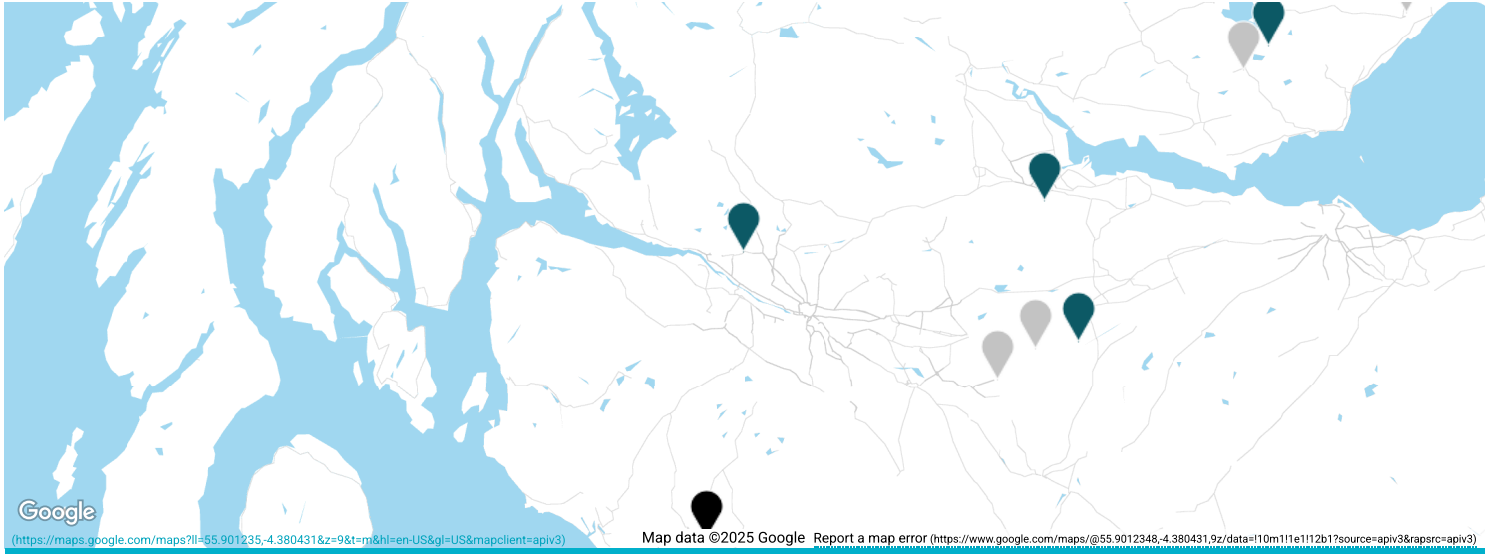




Hurlford and Crookedholm

Hurlford and Crookedholm in East Ayrshire developed after coal was found. Fireclay and ironstone were also worked and iron and steel produced. Today it is a residential settlement with easy access to Kilmarnock.

