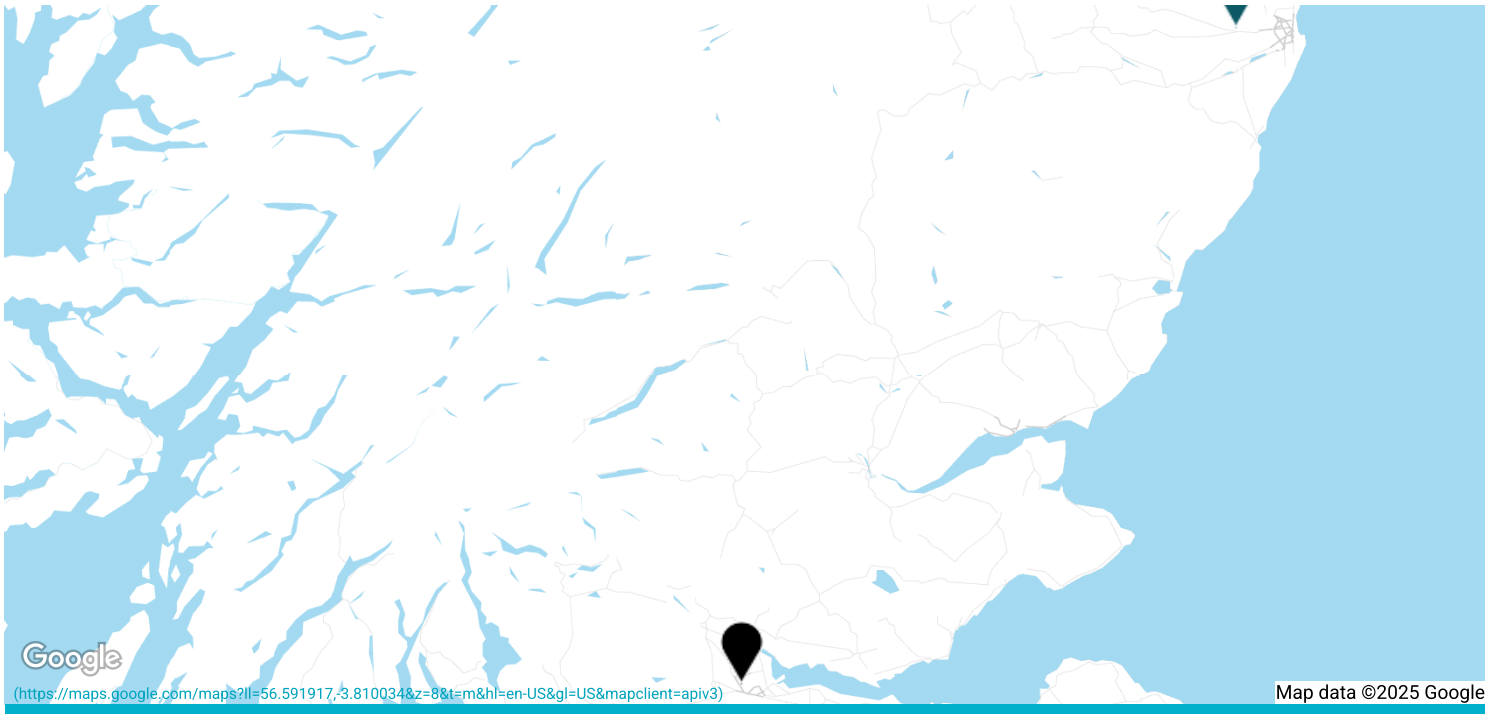




Larbert

Larbert in Falkirk has a long history dating back to Roman times. Its growth is a result of the development of boiler making and casting and in particular the Carron Ironworks. Heavy industry has declined and the town has many commuters. There are several industrial estates with a range of manufacturing companies and service industries.

