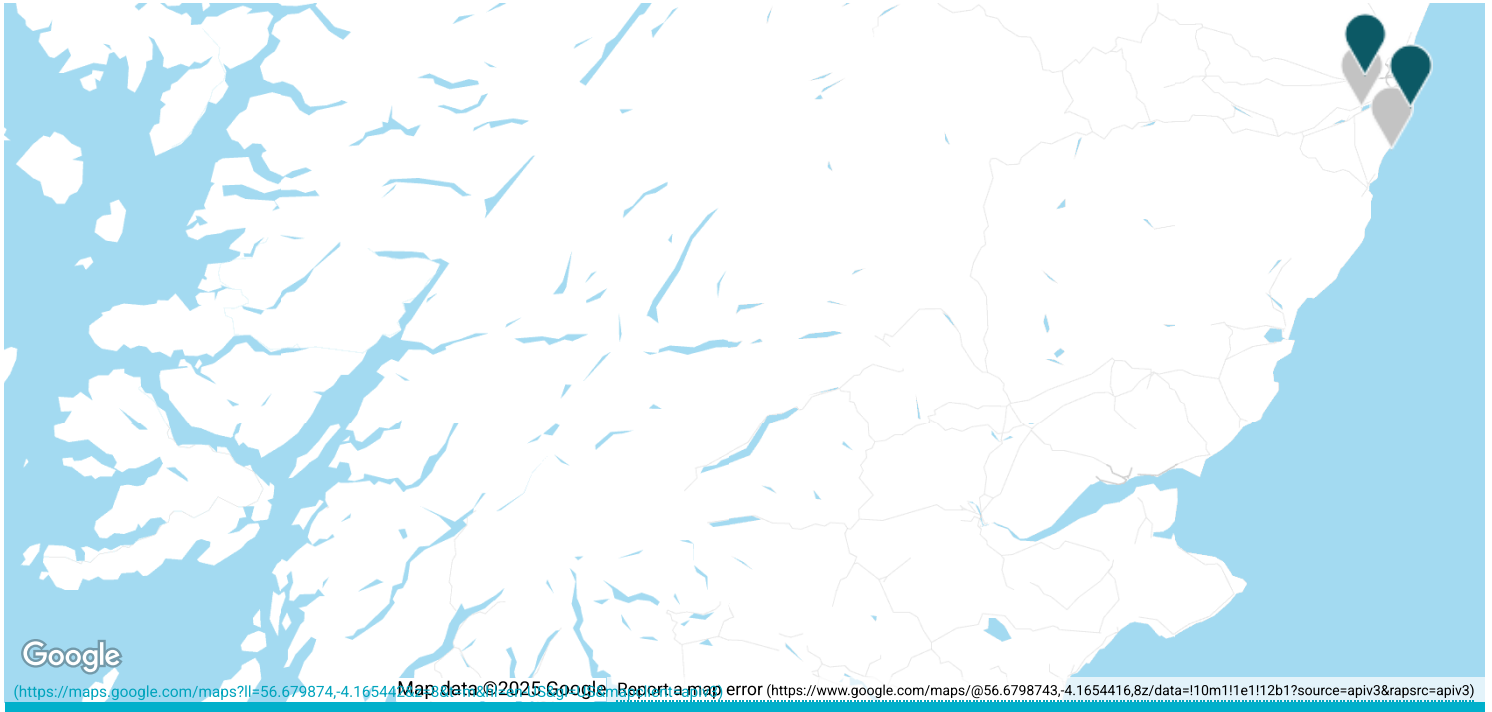




Kirkliston

Kirkliston is part of Edinburgh City. It was an independent burgh in times past. Quarrying and distilling have been key industries with Drambuie produced until 1981. It is now primarily a commuter settlement.

