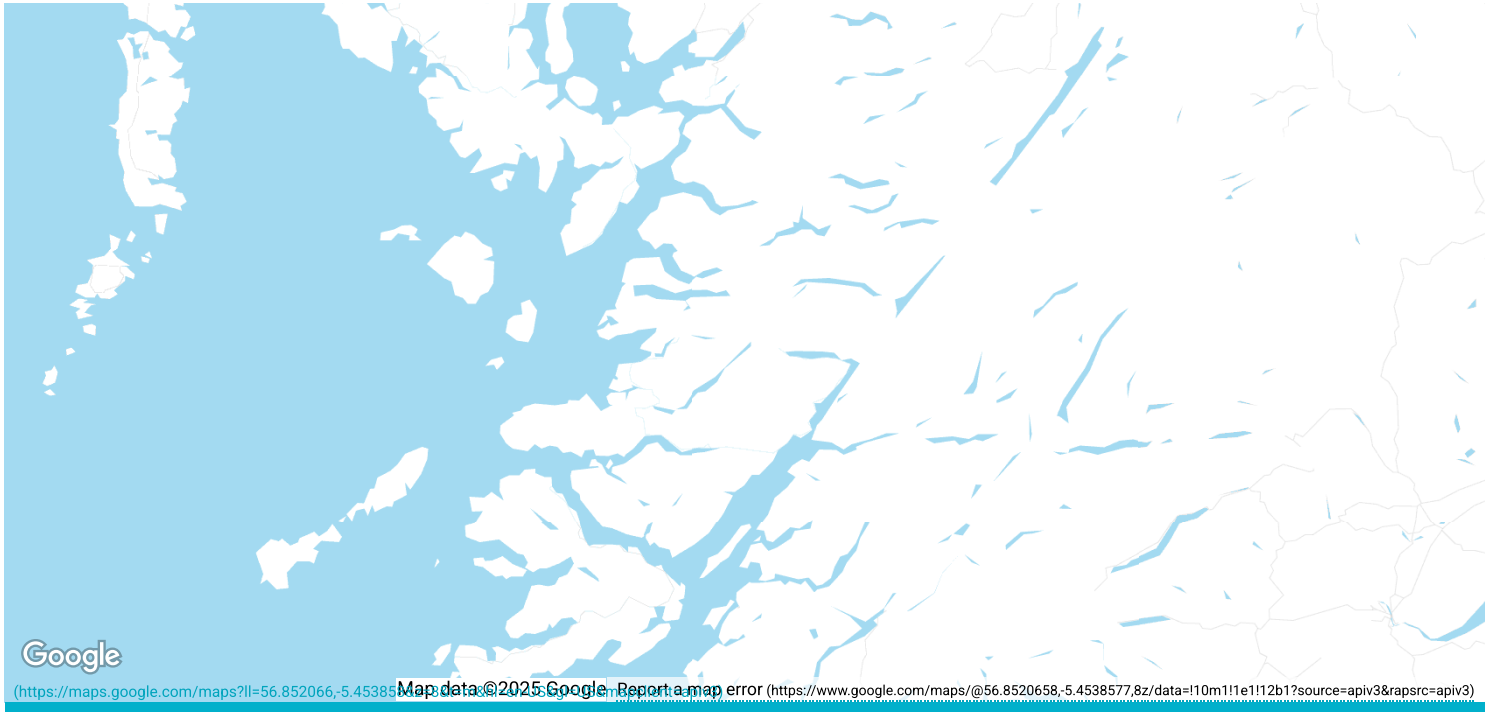




Invergordon

Invergordon in Easter Ross is in Highland. It was established by the local laird in the 18th century. Today cruise liners use the port. In WWI it became a re-fueling and repair base and in WWII was used by the Royal Navy. It retained an industrial profile with oil rig construction (formerly at Nigg) and oil rig repair (Global Energy Group), wind turbines, aluminium production (Alcan closed in 1981) and distilling.

