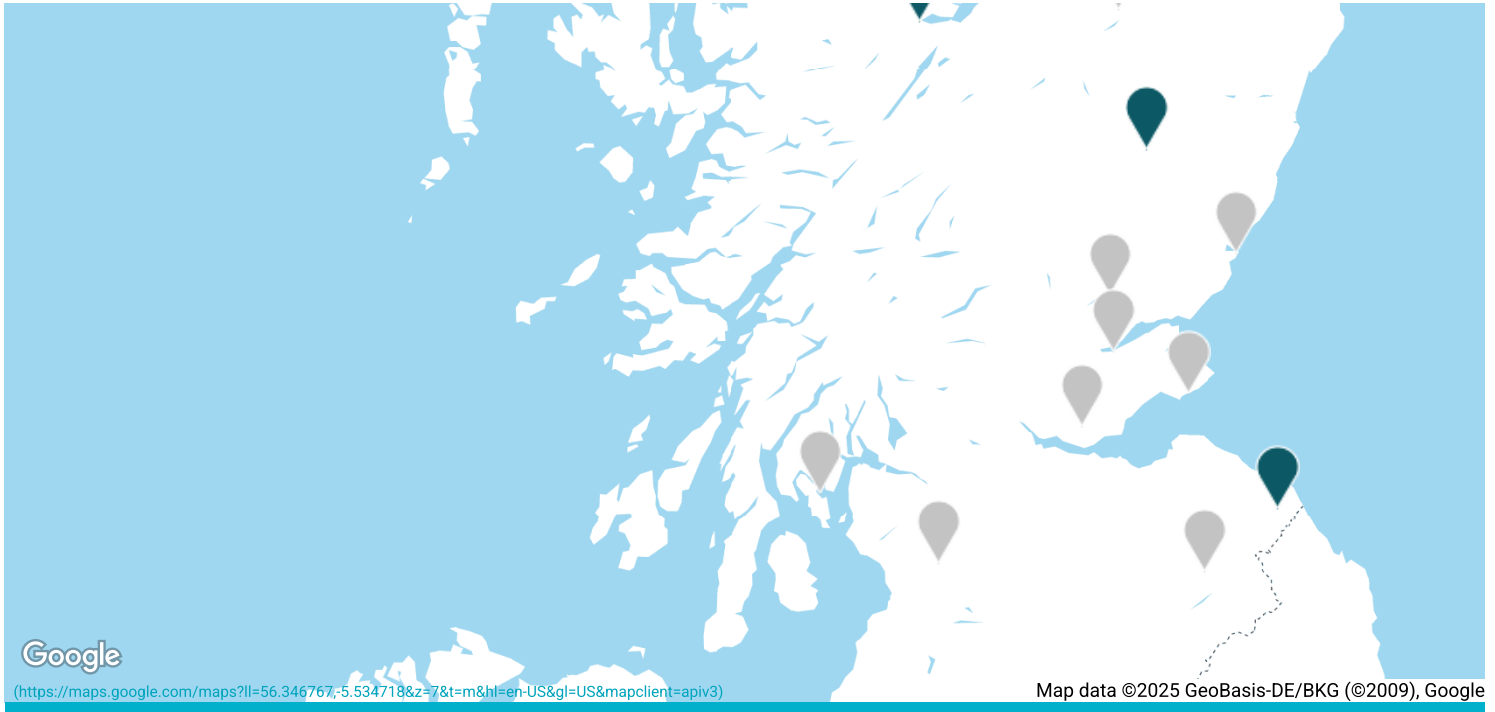




Gatehouse of Fleet

gatehouse of Fleet is an historic town buit at the lowest bridging point. Historically it was a coaching town with cotton mills. A small amount of housing to meet local needs has been built increasing the population very slightly. It is a UNESCO Biosphere Community. Toruism and local service provision are mainstays.

