Forfar in Angus is the administrative centre for Angus. It is an historic burgh. Both historically and today local industries reflect its location in an agricultural region. It has a livestock market, slaughter house, dairy food processing and a spring water plant and is of course famed for the Forfar bridie.

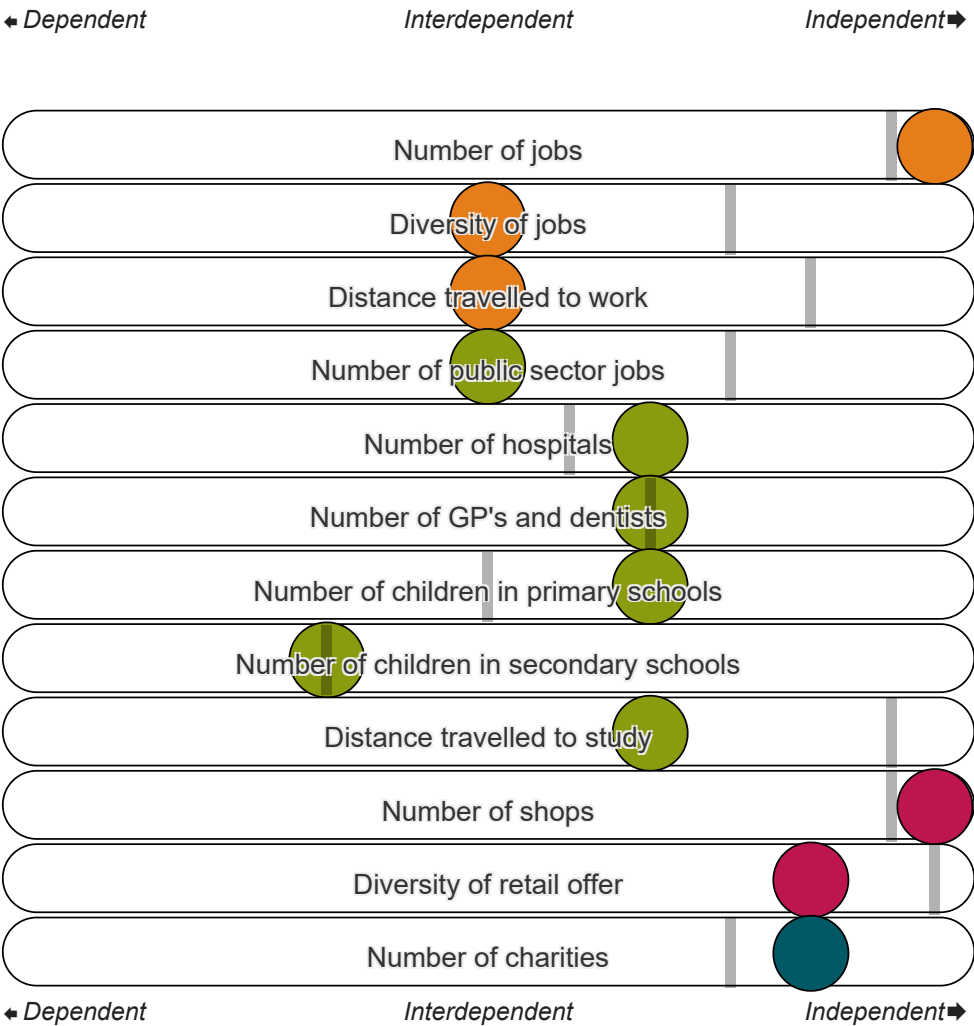
In large towns such as this, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Forfar is an independent to interdependent town.

Forfar is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Forfar is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to study. Forfar differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

