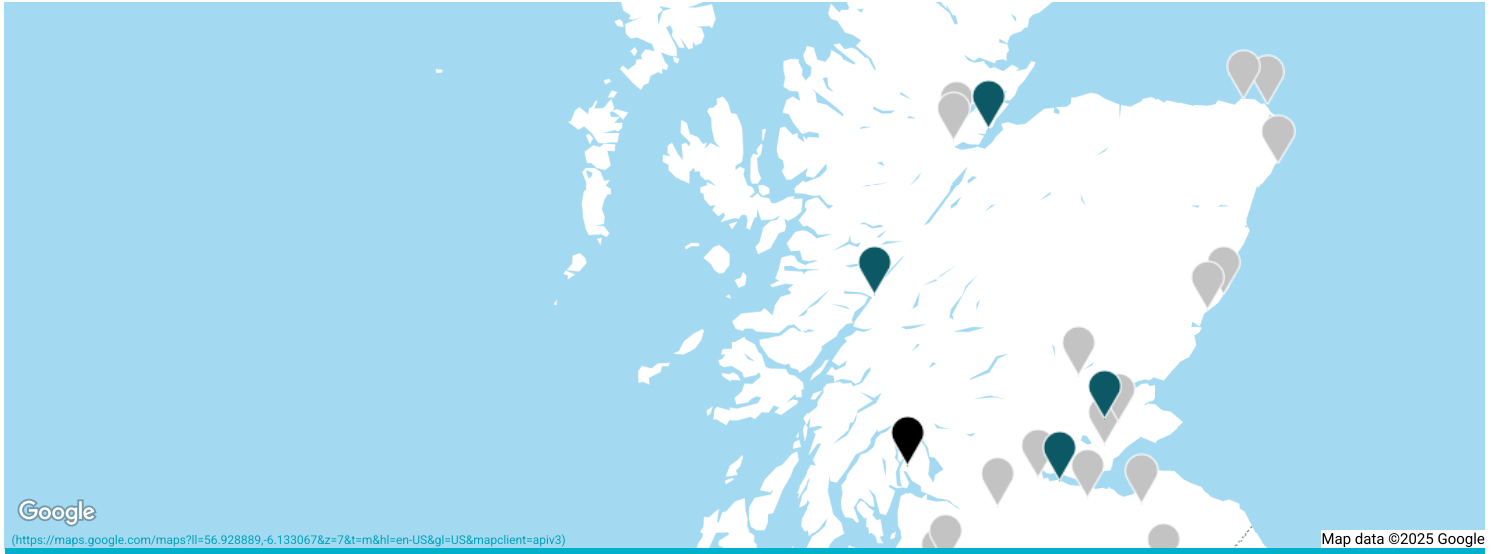




Garelochhead

POPULATION **1,707**

Garelochhead in Argyll and Bute developed in the 1820s as a Clyde steamer port. In the 20th century the development of the deep sea port at Finnart and the Faslane military base have shaped the development of the settlement at Garelochhead.

