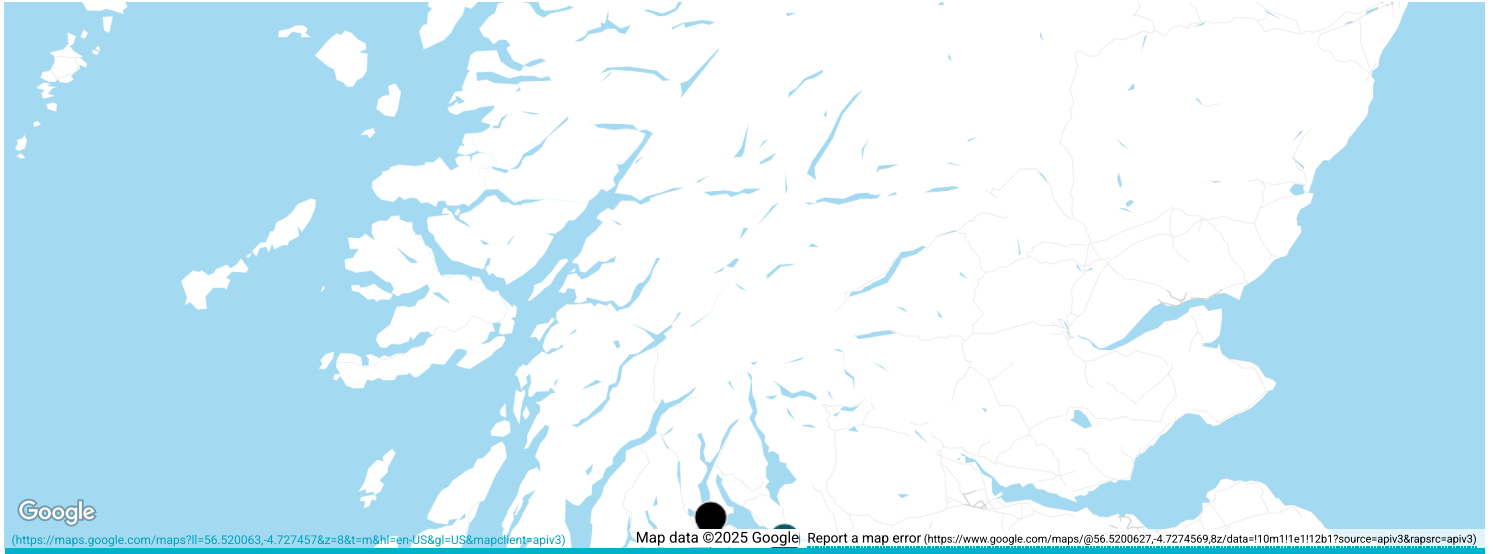




Inverkip

Inverkip is located in Inverclyde. It was established by monks from Paisley Abbey. Once a fishing port it soon developed from an agricultural rural settlement to become a seaside resort and today continues to attract tourists with its marina. The Inverkip Power station is currently mothballed.