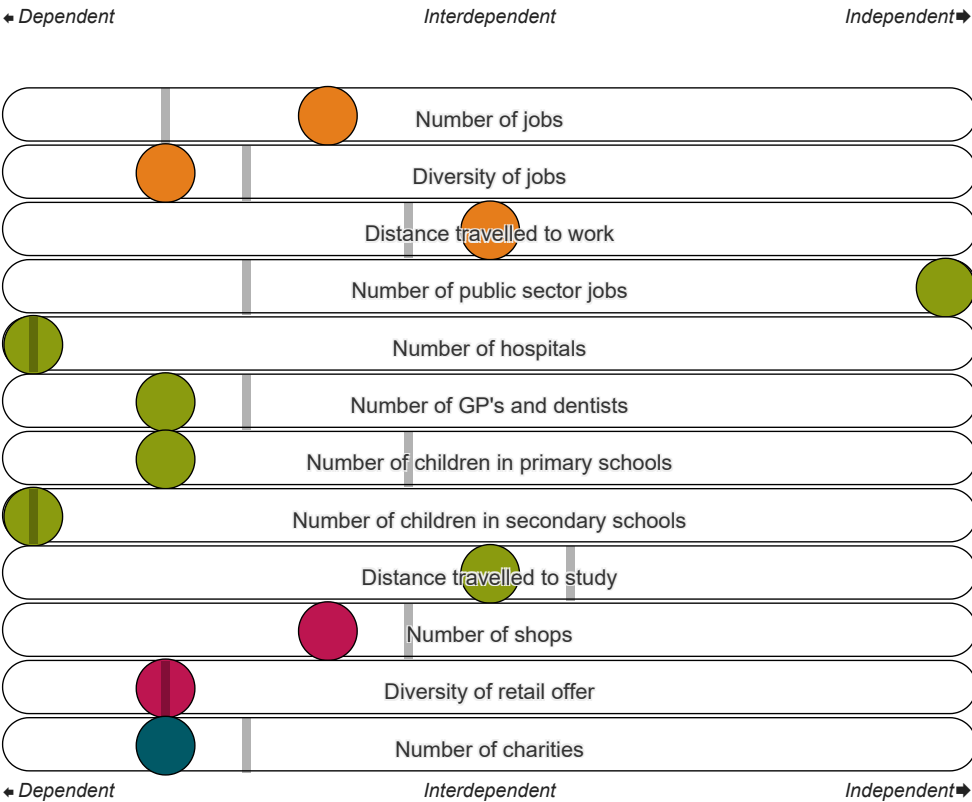
In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Hurlford and Crookedholm is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Hurlford and Crookedholm is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Hurlford and Crookedholm is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

Hurlford and Crookedholm differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

