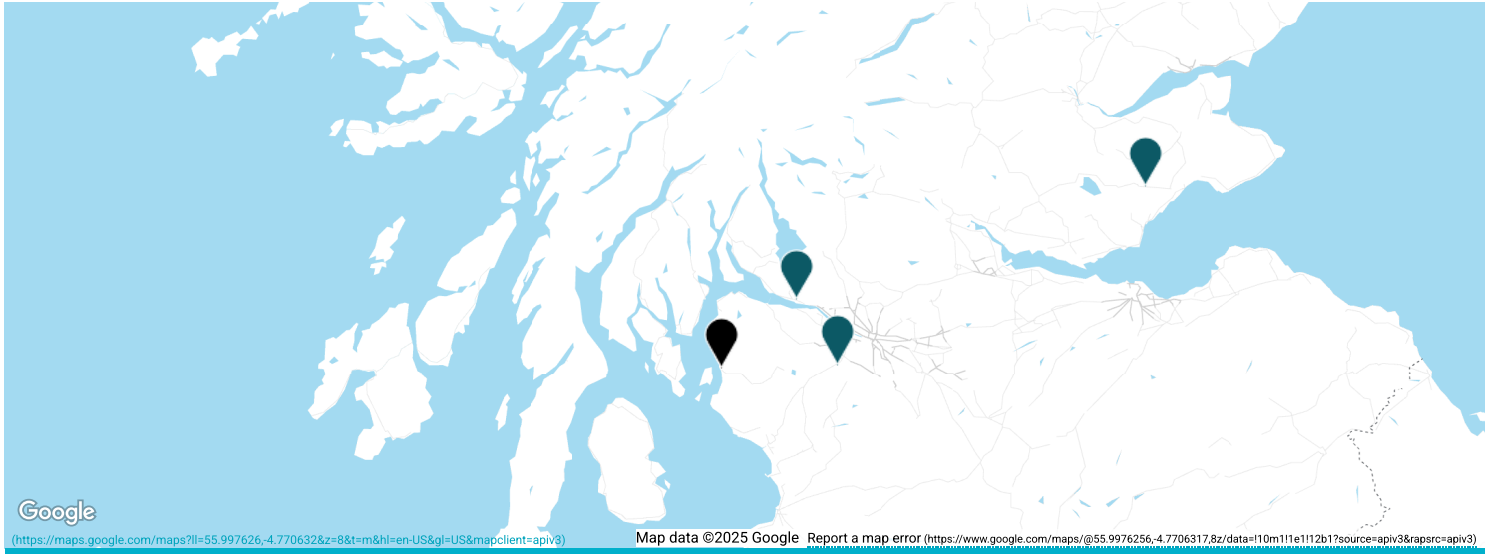




Largs

POPULATION **10,917**

Largs is in in North Ayrshire. It has early Norse connections with the defeat of the Norsemen at the Battle of Largs in 1263. The town developed as a tourist resort in Victorian times and is today a popular marina.

