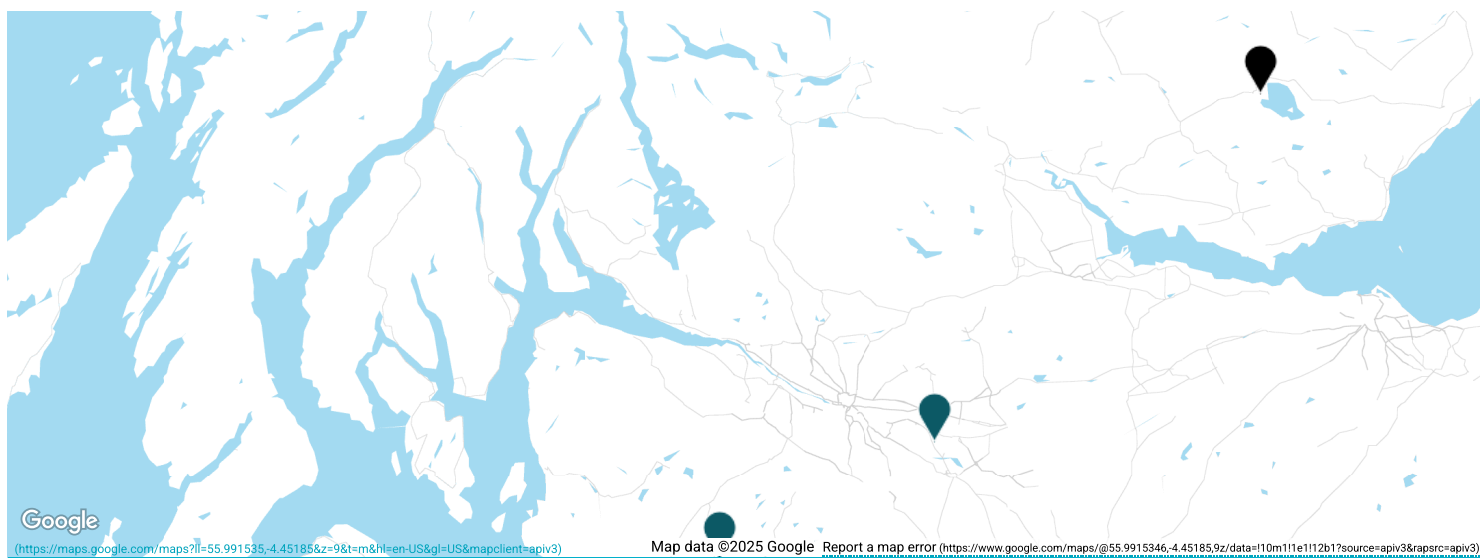




Kinross

Kinross is located by Loch Leven in Perth and Kinross. It was the former county town for Kinross-shire. It was in historic times a resting point on the route from Edinburgh to Perth and royalty stopped there. It still has many inns and hostellries. In the 17th and 18th century it was known for cutlery making. Today there is a cashmere factory and light industries.

