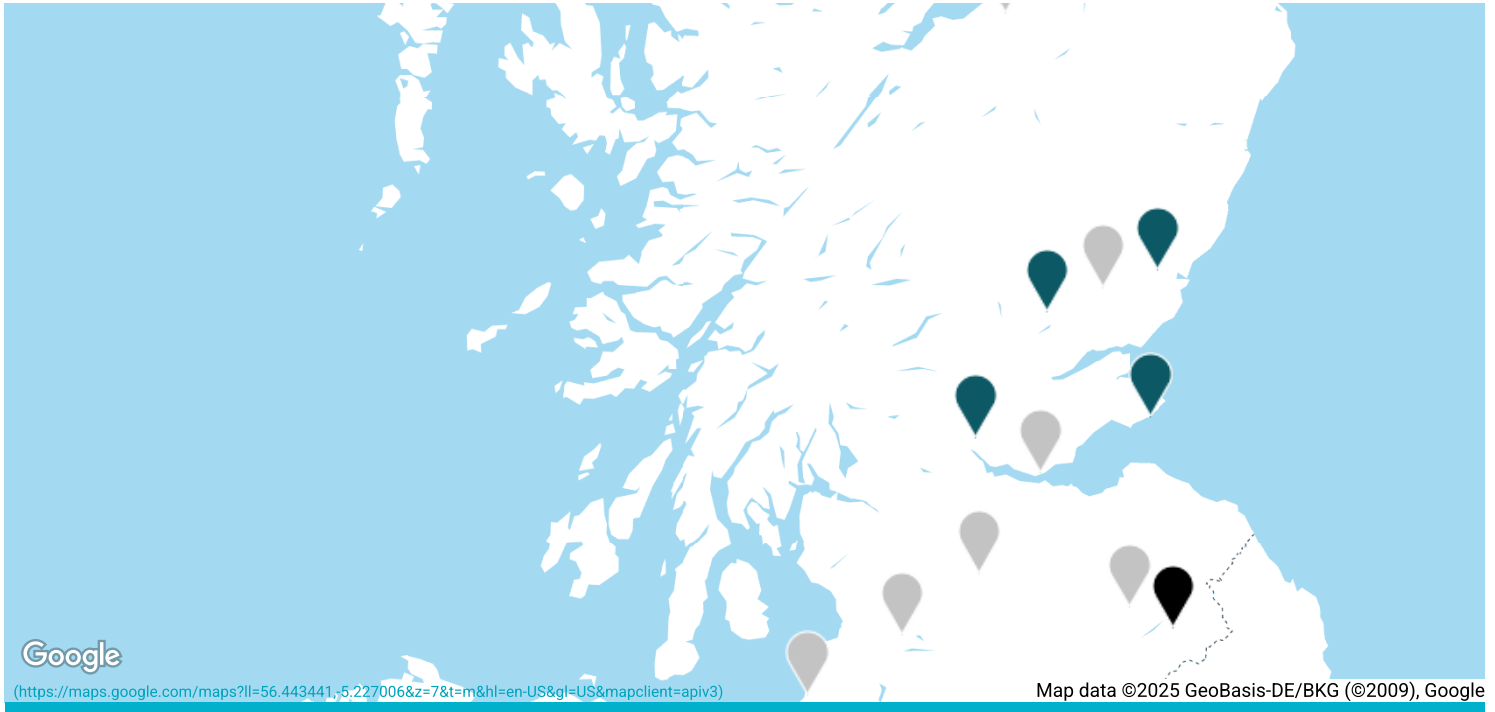




Jedburgh

Jedburgh is in Scottish Borders. It was the county town of Roxburghshire. The abbey dates from the 12th century. It suffered from many skirmishes across the Scotland England border. It was an agricultural rural town with trades related to local produce. Today it is a local market town closely linked to rural life in the area.