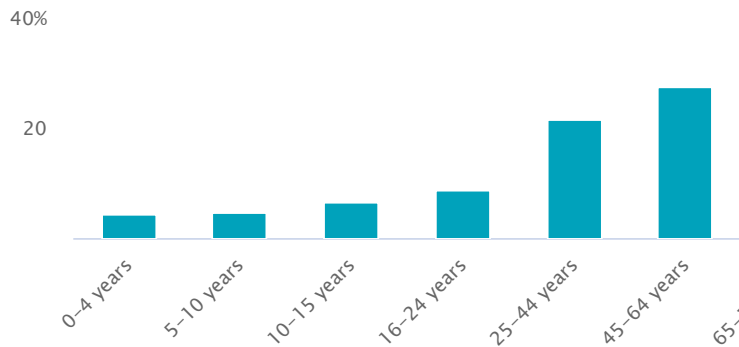

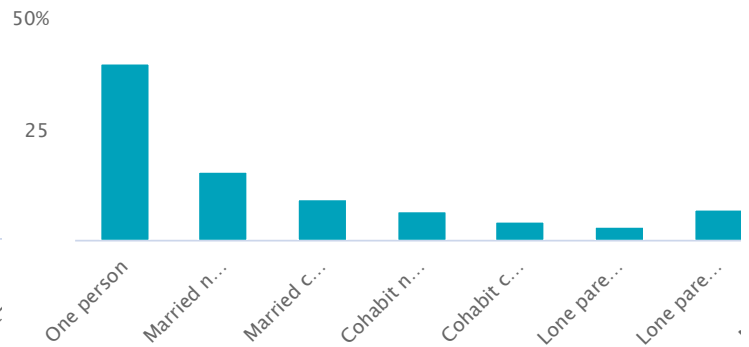

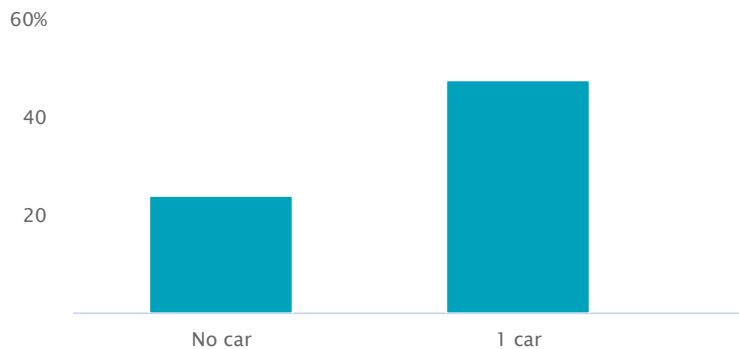

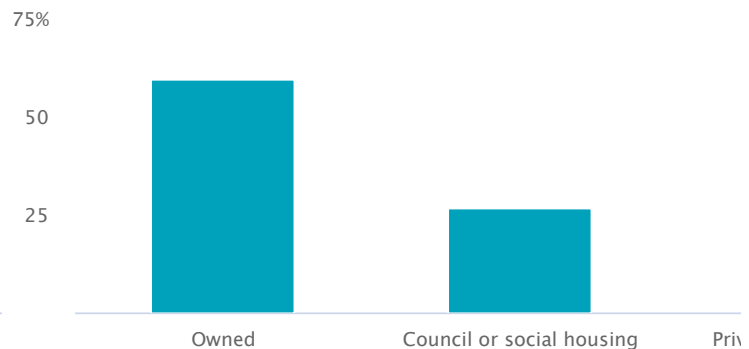
Household composition

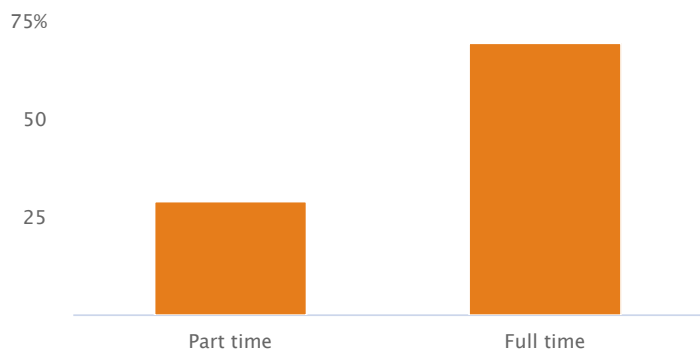

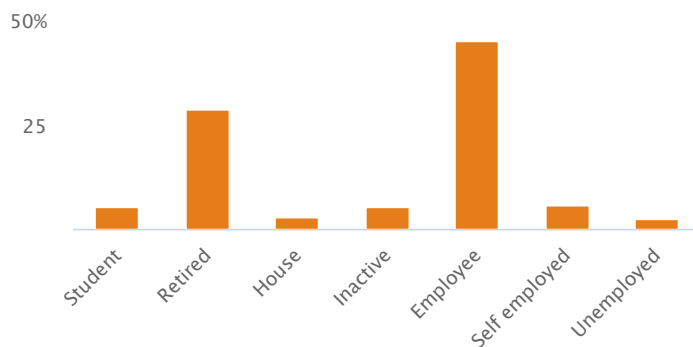
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



