Kilwinning is in North Ayrshire. St Winning established an abbey there in the 8th century. It developed as a local market town. Whisky and electronics are manufactured there today.

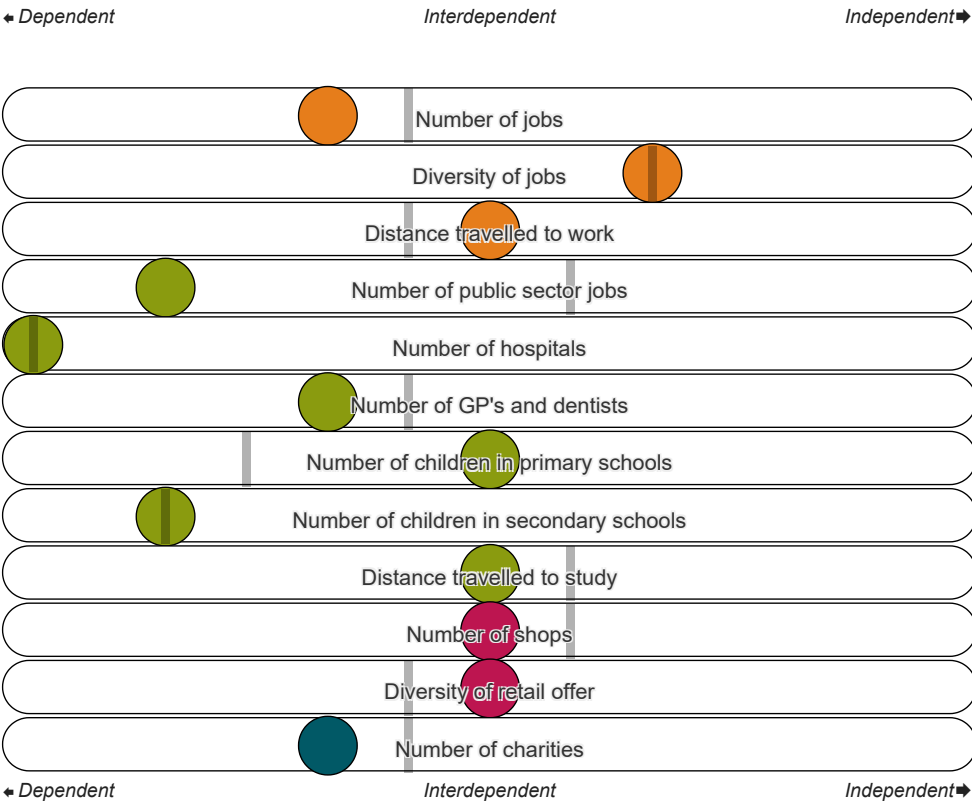
In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Kilwinning is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Kilwinning is grouped with 2 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