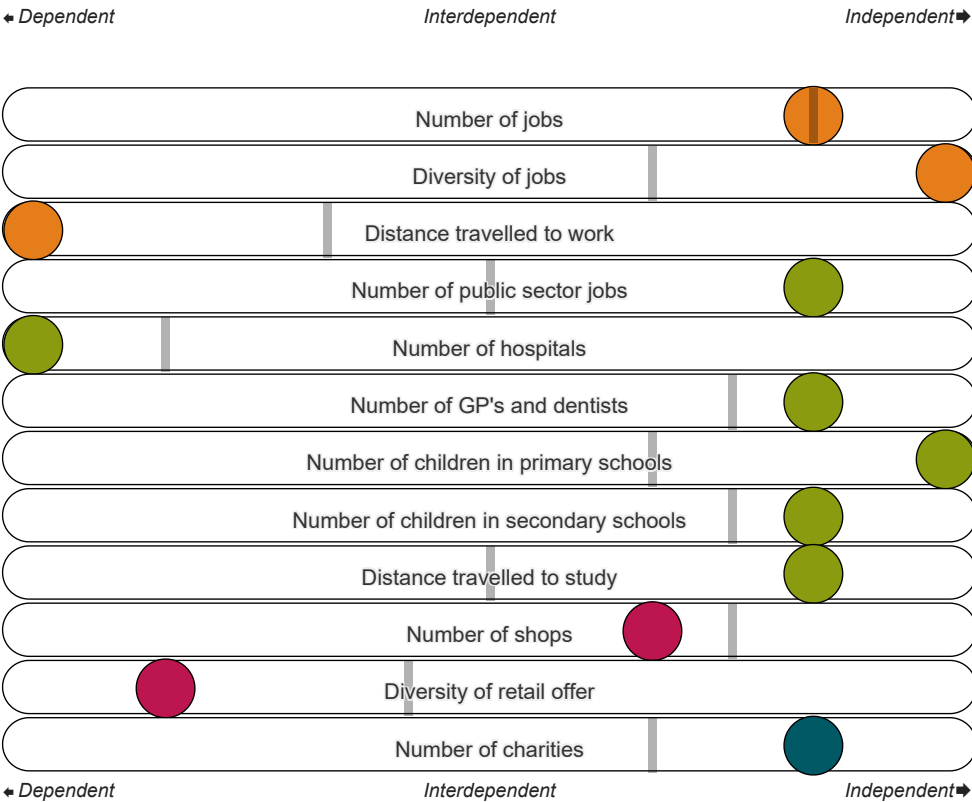
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Kinross is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Kinross is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study. Kinross differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

