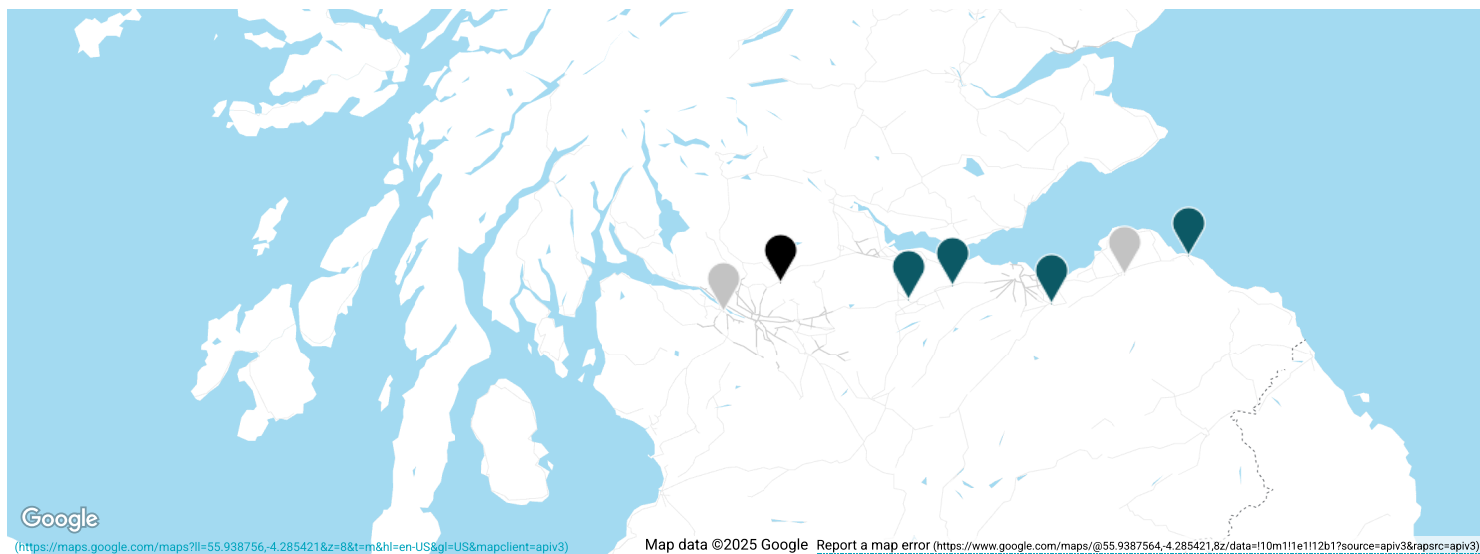




Kirkintilloch

EAST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **22,037**

Kirkintilloch is in East Dunbartonshire and is the administrative centre for the council area. Located on the Antonine wall and the Forth and Clyde Canal the town has a long history and industrial heritage from textiles and cotton mills to coal, iron and nickel production in the 18th and 19th centuries. In the 1960's new public housing was built for Glasgow overspill. In the 20th century it had important foundries and shipbuilding. The most famous product from Kirkintilloch was the red post and phone boxes. Today it is a local service centre and has expanded with new private housing for commuters to Glasgow.