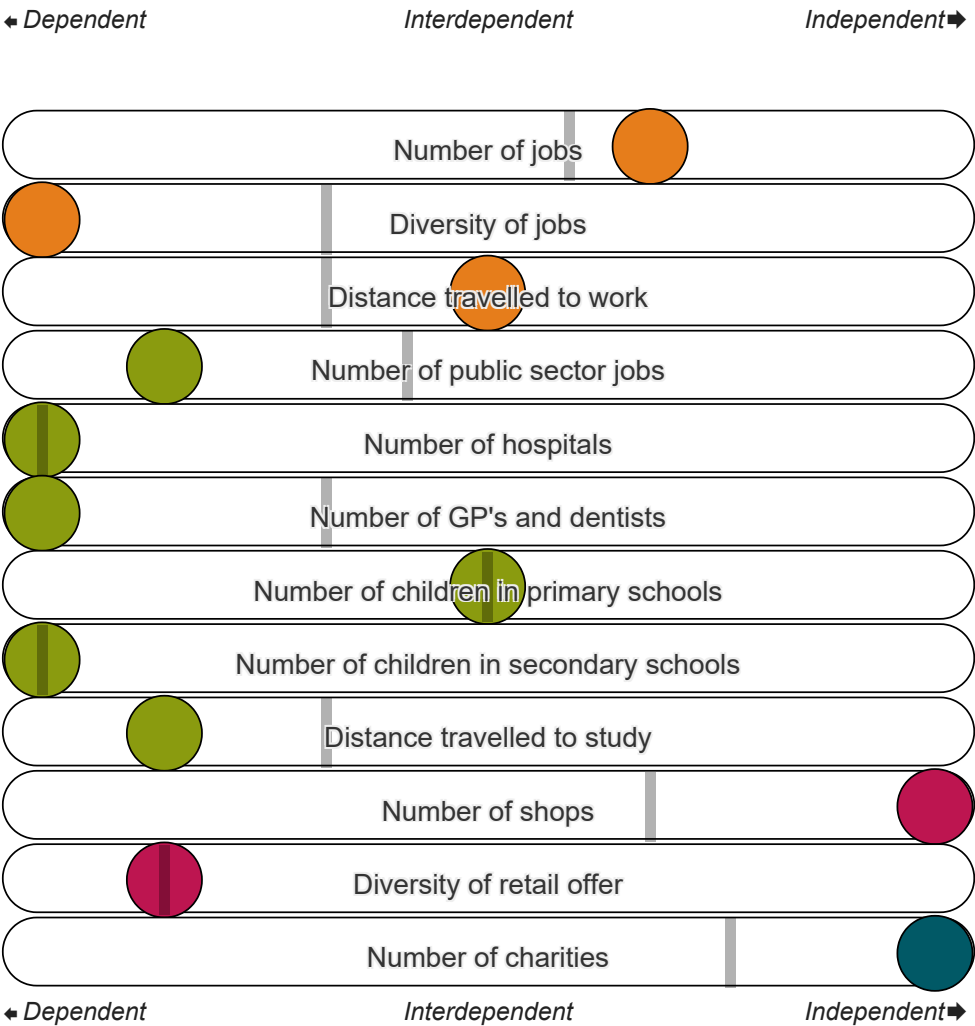
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Gatehouse of Fleet is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Gatehouse of Fleet is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Gatehouse of Fleet is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs, and shops. Gatehouse of Fleet differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists; and the diversity of jobs.

- Average for the category (Grey line)

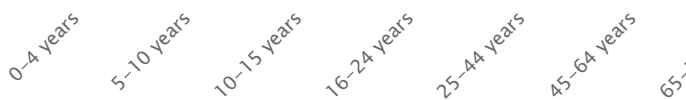

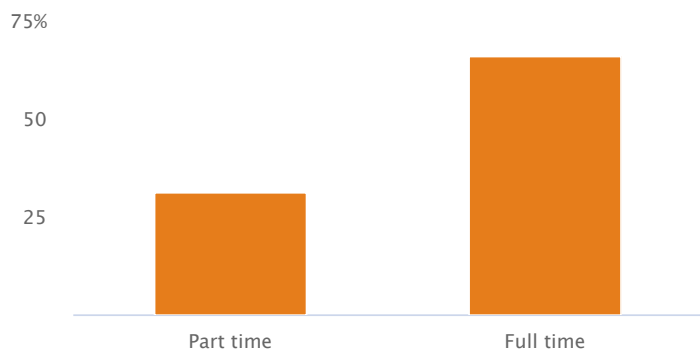

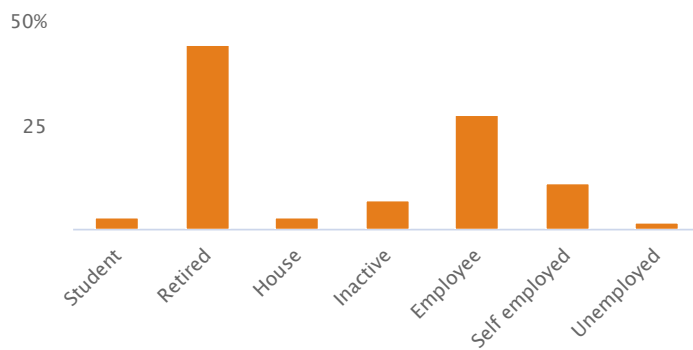
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