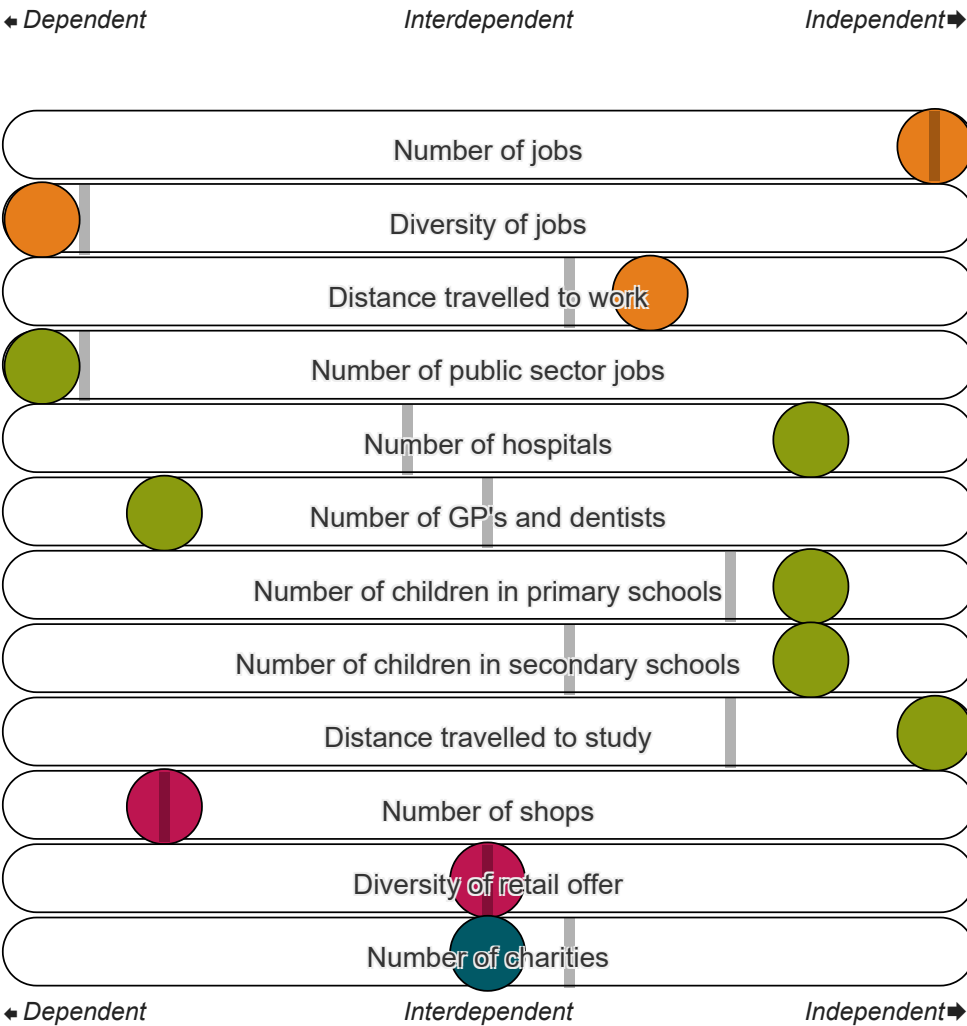
In large, affluent towns, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Larbert is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Larbert is grouped with 1 other town. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals, and children in secondary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Larbert differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

