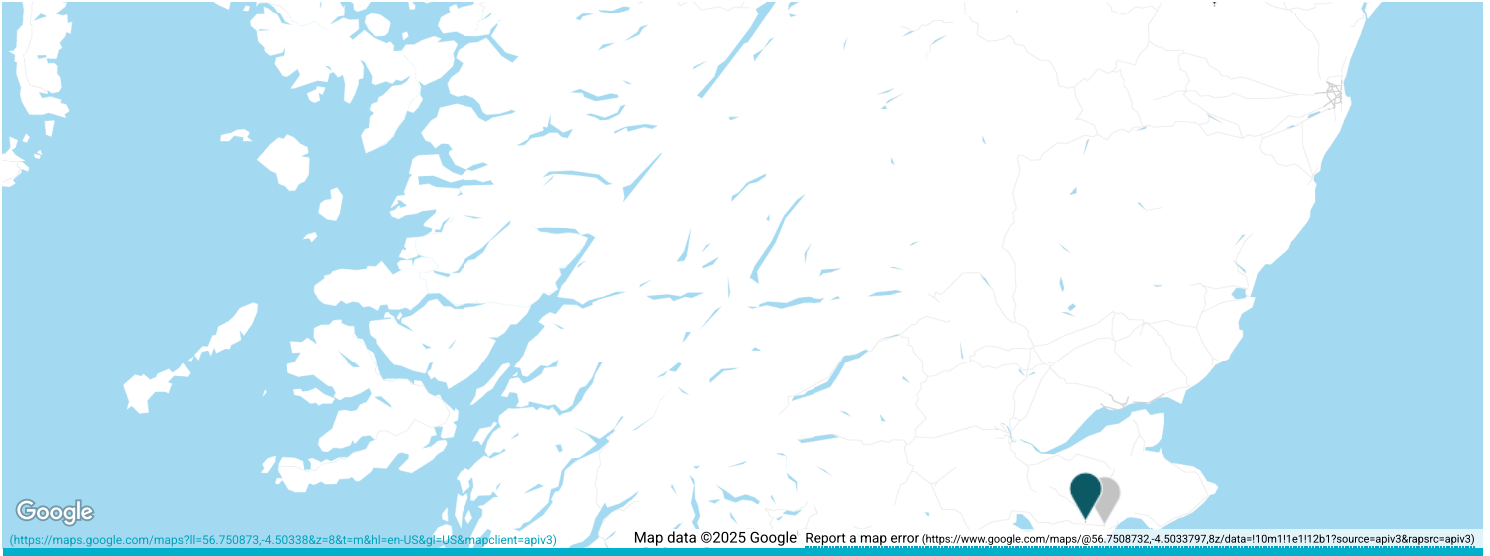




Insch

Insch in Aberdeenshire was a relatively small village until the oil boom. Since then it has become a commuter settlement.

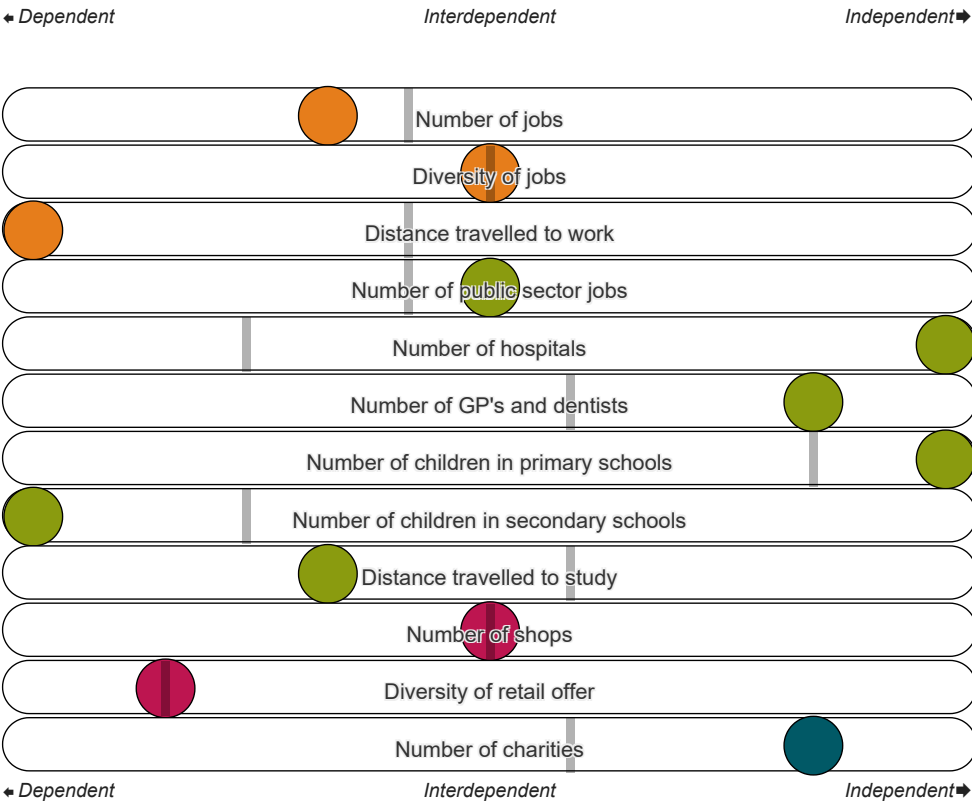
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Insch is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Insch is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Insch differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