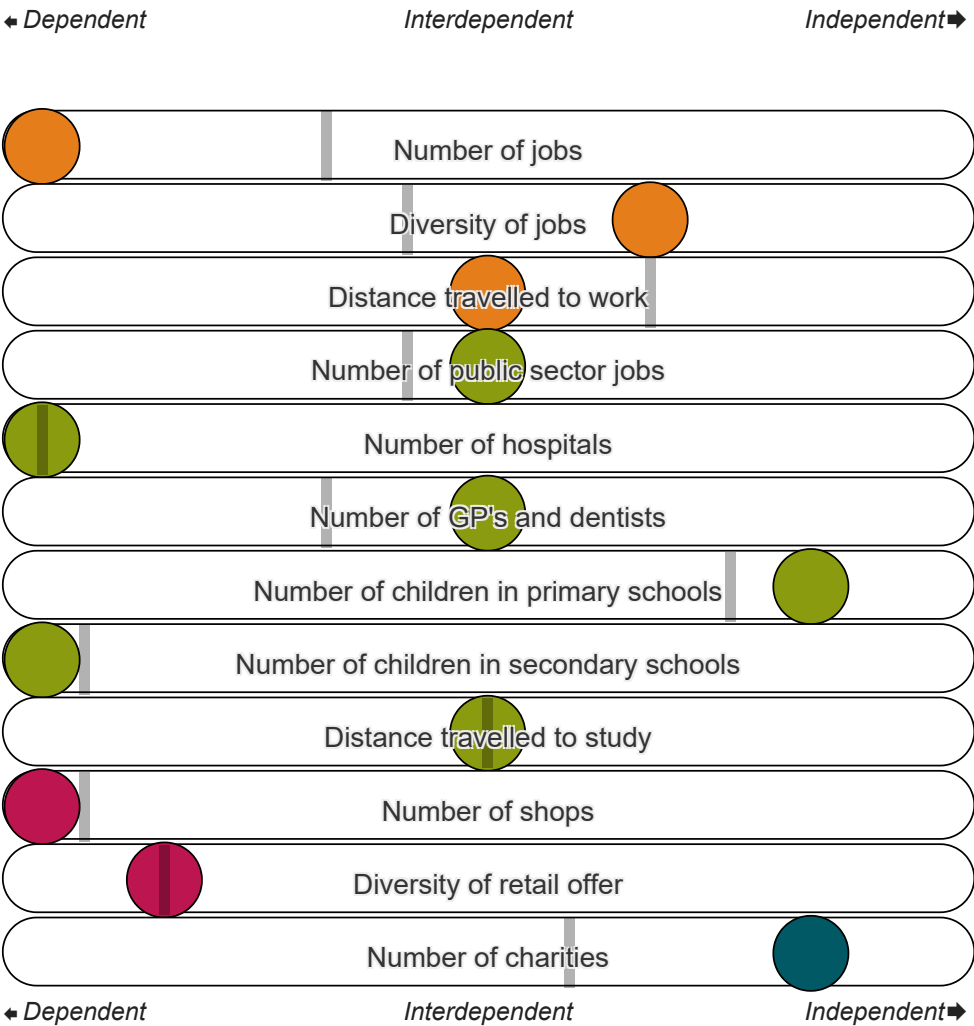

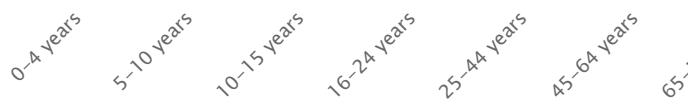

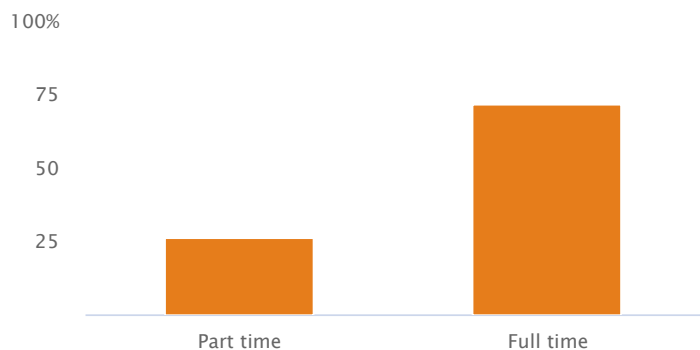

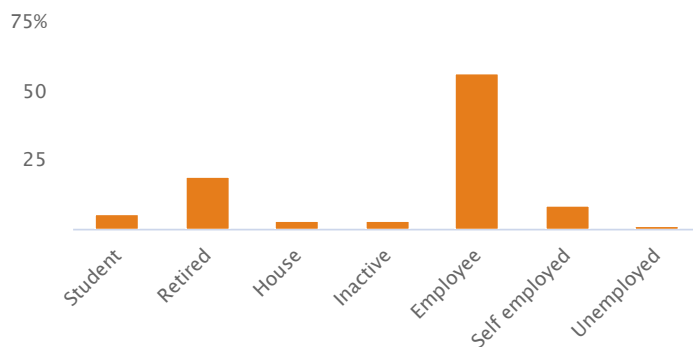
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



