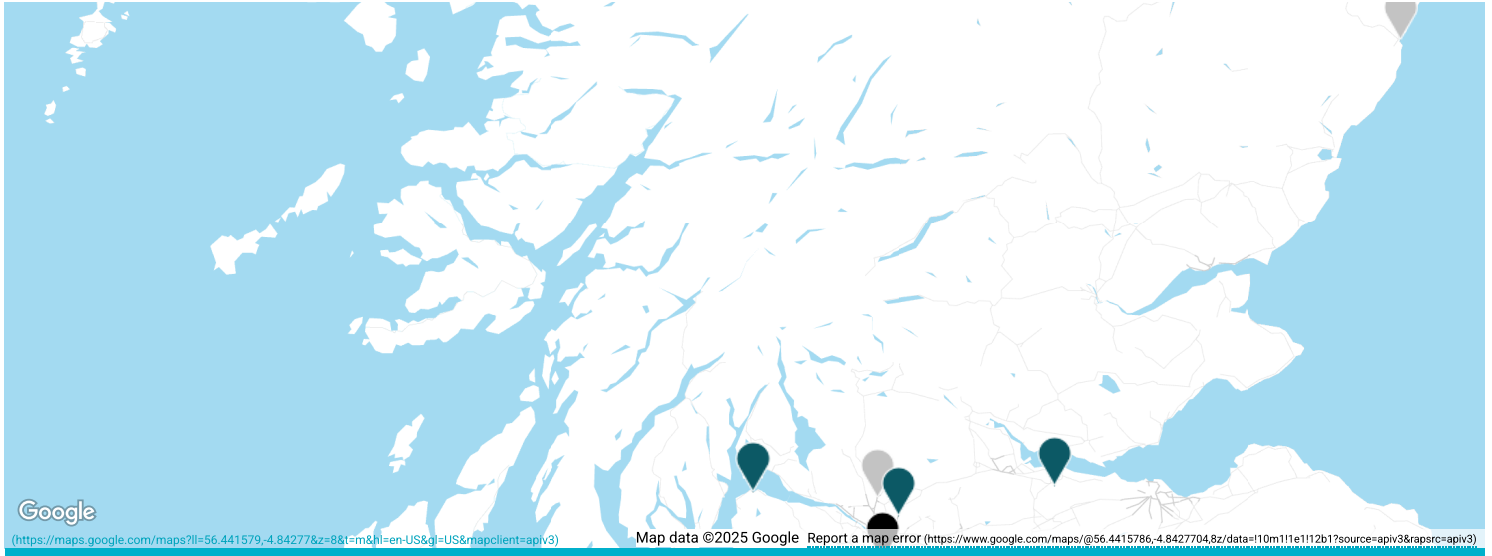




Giffnock

Giffnock in East Renfrewshire is effectively a suburb of Glasgow.

