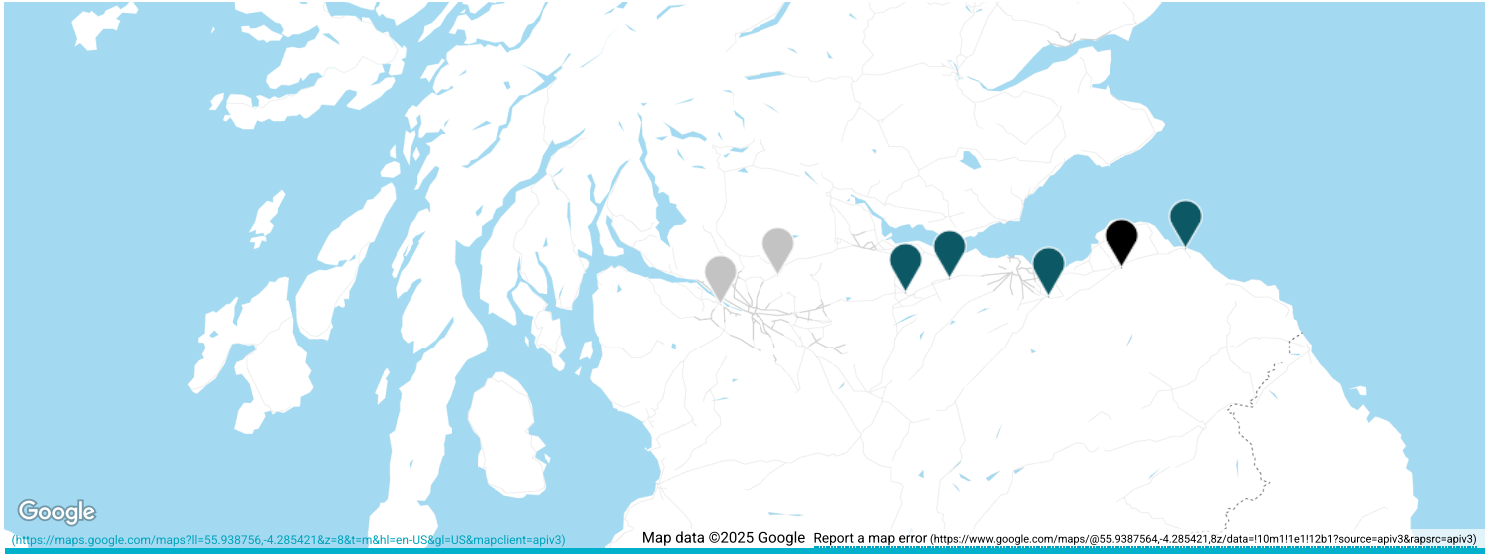




Haddington

EAST LoTHIAN

POPULATION **11,354**

Haddington is in East Lothian. The name is Anglo-Saxon and it was an important town in the Middle Ages. Its location on the River Tyne meant that it became a point of conflict between the Scots and English. In the 18th and 19th centuries it was an important agricultural centre with a grain market. It is the administrative centre for East Lothian. The former Mitsubishi plant closed in the late 1990s but the town continues to be an important service centre and has a maltings.

