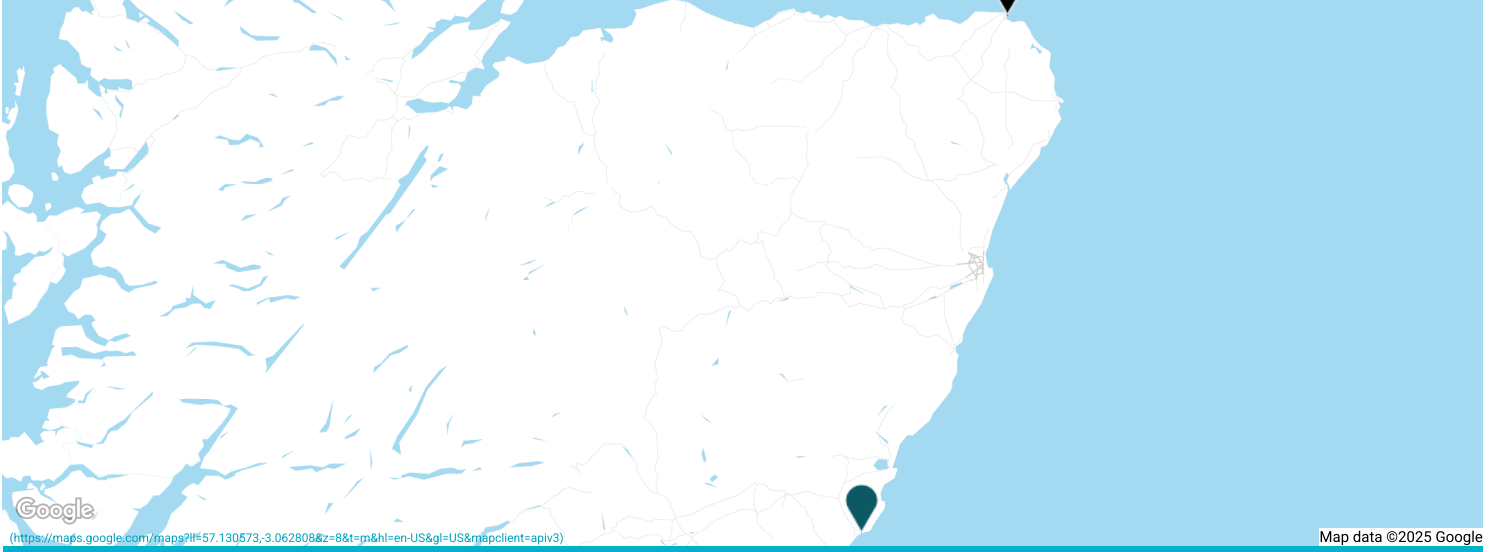




Fraserburgh

Fraserburgh is in Aberdeenshire. Its role as a fishing port dates from the 16th century when the harbour was built. It remains an important commercial fishing port today and associated industries such as fish processing have developed.

