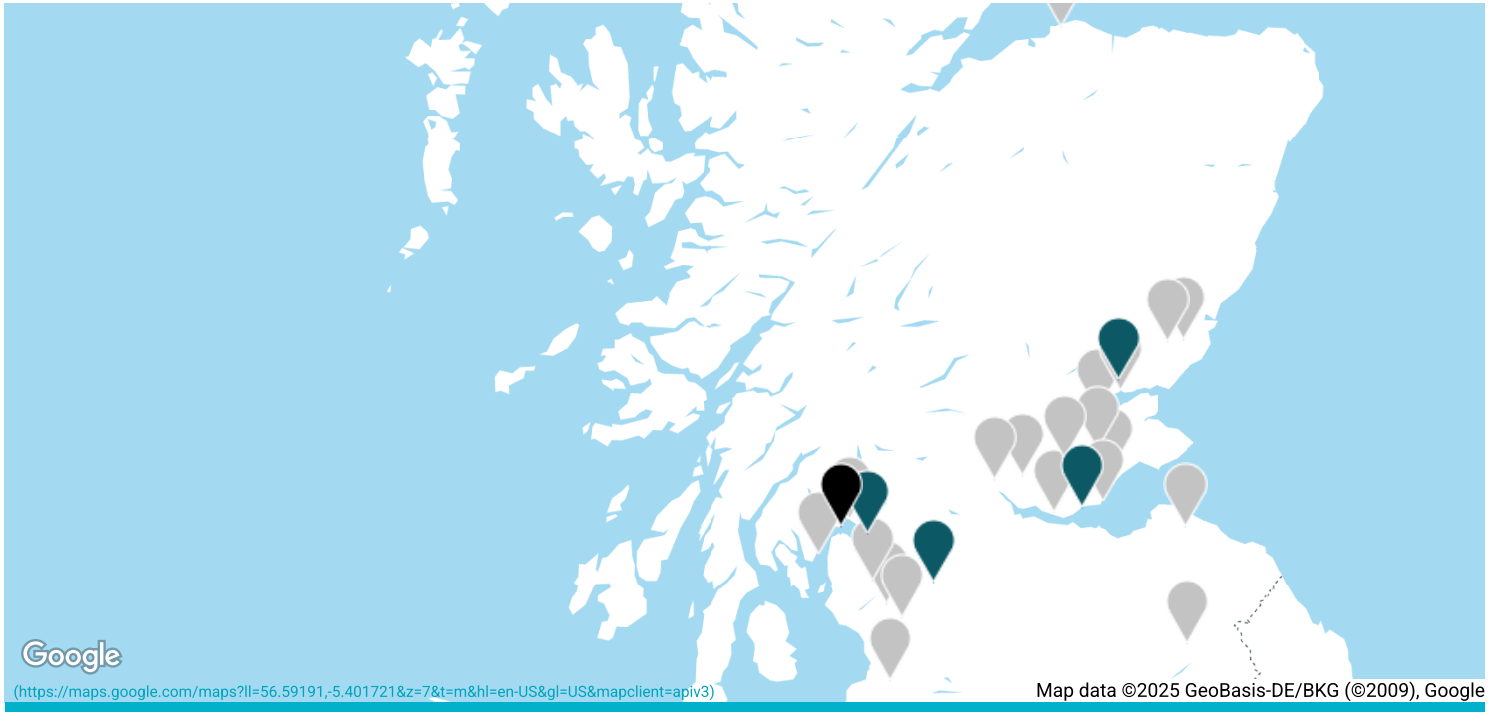




Kilcreggan

Kilcreggan is located on the Rosneath Peninsula in Argyll and Bute. It was established as a port for the Clyde steamers and developed a tourist trade. Today it is popular with yachtsmen.