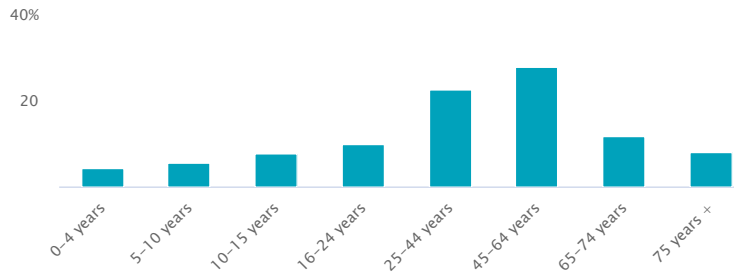

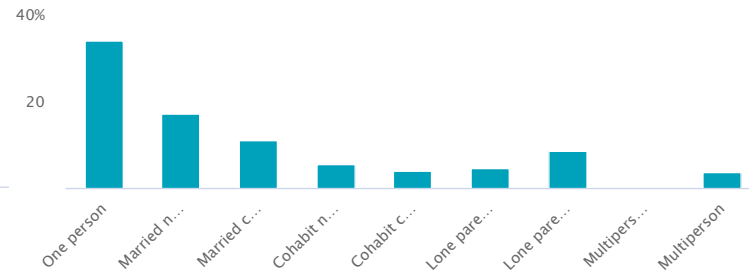

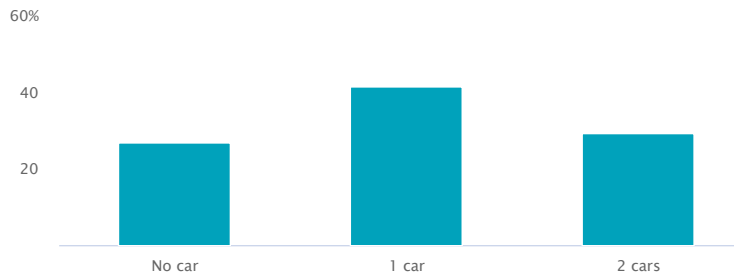

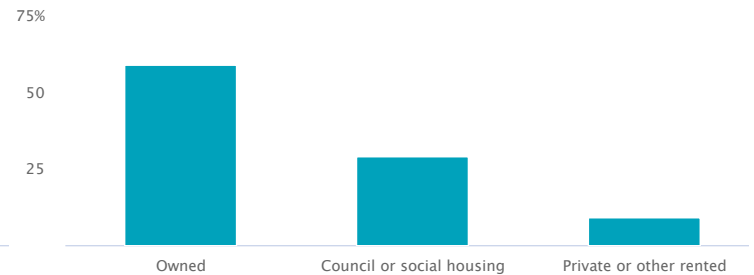
Household composition

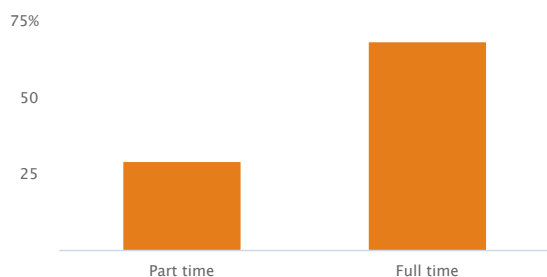

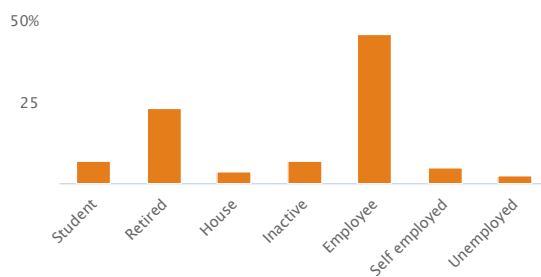
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



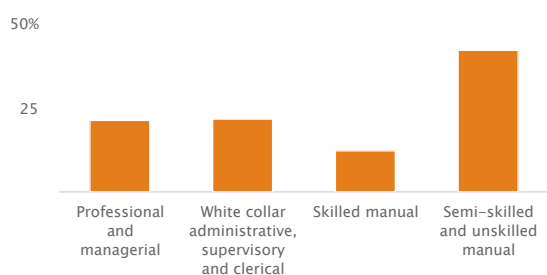
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

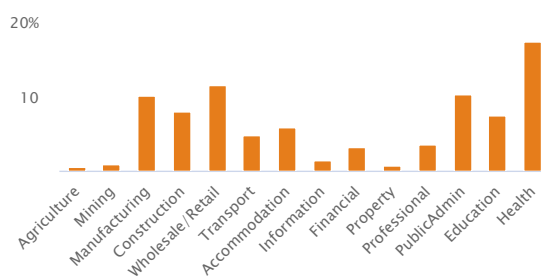


Social Grade

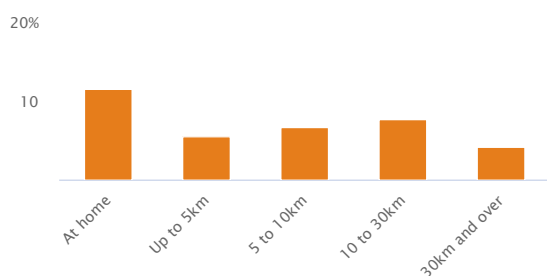
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

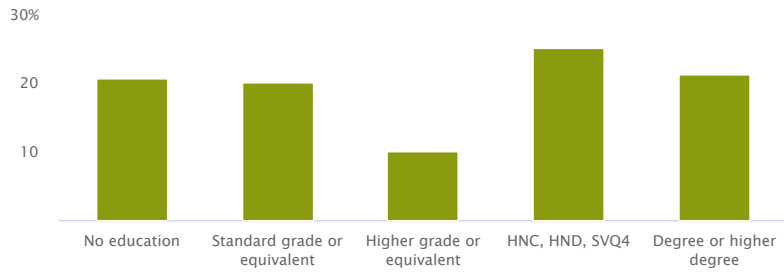


Distance travelled to work

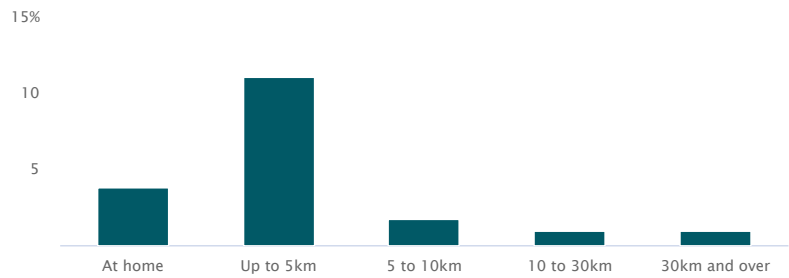
