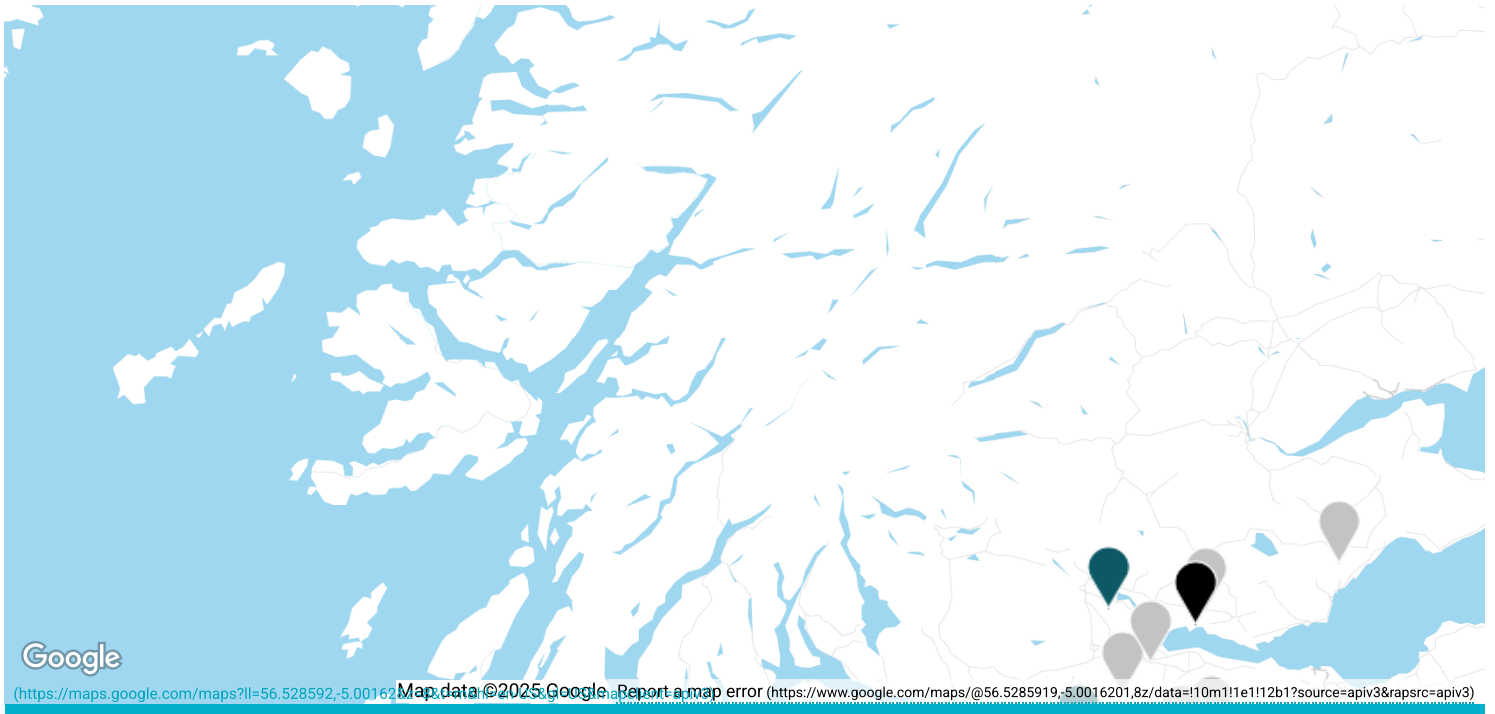




High Valleyfield, Low Valleyfield and Culross

High Valleyfield in Fife was a 20th century coal mining town. The Valleyfield colliery operated from 1908 until 1978. Public housing was built for mine workers. Today new private housing has been built.