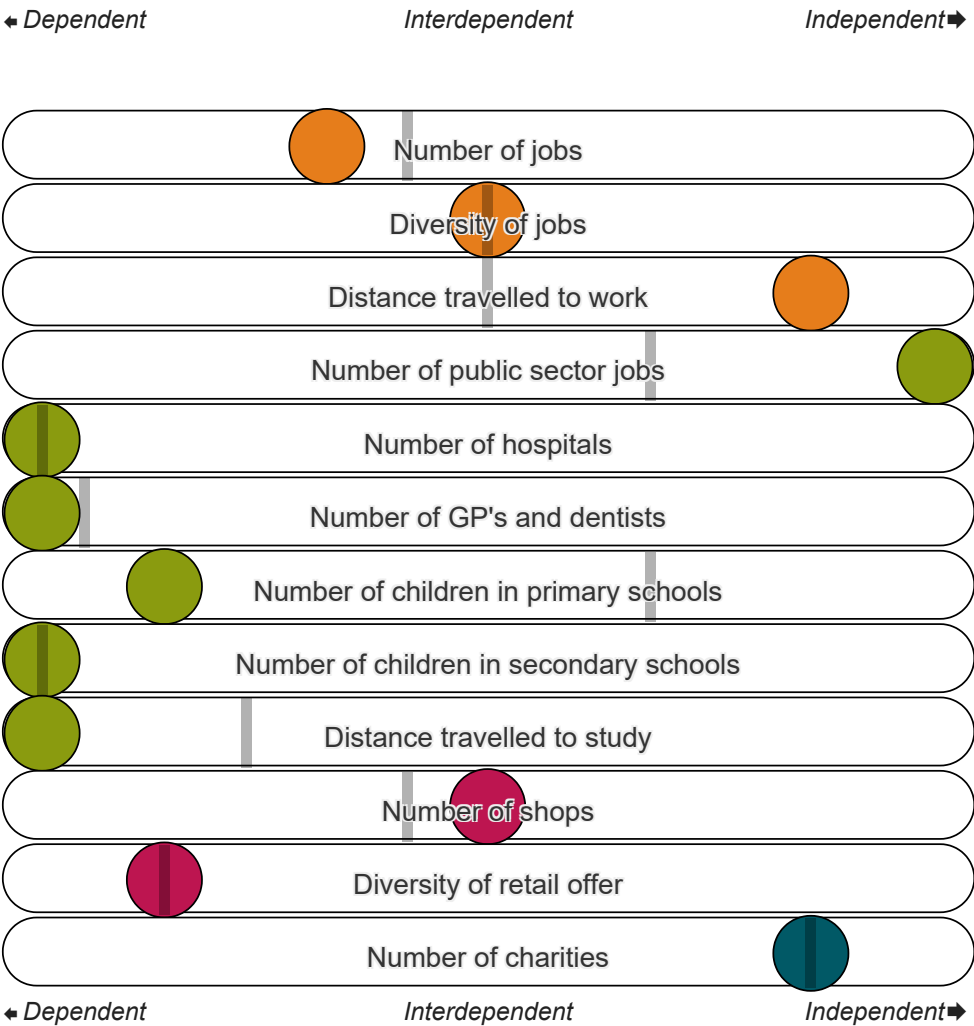
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Kilcreggan is an interdependent to dependent town.

Kilcreggan is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Kilcreggan is grouped with 24 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Kilcreggan differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

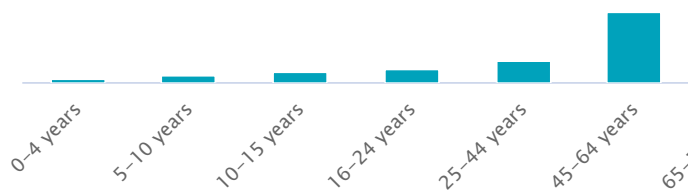

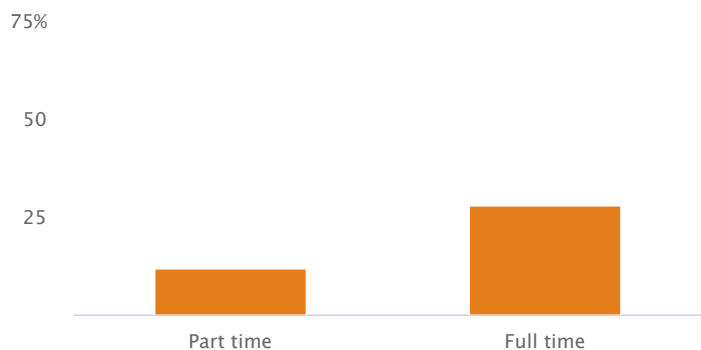

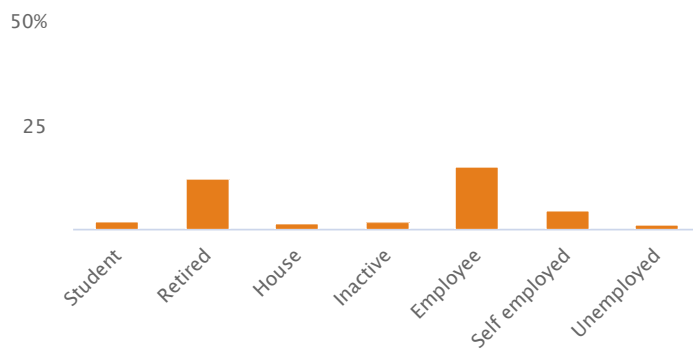
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