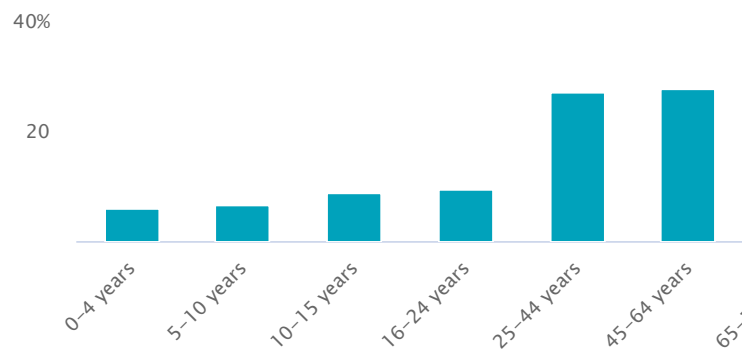

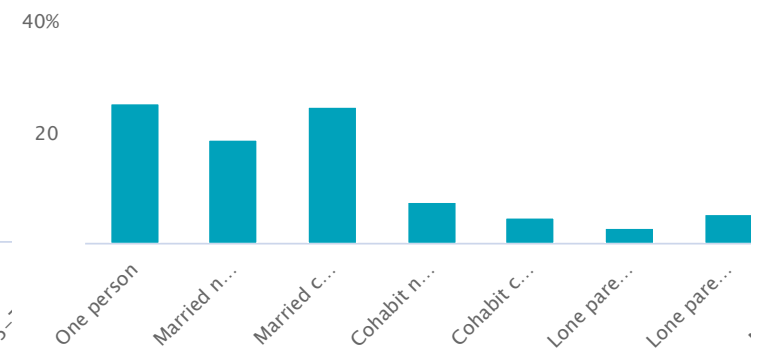

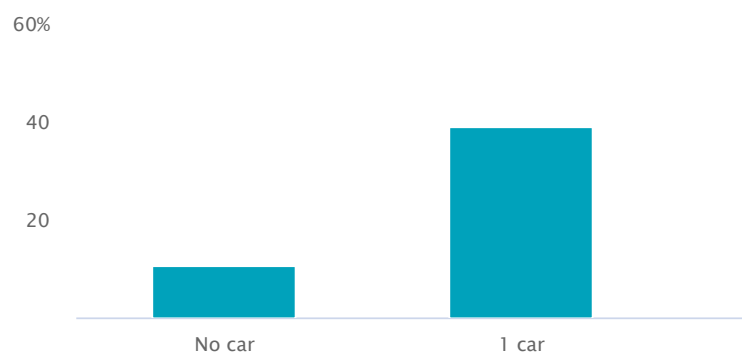

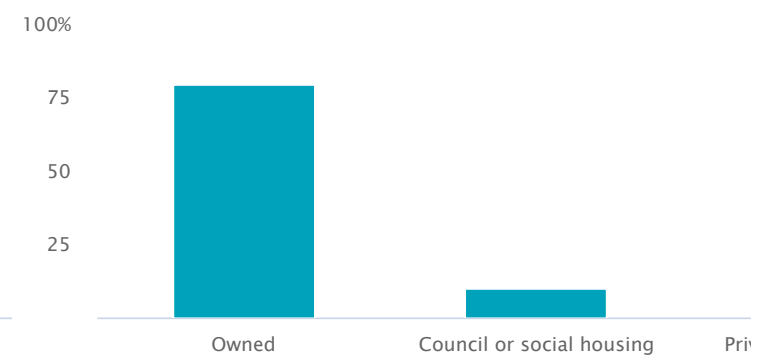

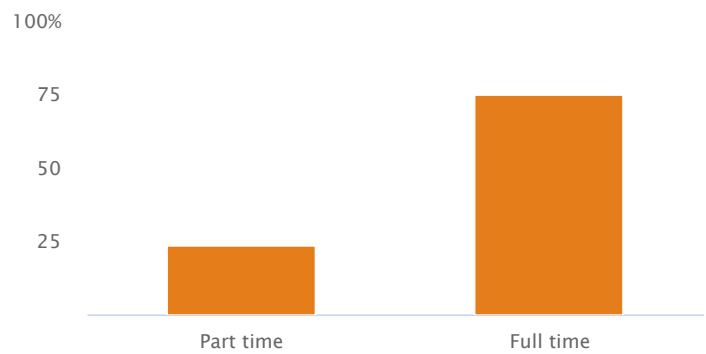

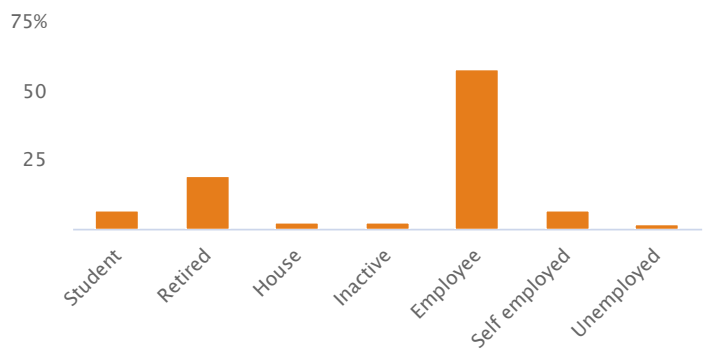
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



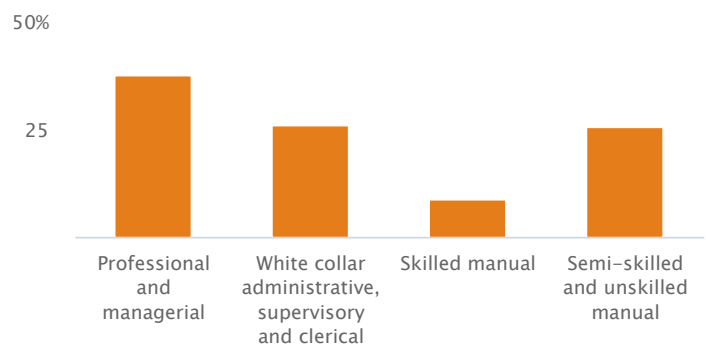
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

