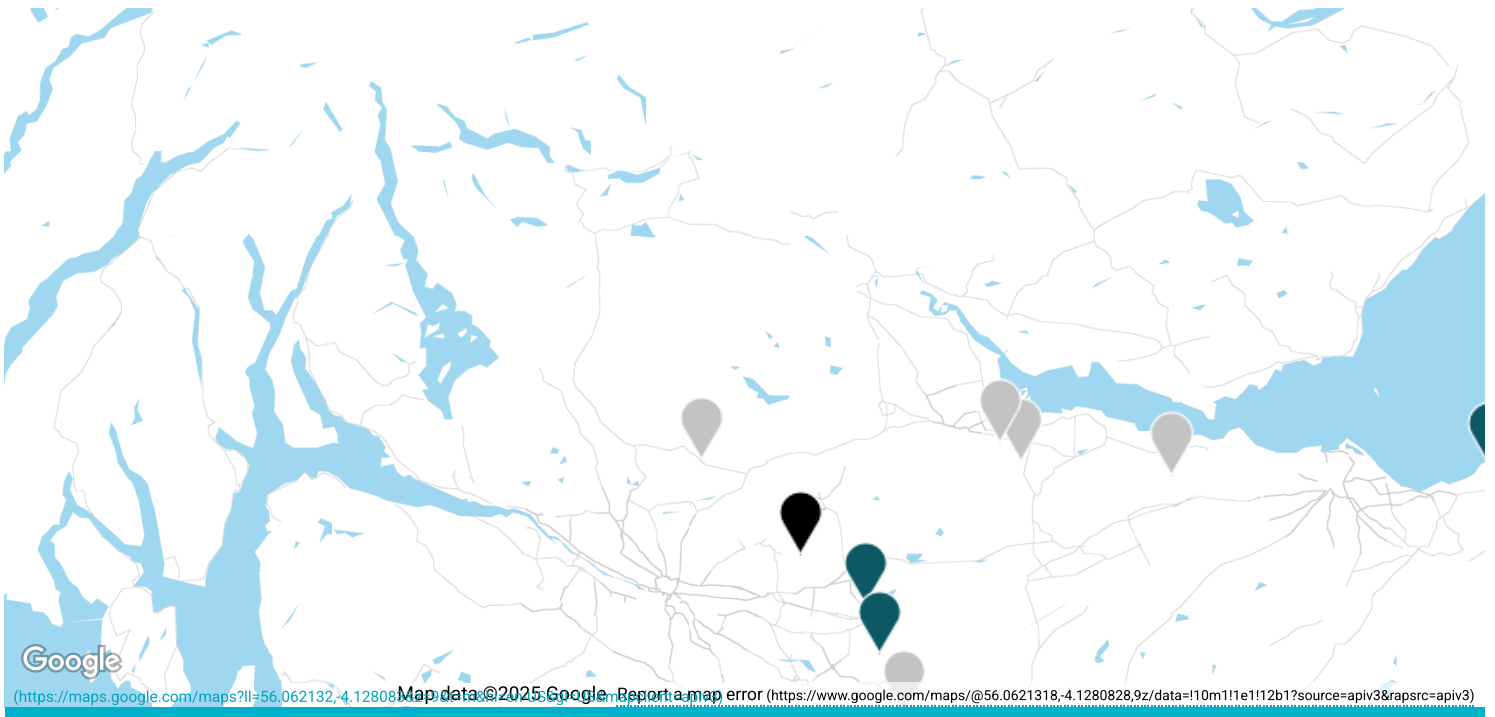




Glenboig

Glenboig is in North Lanarkshire. It was known for its production of fireclay and brickmaking. Coal mining was also developed. Production ceased in the 1980s. With the closure of the Bedlay colliery. Much of the older housing has now been demolished. The town has a number of small local businesses and is a local service centre.