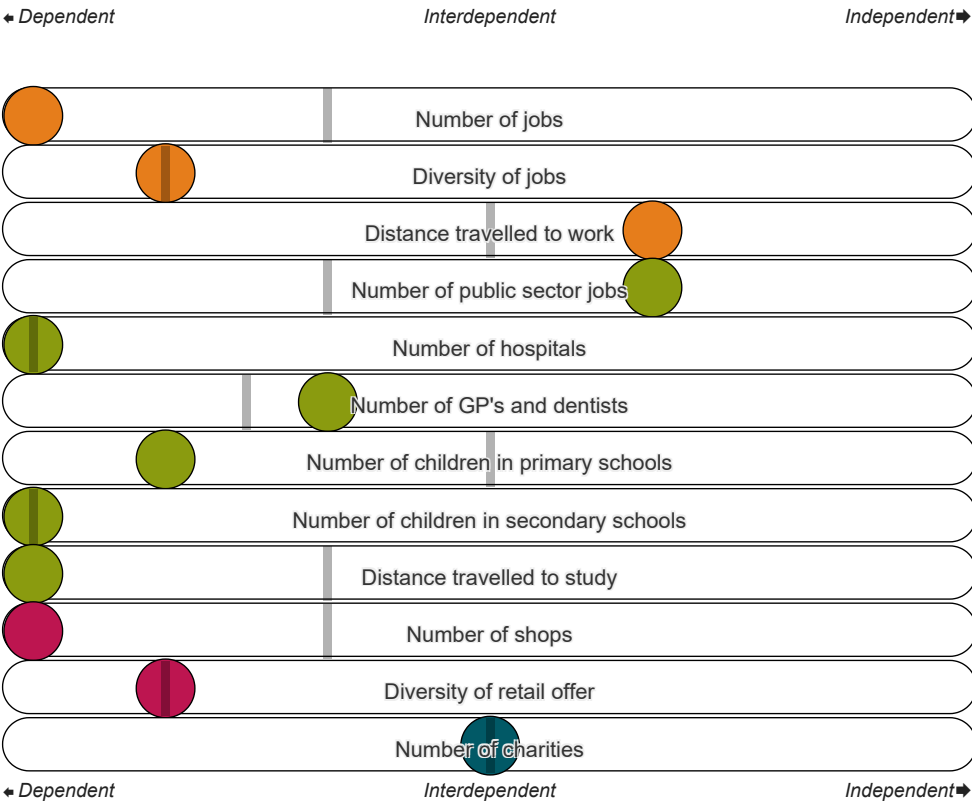
In affluent medium towns, population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Inverkip is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Inverkip is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Inverkip is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs. Inverkip differs most from its group in the number of jobs, and shops; and the distance travelled to study.