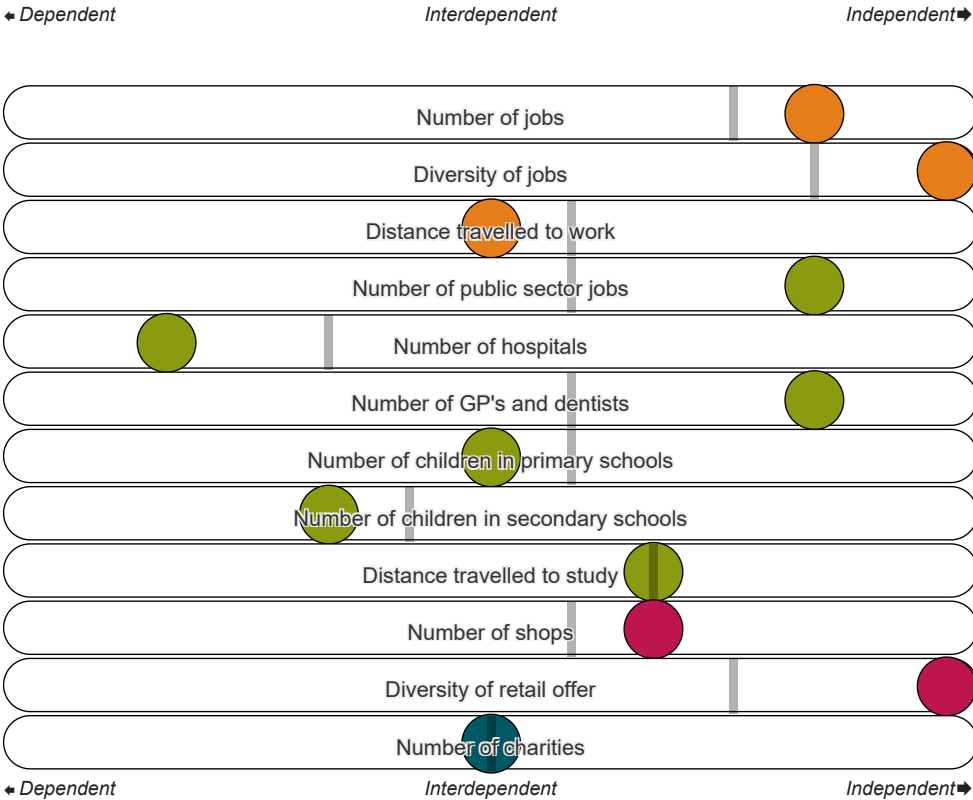
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Kirkintilloch is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Kirkintilloch is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, and shops. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

