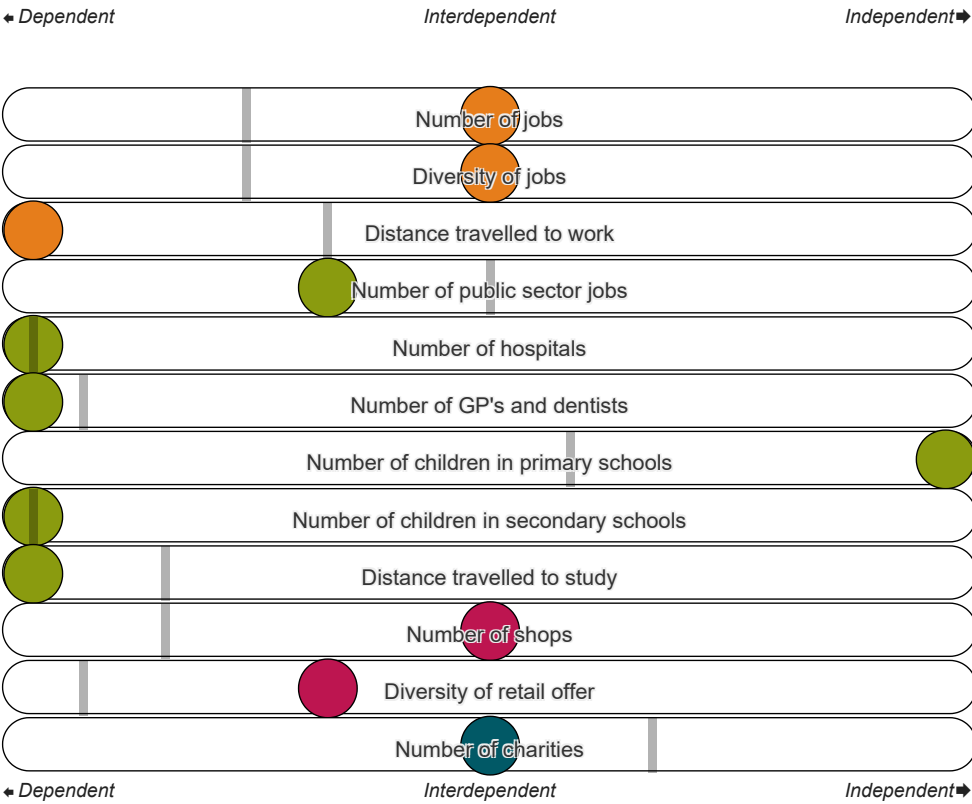
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Lauder is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Lauder is grouped with 19 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, shops, and diversity of retail offer. Lauder differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