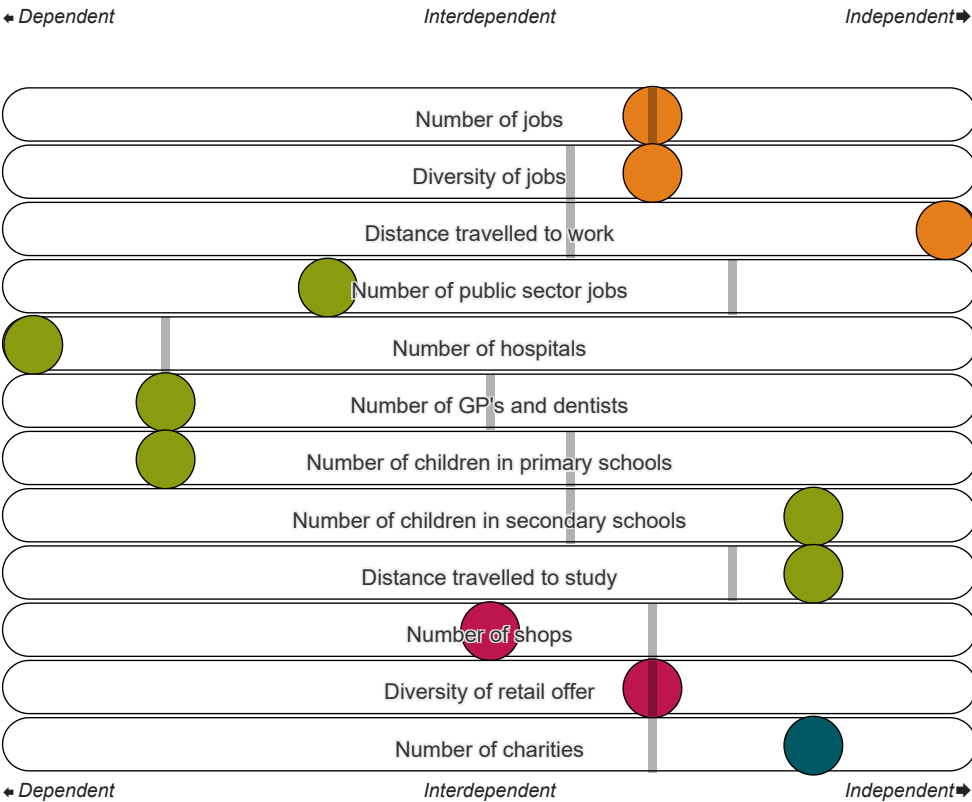
In large towns such as this one, the population typically is older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Giffnock is an interdependent to independent town.

Inter-relationships



Giffnock is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Giffnock is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Giffnock differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, and GP's and dentists.