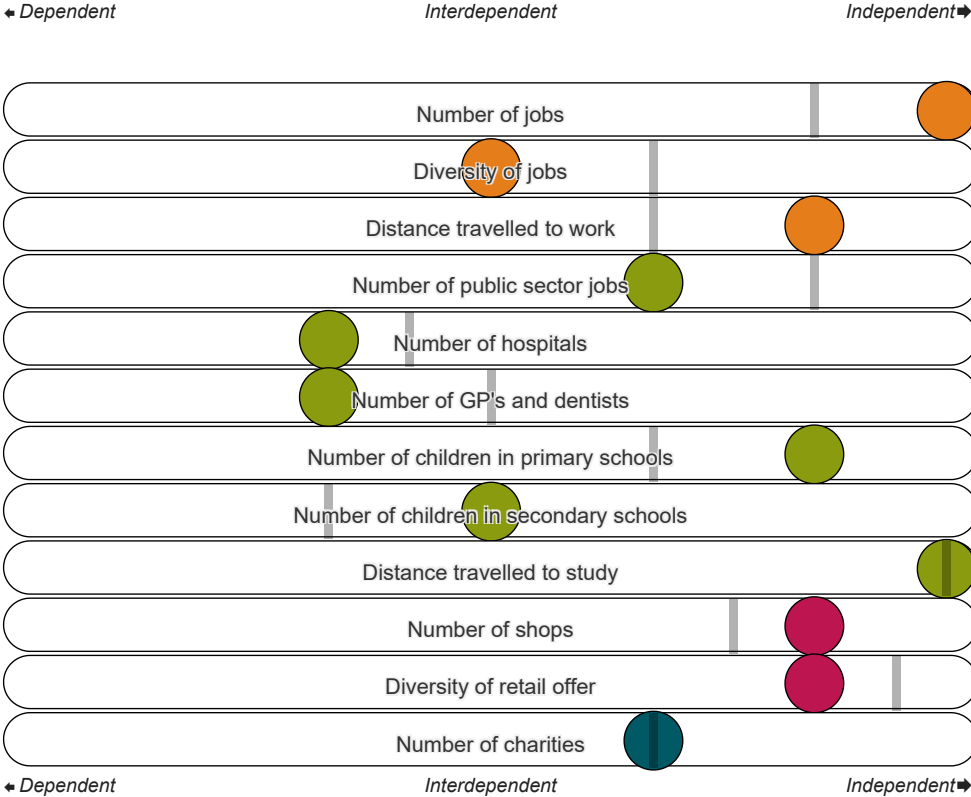
Social and council housing are the norm in large towns like Fraserburgh. Manufacturing and construction are the dominant forms of employment. Health and social work services are particularly active. There is a relatively high level of unemployment. Educational attainment and car ownership are low.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Fraserburgh is grouped with 1 other town. 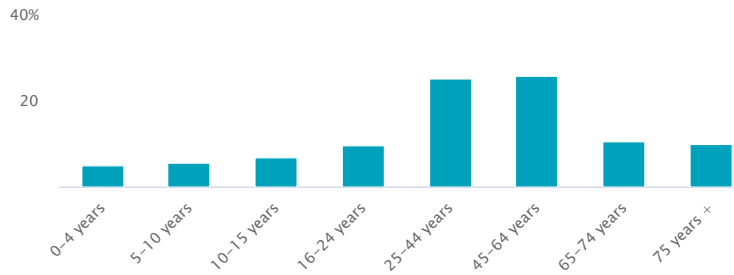