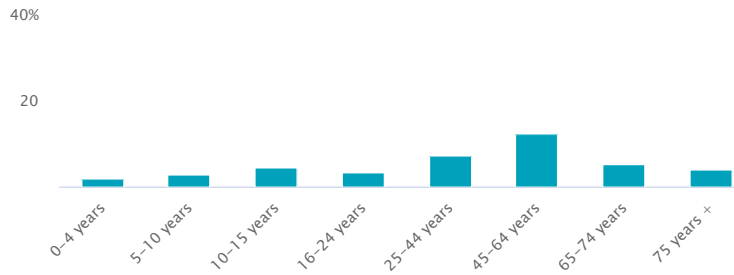

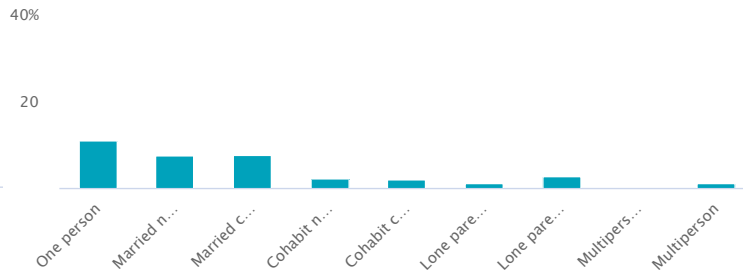

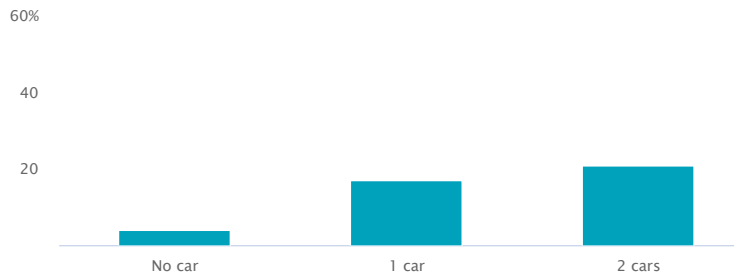

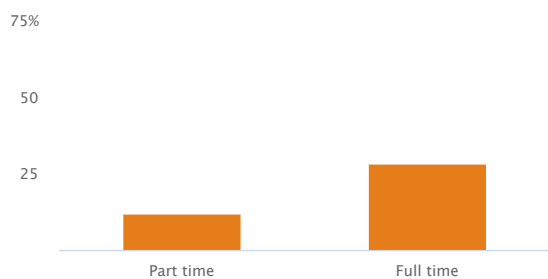

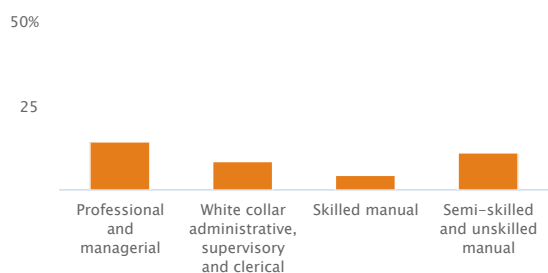
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



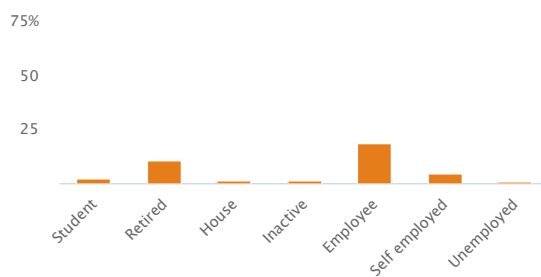
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

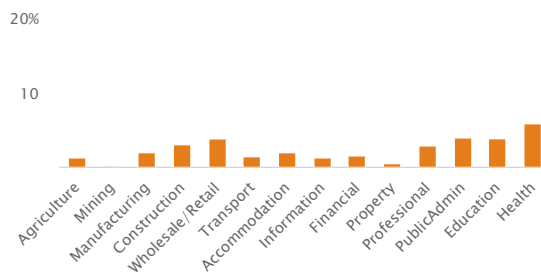

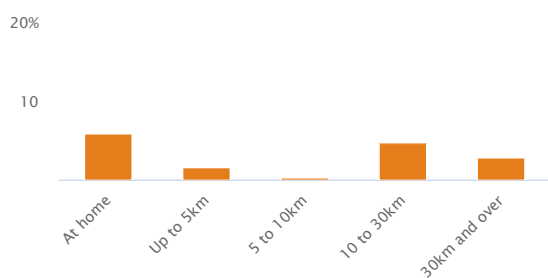

Sector Diversity

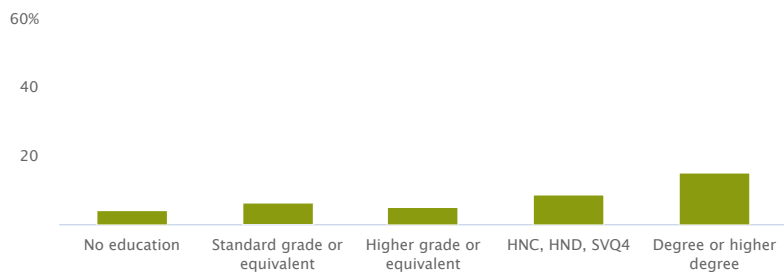


Distance travelled to work

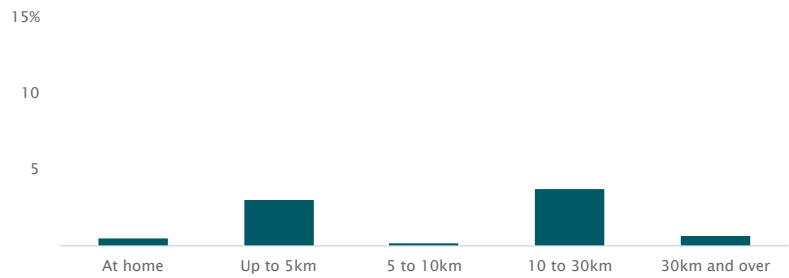