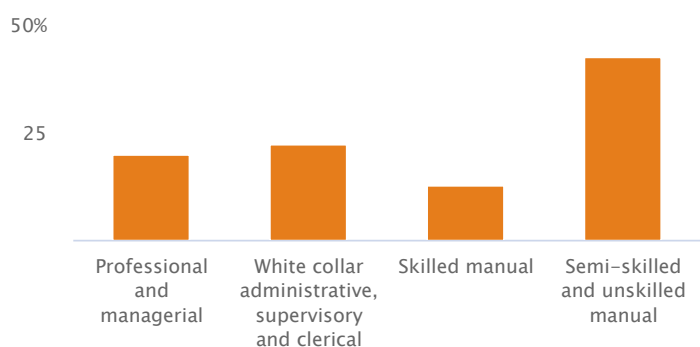
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

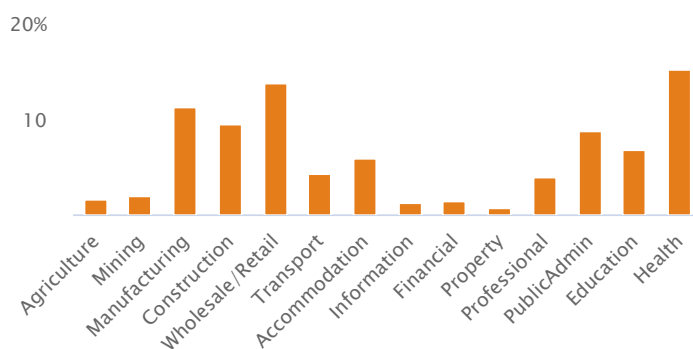

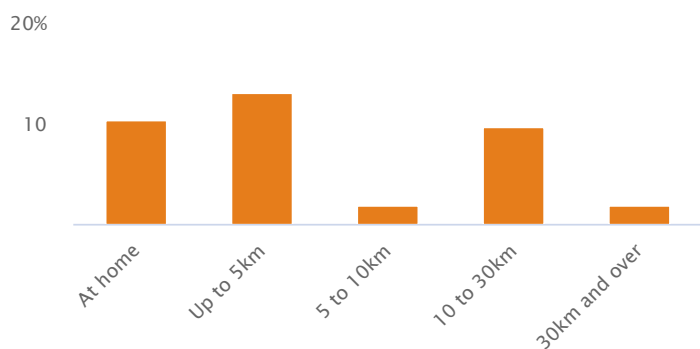
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

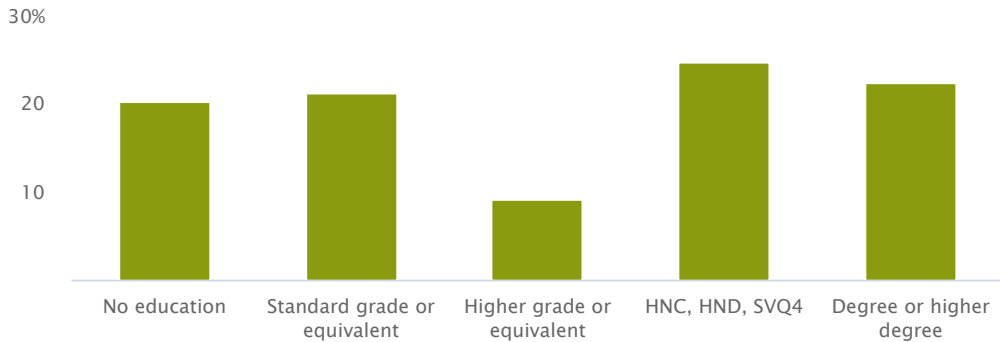


Distance travelled to work

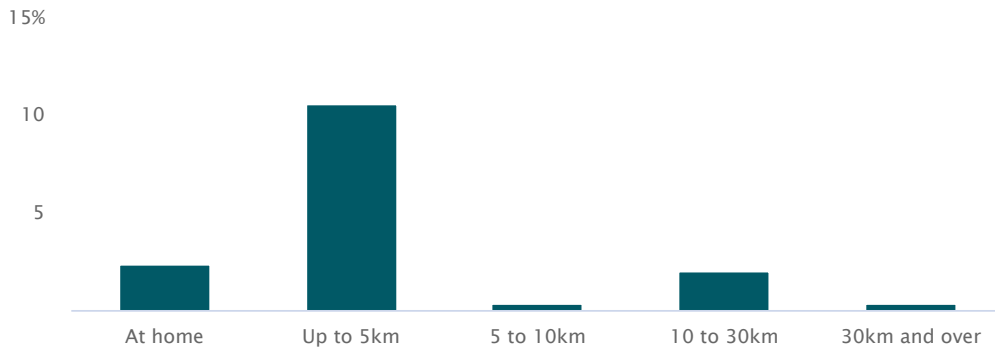