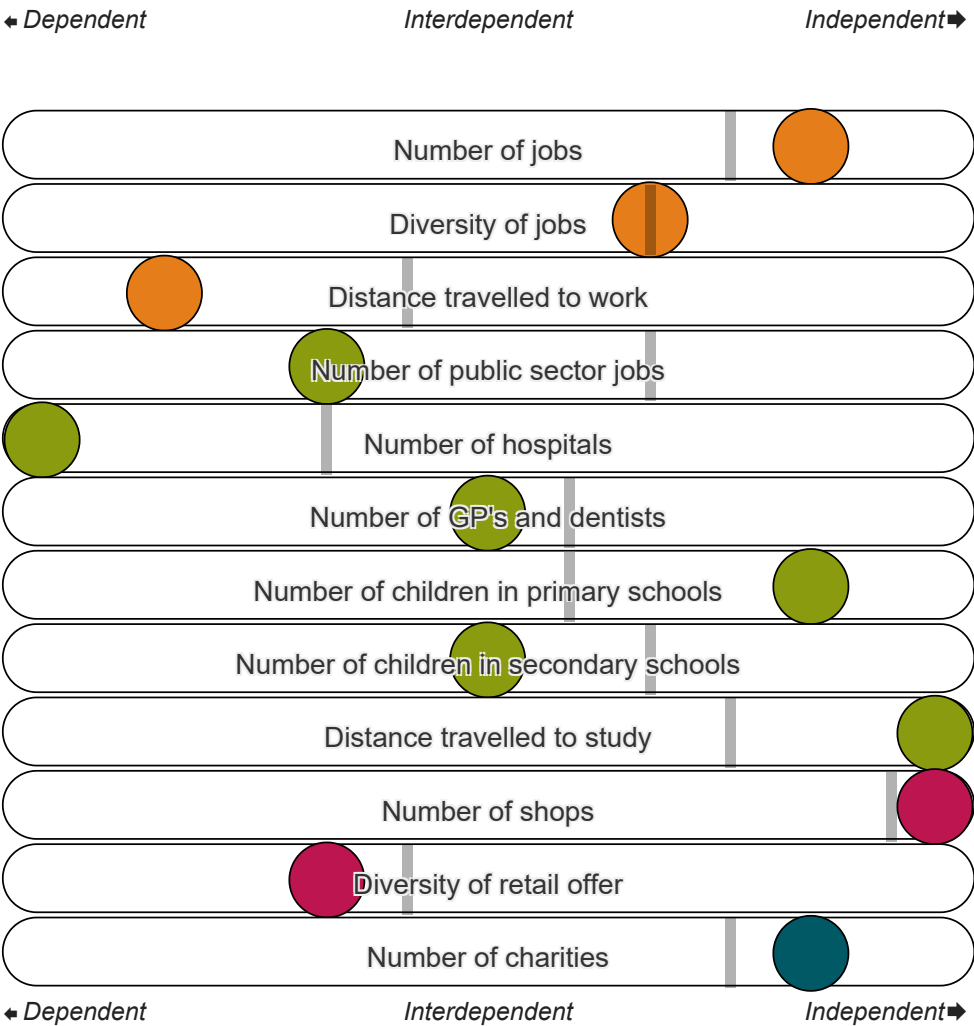
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Jedburgh is an interdependent to independent town.

Inter-relationships



Jedburgh is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Jedburgh is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Jedburgh differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.