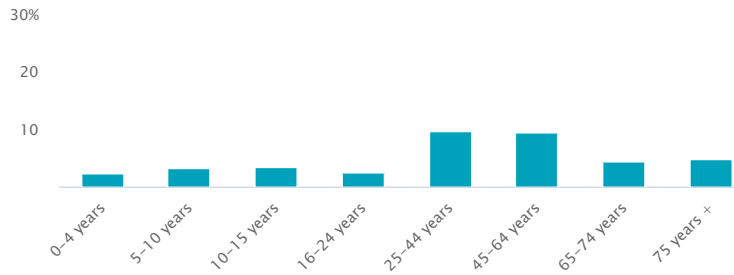

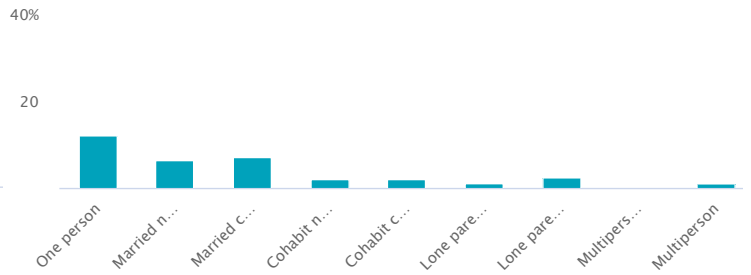

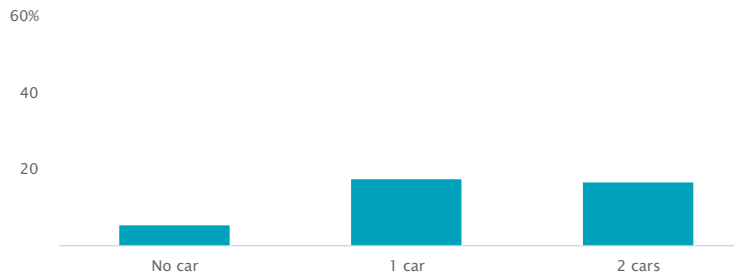

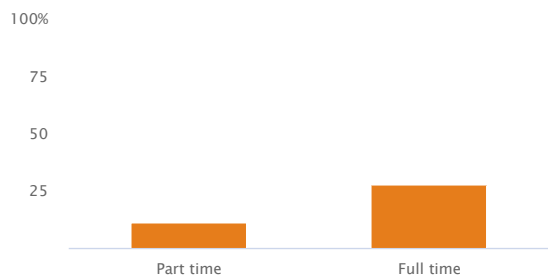

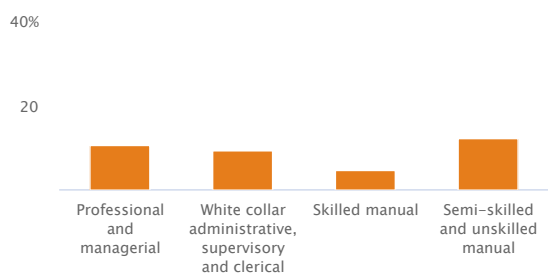
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



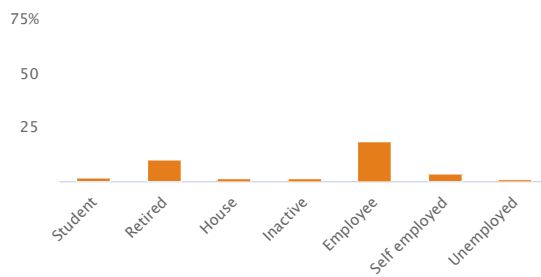
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

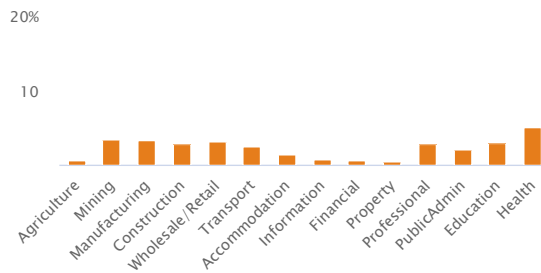

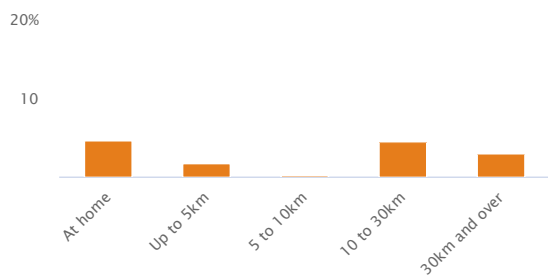

Sector Diversity

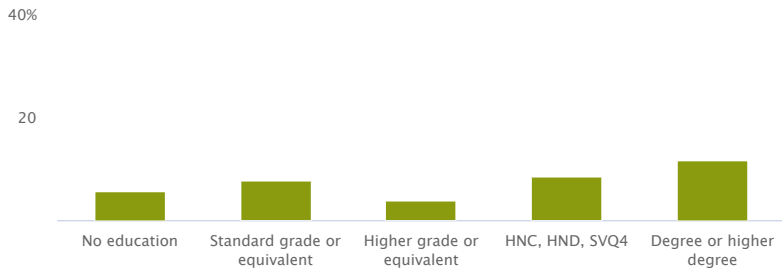


Distance travelled to work

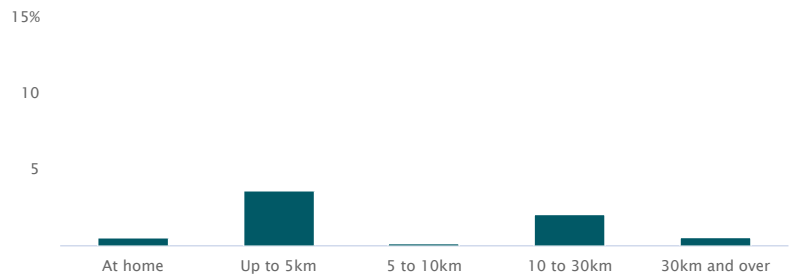
