Granttown-on-Spey is in Highland. It was an 18th century planned village created by the Grant family. It is a local service centre. It is also popular with tourists who have been visiting the town since Victorian times. Other industries include distilling and engineering and fabrication.

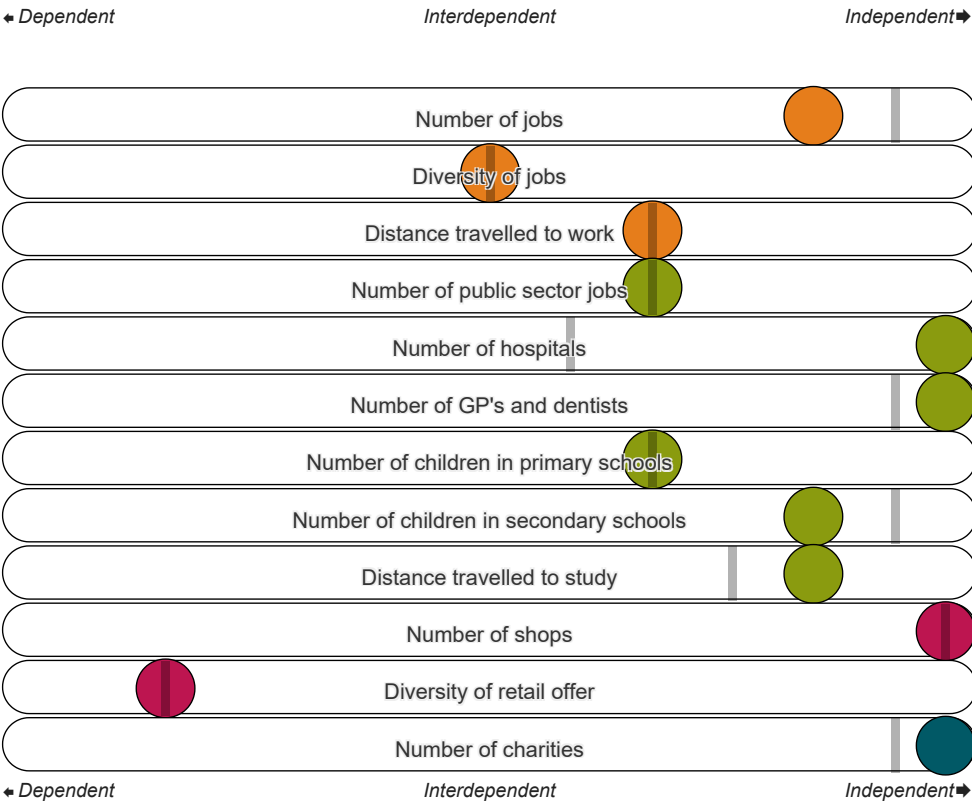
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Granttown-on-Spey is an independent to interdependent town.

Granttown-on-Spey is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Granttown-on-Spey is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