Population change 2011 to 2022**2%**

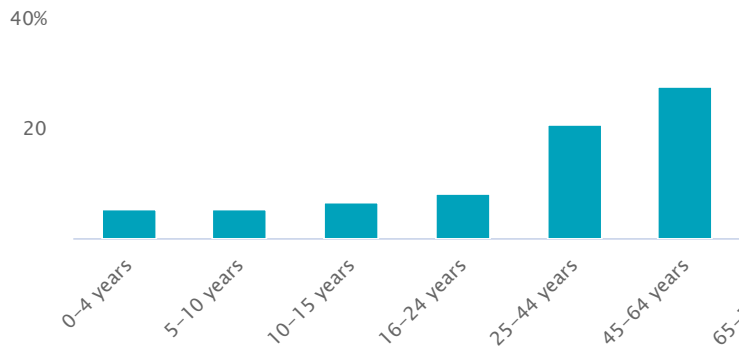

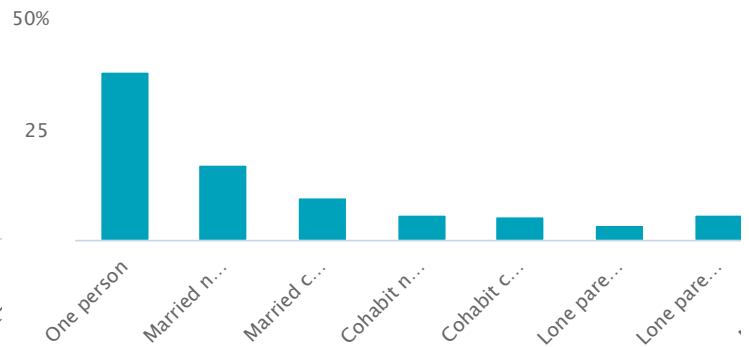

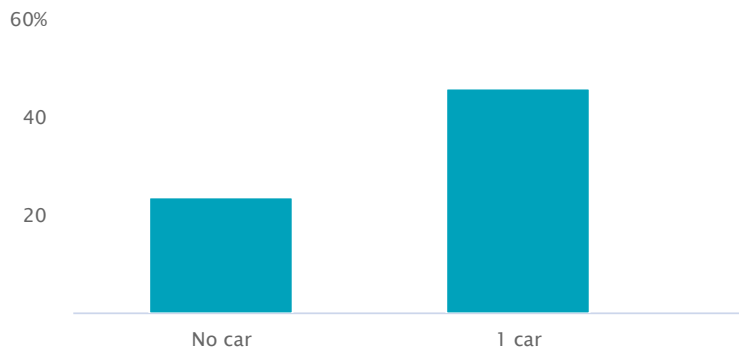

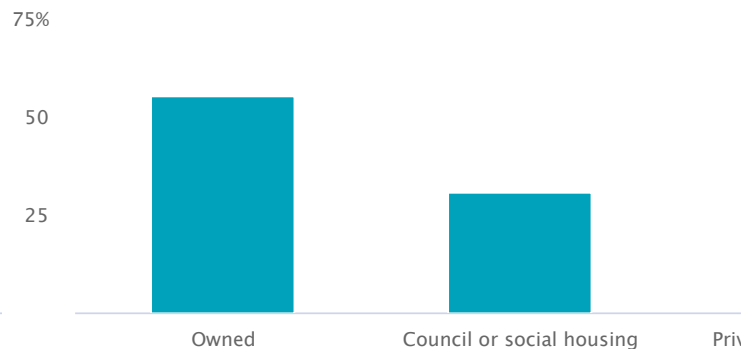

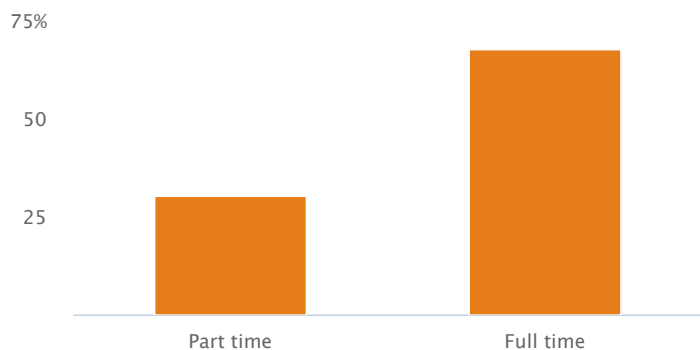

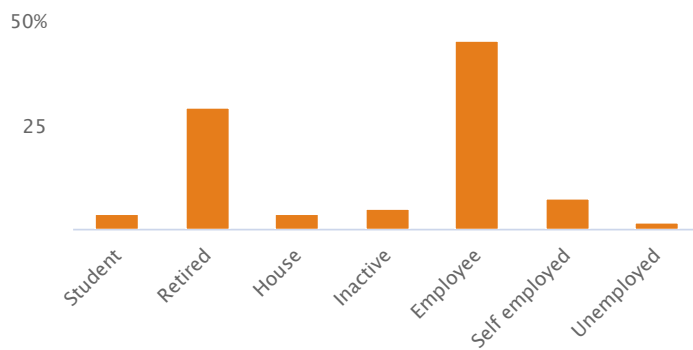
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



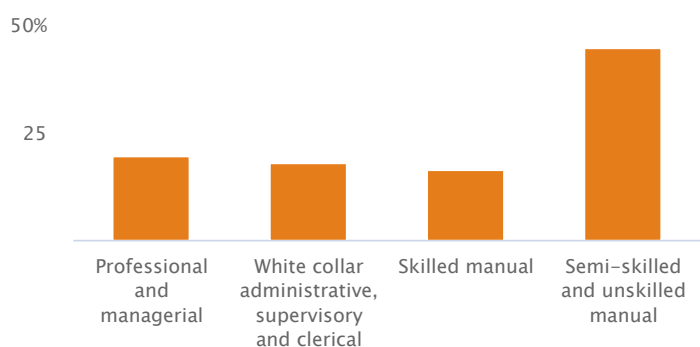
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

