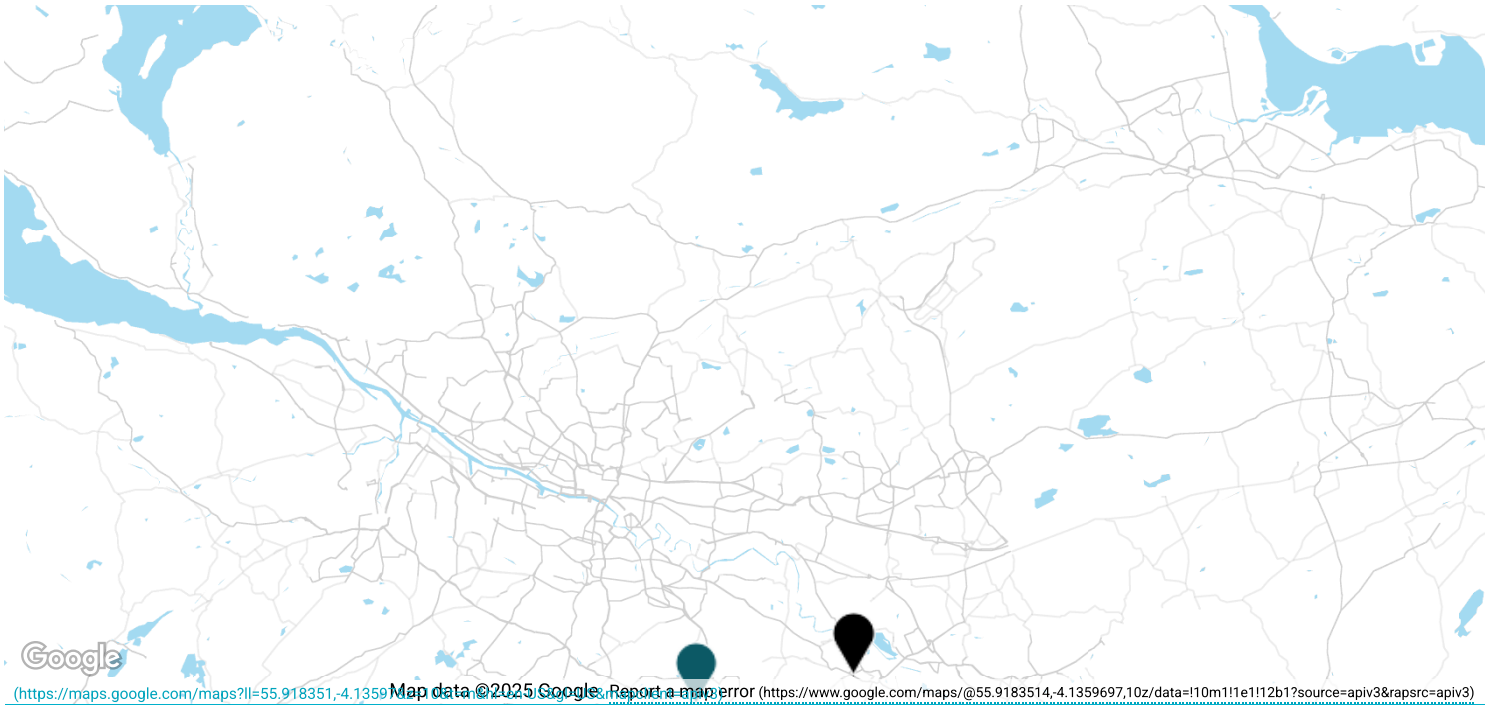




Hamilton

Hamilton is located in South Lanarkshire. It was originally known as Cadzow and only when the Hamilton family was gifted land there did it become Hamilton. The family constructed many of the buildings over the years, in particular Hamilton college. It is the administrative centre for South Lanarkshire.

