Kirkwall is the capital of Orkney. Its origins are Norse. St Magnus cathedral dates from the 11th century. There are a number of light industries and the town is the main service and retail centre for Orkney.

In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Kirkwall is an independent town.

Its most similar towns are $\underline{\text{Castle Douglas}}$, $\underline{\text{Kelso}}$, $\underline{\text{Kirkcudbright}}$, and $\underline{\text{Lerwick}}$.






Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)




Distance travelled to work




Occupation