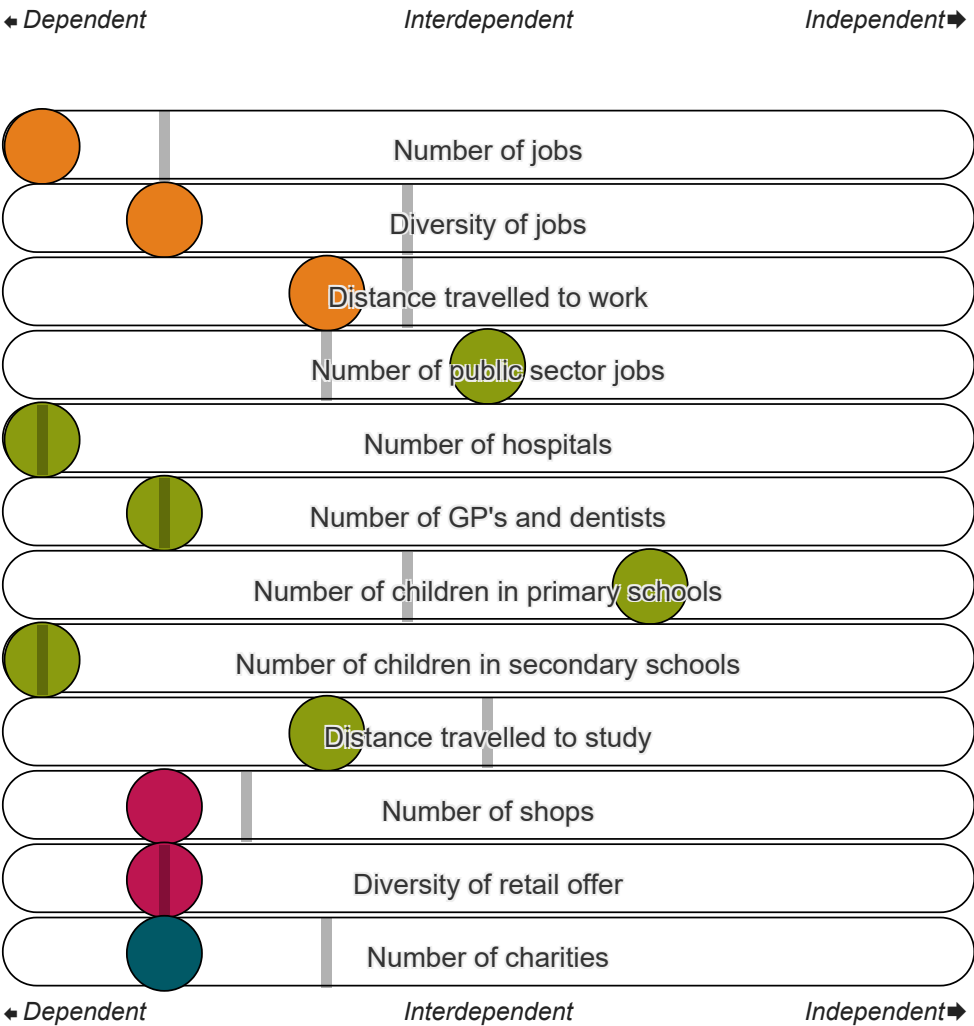
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

