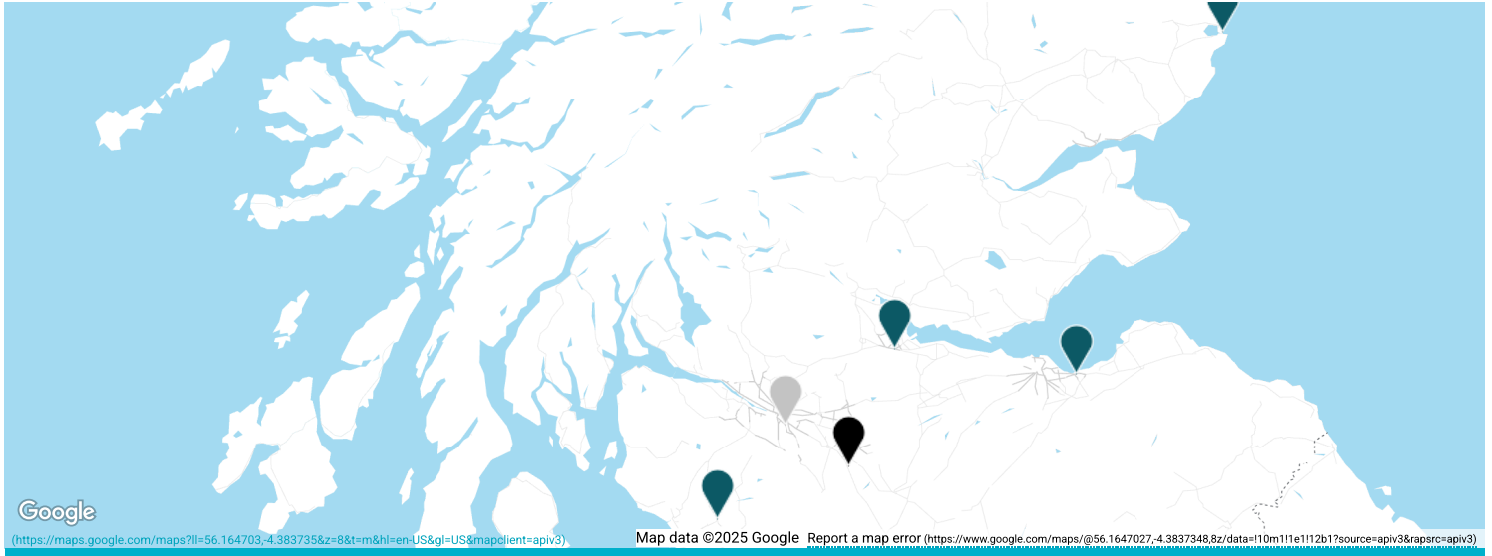




Larkhall

POPULATION **15,308**

Larkhall is located in South Lanarkshire. Mining developed in the town attracting many Irish immigrants. The mines closed and the associated iron and steel works also closed. Today other light industries offer some local employment but many commute for work.