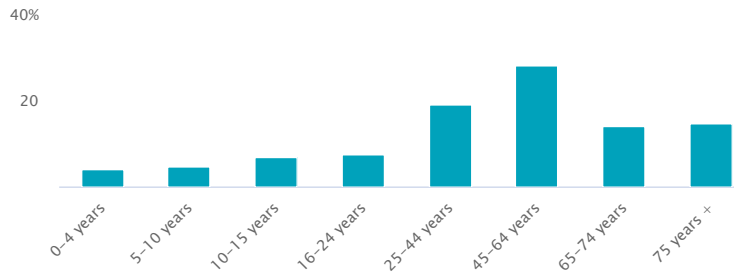

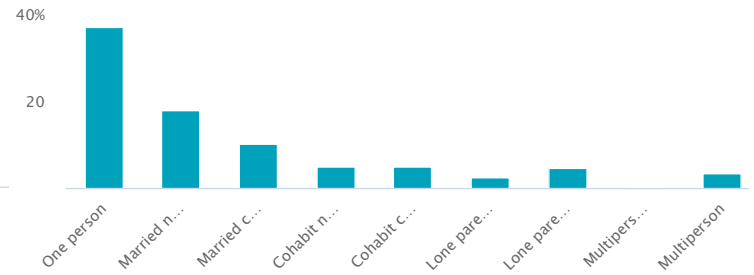

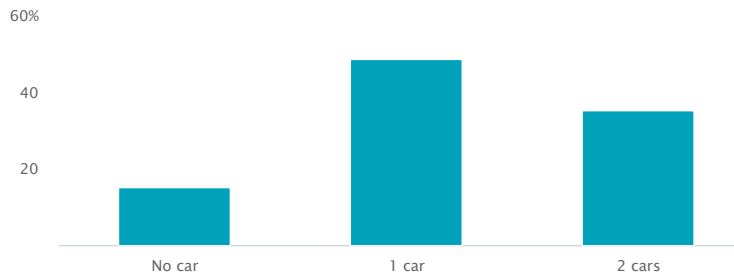

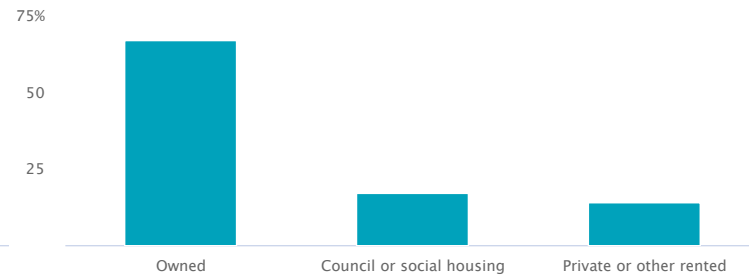

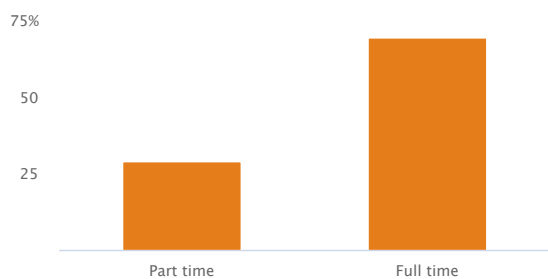

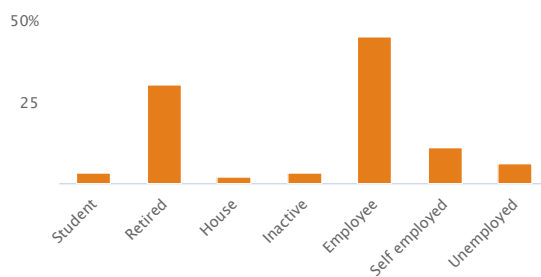
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



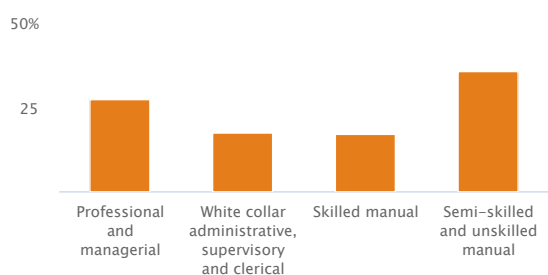
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

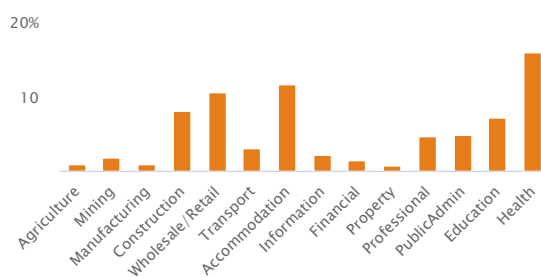


Social Grade

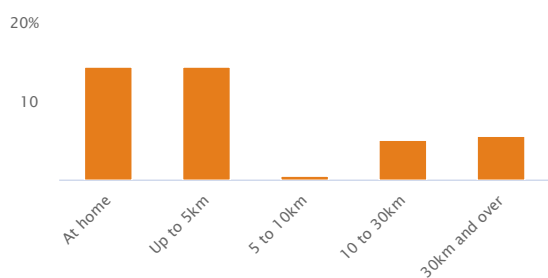
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

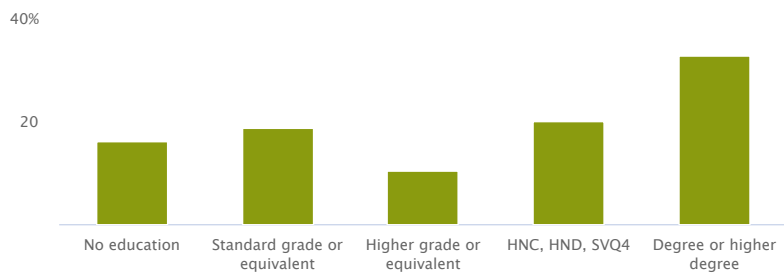


Distance travelled to work

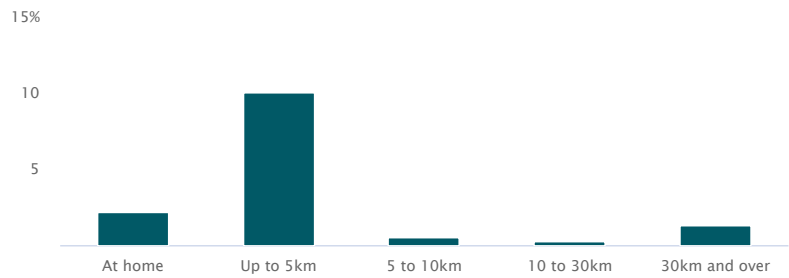