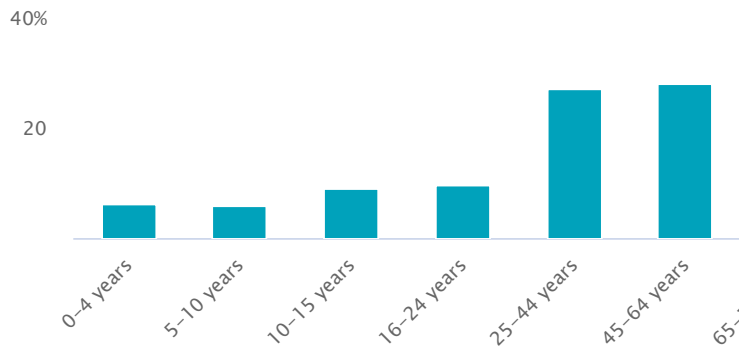

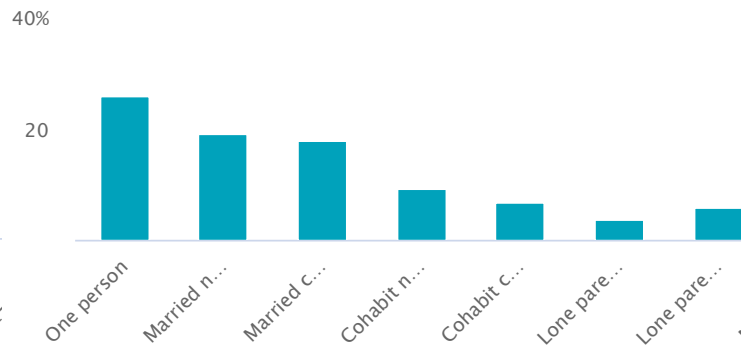

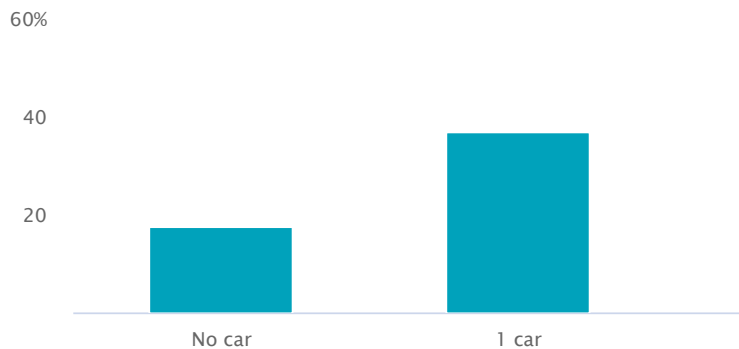

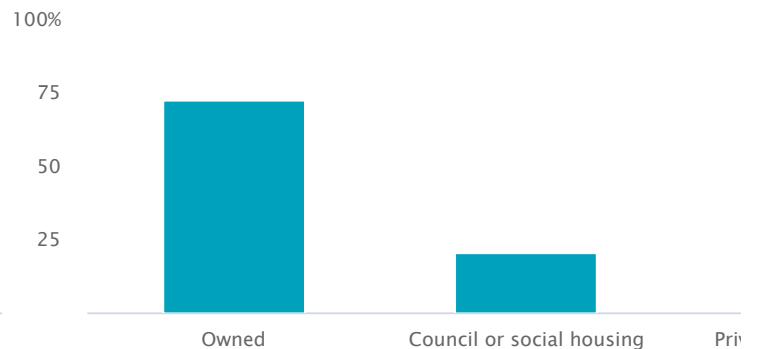

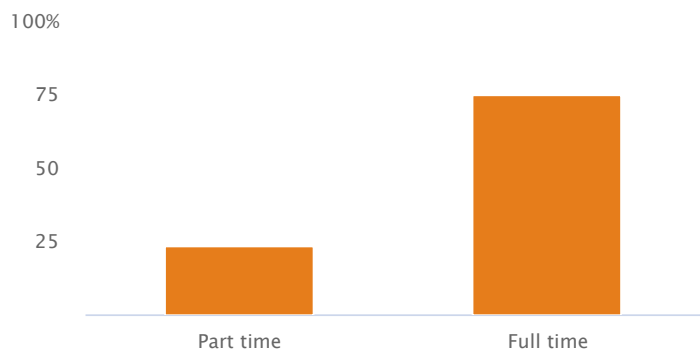

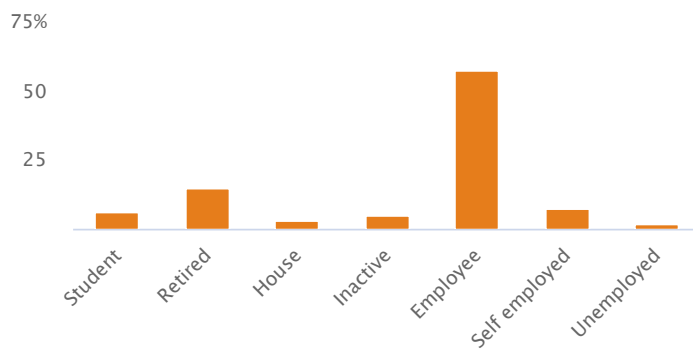
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



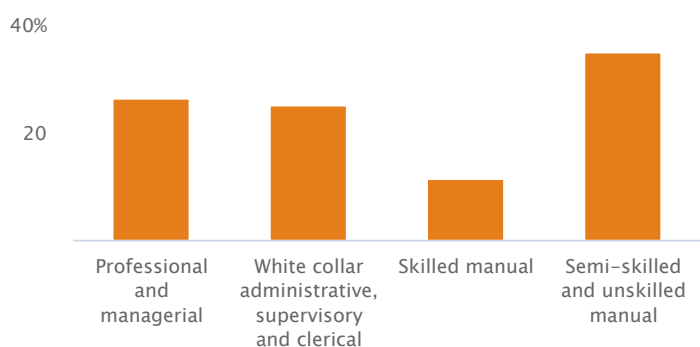
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