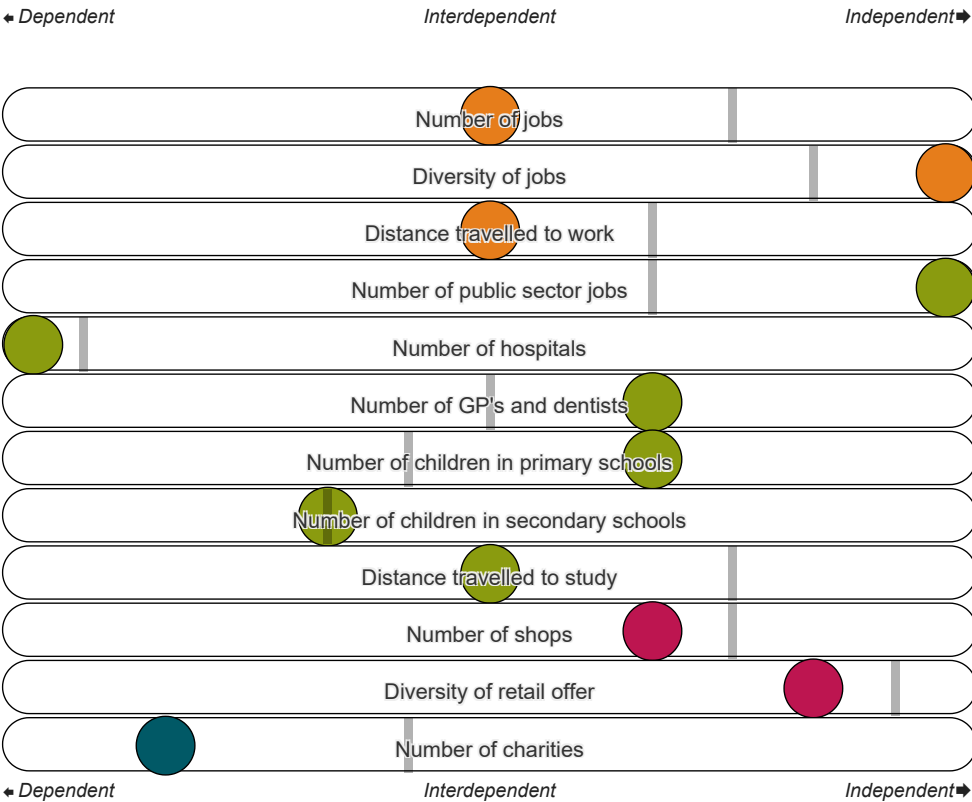
In large towns such as this, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Larkhall is an interdependent to independent town.

Larkhall is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Larkhall is grouped with 5 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. Larkhall differs most from its group in the number of jobs; and the distance travelled to study.