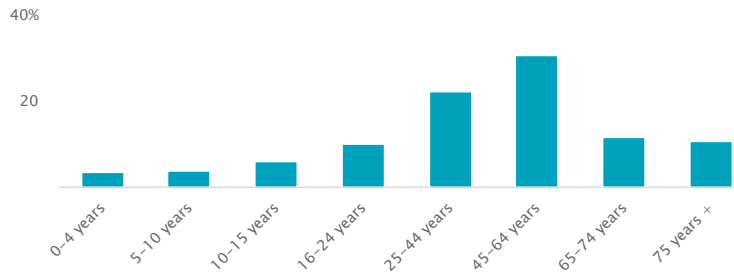

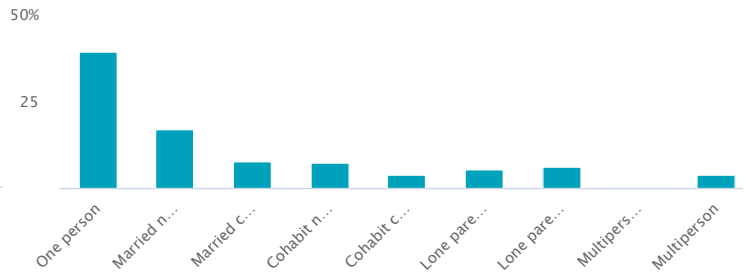

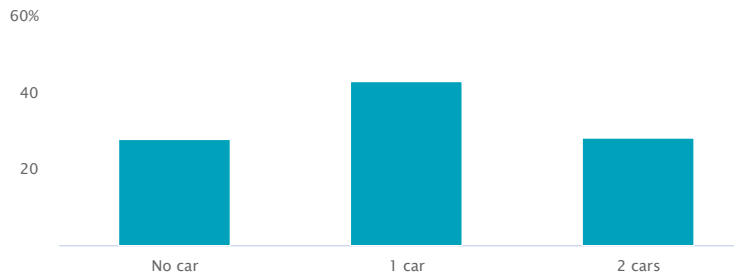

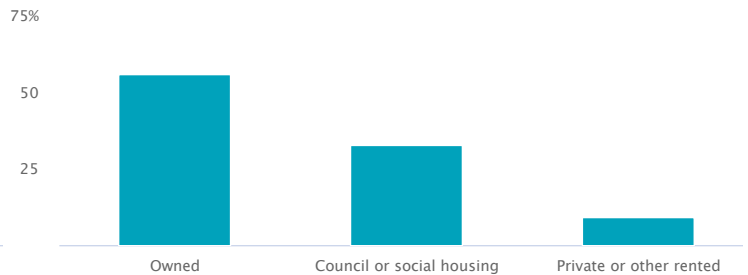

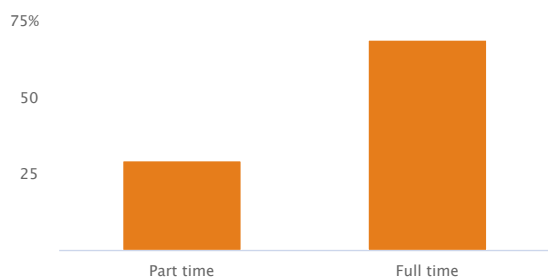

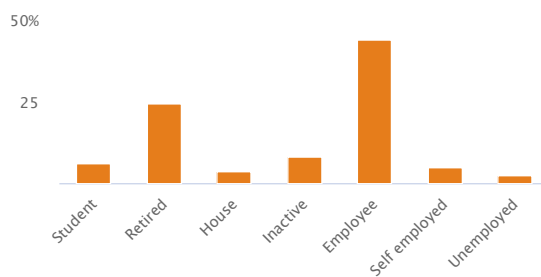
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



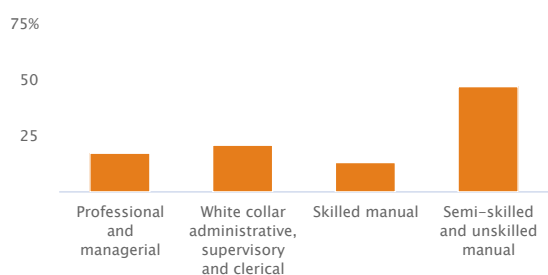
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

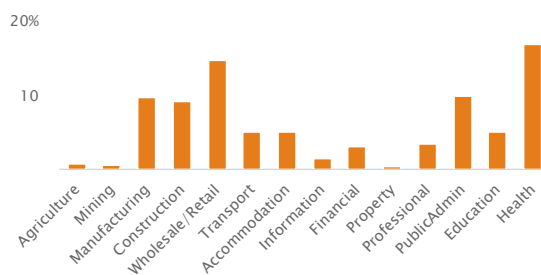

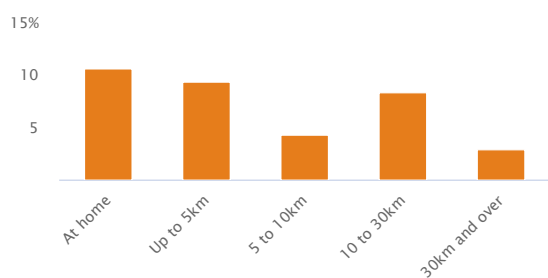
(% households aged 16-64)



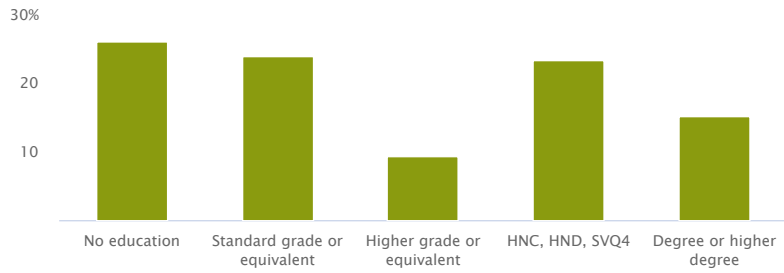
Sector Diversity

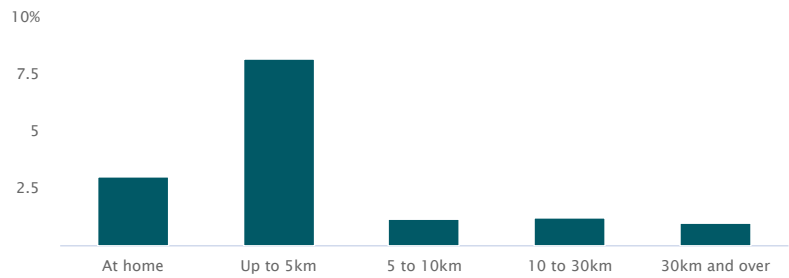
