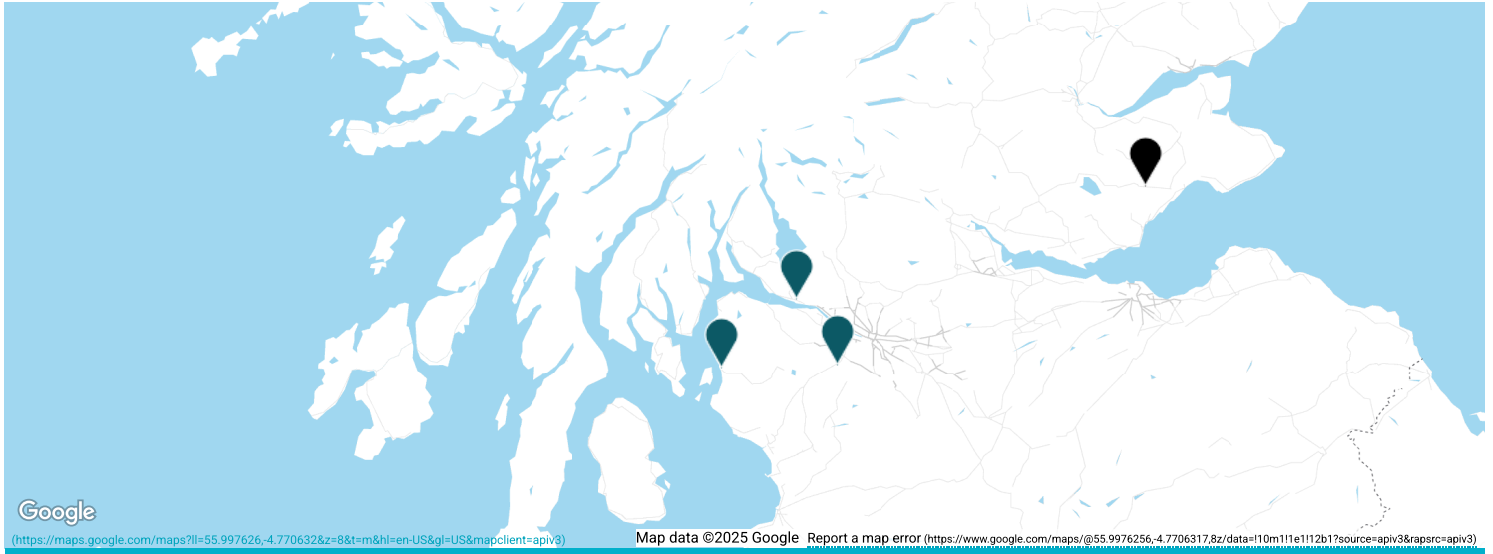

Glenrothes in Fife was built as a new town on a garden city layout. Industries have changed over time. The Rothes colliery and the paper mill closed and the Amazon warehouse moved away. A biomass plant opened. Food processing and light industries (including Raytheon Systems) are to be found. As the administrative headquarters for Fife administrative employment is important

