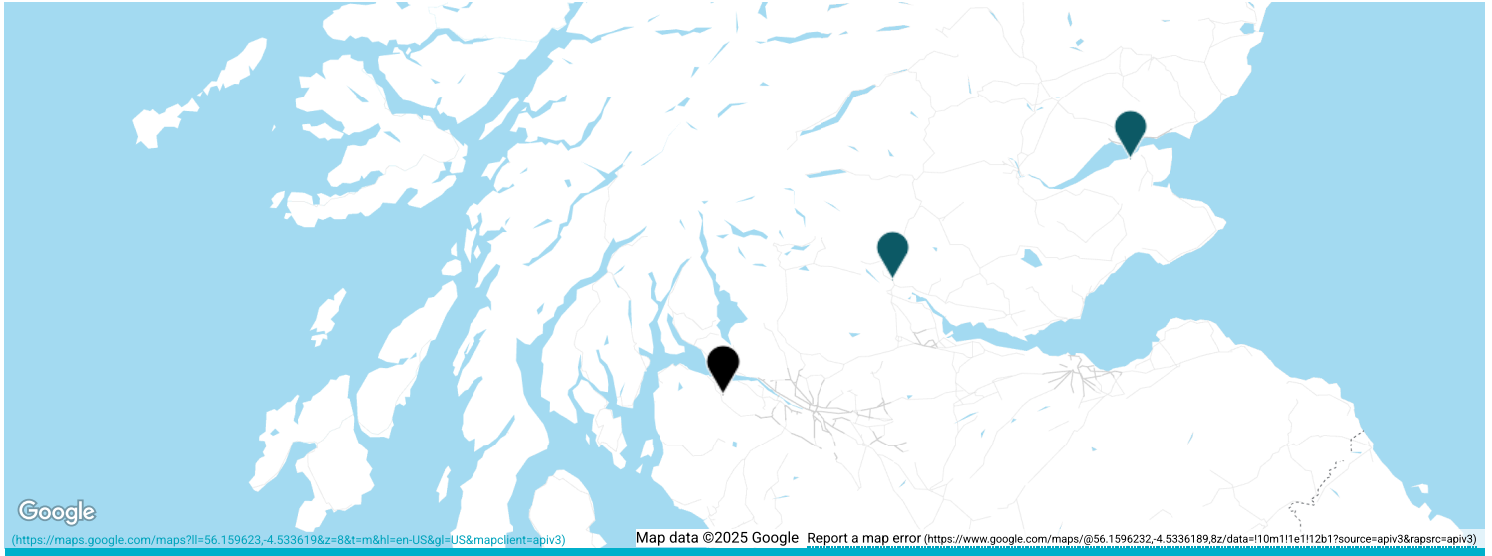




Kilmacolm

Kilmacolm is in Renfrewshire. Back in the 7th and 8th centuries it was a hydropathic resort. Today it is a commuter settlement.