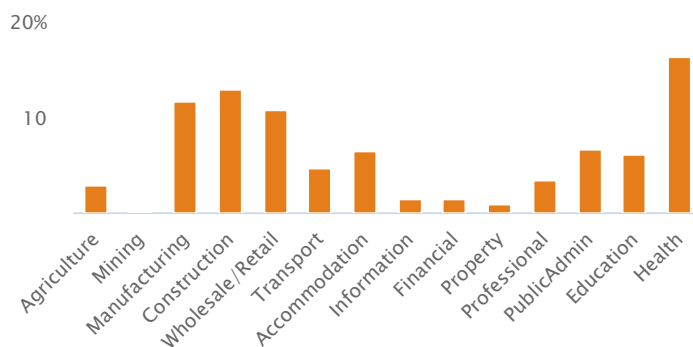


Social Grade

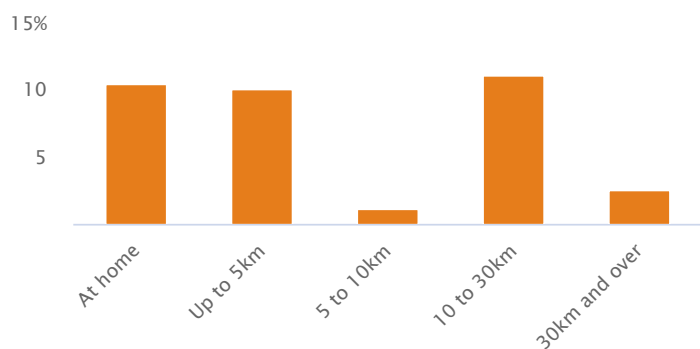
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

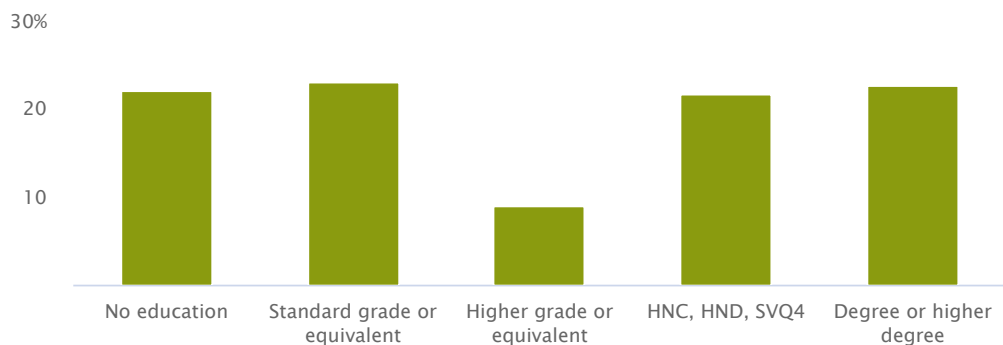


Distance travelled to work

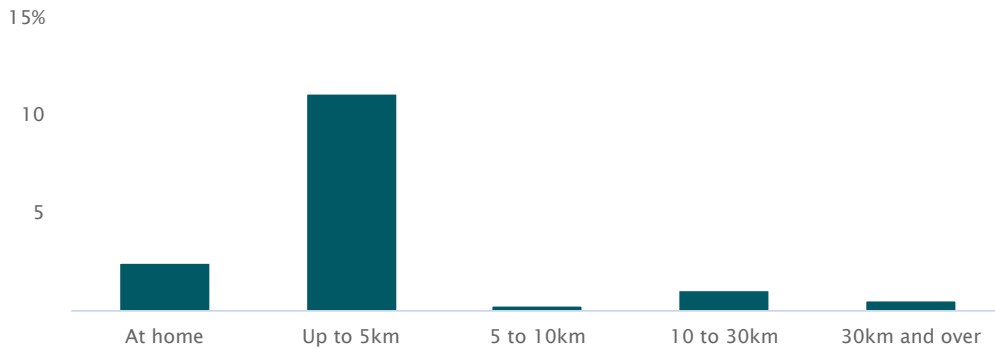
