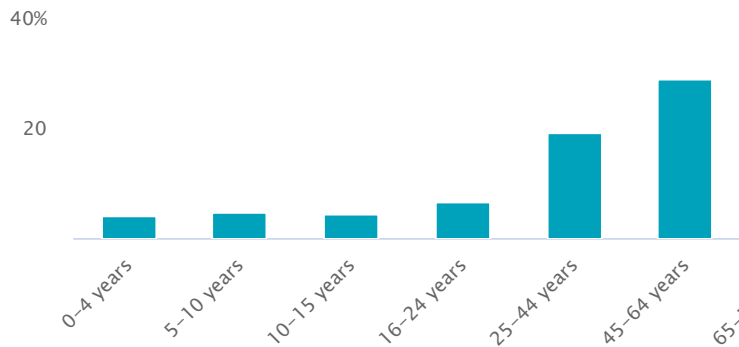

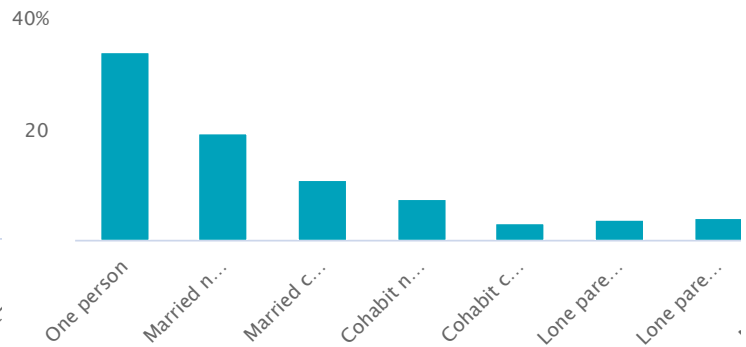

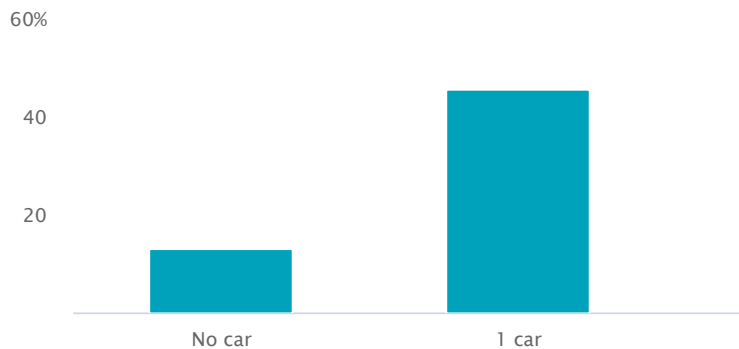

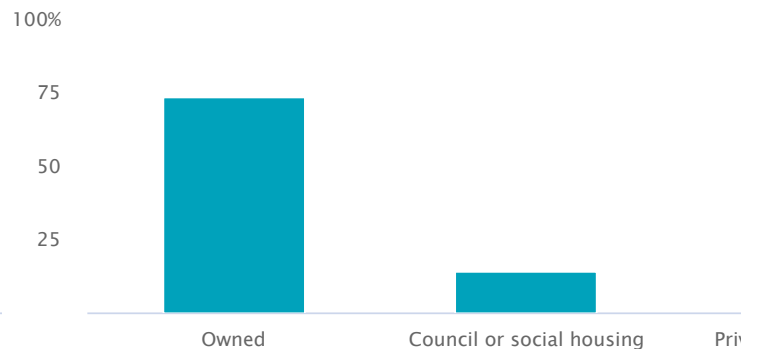
Household composition

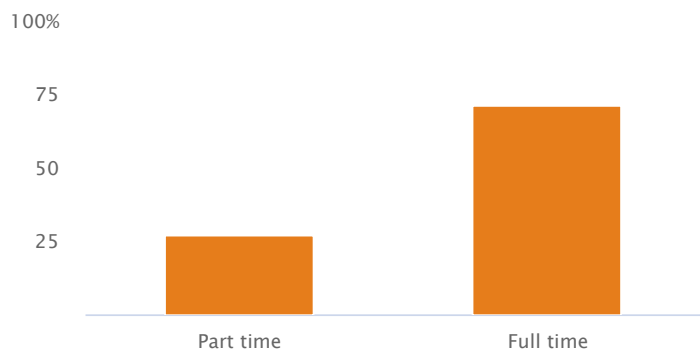

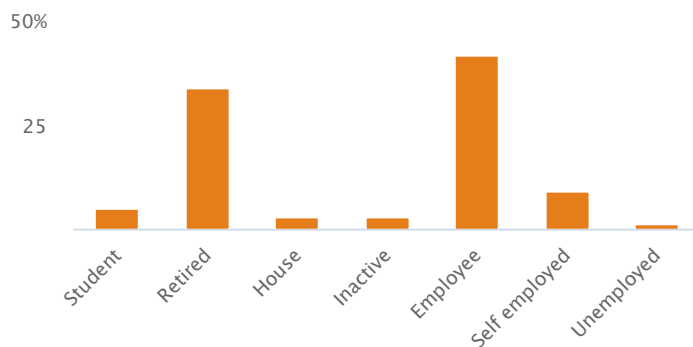
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