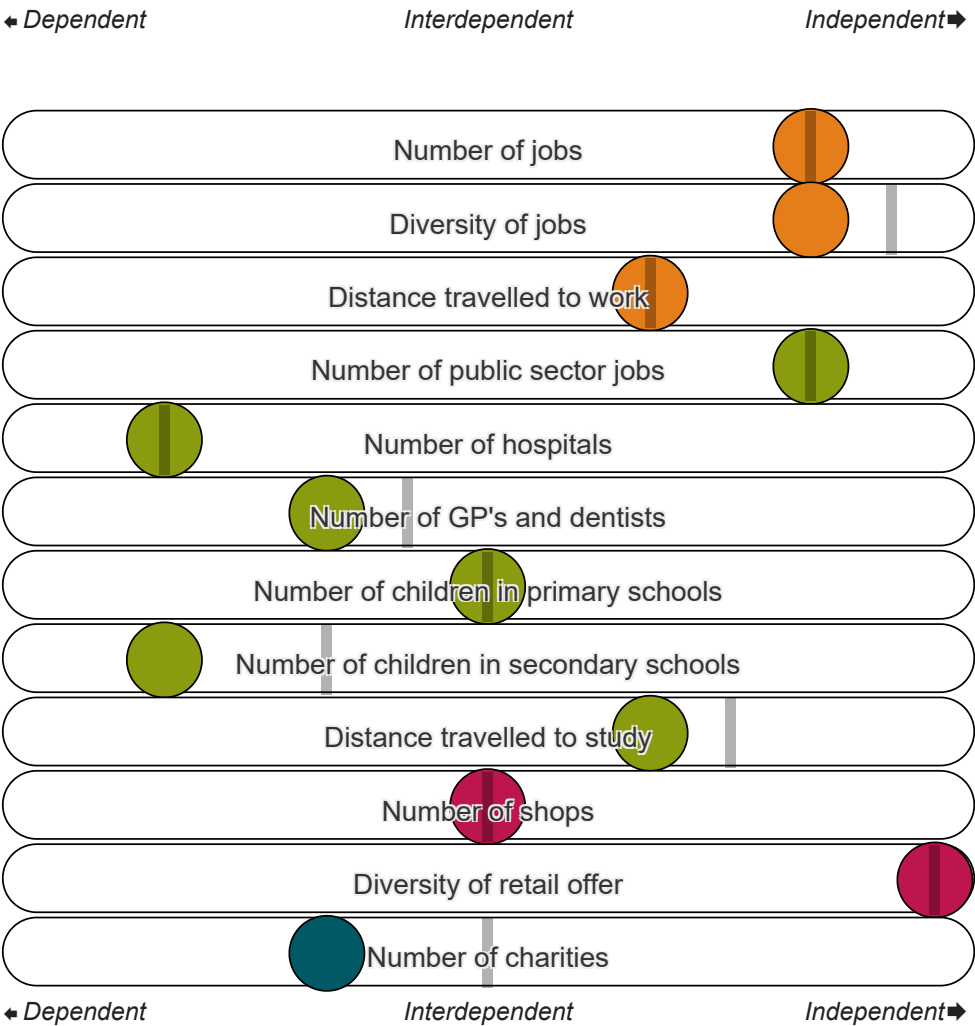
In cities like this, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Hamilton is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Hamilton is grouped with 3 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