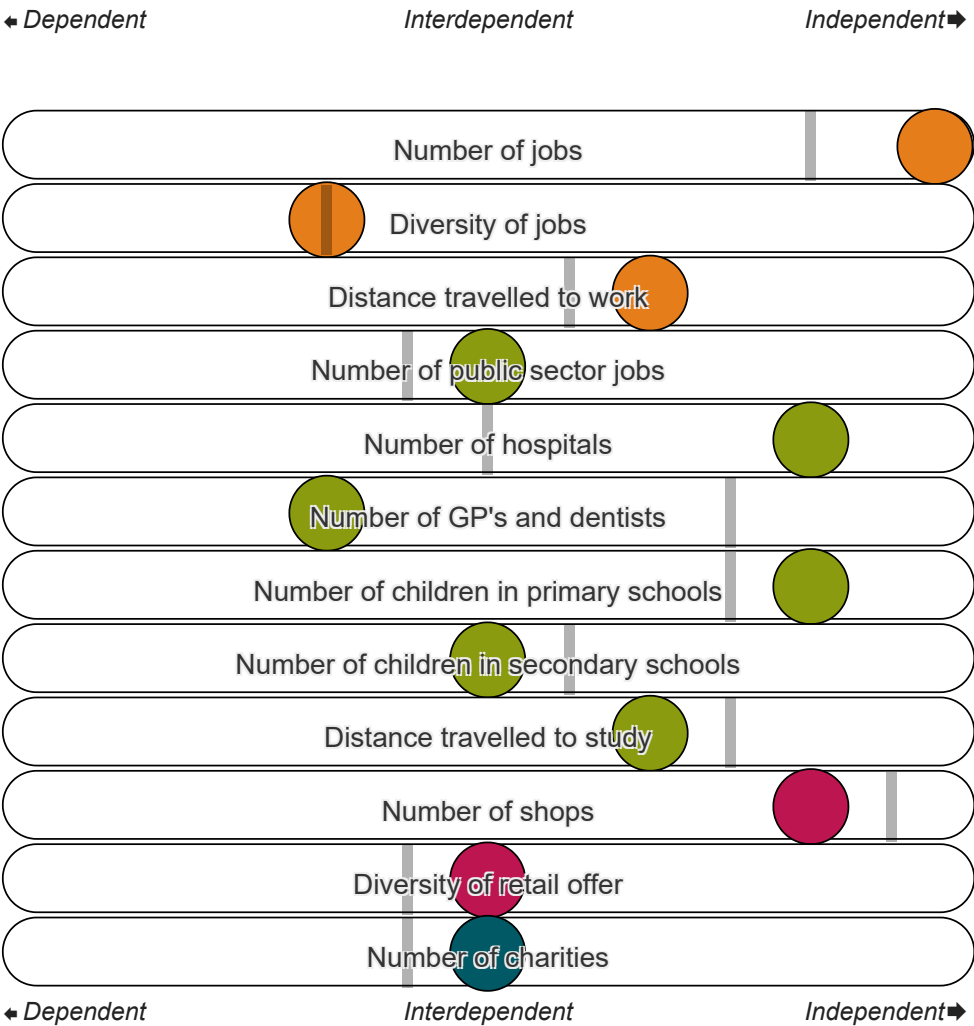
In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Invergordon is an interdependent to independent town.

Invergordon is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Invergordon is grouped with 2 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals. Invergordon differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