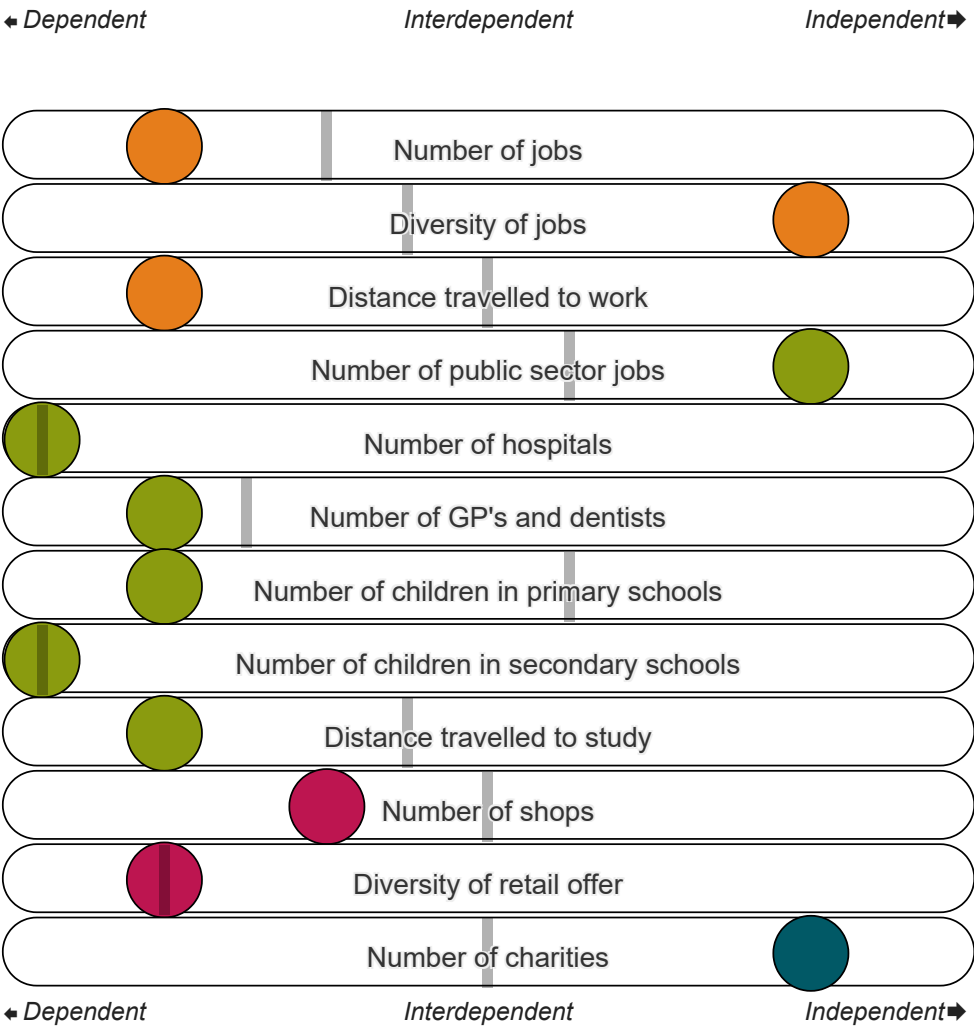
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

High Valleyfield, Low Valleyfield and Culross is an interdependent to dependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Ardersier](#), [Calderbank](#), [Cowie](#), and [Douglas](#).

Inter-relationships



High Valleyfield, Low Valleyfield and Culross is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, High Valleyfield, Low Valleyfield and Culross is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. High Valleyfield, Low Valleyfield and Culross differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools; and the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