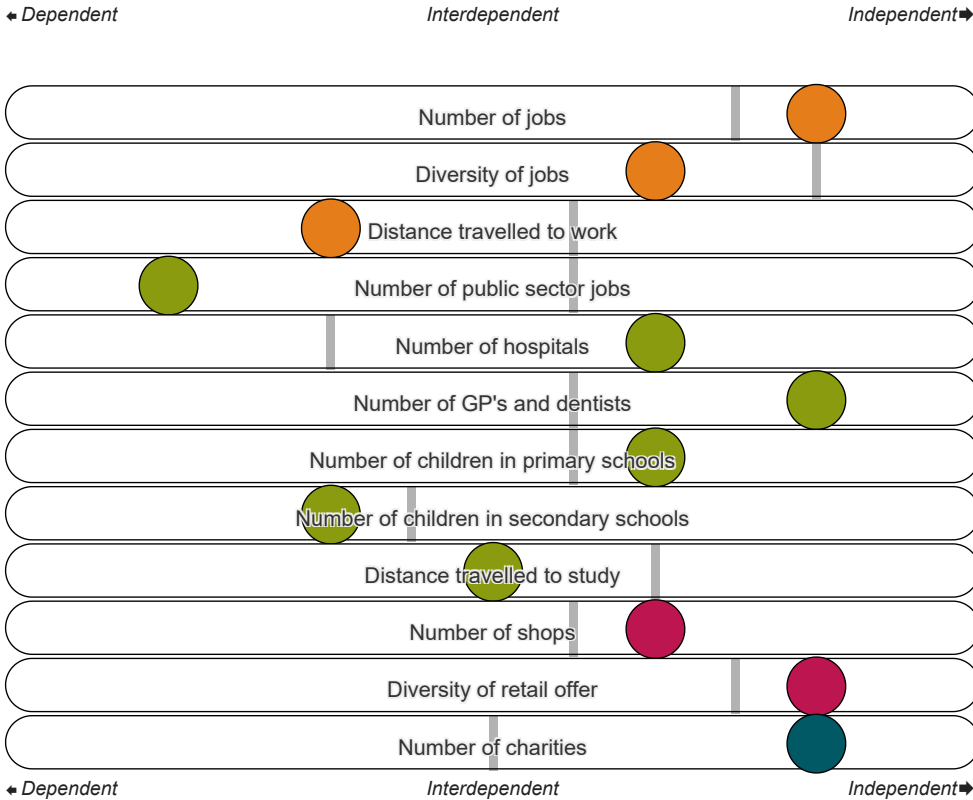
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Haddington is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Haddington is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and hospitals. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Haddington differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