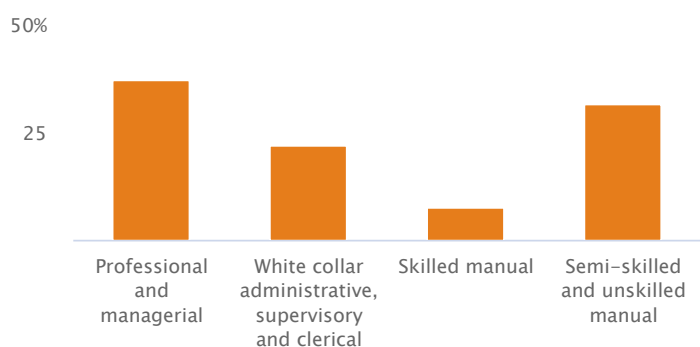
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

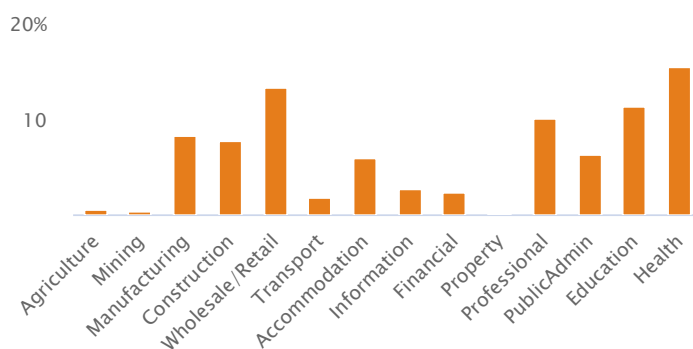


Social Grade

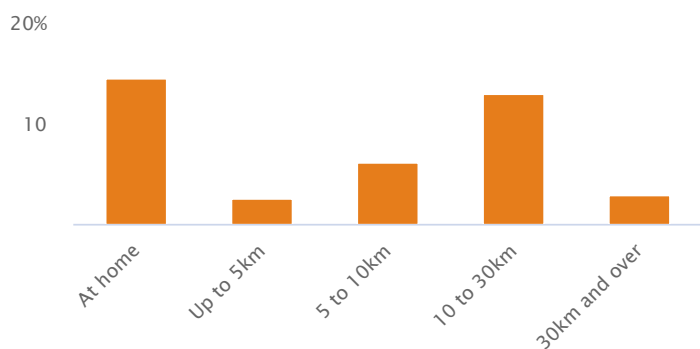
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

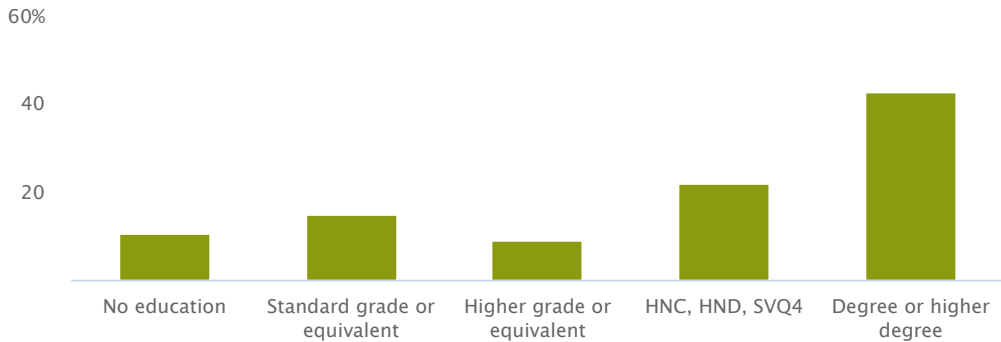


Distance travelled to work

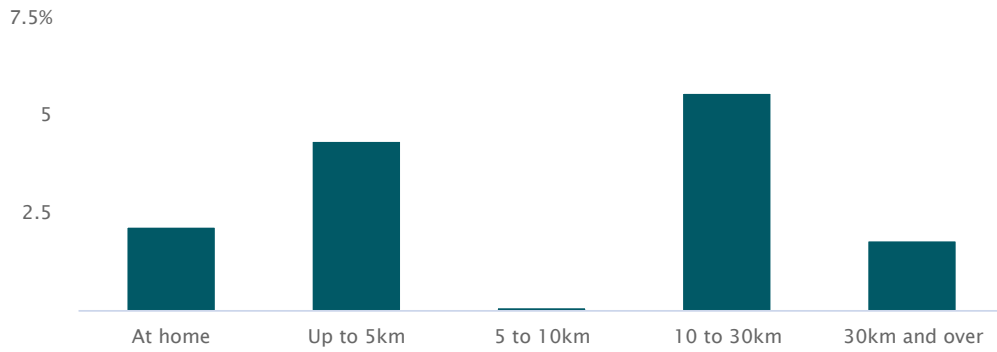