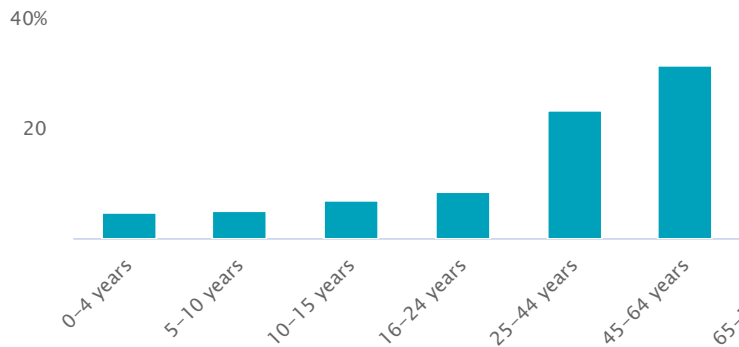
Population change 2011 to 2022

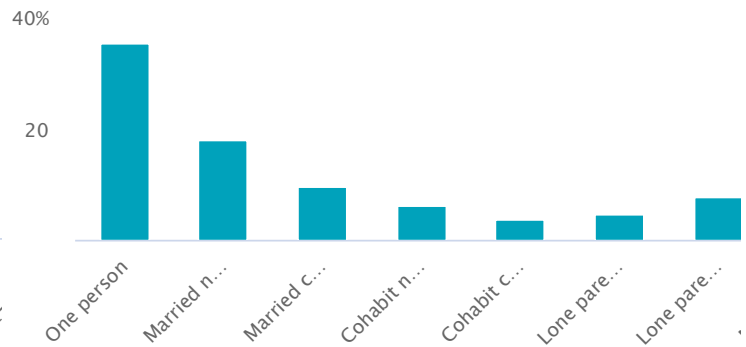

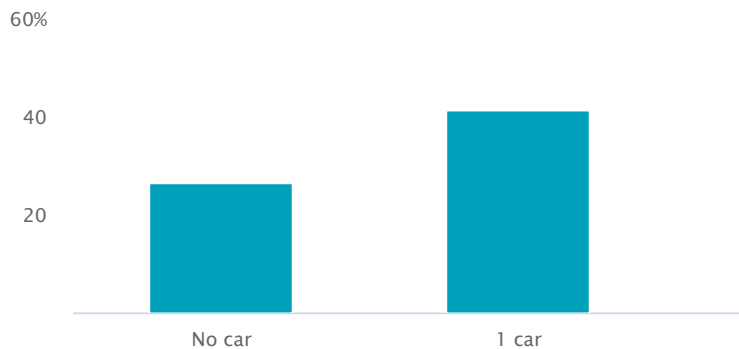

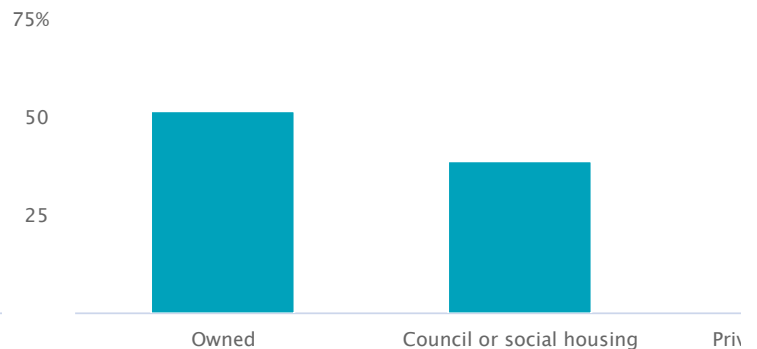
Household composition

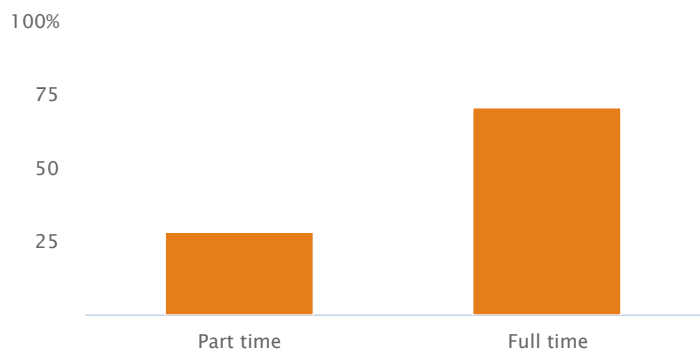

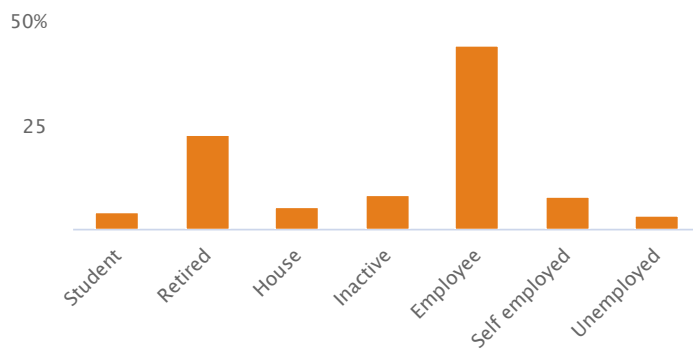
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



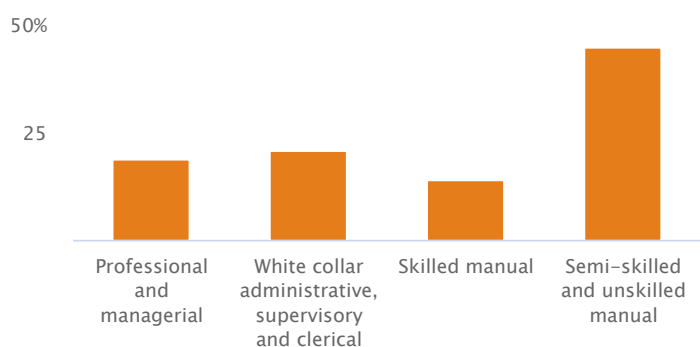
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

