Greenock is in Inverclyde. Its history is linked to its location. As early as the 12th century it was recognised as a safe anchorage. It developed as a fishing village to become a trading port exporting herring. From the 18th century it emerged as a port trading across the Atlantic and importing sugar and tobacco. Related processing activities such as sugar refining (Tate and Lyle closed in 1997) followed. In wartime torpedoes were manufactured and the Atlantic convoys used the port. The heavy industries (especially shipbuilding) of the post-war years have now declined. Electronic industries developed (IBM, Texas Instruments, Lenovo and Sanmina) but have now gone elsewhere and service industries such as call centres have opened.


In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Greenock is an interdependent to independent town.

Its most similar towns are Alloa, Clydebank, Coatbridge, and Irvine.










