Huntly is in Aberdeenshire. It was formerly known as Milton of Strathbogie. In the late 18th century the Duke of Gordon established a planned town and the name Huntly was adopted. It is primarily a local service centre with agricultural trades and food processing (including a shortbread factory).

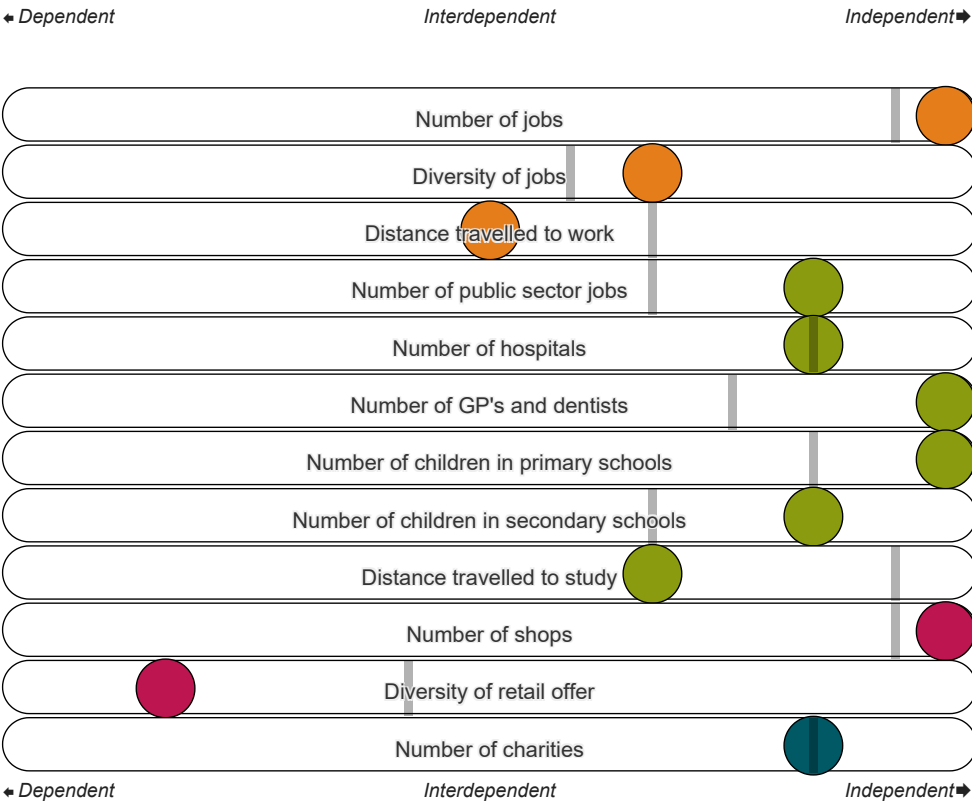
Social and council housing are the norm in towns like Huntly. Manufacturing and construction are the dominant forms of employment. Health and social work services are particularly active. There is a higher level of unemployment. Educational attainment and car ownership are low.

Huntly is an independent to interdependent town.

Huntly is an **independent to interdependent** town.

It differs in terms of the number of GP's and dentists. Huntly differs most from its group in the distance travelled to study.