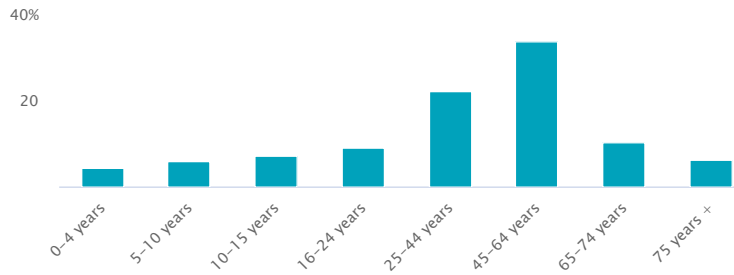

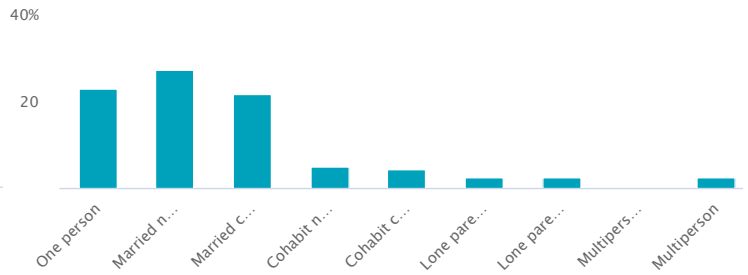

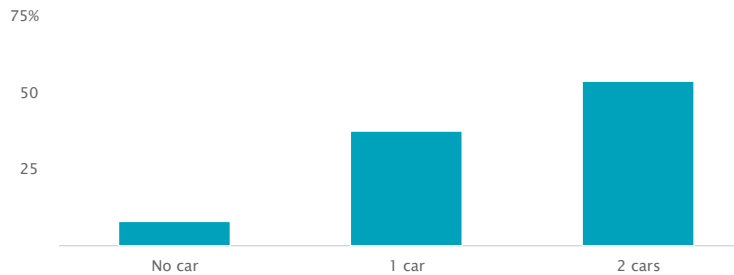

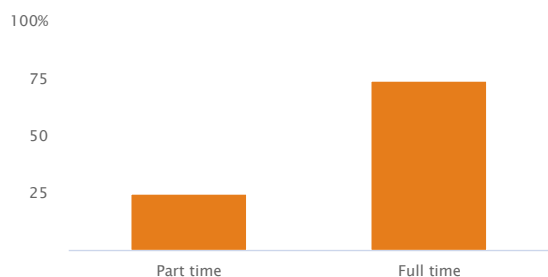

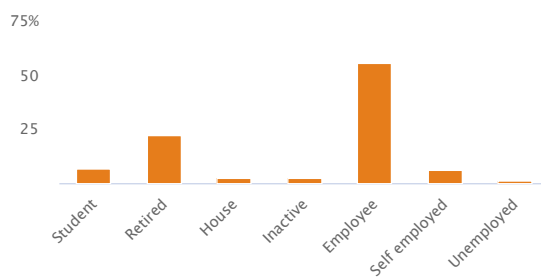
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



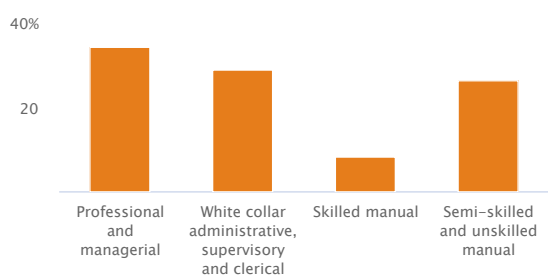
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

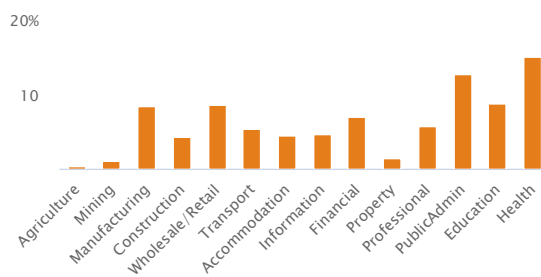


Social Grade

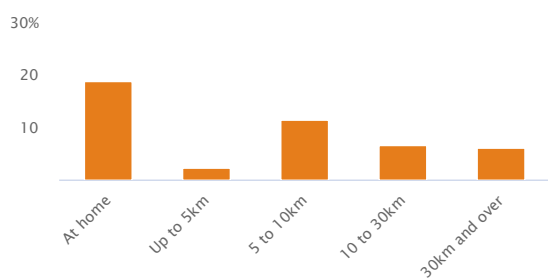
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

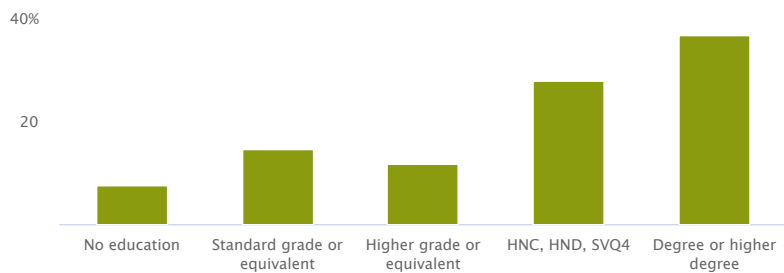


Distance travelled to work

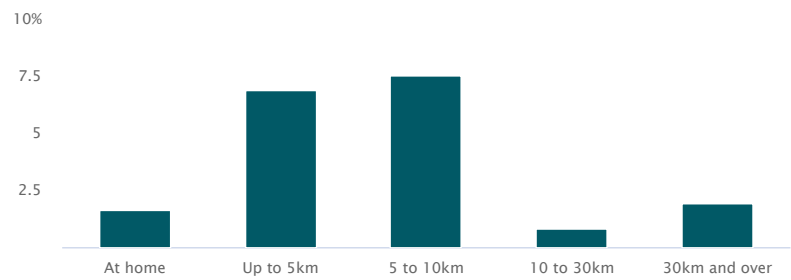