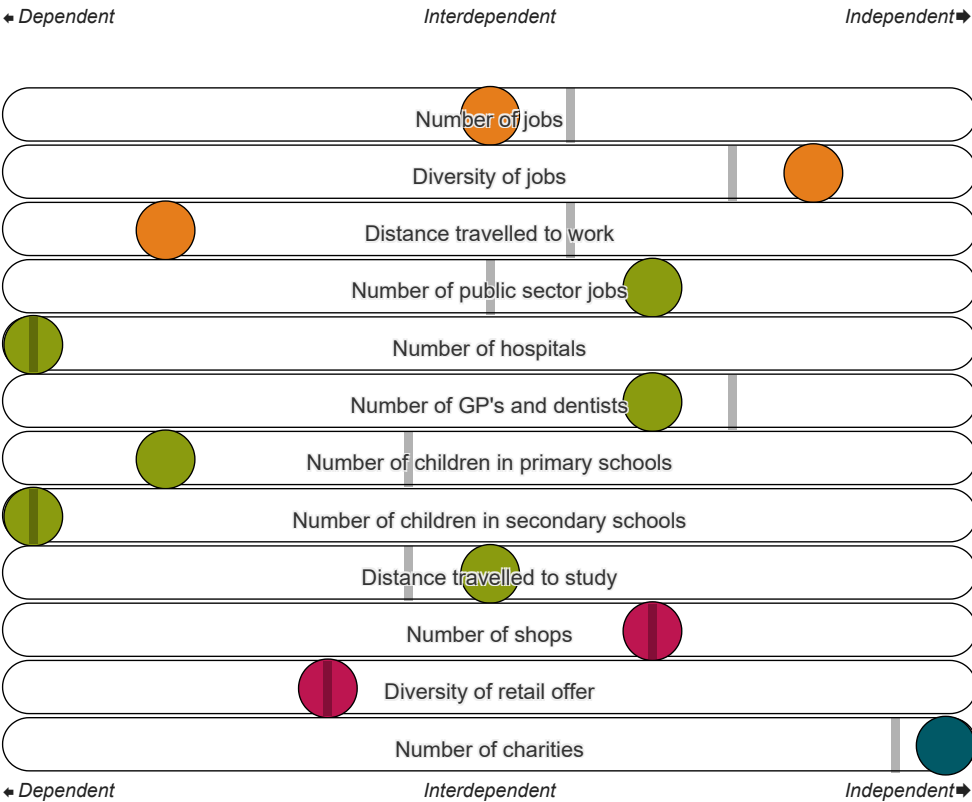
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Inter-relationships



Kilmacolm is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Kilmacolm is grouped with 2 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

Kilmacolm differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools; and the distance travelled to work.

