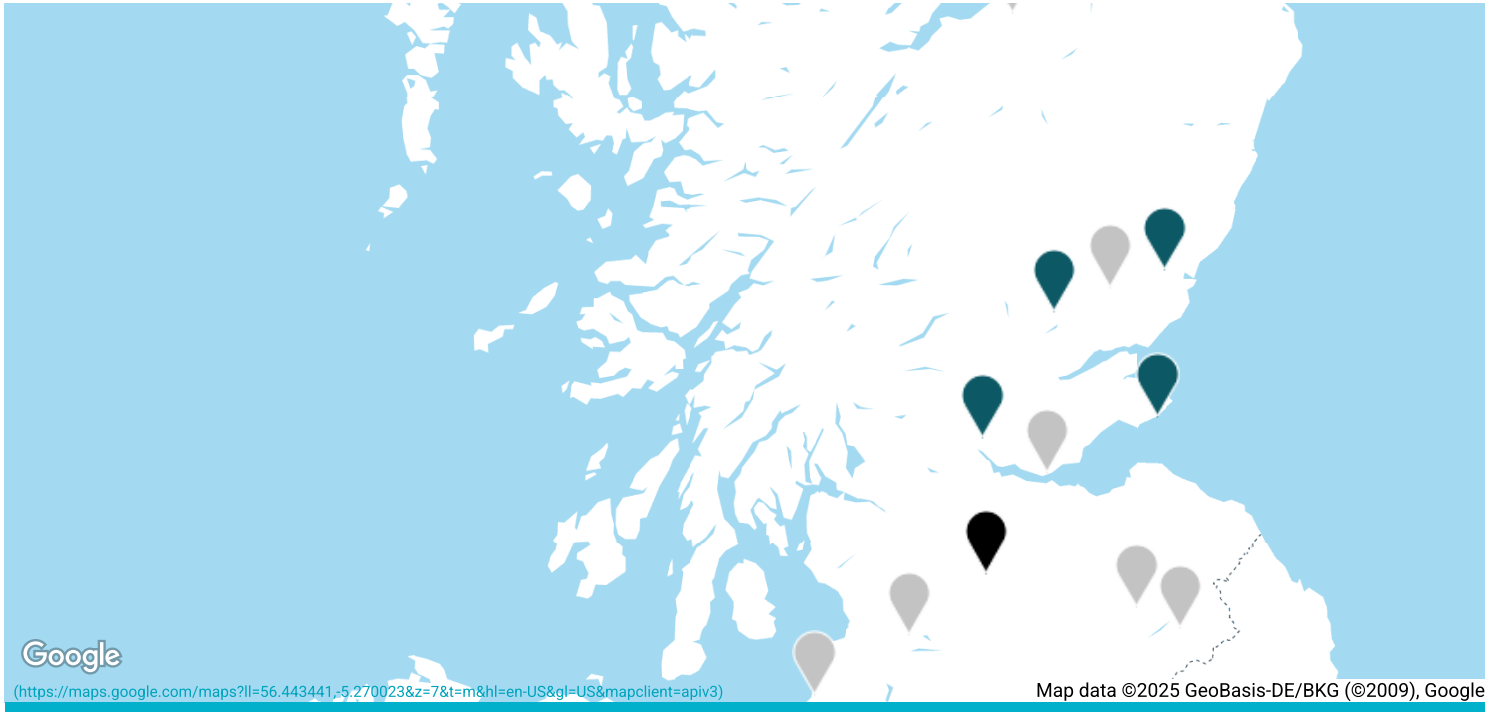




Lanark

Lanark is located in South Lanarkshire. It was the county town for Lanarkshire. There is currently little employment in Lanark and most residents are commuters. It has local services for the surrounding agricultural area.