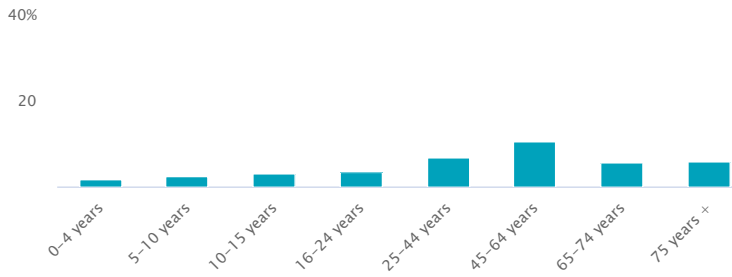

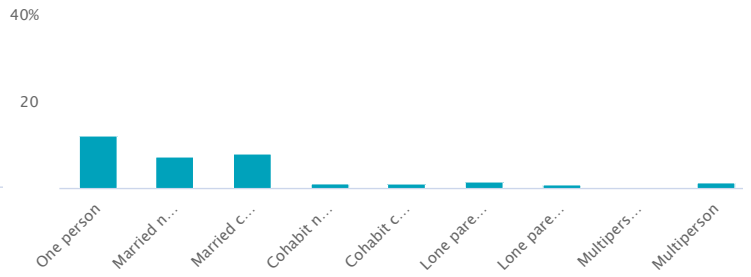

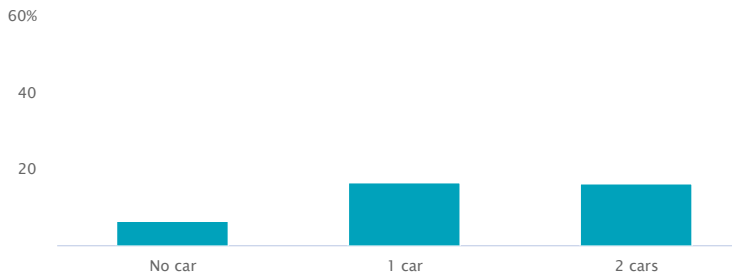

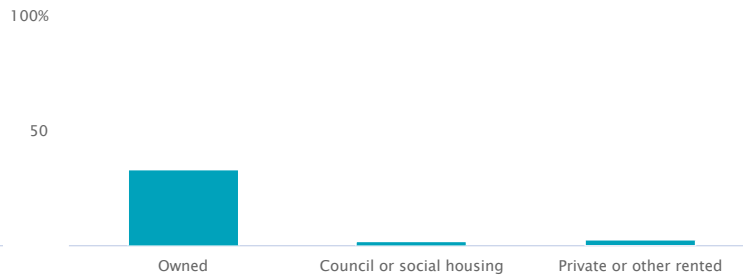

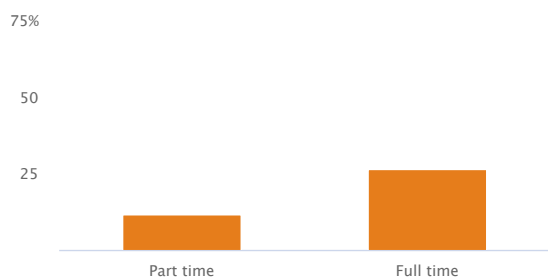

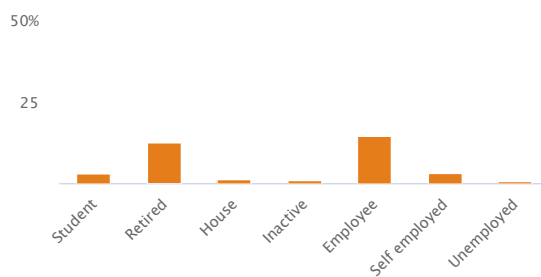
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



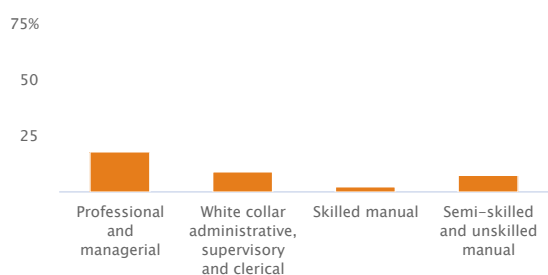
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

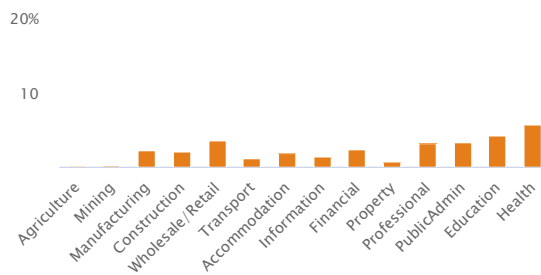


Social Grade

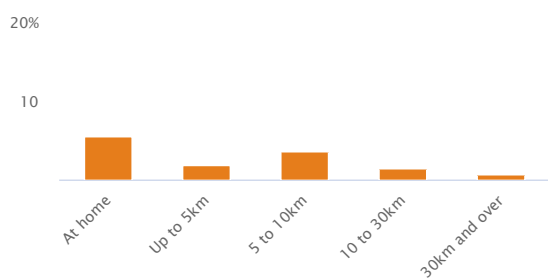
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

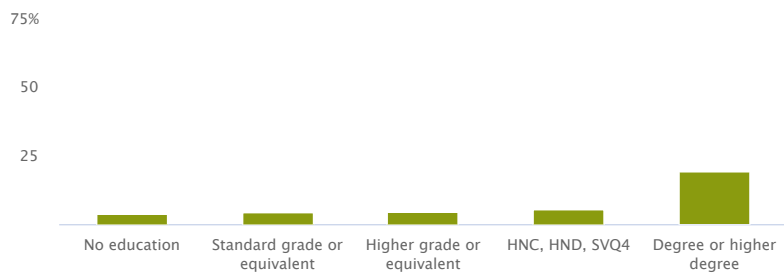


Distance travelled to work

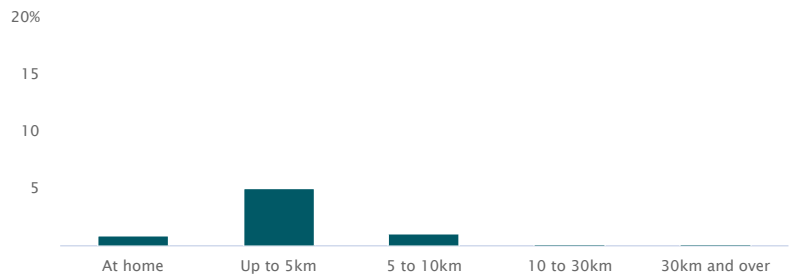