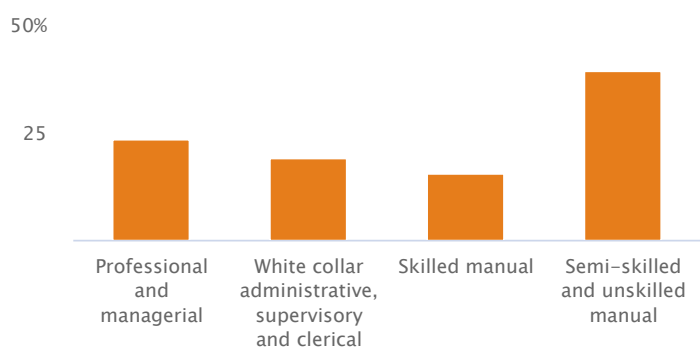
Occupation

Social Grade

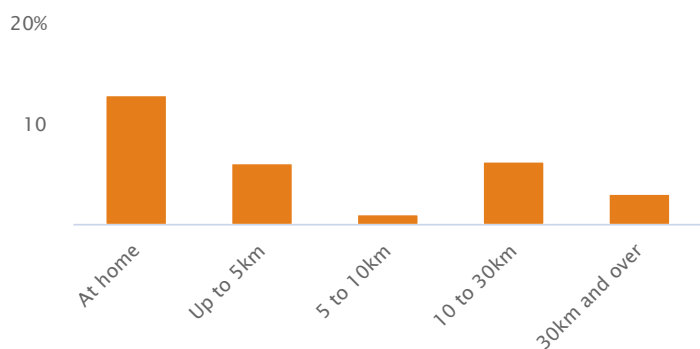
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

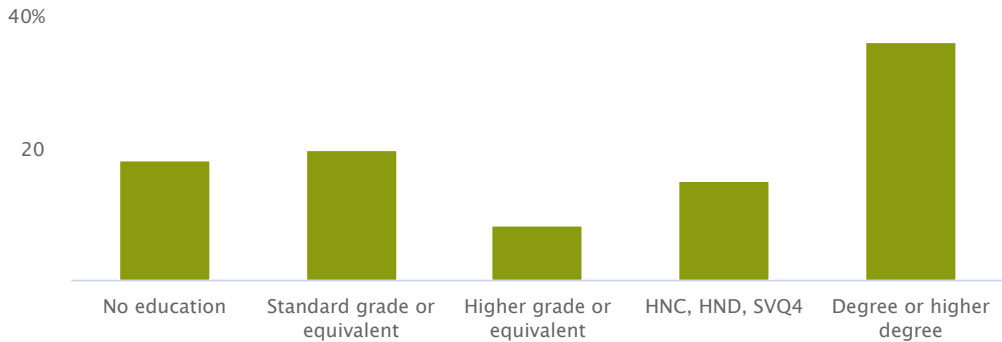


Distance travelled to work

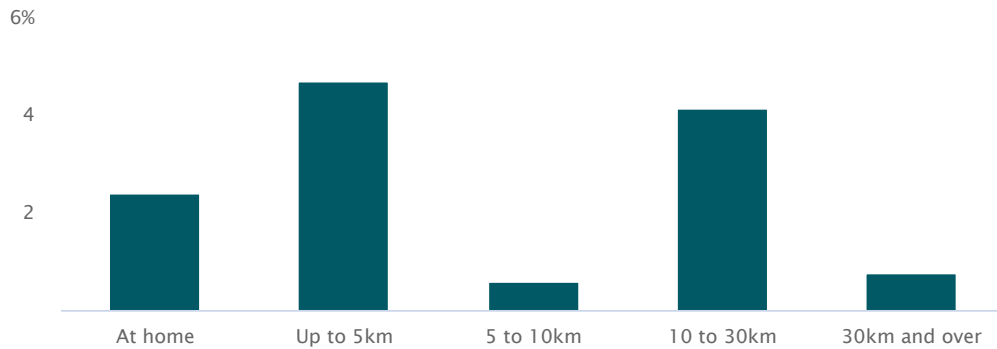