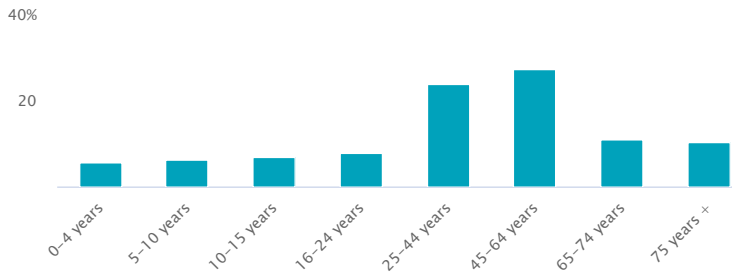

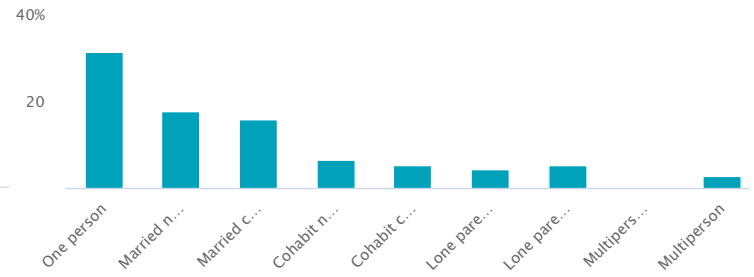

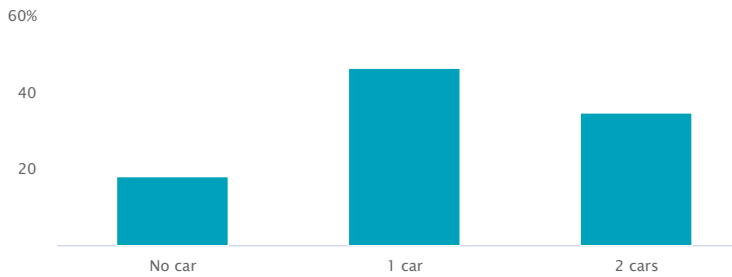

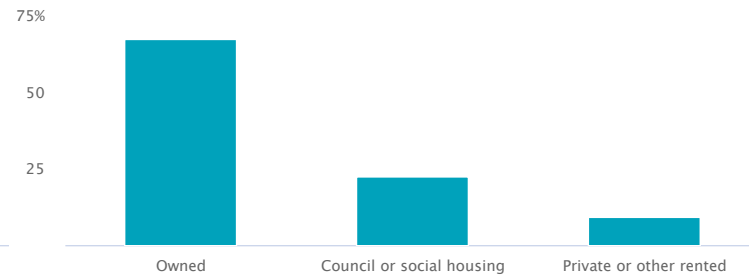
Household composition

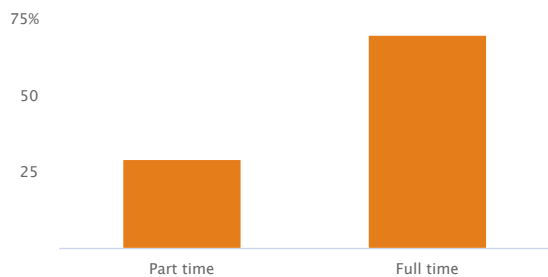

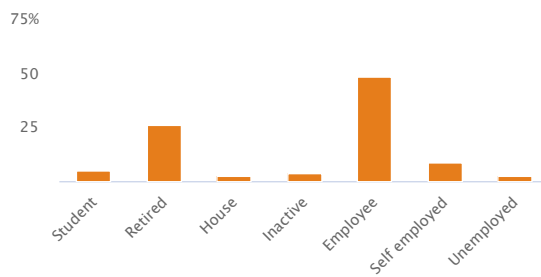
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



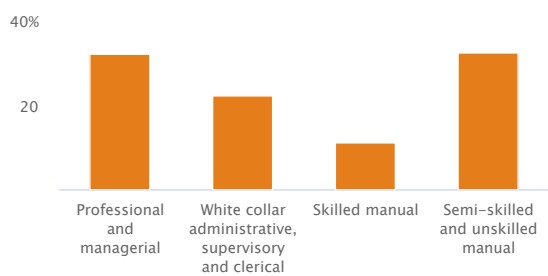
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

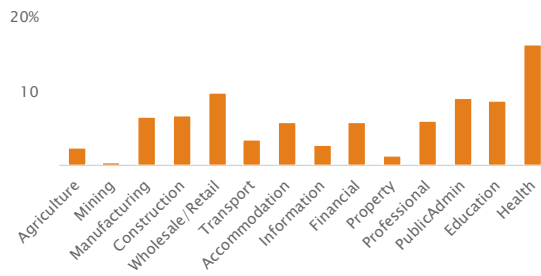


Social Grade

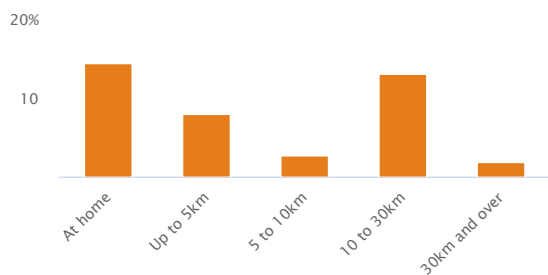
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

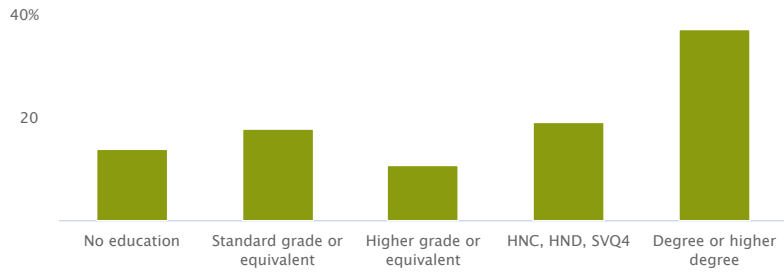


Distance travelled to work

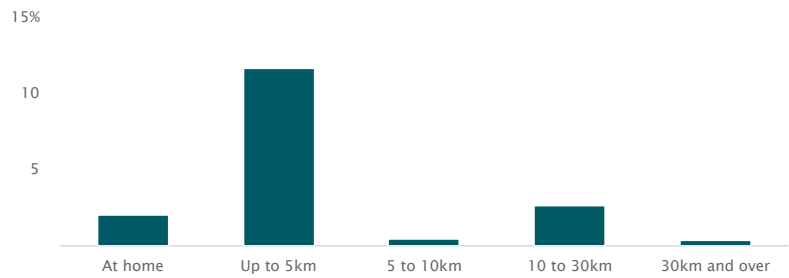
