NORTH AYRSHIRE

Lamlash is in North Ayrshire. It is on the western seaboard of Arran and is the ferryport to Argyll in summer. It was a late 19th century estate village focussed on fishing. It is now in a marine protected area and acts as a service town for northern Arran.

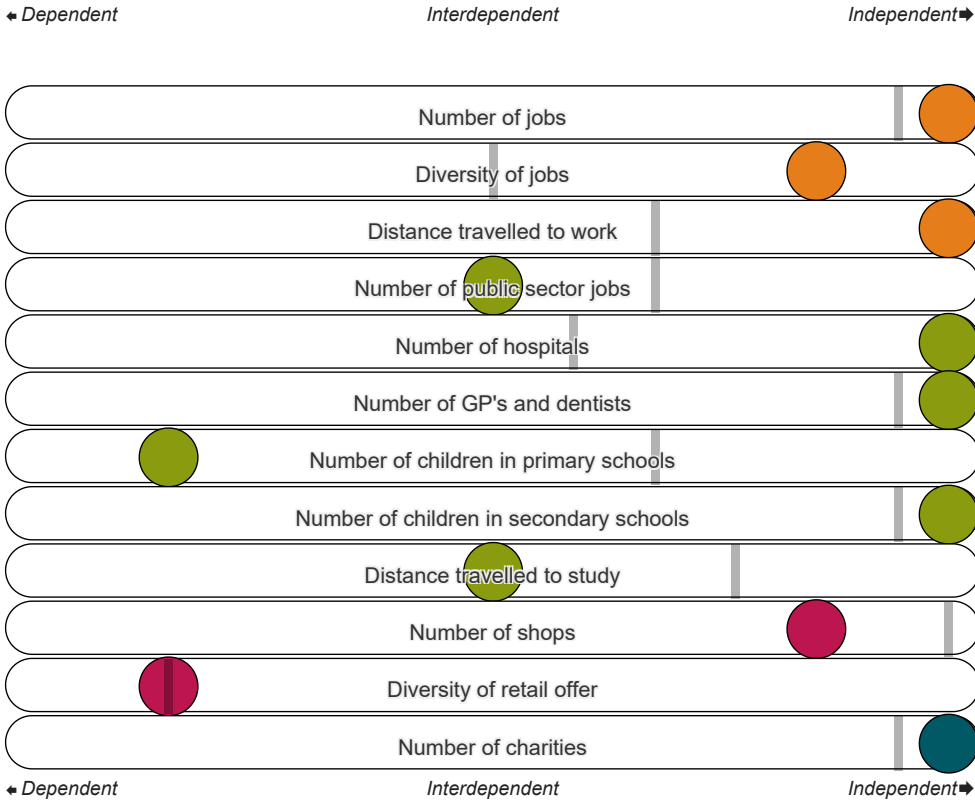
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Lamlash is an independent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Aberfeldy](#), [Aberlour](#), [Dornoch](#), and [Grantown-on-Spey](#).

Lamlash is an **independent to interdependent** town.

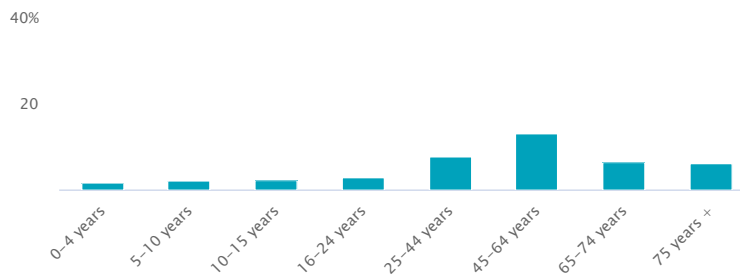
Combining inter-relationships and typology, Lamlash is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Lamlash differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