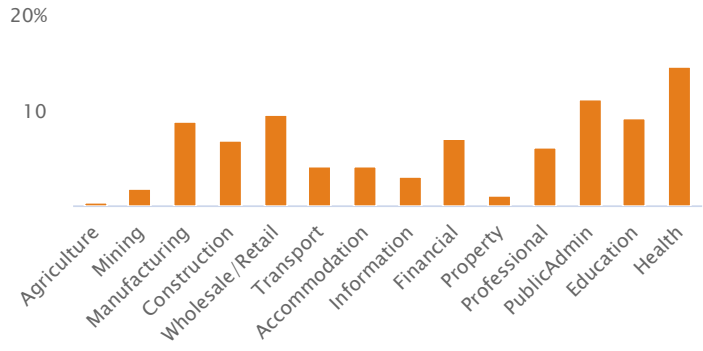

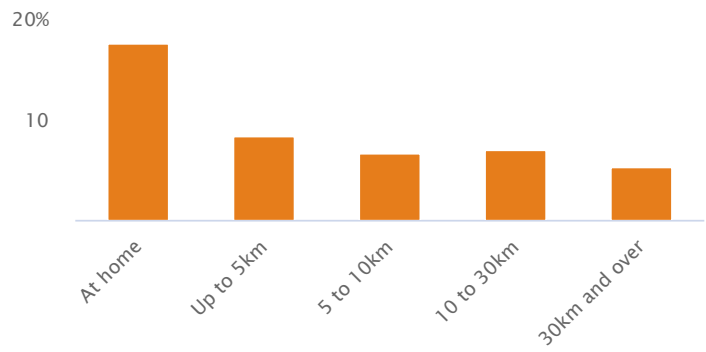
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

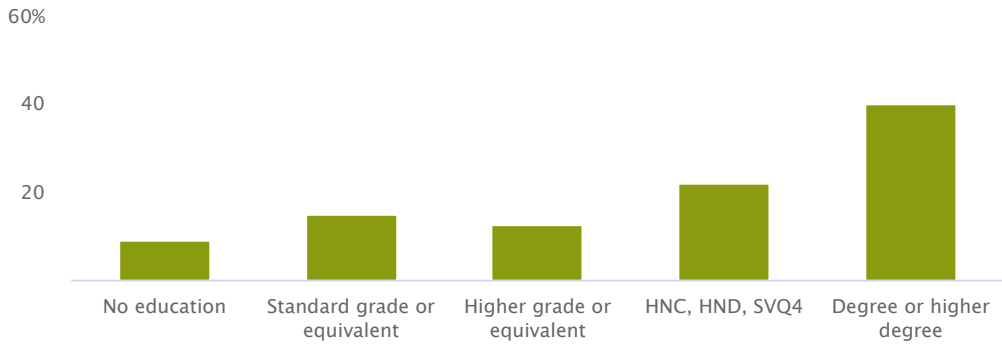


Distance travelled to work

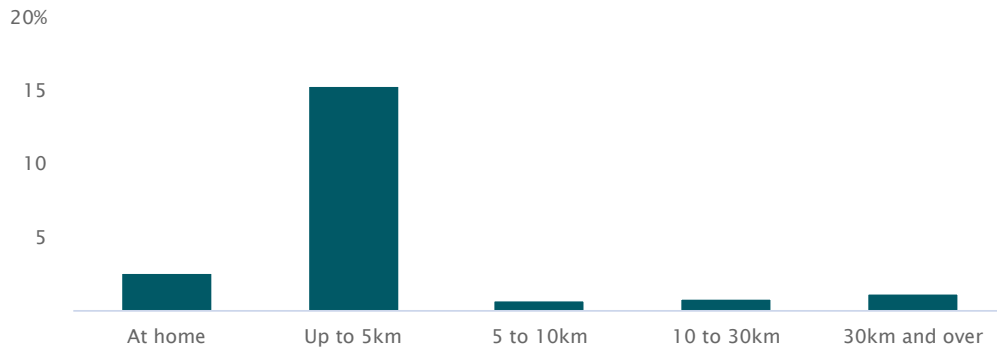