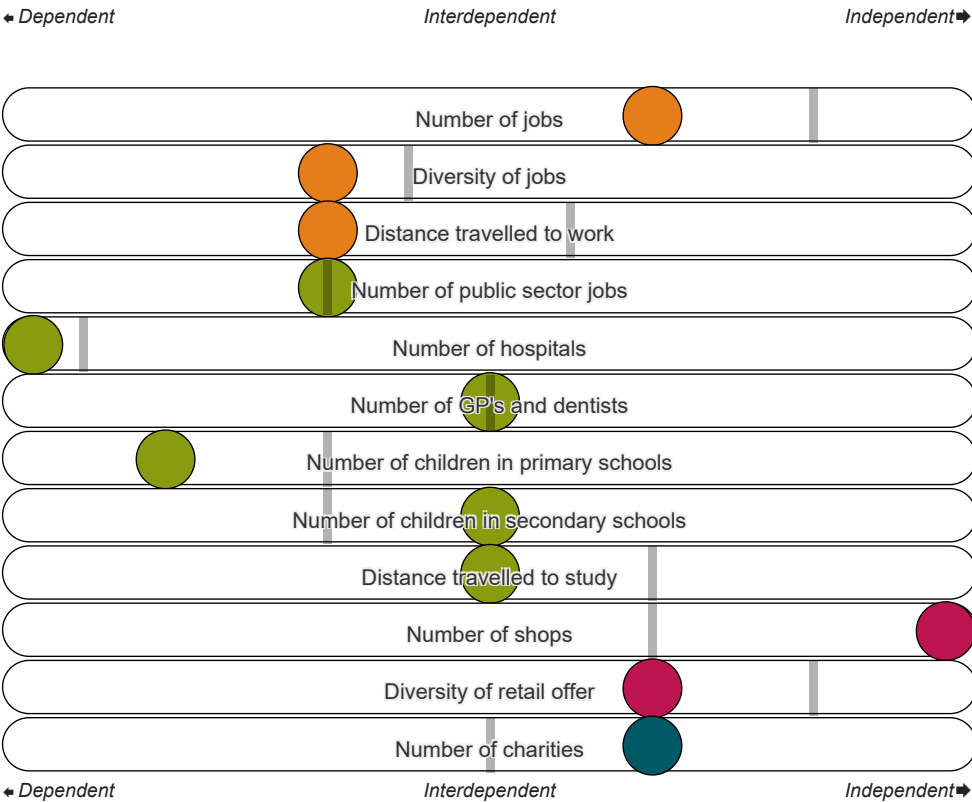
In large towns such as this, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Largs is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Largs is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Largs is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of shops. Largs differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