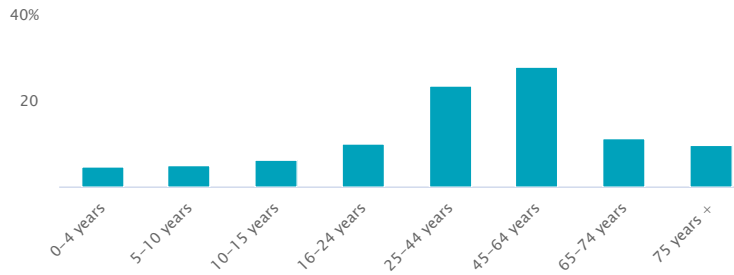

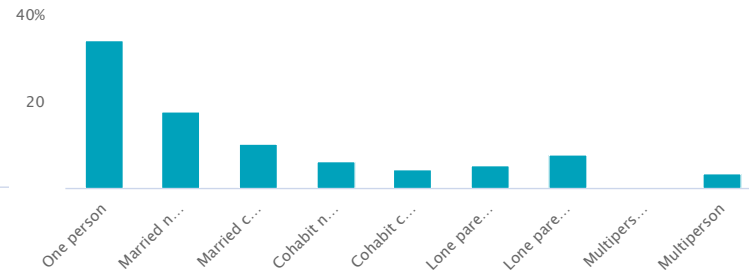

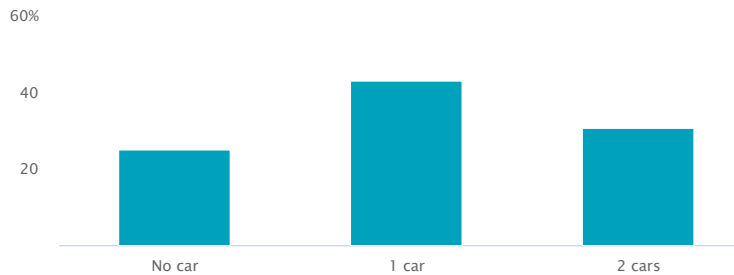

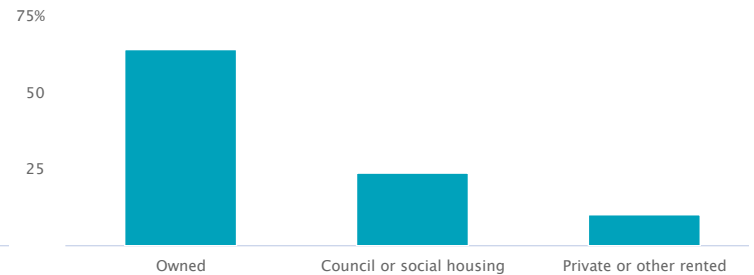

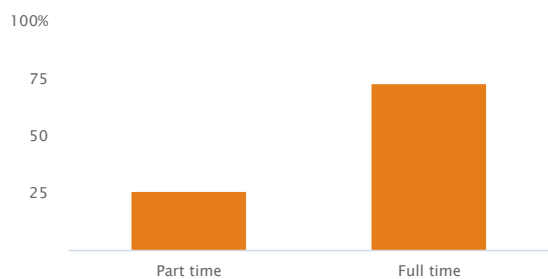

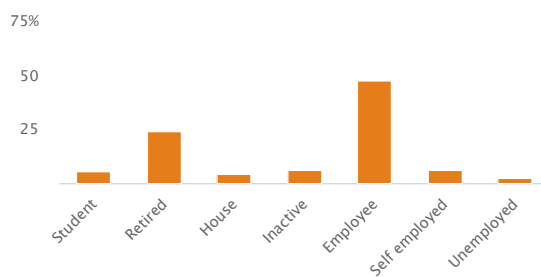
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



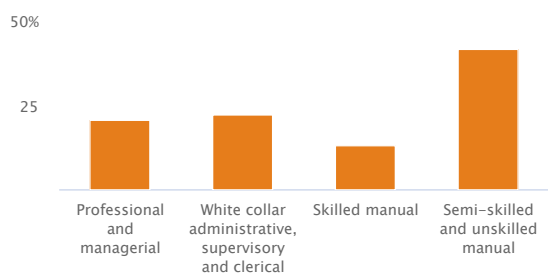
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

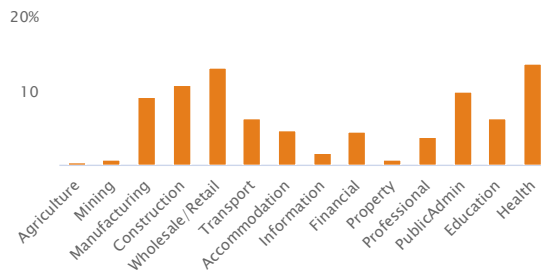

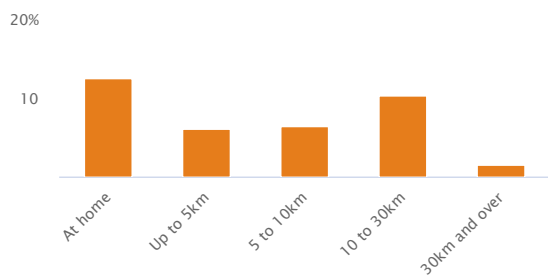
(% households aged 16-64)



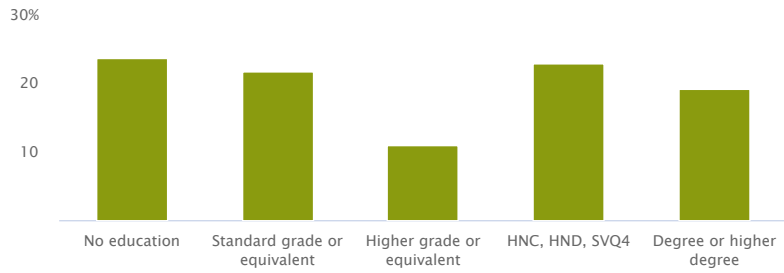
Sector Diversity

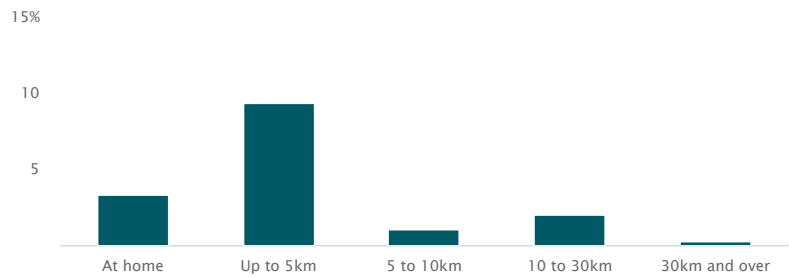