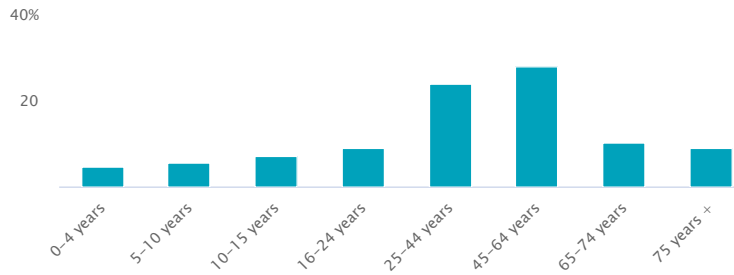

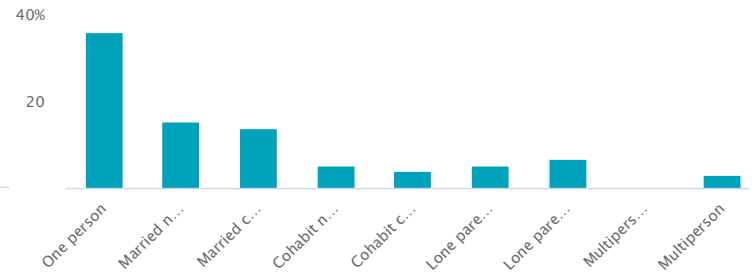

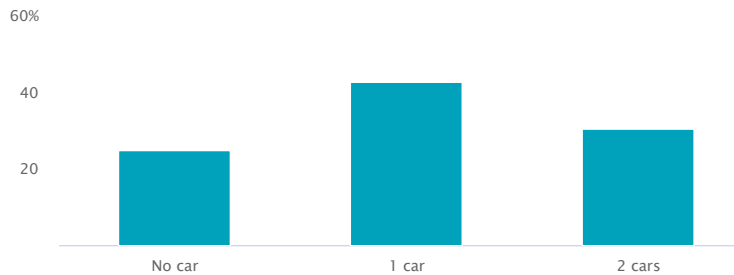

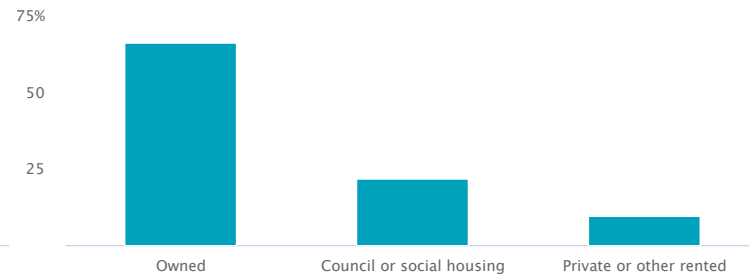

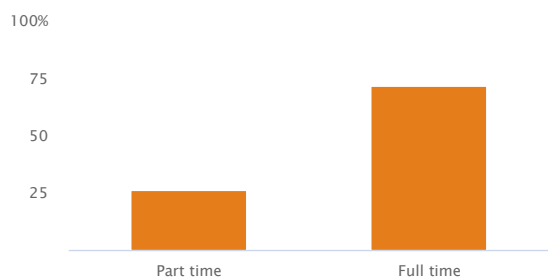

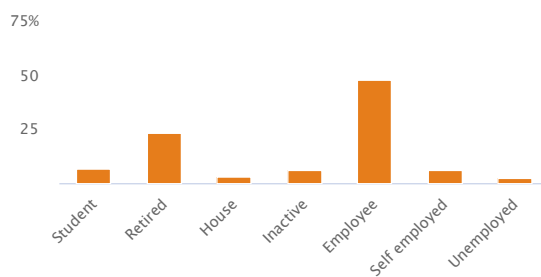
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



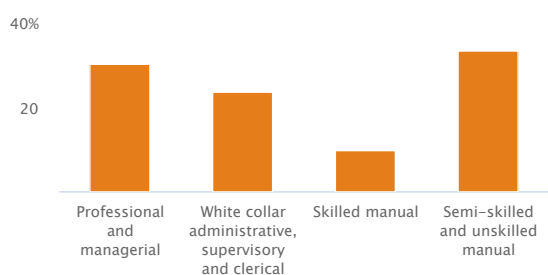
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

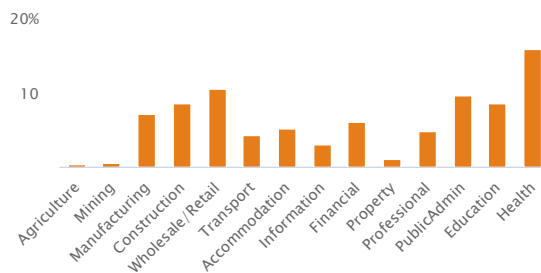

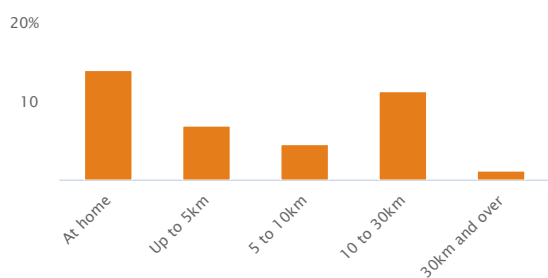
(% households aged 16-64)



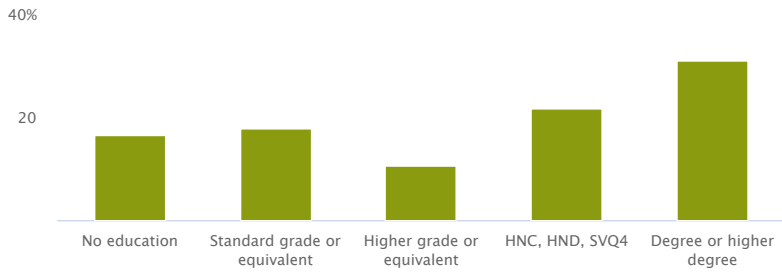
Sector Diversity

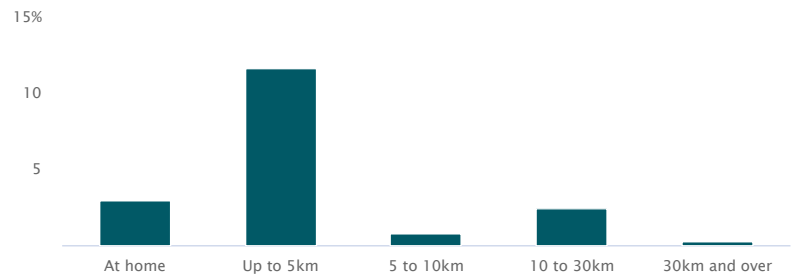