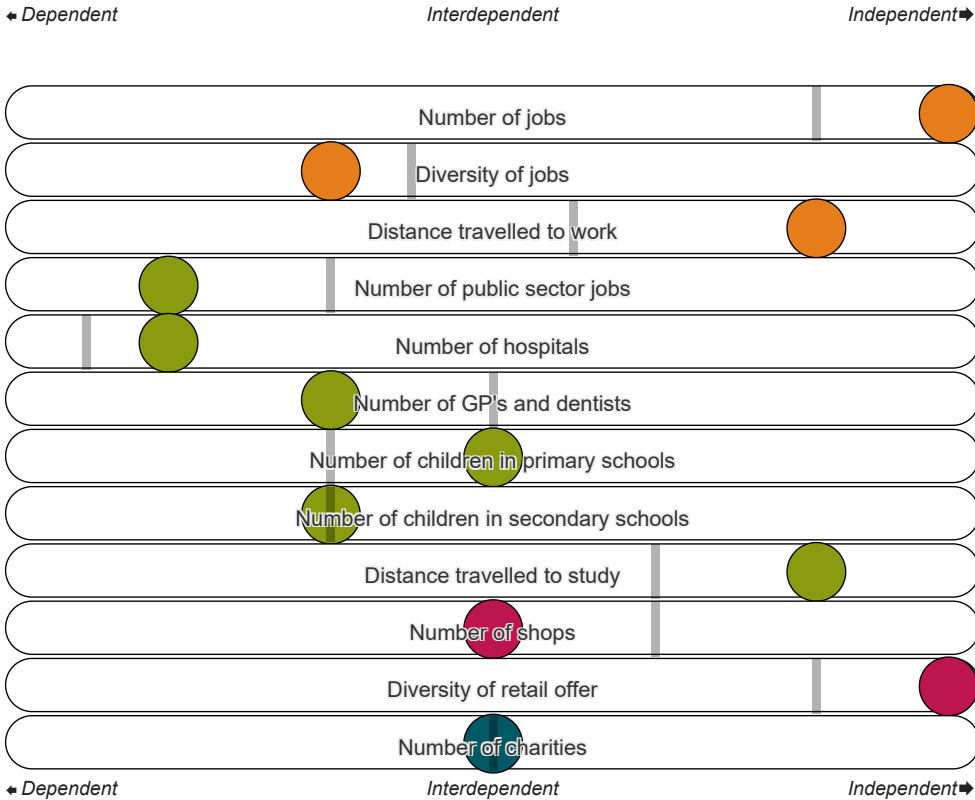
In large towns such as this, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Glenrothes is an interdependent town.

Glenrothes is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Glenrothes is grouped with 3 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