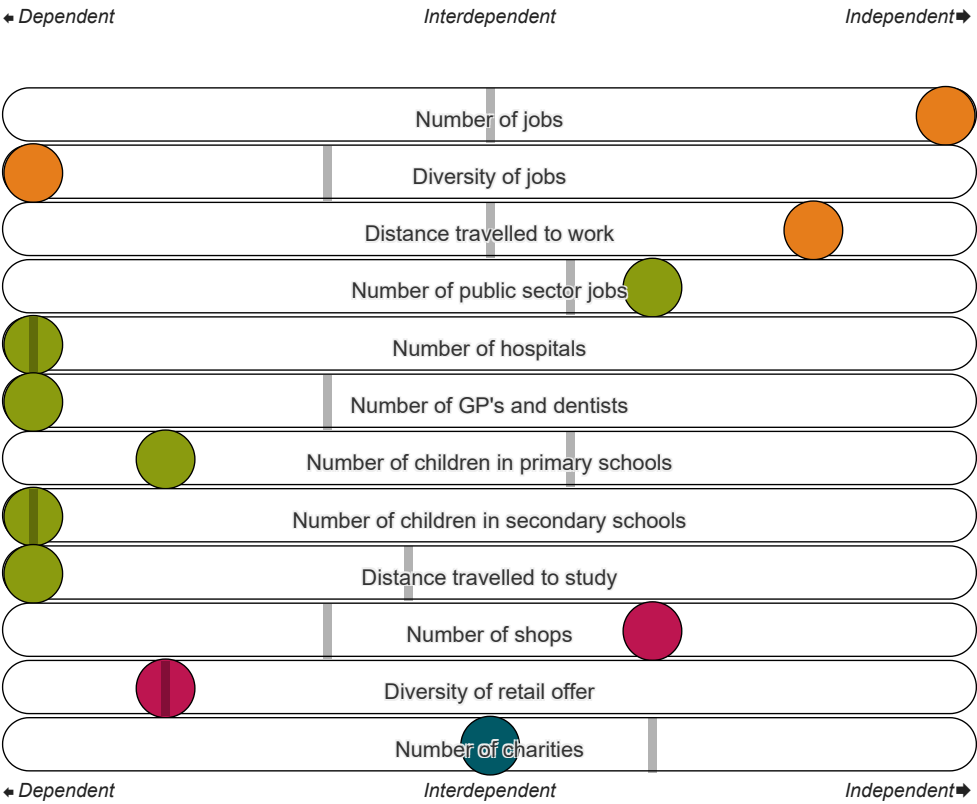
Garelochhead is characterised by its military base. Employment is high and largely provided by the base. Levels of deprivation are low. As with other military towns, it is largely populated by young families. There are a higher number of women staying at home compared to other kinds of town and a high percentage of children under five years old.

Garelochhead is an interdependent to dependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Auchtermuchty](#), [Avoch](#), [Banavie and Corpach](#), and [Bo'ness](#).

Inter-relationships



Garelochhead is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Garelochhead is grouped with 22 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, jobs, and shops. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Garelochhead differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists; and the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