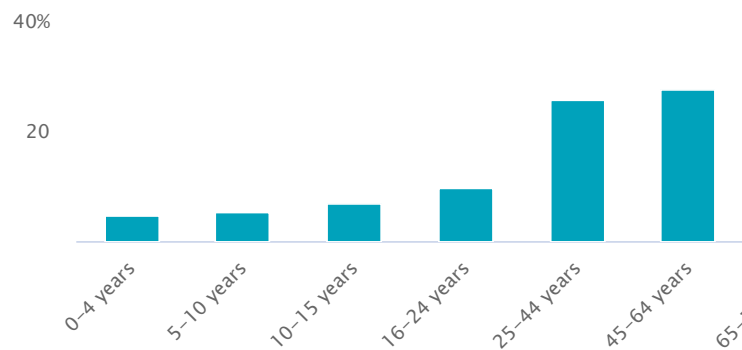

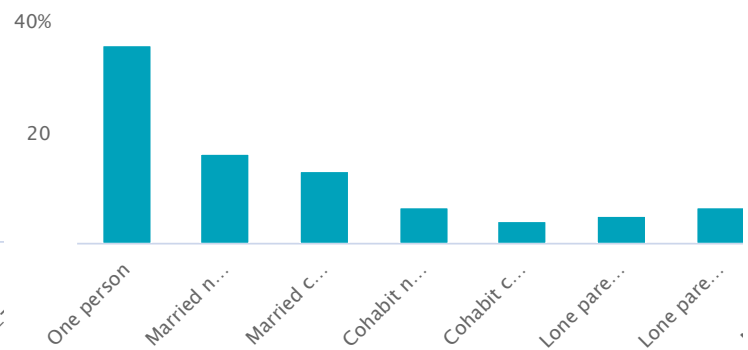

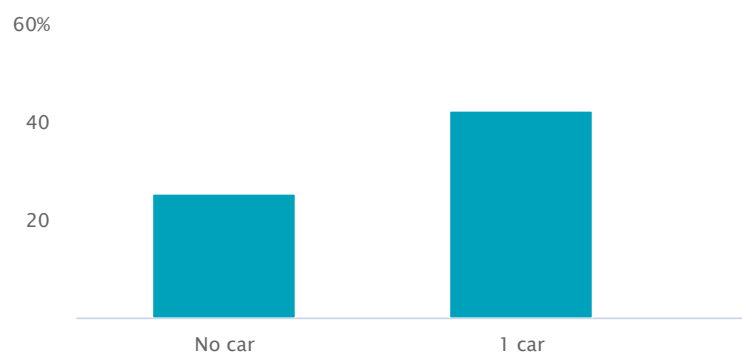

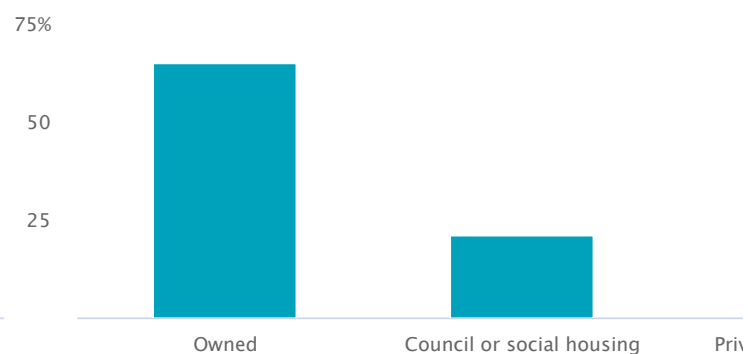

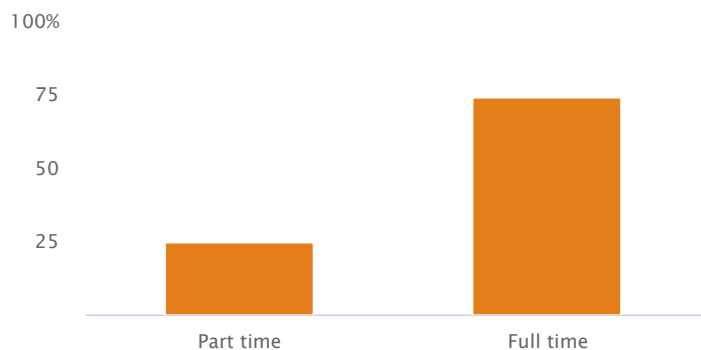

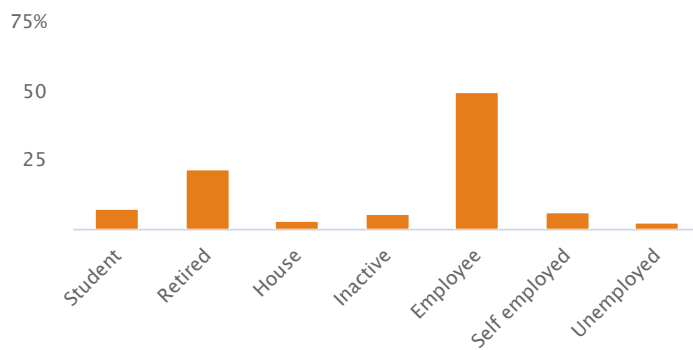
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



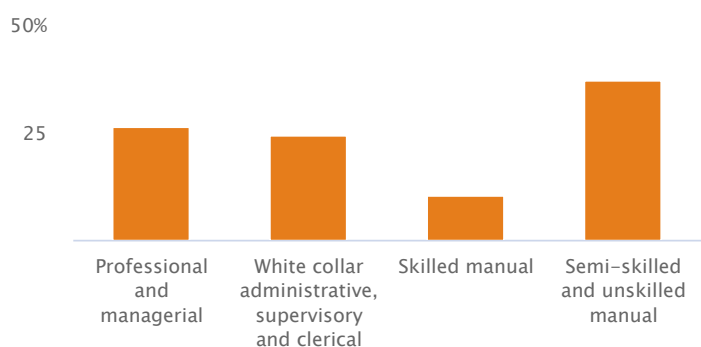
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