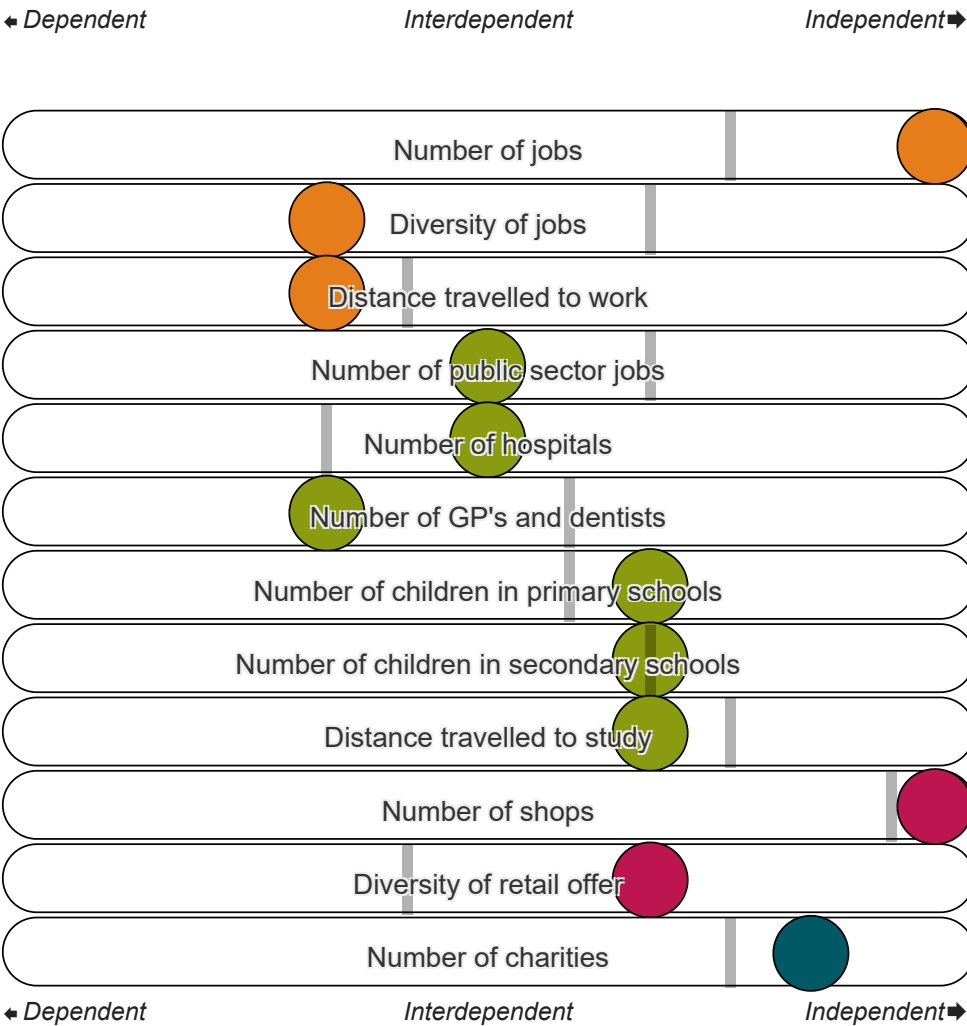
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Lanark is an interdependent to independent town.

Lanark is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Lanark is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and shops. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs. Lanark differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists; and the diversity of jobs.

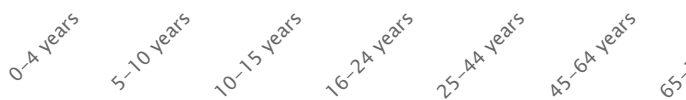

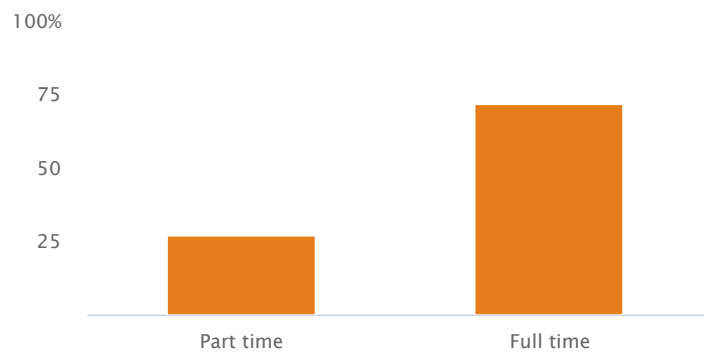

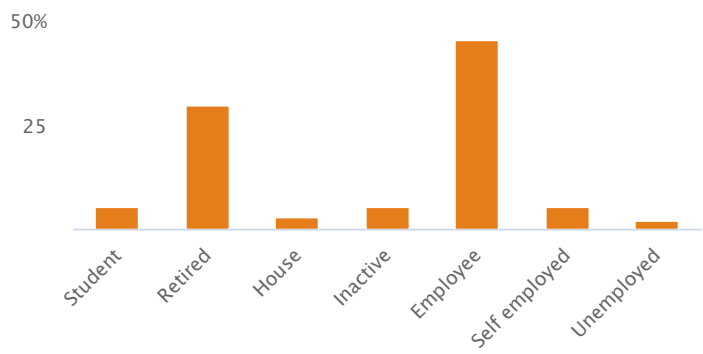
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