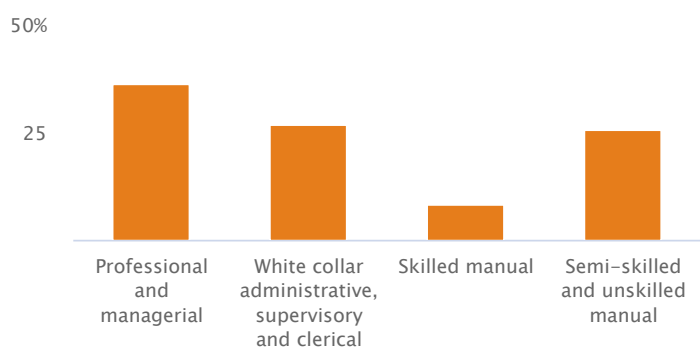
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

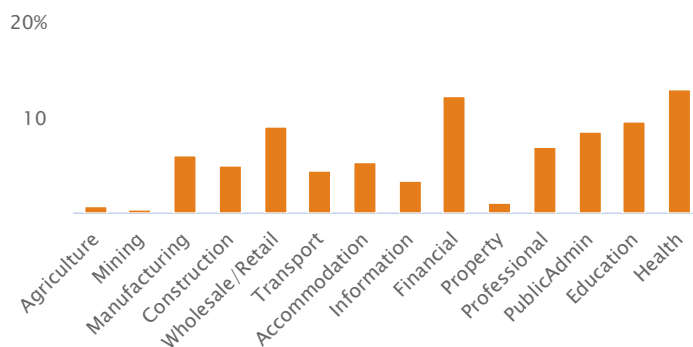


Social Grade

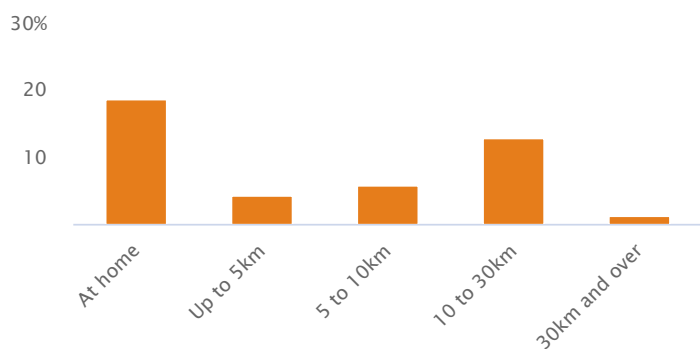
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

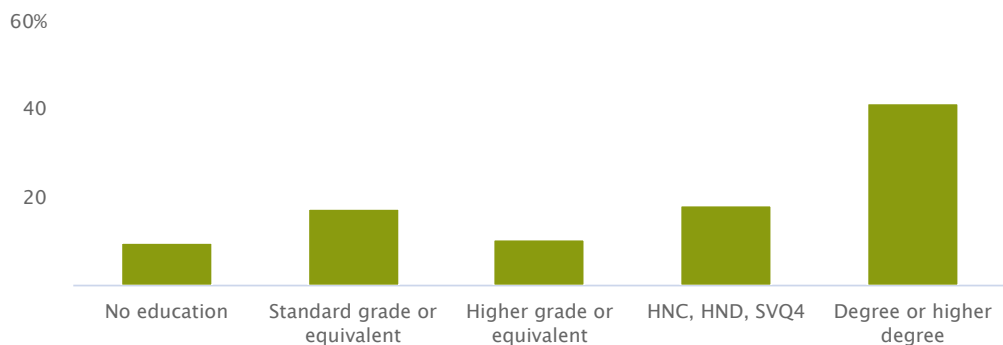


Distance travelled to work

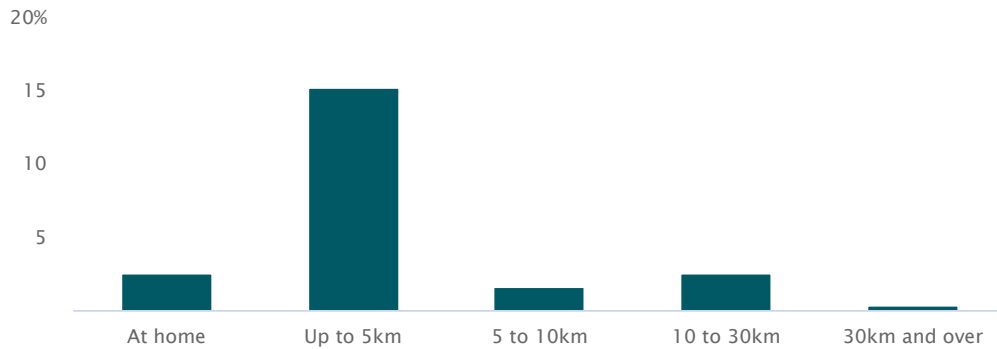