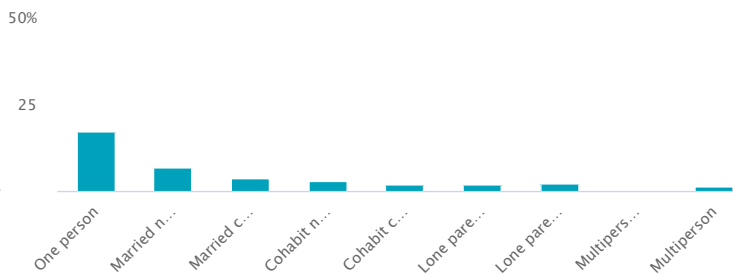

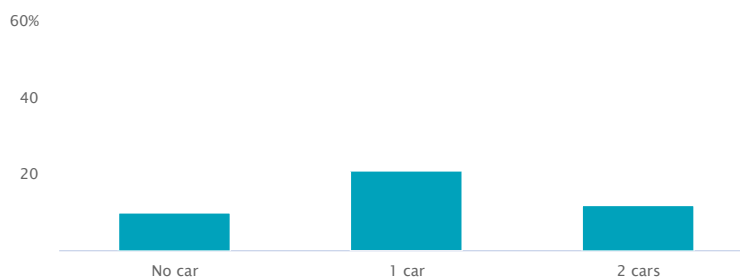

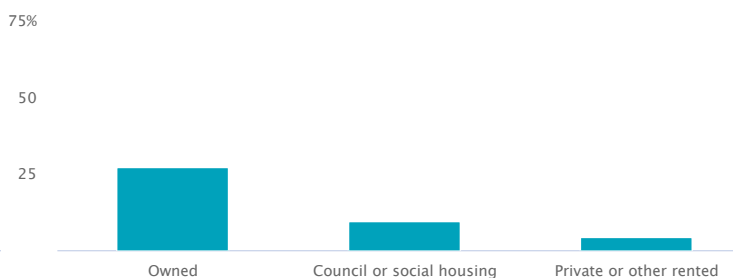
Household composition

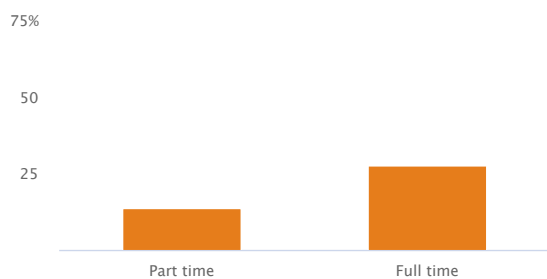

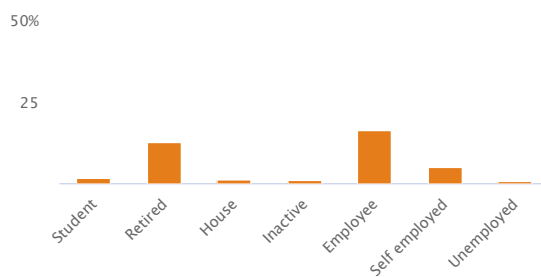
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



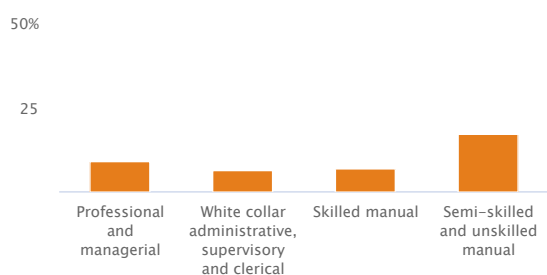
Occupation

Social Grade

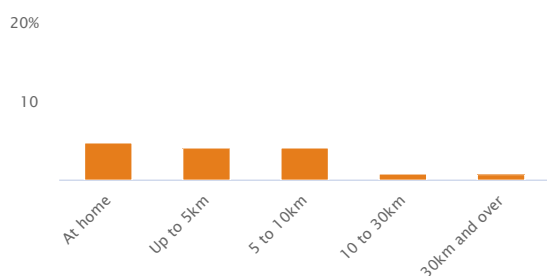
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

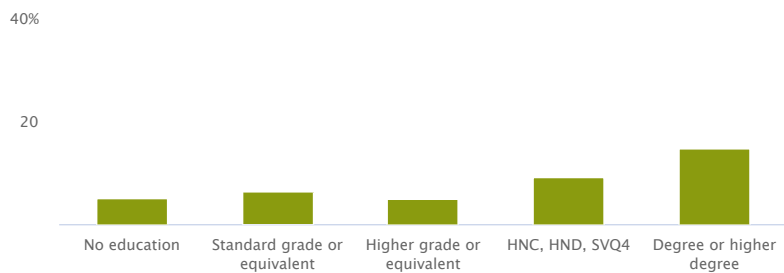


Distance travelled to work

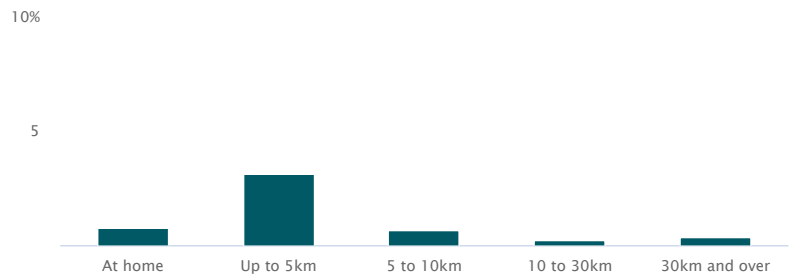