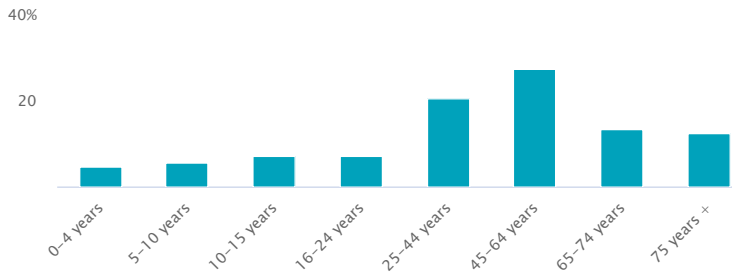

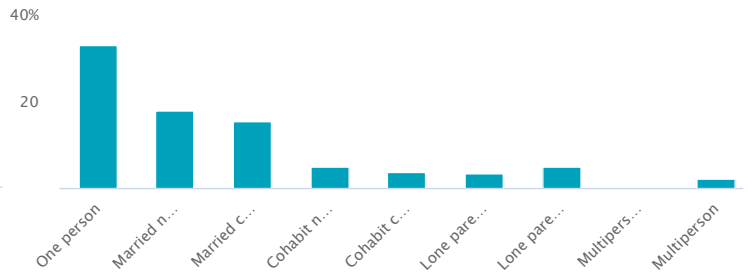

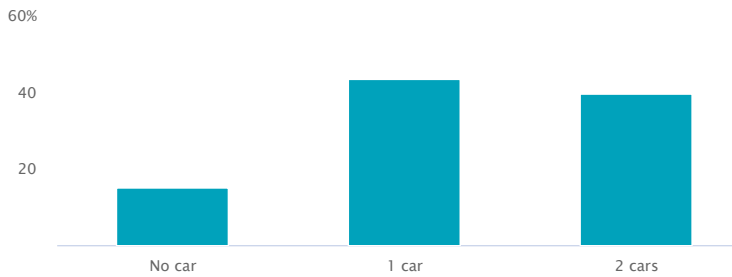

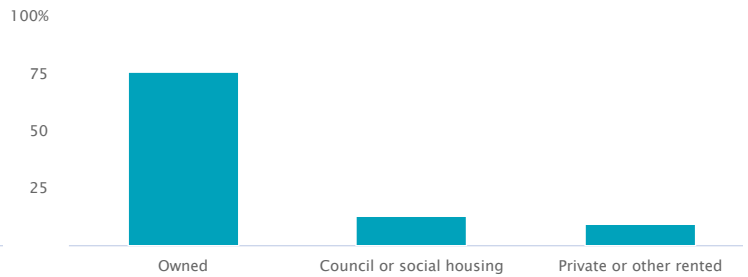

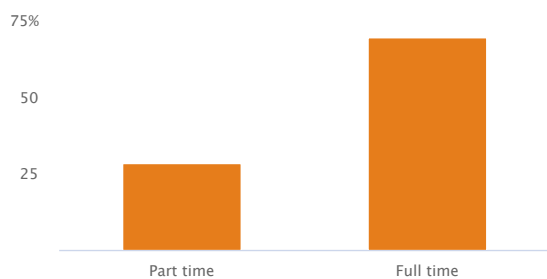

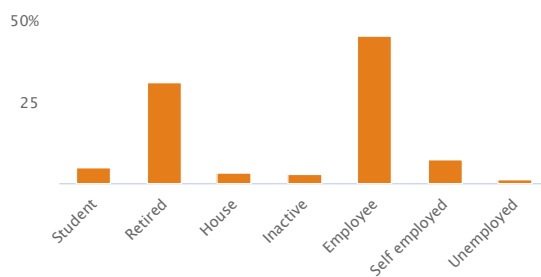
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



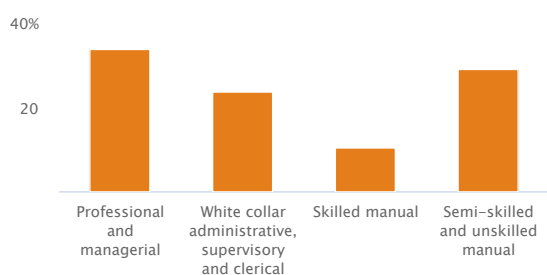
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

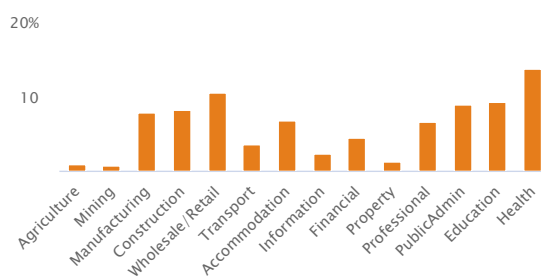

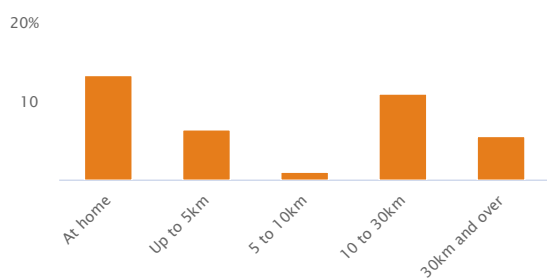
(% households aged 16-64)



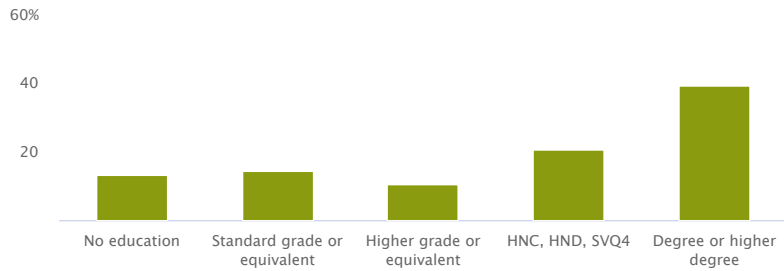
Sector Diversity

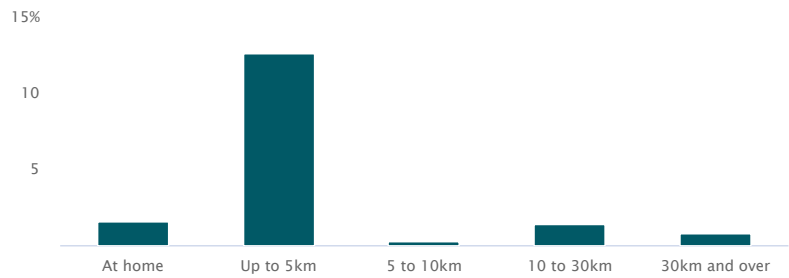