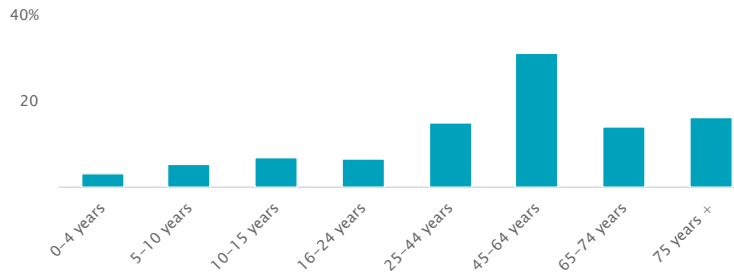

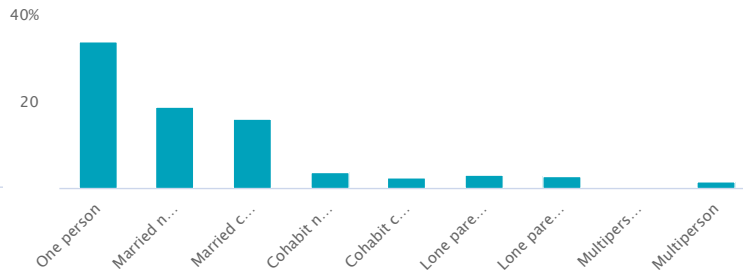

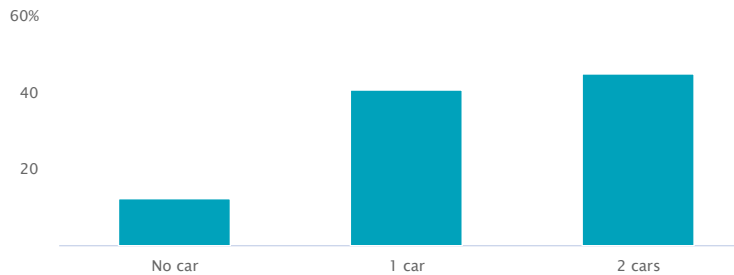

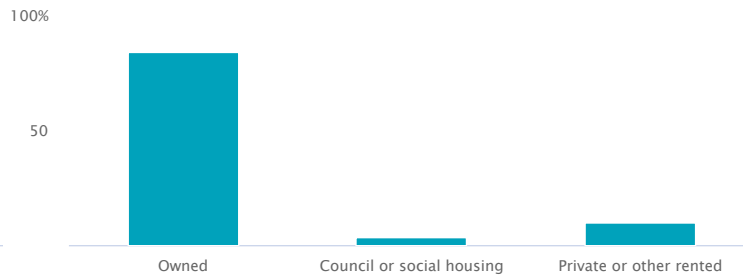

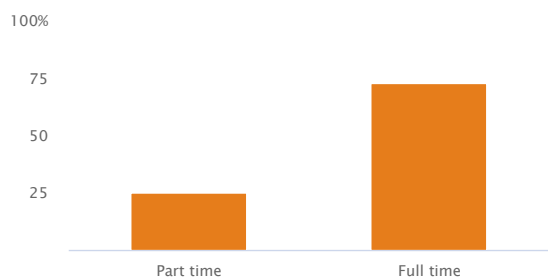

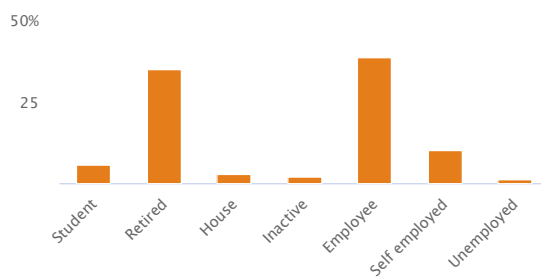
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



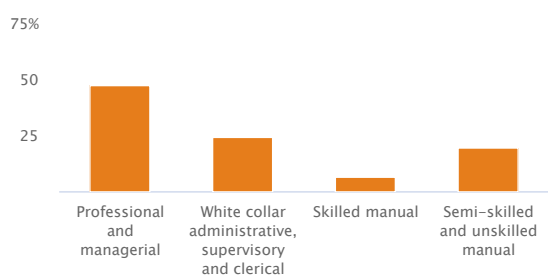
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

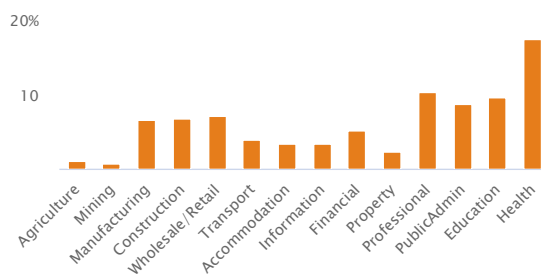


Social Grade

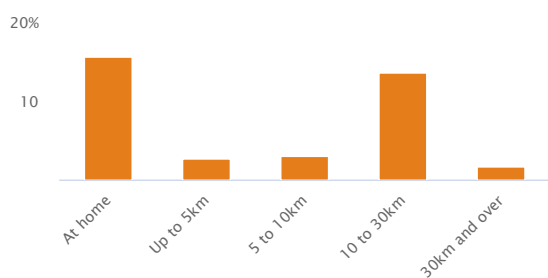
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

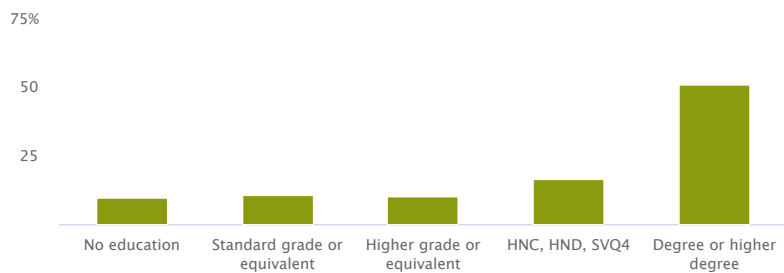


Distance travelled to work

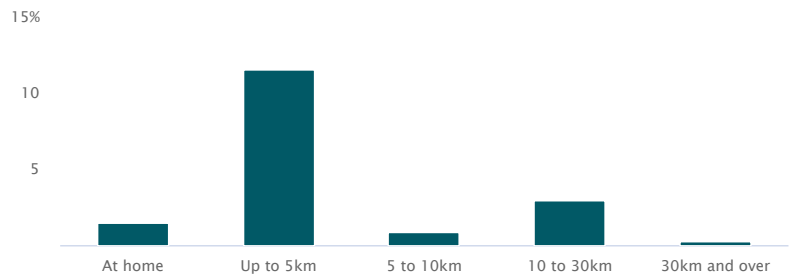