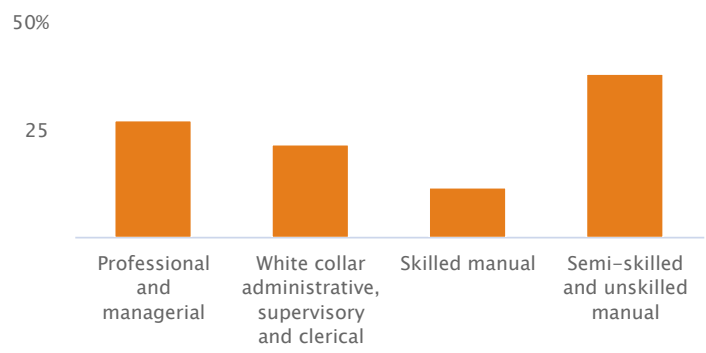
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

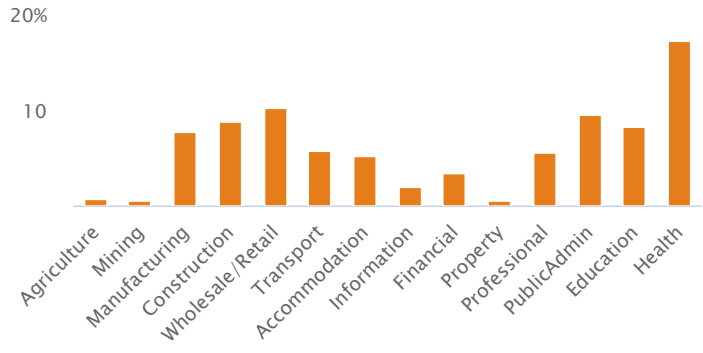

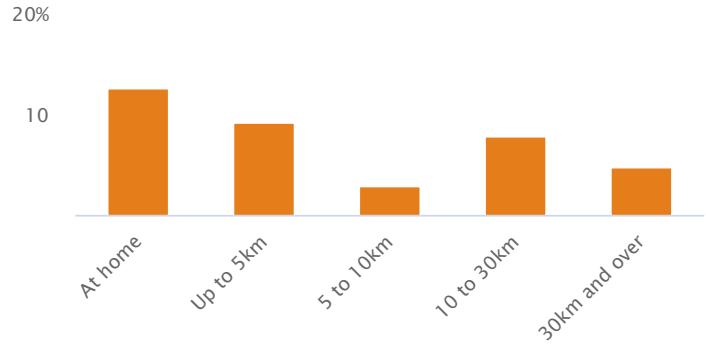
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

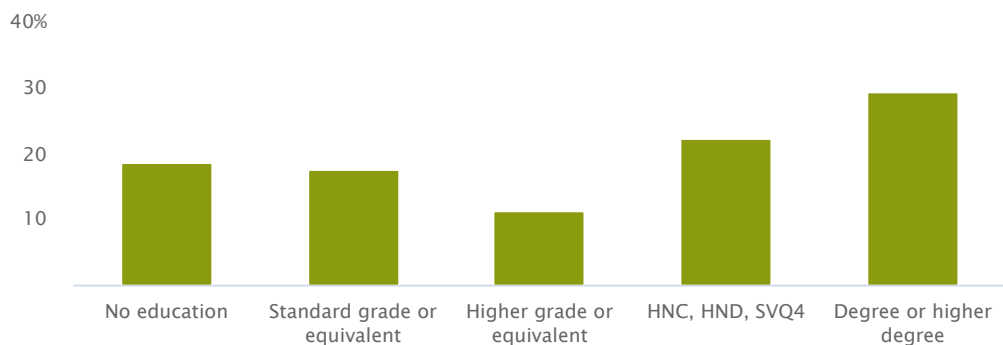


Distance travelled to work

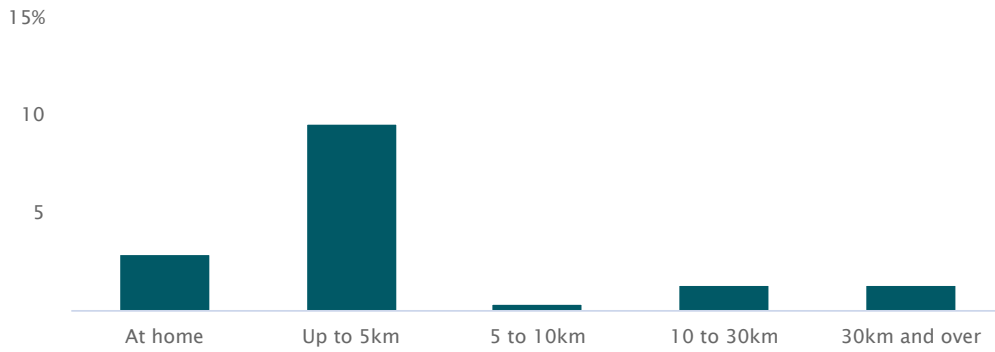