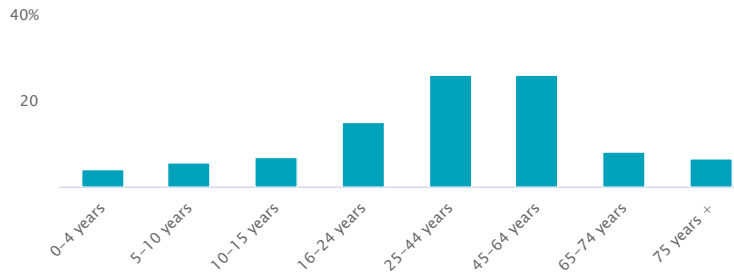

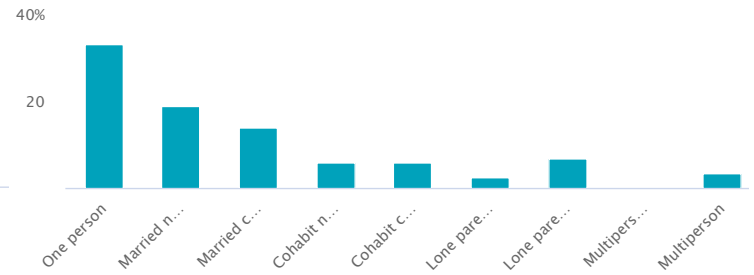

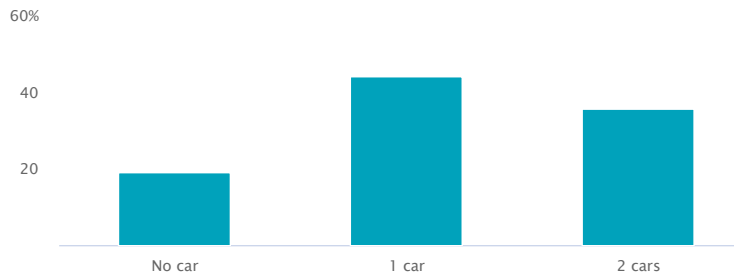

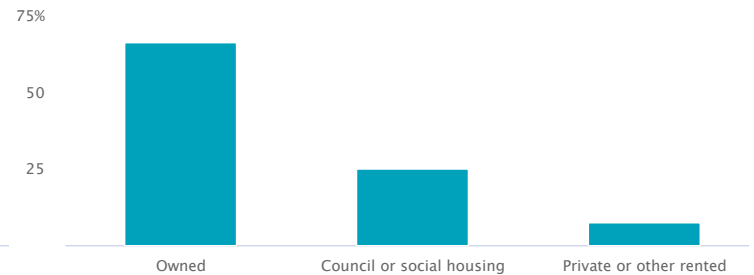

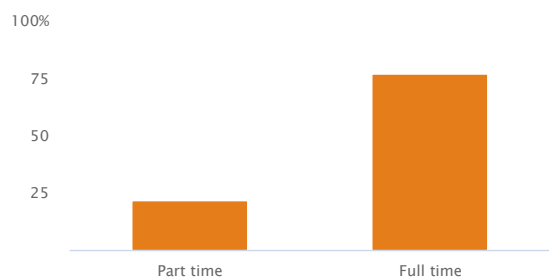

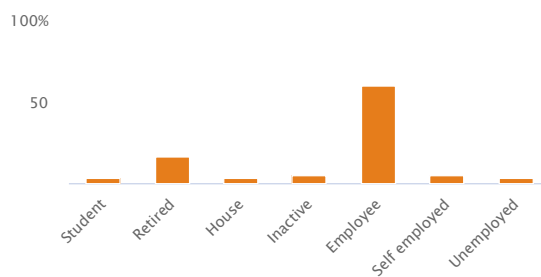
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



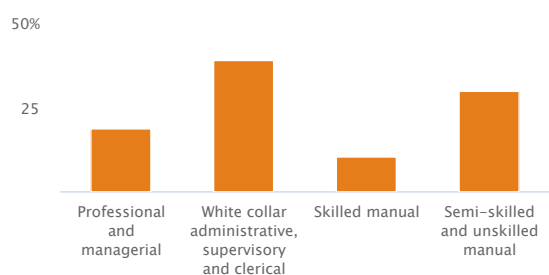
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

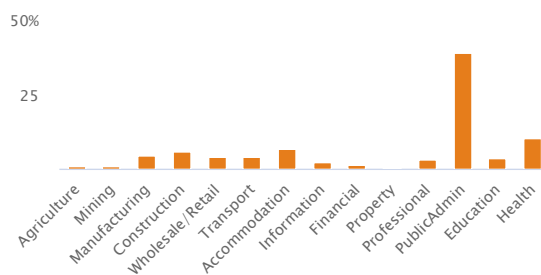


Social Grade

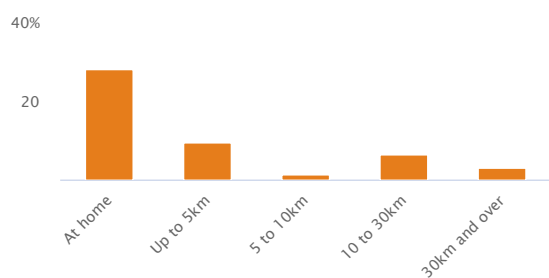
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

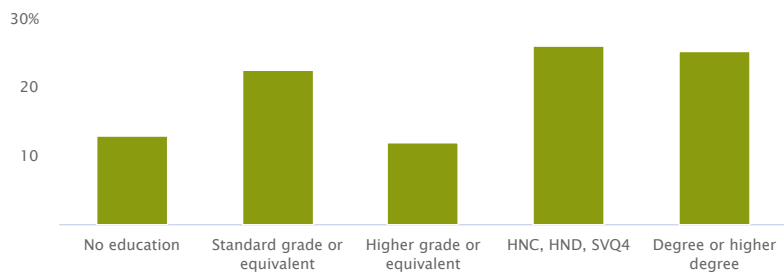


Distance travelled to work

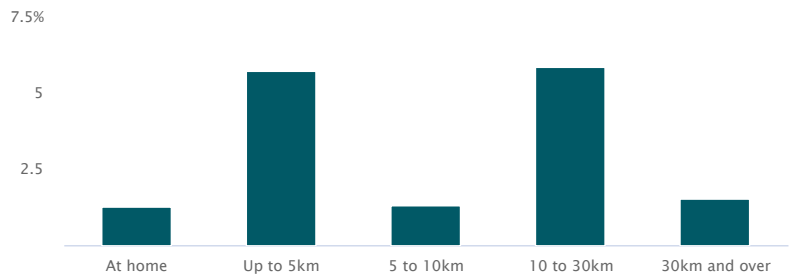