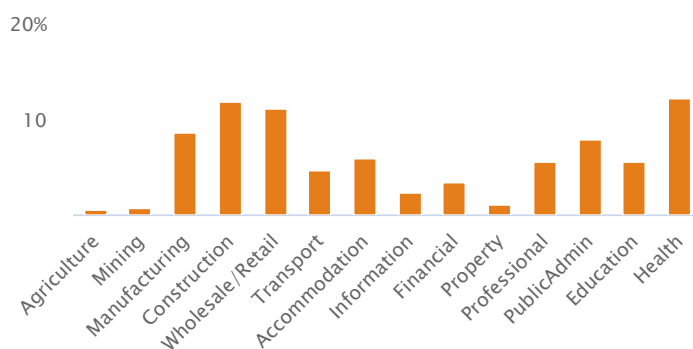


Social Grade

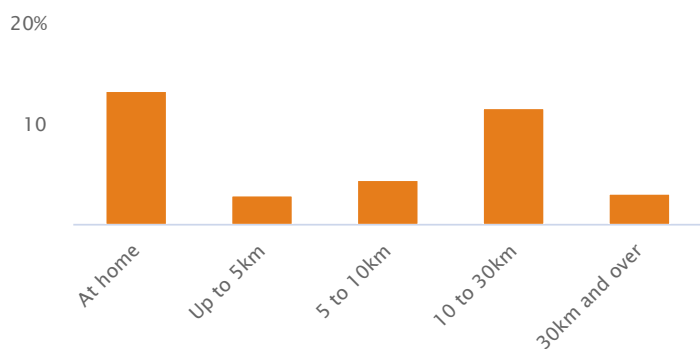
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

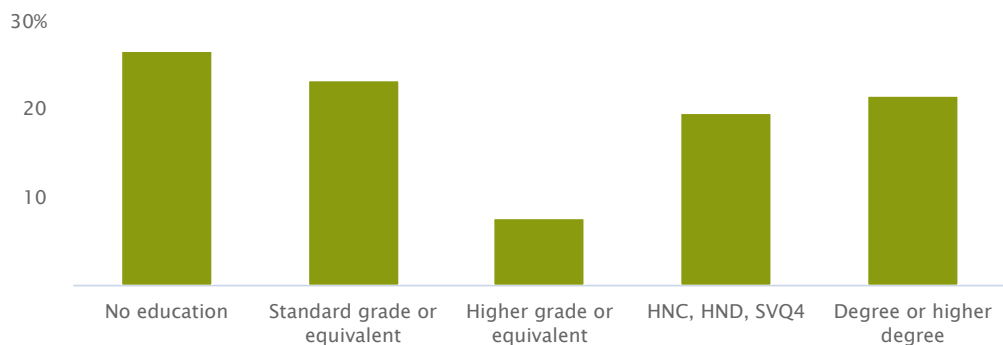


Distance travelled to work

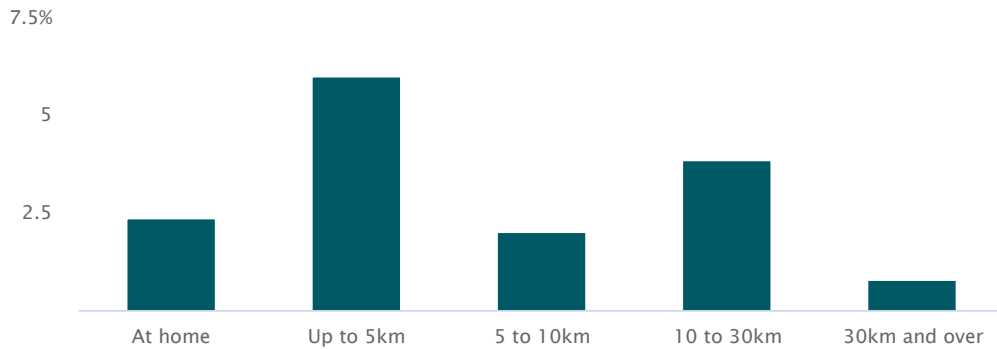