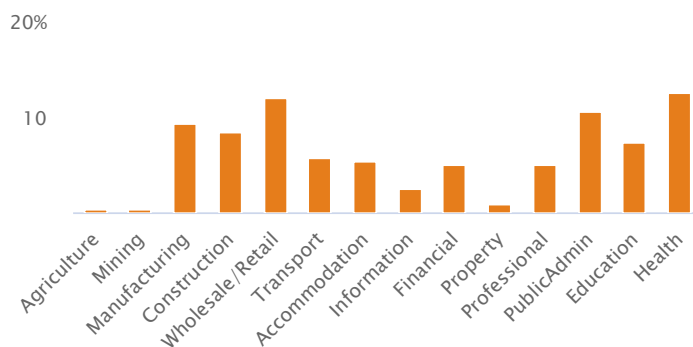

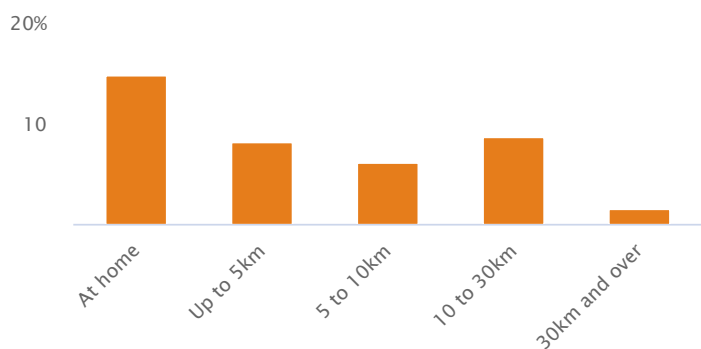
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

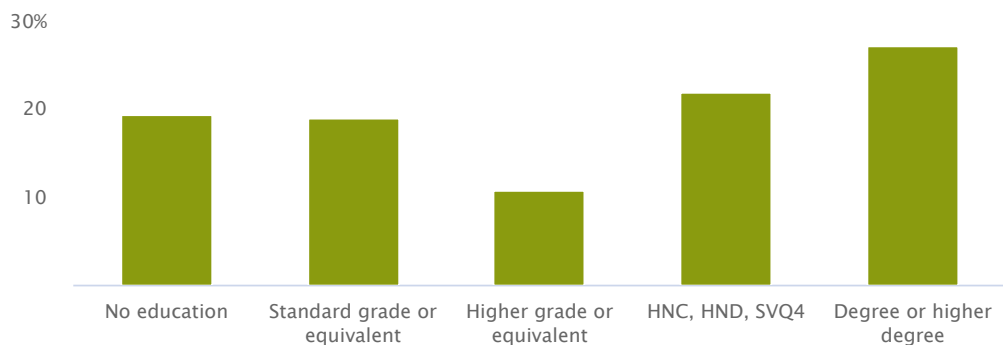


Distance travelled to work

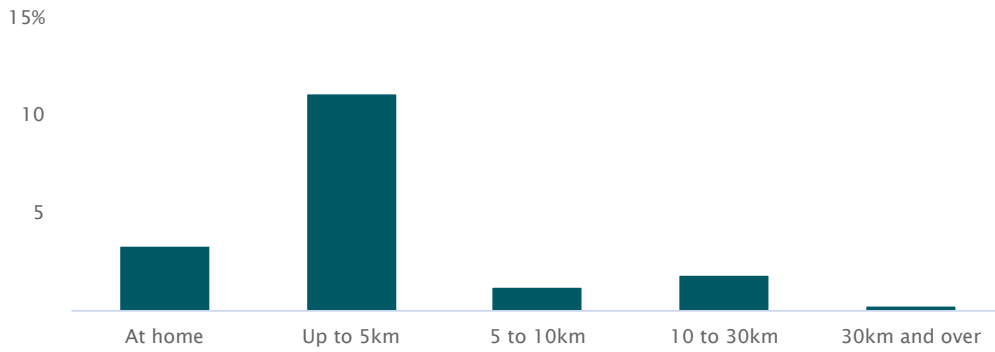