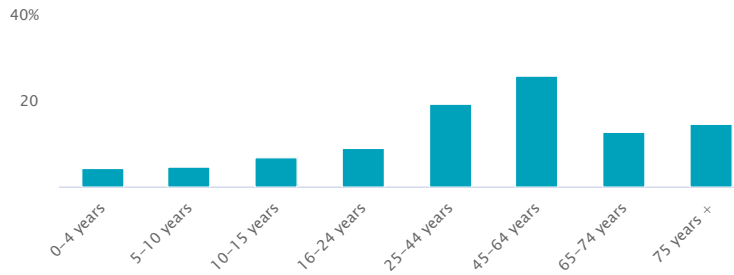

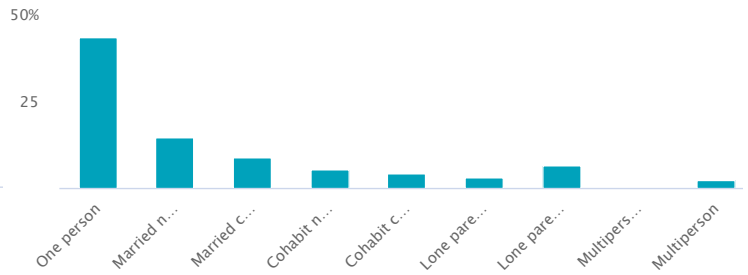

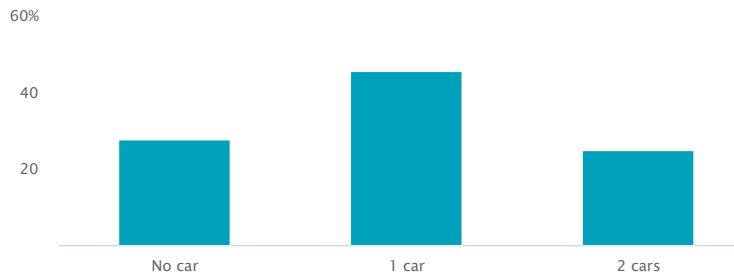

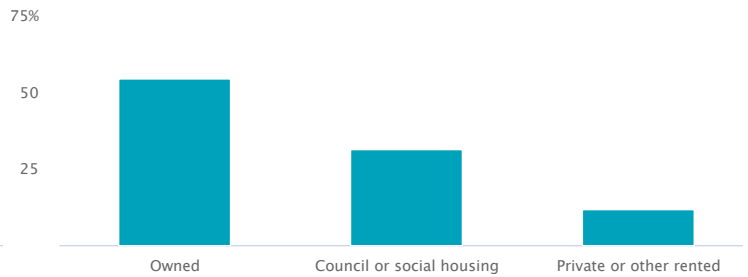

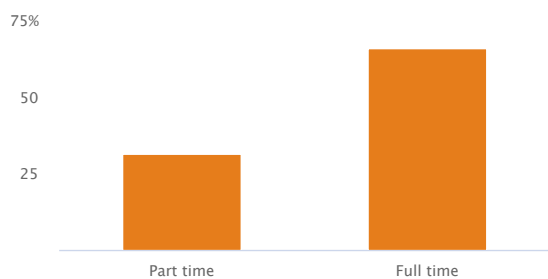

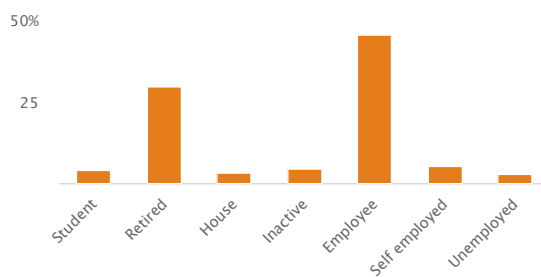
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



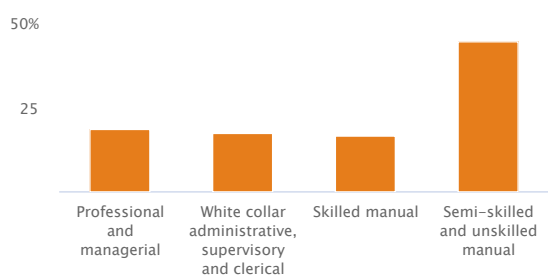
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

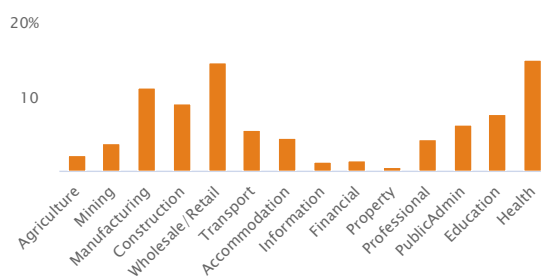

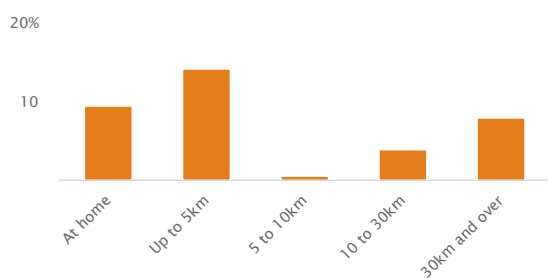
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

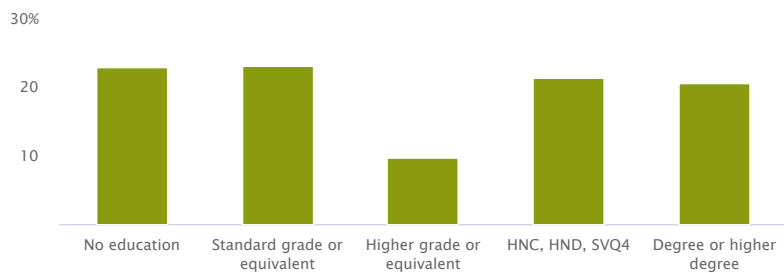


Distance travelled to work

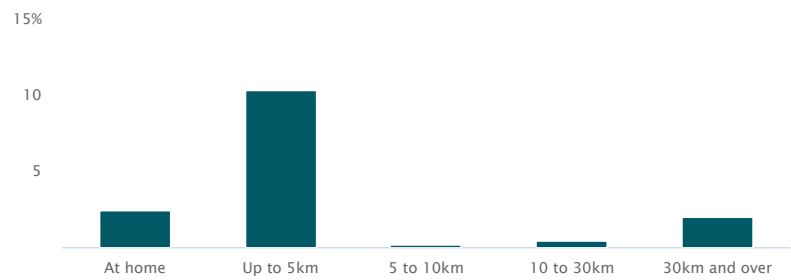