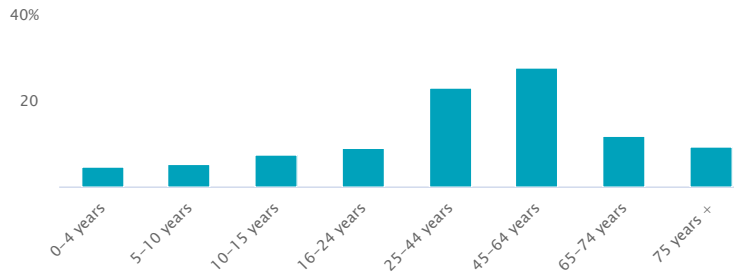

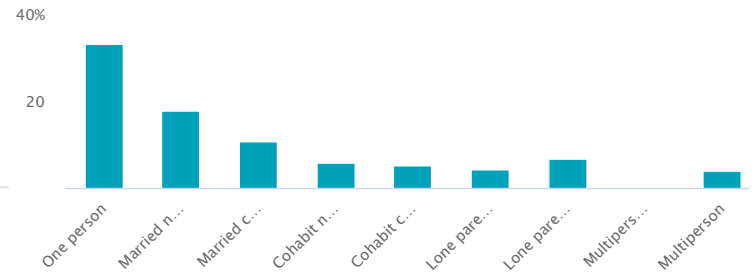

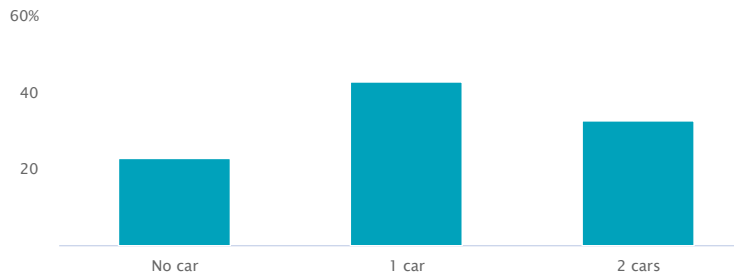

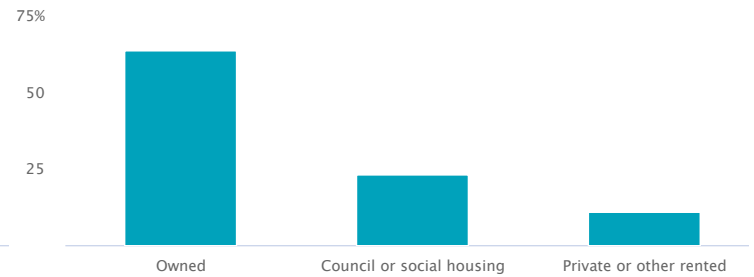
Household composition

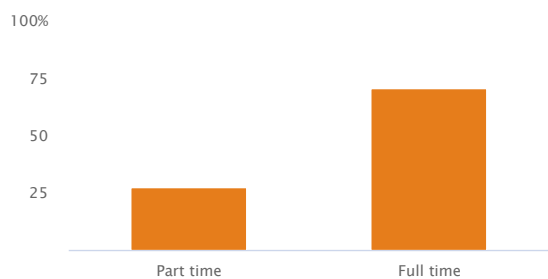

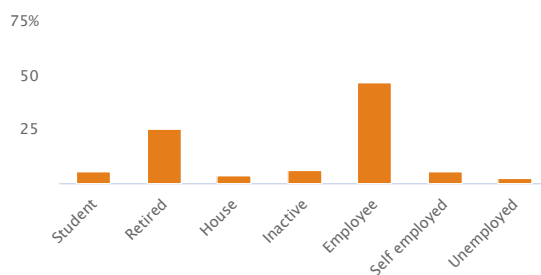
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



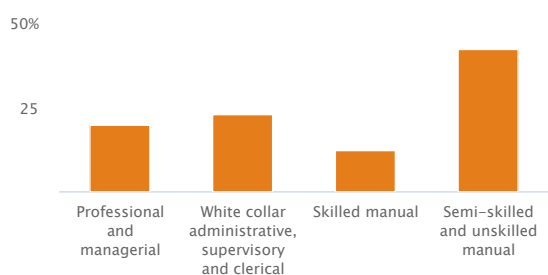
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

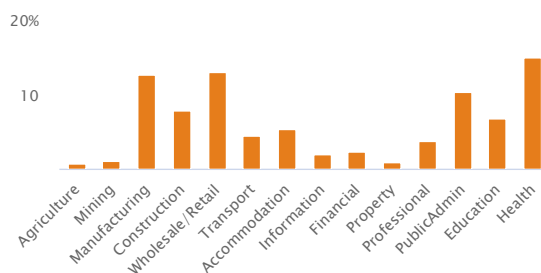

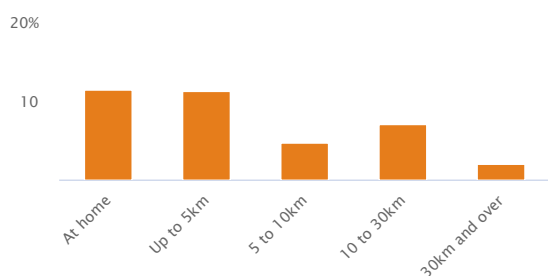
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

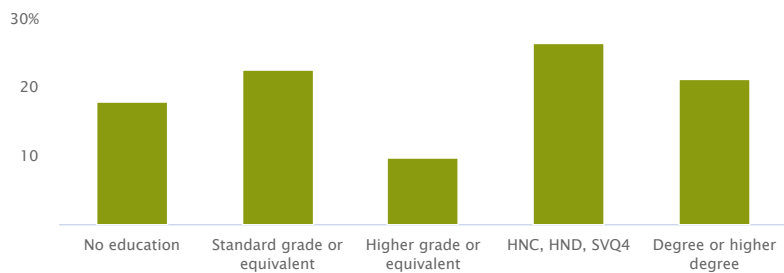


Distance travelled to work

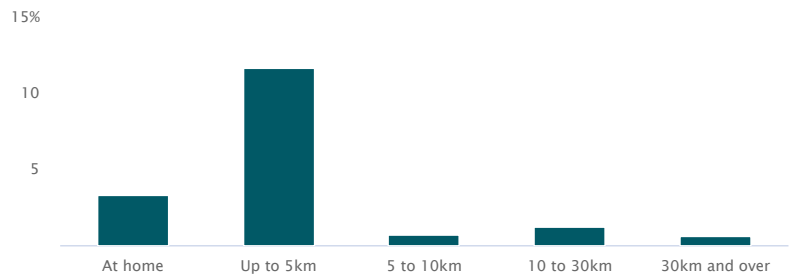