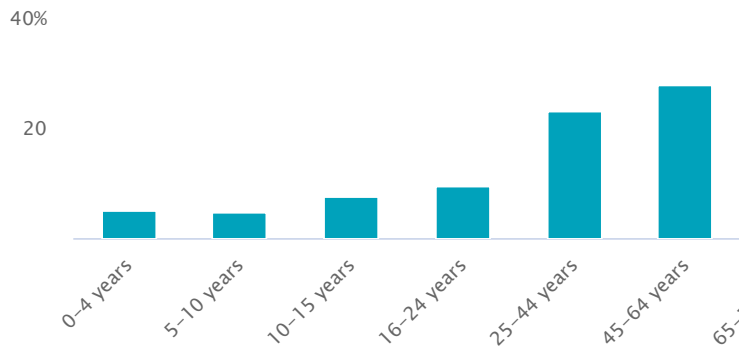

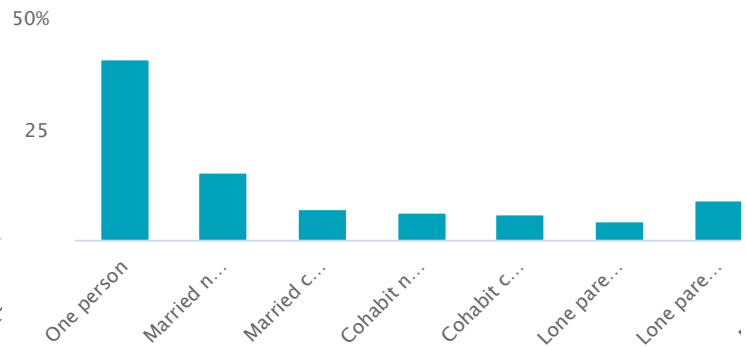

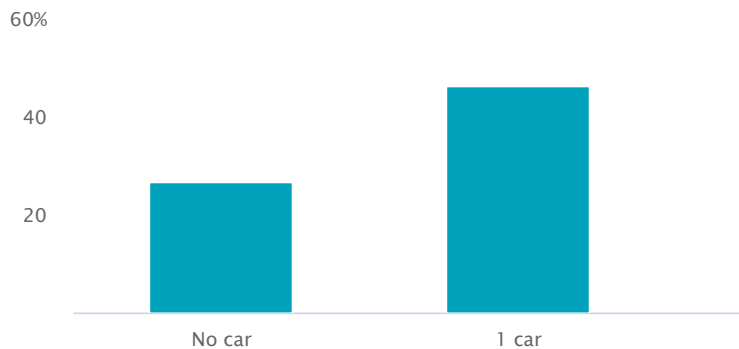

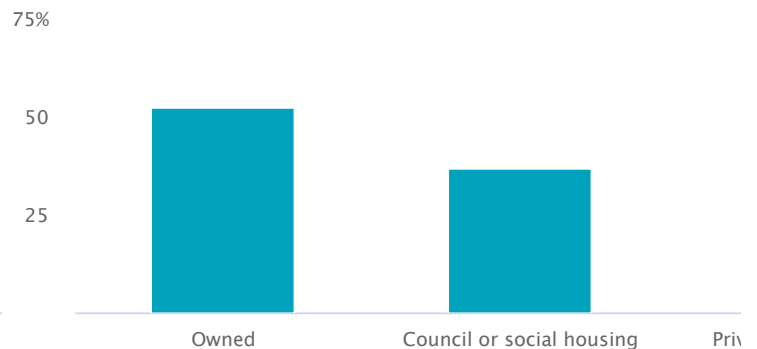

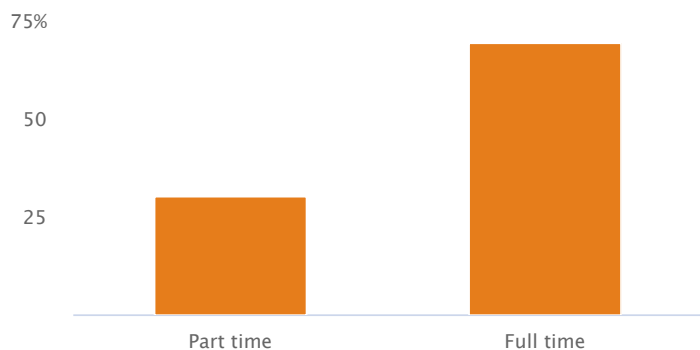

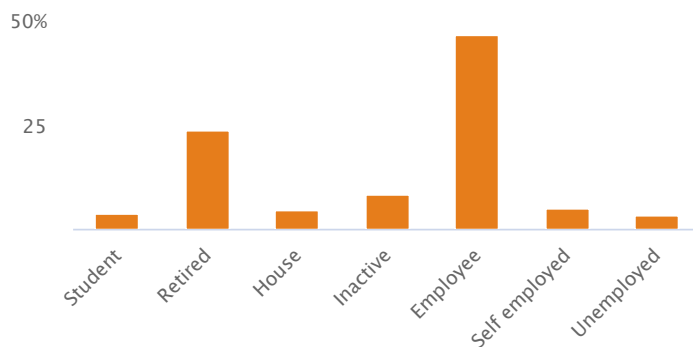
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



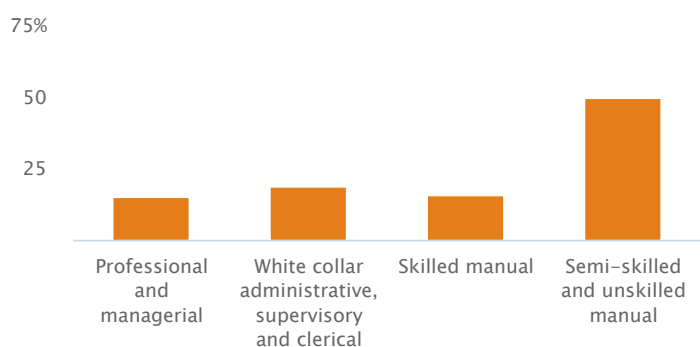
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