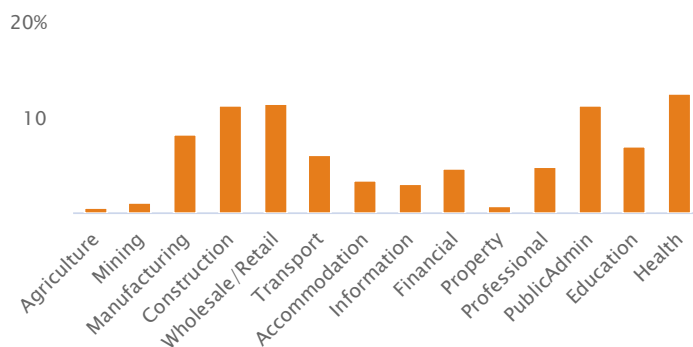

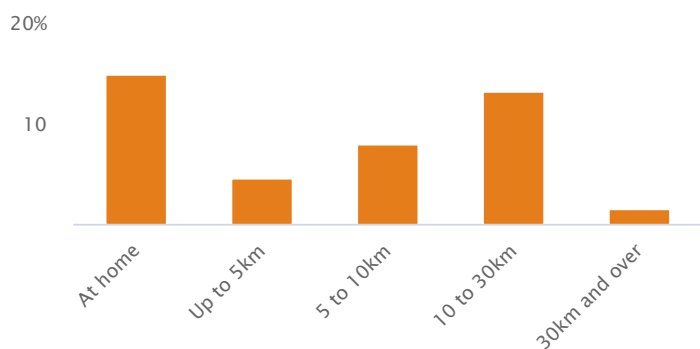
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

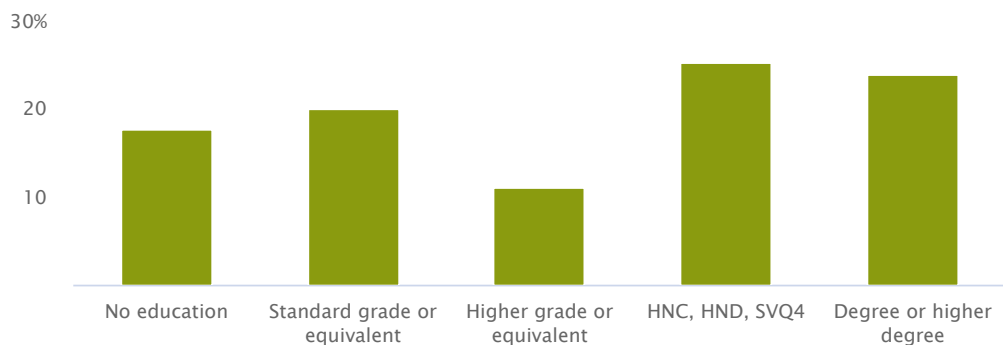


Distance travelled to work

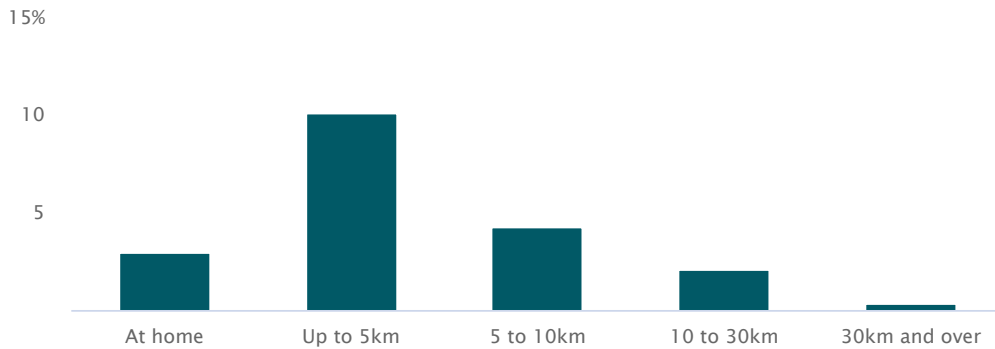