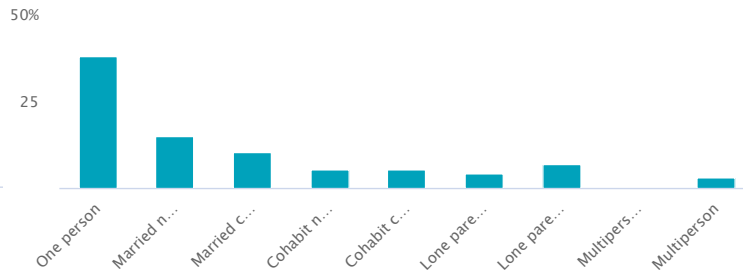

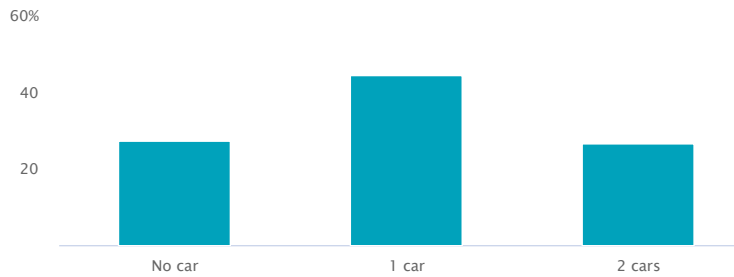

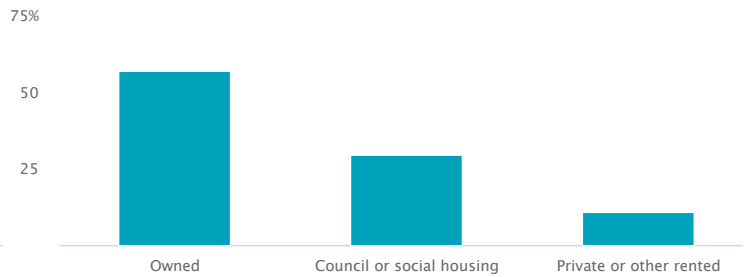
Household composition

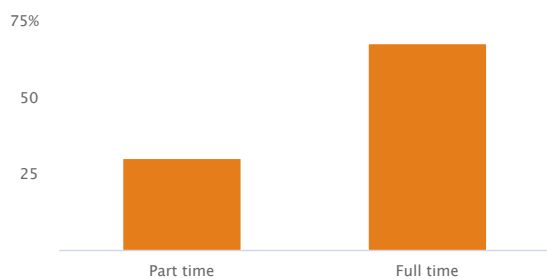

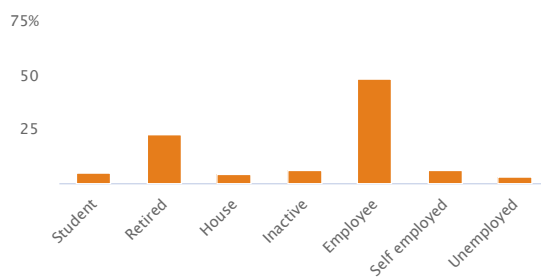
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



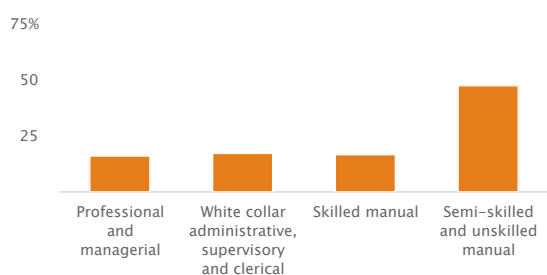
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

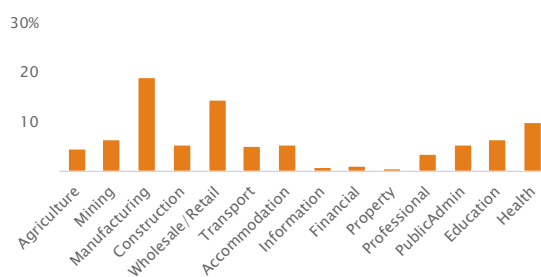

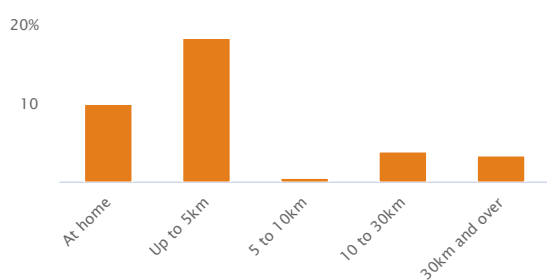
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

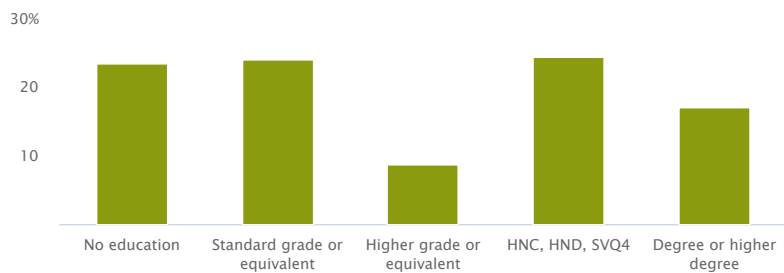


Distance travelled to work

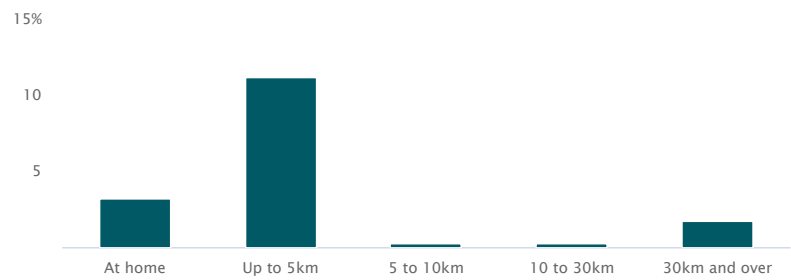