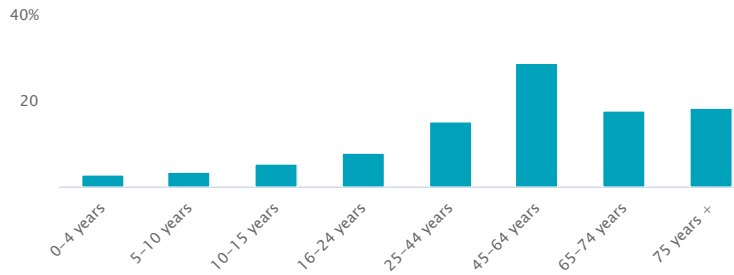

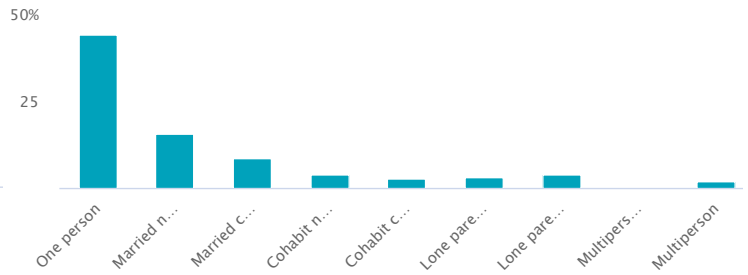

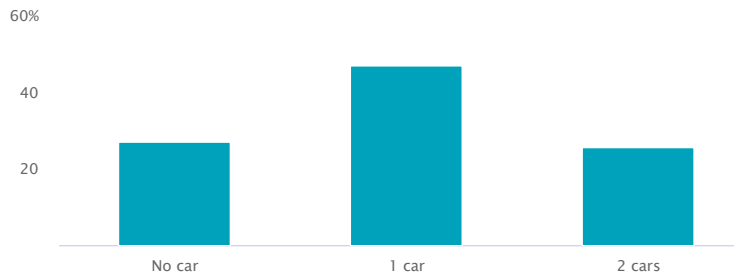

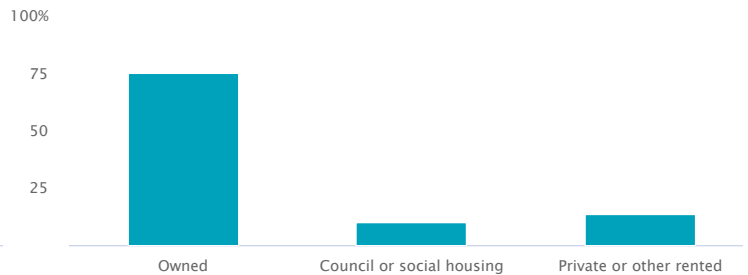
Household composition

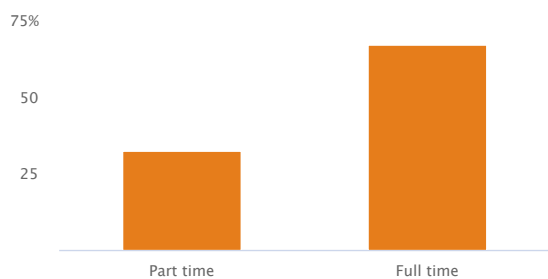

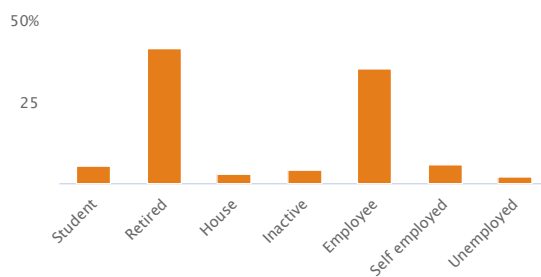
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



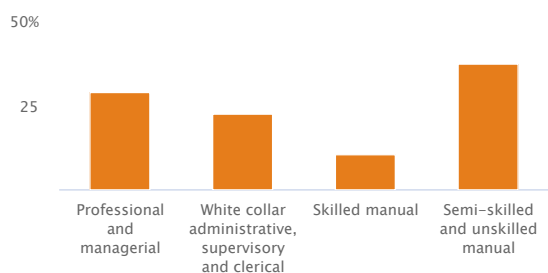
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

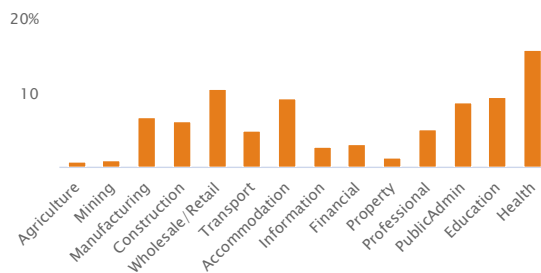

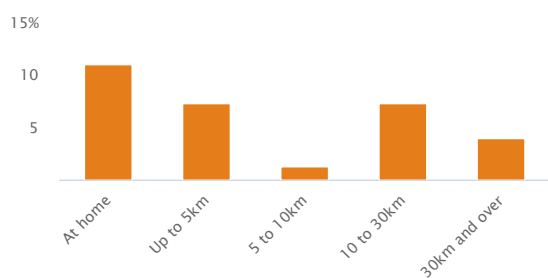
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

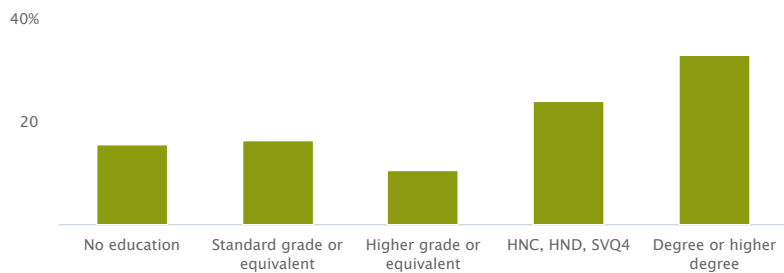


Distance travelled to work

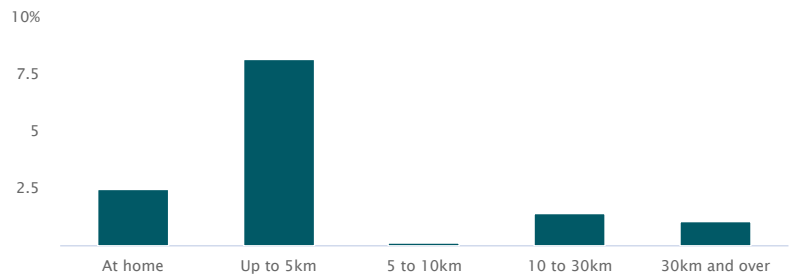