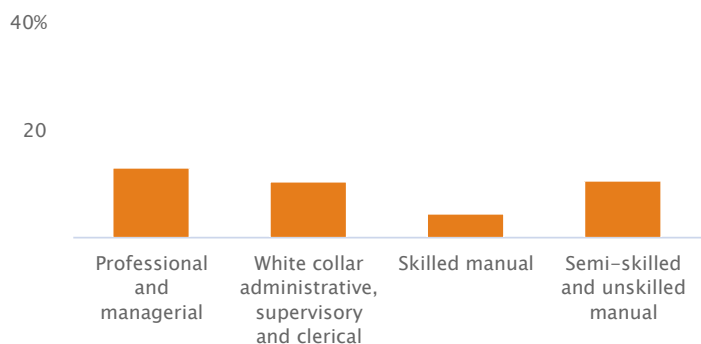
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

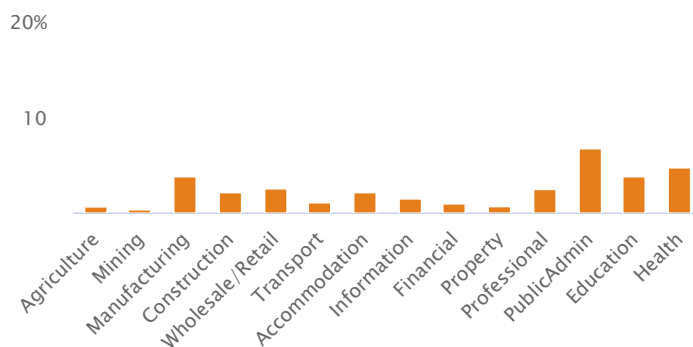


Social Grade

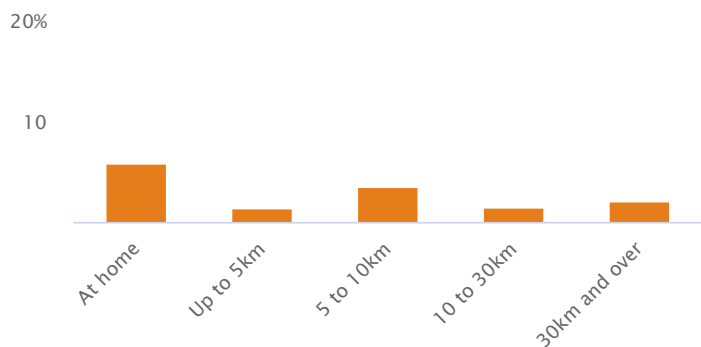
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

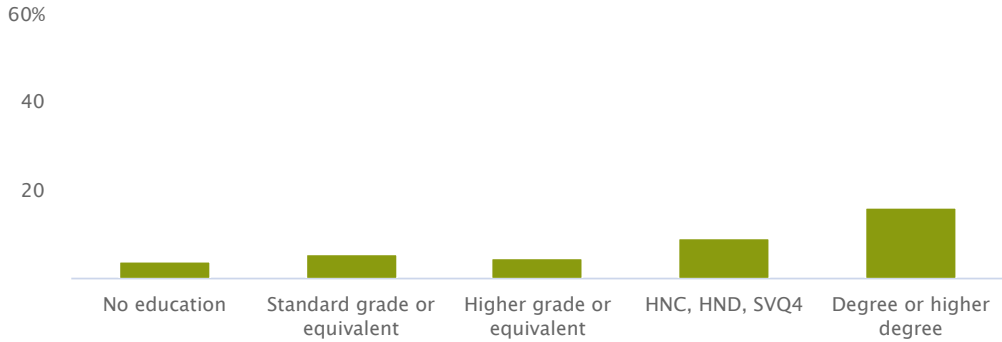


Distance travelled to work

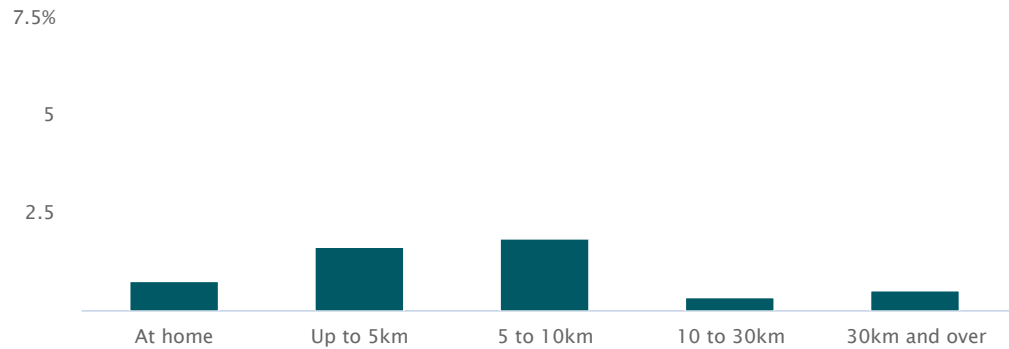