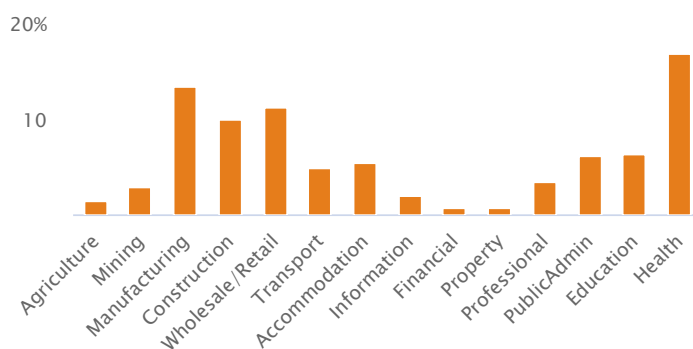


Social Grade

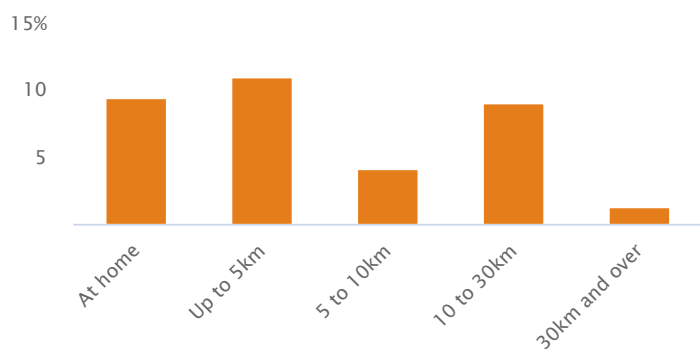
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

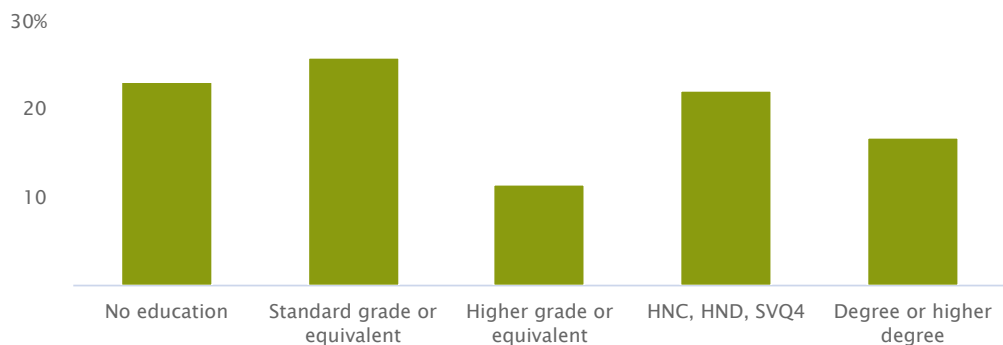


Distance travelled to work

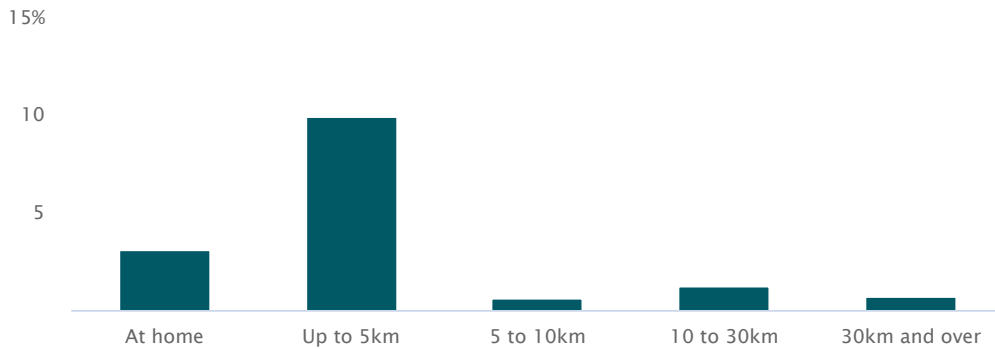
